DEDICATION

After long and careful consideration of the dedication of the 1949 RAMPWAY, one obvious choice emerged from the many possibilities, Professor George E. Manners. In order to present both well-deserved tribute to an individual, and at the same time commend the progress of the Atlanta Division under Dr. Sparks, one person stood out as meeting these requirements. He is a man whose quiet, unassuming personality at times may cause him to be overlooked, but whose record stamps him as thoroughly typical of our advancing institution.

During the time of the many recent changes which have affected the school administration in becoming part of the University of Georgia, a large part of this has been the responsibility of Prof. Manners. To say that he has performed creditably would be an understatement.

Mr. Manners, at present Associate Dean of the College of Business Administration, and dean of that department here at the Atlanta Division, has long been active in the affairs of this school. He grew up with the institution during the past 20 years, both as a student and as an instructor, and has the students' viewpoint. He went through the same routine the present students are going through, and has experienced the same emotions.

Once one of the most active students here, he is now one of the most active instructors. Manners was a member of Delta Sigma Pi, the Speakers Club, the Spur Club, Delta Mu Delta, and Intramural Key, to name a few, and has held high office in most of them. He received his C.P.A. in his junior year here, graduated with a B.C.S., and has since obtained his Master's degree.

A more fair-minded instructor would be difficult, if not impossible, to find. A more sympathetic friend of the students would also be hard to find. He has enriched the meetings of many of the school organizations by his remarks and speeches.

For his helpfulness to students, for his devotion to his job, for his many valuable suggestions, for his present work, and for his numerous achievements, this third issue of the combined RAMPWAY is dedicated to Professor George Manners. Even as the RAMPWAY is now a combined annual, Prof. Manners works for closer cooperation between day and evening students. We feel that he most typifies the progress and spirit of our school, a great university with a great future.

The editors are proud to dedicate the 1949 RAMPWAY to George E. Manners.

HISTORY OF THE ATLANTA DIVISION

"I see, from time to time, manifestations of fine work here that has been done in the past. You will have 4,000 students, and instead of 50 rooms, 100 rooms, some day, and that will be just the beginning. . . . It is not too much to say that this institution will lead the way of all the state institutions." (Ellis Arnall, former governor of Georgia, at 25th Anniversary banquet, 1939.)

The phenomenal growth of the Georgia Tech Evening School of Commerce, begun in 1913 with 47 students, into the Atlanta Division, University of Georgia, with an enrollment of more than 5,000, is without parallel in the history of education. Gratifying the wish of Atlanta men and women for higher learning has been an ever-increasing task through the 36 years of the school's life, and its scope shows no signs of narrowing.

The idea for an evening school in Atlanta had its embryonic beginning in 1911 when W. M. Fambrough, president of the Alumni Association of Georgia Tech, inquired of the alumni concerning their need for business training, especially during the first few years after graduation. Their replies prompted him to express the desire for a Chair of Business Science at Tech.

In 1912 a campaign was begun to interest juniors and seniors in a series of business lectures given at the school. These lectures were placed on the regular schedule at the end of that term.

In 1913 the Georgia Tech Evening School of Commerce was established, housed in three rooms in the Walton building. Although it was authorized by the Board of Trustees its financing was independent.

The school's first president was the late W. S. Kell, a member of the Georgia Tech faculty. His aims, as stated, were:

1. To interest business men in the idea of an evening school in behalf of the youth of Atlanta.
2. To prepare himself for a more thorough business training in order to raise the standards of the school (in quest of this, he became the third C.P.A. in Georgia).
3. Eventually to make the school co-educational.

A peak enrollment of 364 attended classes in the four rooms in the Arcade building from 1917 to 1921. In the latter year the site was moved to a third-floor attic at 18 Auburn avenue, where there were five classrooms. In 1920 the school was made co-educational.

For 1926-27 the school operated at 92½ Forsyth street, and from 1927 to 1931 had six rooms at 106 Forsyth. The enrollment had spurted to 654.

