
ATLANTA DIVISION UNIVERSITY OF GEORGIA


The history of the Atlanta Division, University of Georgia, is as impressive as the plans for its new campus. The Atlanta Division began as an idea for promoting education for men and women who were in search of a college education but could not attend day classes. One hundred and sixty students were enrolled, and the faculty was made up of eleven professors. Courses offered were mainly business subjects, with languages and history added later. All of the school facilities were in the building itself.

The aim of the Atlanta Division has been accomplished by offering to thousands of young people the opportunity to gain an education while making their living. Students attending the Atlanta Division now number from 4,000 to 6,000, with a faculty composed of one hundred and fifty professors. The curriculum contains a large variety of courses, with several degrees and diplomas now being offered. The present location of the Atlanta Division at 24 Ivy Street is its third home, with school facilities now including the school lodge and the gymnasium. Students have an opportunity to enter into organizations which promote certain types of activities, both social and professional, and further business education generally.

Plans for the new home of the Atlanta Division will bring to students a magnificent structure, enclosing a new library, additional classrooms, executive offices, and student lounges, with the present building being used for laboratories and additional classroom space. The ingenuity, aggressiveness, and genuine interest of the faculty and students in the Atlanta Division will continue to make it a school of which we can all be proud.






