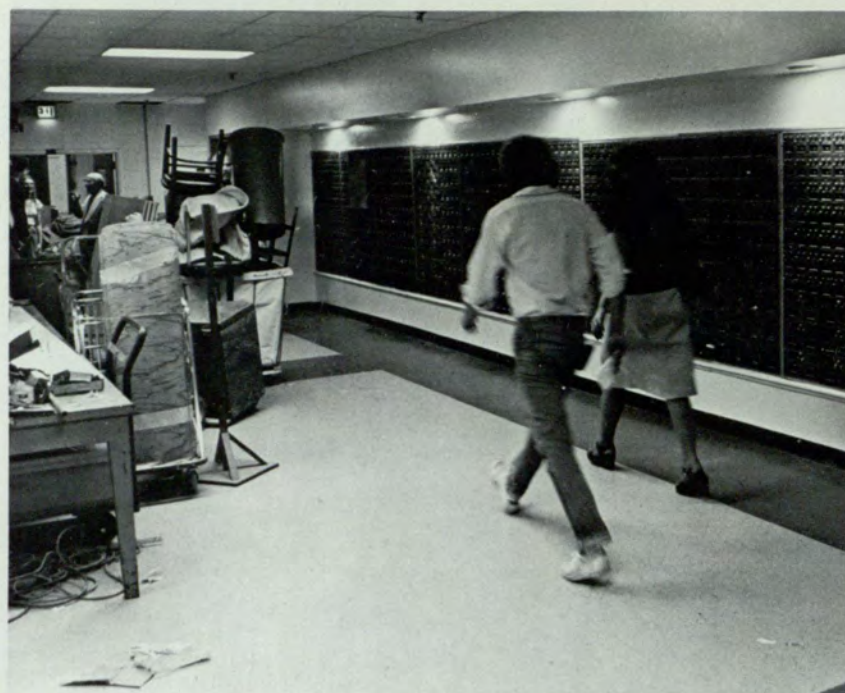

ment. The food line was stepped up to include fruit, salad platters, and cheese and vegetable trays.

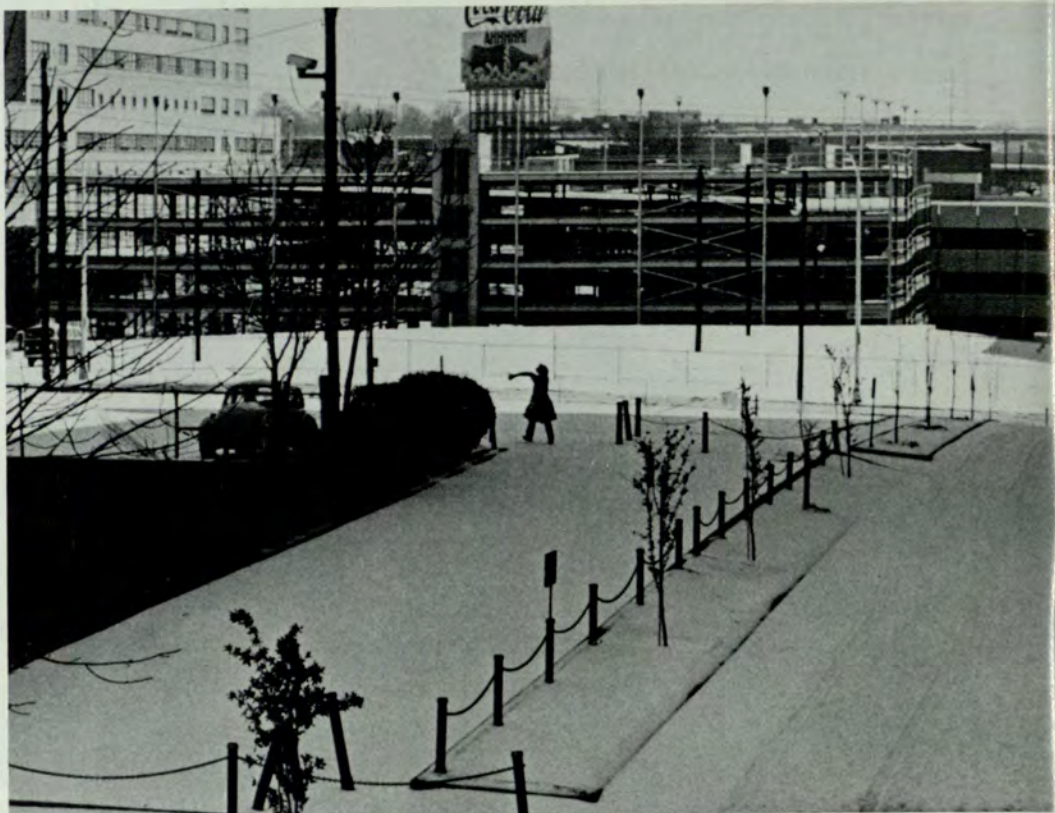