In 1928 Dr. George M. Sparks became director of the school, and increased the number of courses required for a degree from 24 to 30. The next year it was made the standard 40. The year 1931 saw the number of courses offered jump from 22 to 92, and the faculty increase from 17 to 35. By 1933 there were 138 courses taught by 38 professors.

From 1931 to 1938, some 19 rooms at 223 Walton street building housed the school. When the junior college was opened in 1935, enrollment shot from 853 to 1,274, and reached a peak of 1,709 in 1938.

Crowded conditions necessitated another move, and the Georgia Evening College and Georgia Junior College settled at 162 Luckie street, where there were 50 classrooms for the more than 2,000 students.

The war years saw a slump in enrollment which was more than compensated for afterward with the influx of thousands of veteran students. Enrollment records continued to be broken, and new quarters were sought again.

They were found at 24 Ivy street, S.E., in the old Ivy Street garage. War surplus materials worth hundreds of thousands of dollars speeded the changeover, and classes opened in the fall of 1945.

In 1947 the school was made the Atlanta Division, University of Georgia. Today it has over 100 classrooms, with almost 160 instructors teaching 300 subjects. The peak enrollment for the year 1948-49 was 5,327.

The Atlanta Division has proved her worth to Atlanta high school graduates as well as to working men and women. Her reputation has been won, not through famous athletic teams or by individual exploits, but through liberal, thorough education bestowed in the best American tradition. She looks always to the future, never to the past, for her best is ever yet to come.

EXPLANATION OF CLASSES

This year plans for the RAMPWAY were made early last summer; a tentative schedule was drawn up at that time which was followed most of the year. Before the fall quarter opened contracts had already been signed for the printing, advertising, and photographing.

Pictures were taken during a five week period in the fall quarter, and retakes were made during the Christmas holidays. Approximately 2500 pictures appear in the 1949 RAMPWAY, a considerable increase over previous years. With this many pictures it was unavoidable that mistakes would be made; however, less than 25 pictures were either not used or were incorrectly identified. This margin of error, therefore, was less than 1%, which should not be considered out of reason.

The first 150 pages of the RAMPWAY cover the dedication, faculty, and class sections. The remaining 100 pages are devoted to the organizations of the school, to pictorial features of the school activities, and to the advertising. This makes the largest annual yet published at the Atlanta Division, but it should be even larger next year.

According to the printer's production schedules, the 1949 RAMPWAY publication date was early enough to assure that the book would be distributed to the students before school was out in the spring quarter. This, again, marked the first year this has been done under the combined RAMPWAY.

Events sponsored by the RAMPWAY were the Beauty Revue, and the Carnival. The Beauty Revue is held at a dance and the queen of the annual selected. The Carnival is for the main purpose of raising funds, and was attended by the largest single crowd of the year at the university.

The staff is aware of the shortcomings of this issue of the 1949 RAMPWAY, and knows that there was good reason for most of them. However, it is inevitable that criticism, both justified and unjustified, will greet any annual. The staff has no apologies; this is the largest book, with the most pictures, and came out on time.

All this was possible because everyone connected donated a considerable amount of his time to the book. The school administration, staff members, and organizations cooperated in every respect. And without the help, experience, and advice of previous editors the 1949 RAMPWAY would have been inferior.

It was not the work of the editor that made possible the 1949 RAMPWAY; it was the combined work of the many assistants. And the editor thanks every one of them for giving the school an annual of which he is not ashamed.

STUDENT ACTIVITIES

The activities of the school, as distinguished from the organizations, are those functions of the student body which are administered by students independent of any membership in the recognized school groups. These are the governing bodies and the publications.

The Student Councils are responsible for the affairs of the student body, one for day students and one for evening students. Members are elected each quarter from various classes, and serve for that school quarter only. Their chief functions include the conducting of all elections, general supervision of students' welfare, and the evening Homecoming Banquet. Both councils now operate under new constitutions. The student body president, elected by the entire evening student body, is also the president of the evening Student Council.

