



### FOREWORD

In presenting this first "Nocturne" it is most fitting that we should reflect upon the history of our school . . .

Through the efforts of the Georgia Tech Alumni Association under the leadership of Mr. W. M. Fambrough, then its president, a series of lectures on business subjects were held on the campus for Tech undergraduates in 1911. As a result of the response to these lectures a number of the instructors offered to treat their subjects more fully in evening classes so that in the school year 1913-14 the Evening School of Commerce of the Georgia School of Technology was established on the Tech campus offering courses leading to the degree of B.C.S.

The following year funds for renting downtown quarters were secured through the aid of Governor Harrison and the school moved to the seventh floor of the Walton Building. At the time the school was established Wayne Sailley Kell was made its Director and much of its later growth is due to his untiring efforts and those of his associates during those first years.

The School of Commerce—day division—was established in 1916 as an outgrowth of the Evening School. Professor J. M. Watters succeeded Professor Kell as Dean of both divisions and served until 1924, when Professor Fred B. Wenn became Director of the Evening School and Professor Thomas Noel became Dean of the Commerce Department. Constant growth had by this time made necessary the removal of the school from the Walton Building to quarters in the Peachtree Arcade and from there to a location at the corner of Pryor Street and Auburn Avenue.

After remaining at the latter location several years, still larger quarters were secured at 103½ Forsyth Street. The school remained there until May, 1931, when because of the efforts of a group of friends led by Robert Rosser Johnson it was moved into its own splendid building here at 223 Walton Street.

In 1928 Dr. George M. Sparks, our present Director, assumed his duties. At the close of the school year 1932-33 the Evening School was established by the Board of Regents as a separate unit of the University System and became the University System of Georgia Evening School. Under the leadership of Chancellor Emeritus Charles M. Snelling and our present faculty, courses were added to our curriculum which lead to the degrees of B.S., B.S.C., A.B., and M.S.C. During the first year of the school's existence the total enrollment was forty-four students. During this school year the enrollment has exceeded seven hundred students. . . .

It has been our purpose to make this book a worthwhile tribute to all of those men who have striven so well that this school might be.

With pride in the past and faith in the future, we offer this first volume of "The Nocturne" in the belief that it will serve in the years to come to recall for you many pleasant memories of evenings spent in study and companionship. It is our sincere hope that you will find among these pages a faithful record of the school year 1933-34.



#### STUDENT COUNCIL

The Student Council was organized in 1929 to coordinate class activities and to encourage a close understanding between students and faculty. Each class elects two representatives to the Council for a term of one year. Class Presidents are ex-officio members. A Student President is elected from the Senior Class and serves, also, for a one year term.

The year 1933-34 has been an eventful one in the history of the Evening School. Many new problems faced the student body and its student government as a result of the school's new character.

In chronicling the activities and accomplishments of the Council no mere listing of things done can portray the real spirit of school loyalty which characterized it during the past year. Suffice it to say that the personnel of the Council truly depicted the fine qualities of the student body.

Among the problems with which the Council dealt during the year were the publication of the student newspaper—"The Evening Signal"; the issuance of this first yearbook—The Nocturne; the selection of school colors—"Red and White"; the selection of a Senior Ring design; the staging of the traditional Fall Banquet; the forming of a new Constitution, and many others.

In dealing with all of these problems the Council members have displayed a courage and judgment that is a source of pride to those who reflect upon it.

They have truly upheld the ideals of our fine heritage and give over to their successors a record of achievement worthy of students of the Evening School.
