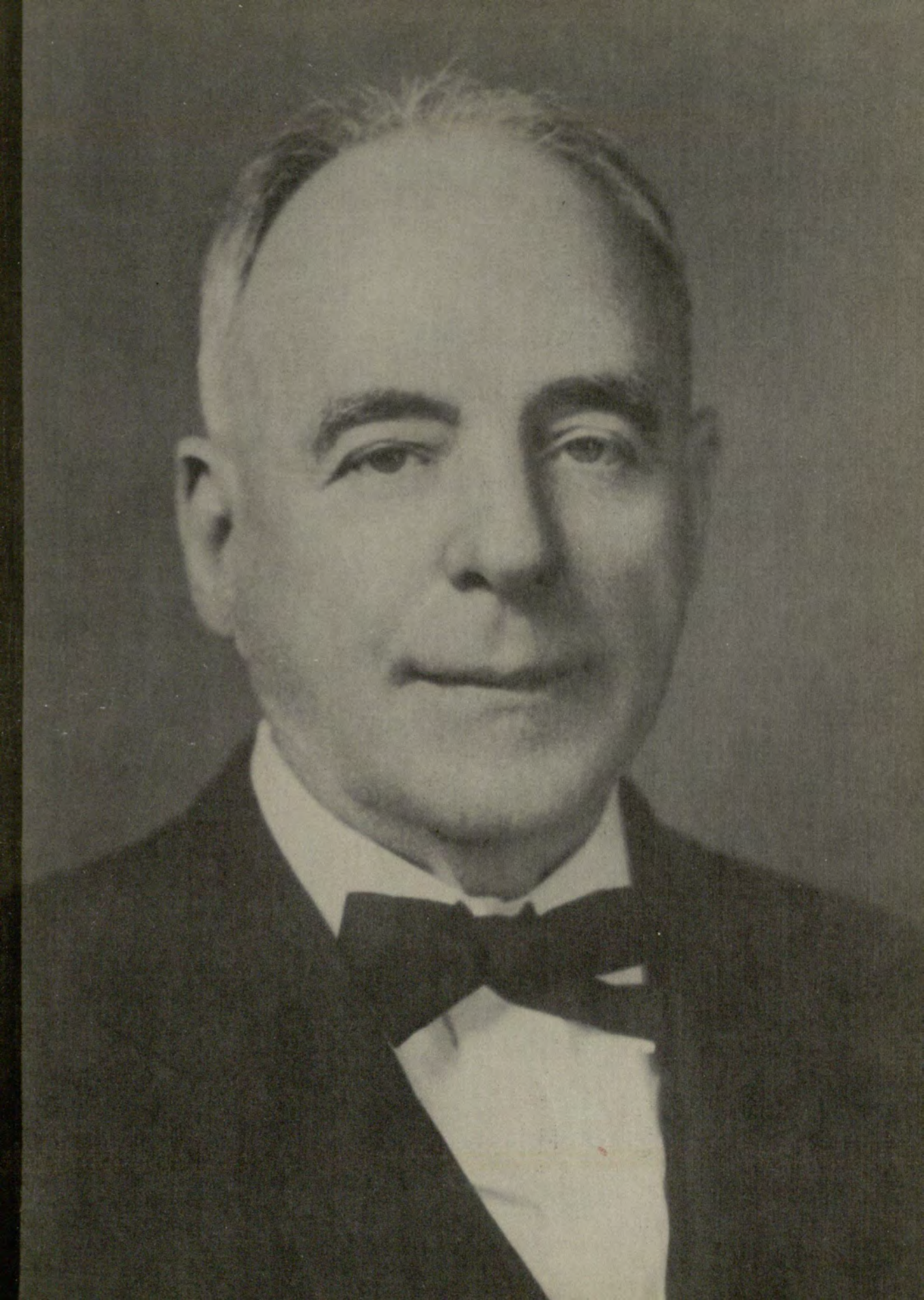

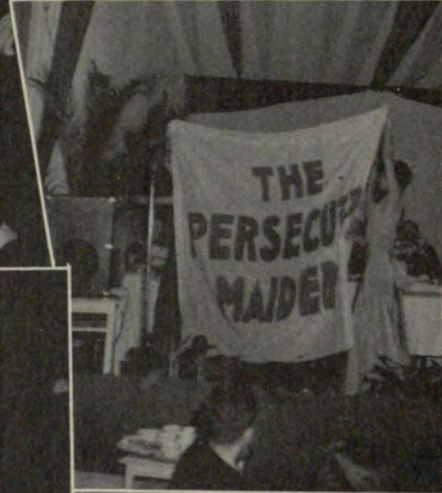

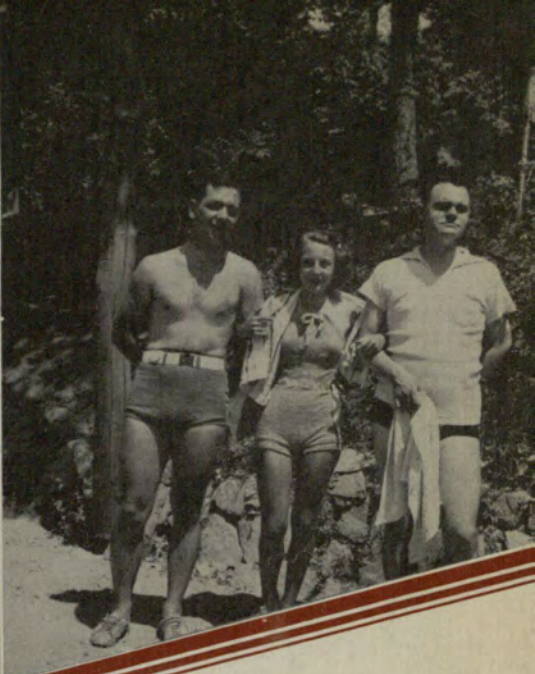
DEDICATION