The Interfraternity Councils of the two divisions are composed of representatives from each member organization meeting to regulate their activities for the common good of all. Dates are granted for their functions in order not to create conflict between similar organizations. A proposal to combine the two divisional interfraternity councils into one combined general council was advanced during the year, and indications were that the proposal would be adopted in some form.

The *University Signal* is the school newspaper, appearing bi-weekly, publishing news concerning the school and the student body. Members of the student body do all the work on the paper as a volunteer arrangement.

The *Flambo* is the university's literary magazine, appearing in various years as either an annual or a monthly magazine. This year an attempt was made to publish the magazine as a literary-humor-feature monthly, but this was discontinued in January.

The RAMPWAY is the school annual, of which this publication is a copy. The RAMPWAY is a combination of earlier yearbooks representing the Day Division (the Gateway) and the Evening Division (the Nocturne). It records the activities of the year, pictures of all students in school, gives general information concerning the school, and introduces the student activities of the university.

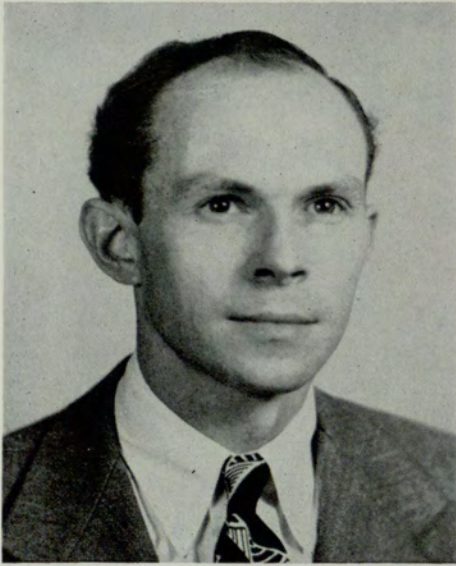

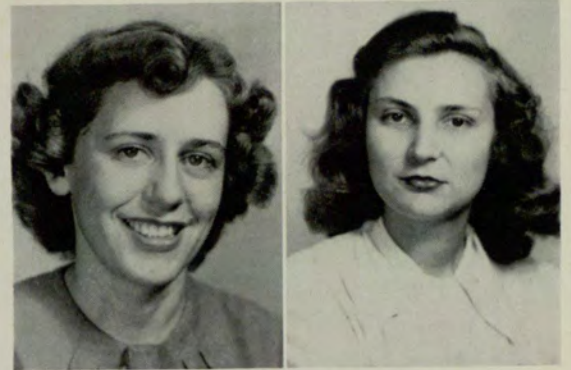

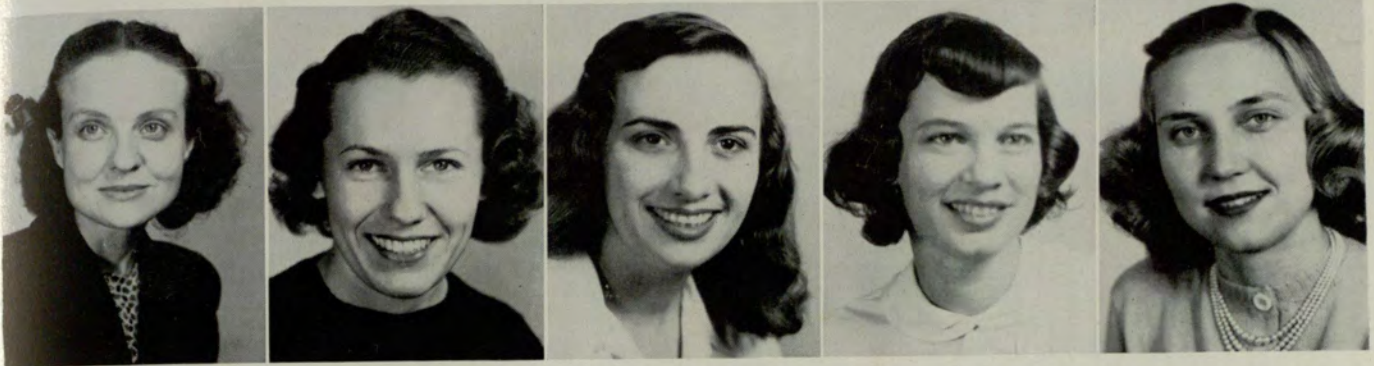

HONORARY ORGANIZATIONS

At present the honorary organizations in school are Delta Mu Delta, Intramural Key, and Crimson Key. There is also a Dean's List, composed of students who have carried a full load of subjects with an average grade of "A" for three consecutive quarters. Sigma Pi Alpha was discontinued last year, and Theta Xi Zeta was inactivated several years past.

Delta Mu Delta is a group selected of the top 15% of the graduating class, plus two juniors with the highest average. The honor is comparable to Phi Beta Kappa in the liberal arts field, being the highest honor in the field of commerce. The two junior members become the president and the secretary for the succeeding year. The group is strictly honorary, with no activities other than publishing an honor roll each year.

Crimson Key is an honor sorority open only to women students, and Intramural Key is an honor fraternity open only to men students. The average required for admission to membership is "B," and applicants must have demonstrated leadership, scholarship, and ability at this university, a minimum of two years of college being required. There is a constitutional limit on membership, and the groups have at least one project each year for improvement of the university.

GREEK LETTER ORGANIZATIONS

Delta Sigma Pi and Alpha Kappa Psi, the two men's international professional fraternities in commerce, have chapters located in the Atlanta Division. The Pi Chapter of Alpha Kappa Psi and the Kappa Chapter of Delta Sigma Pi are among the largest and most efficient organizations in the university, and both contribute generously to student activities. Both have lodges in the country outside Atlanta.

Phi Chi Theta, the women's professional group, is comparable to the men's professional groups, and their aims and activities are similar. Membership in a social sorority does not bar a girl from belonging to Phi Chi Theta also.

ORGANIZATIONS

The Glee Club is a musical organization of men and women students from the entire university; they sing at various functions both at the school and away. The club was in charge of a program for the 1948 Homecoming Banquet.

The Playcrafters is the dramatics club of the school; it helps with dramatic presentations of the university. Members are both men and women students.

The Speakers Club is an organization of men students who are organized for the purpose of becoming better speakers and better expressing themselves.

The Spur Club, also limiting membership by invitation, is a horseback riding group composed primarily of evening students. The group rides frequently during the year, and has several outings in addition.

The Venetian Society is a men's social group which limits membership by invitation. They sponsor several functions during the year, among which are the get-acquainted dance in the fall, and the famous Buttermilk Ball in the spring.

The Bit and Bridle Club is also a riding organization, composed primarily of day students. Their activities consist mainly of horseback riding and other member functions.

ATHLETICS

Because of the early date on which the RAMPWAY was required to go to press this year, most of the usual material on athletics at the Atlanta Division had to be omitted. Since the major portion of the athletic program is conducted during the winter and spring quarters, the staff was unable to obtain any pictures.

Although the school has no football team, there is a program of athletics here, possibly outstanding of which is the basketball and tennis teams. Last year there were two outstanding basketball teams at the university, and the school boasted two of the best tennis players in Atlanta.

The university has a large gym-auditorium adjoining the main school building which contains the only regulation full-size basketball court in Atlanta. New bleachers were added this year to seat spectators at basketball games, and the seating capacity now runs into more than a thousand. For other events which take place on the stage, the auditorium will seat several thousand comfortably. This gym was used for several basketball tournaments, chief among which was the all-city high school basketball tournament held during the Christmas holidays.

This year, for the first time, students of the Atlanta Division were able to purchase season student tickets to all home games (in Athens) of the University of Georgia football team. These tickets covered five games: Chattanooga, Furman, Kentucky, North Carolina, and Georgia Tech. At each of these games a number of Atlanta Division students were present, particularly for the North Carolina and Georgia Tech games. Georgia, incidentally, won the SEC championship and played in the Orange Bowl on January 1, 1949.

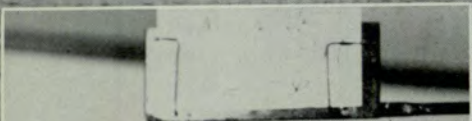

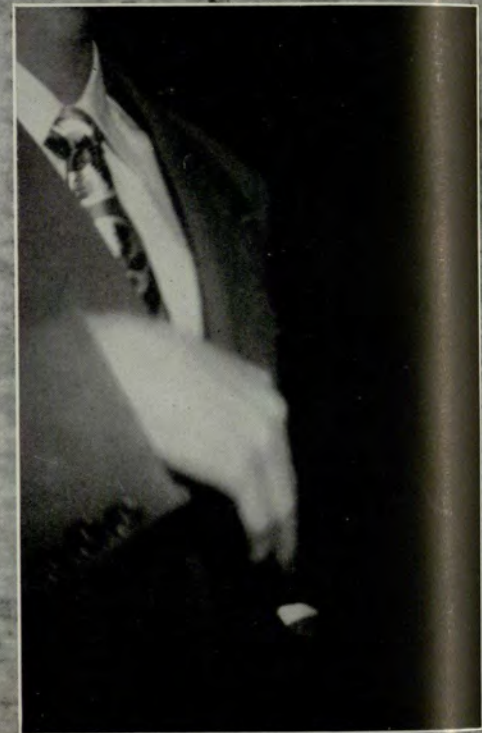

FEATURES

On the evening before the 1948 Thanksgiving, November 24, the Homecoming Banquet was again held in the school auditorium, with the student council responsible for staging the event. A large number of plates were served and the program included numbers by the Glee Club and other musical offerings in addition to the regular and featured speakers. The Auburn Knights furnished music for the dance which followed.

The Third RAMPWAY Beauty Revue was held on January 20, for the purpose of selecting the RAMPWAY Queen. This Revue has grown in popularity each year since its inception, and the largest number of candidates yet assembled paraded across the stage this year.

The second RAMPWAY Carnival was held in the school auditorium on February 18. Originally for the purpose of providing funds for the annual, it has become the favorite event of the year for the entire student body, and still remains the largest single source of revenue for the yearbook. Each organization has charge of some booth, game, or concession, and the overall result has been described by many as better than regular carnivals and fairs.

Fresh Fields was the title of the first play of the year put on by the dramatics department of the school. This play was presented in November 1948 in the school auditorium. For their second play of the school year the selection was *Arms and the Man*, presented in February 1949.

Honors Day and Honors Night are customarily held in the spring quarter of each year to present honors and awards to some of the outstanding students, both graduates and undergraduates. These awards are presented by the various organizations in the school, and by the faculty itself, and cover achievements both in the field of scholarship and in student activities. Pictures shown in this issue of the RAMPWAY cover the previous school year, the honors of 1947-48. Not pictured are recipients of several of the highest awards: Mark Morris, Ben Binford, J. E. Powell, Louise Whitmire, and Paul Otwell.

Other work was done by members of the staff whose pictures and names appear on the RAMPWAY pages. The editor cannot praise them too highly; without their help the 1949 RAMPWAY would not have been what it is and would not have been out on time. Particular credit should go to the four who have contributed most heavily of their time through the entire year and on every phase of the RAMPWAY—Madge Williams, Cliff Blaisdell, John Griggs, and Jimmie Edwards. They have worked.

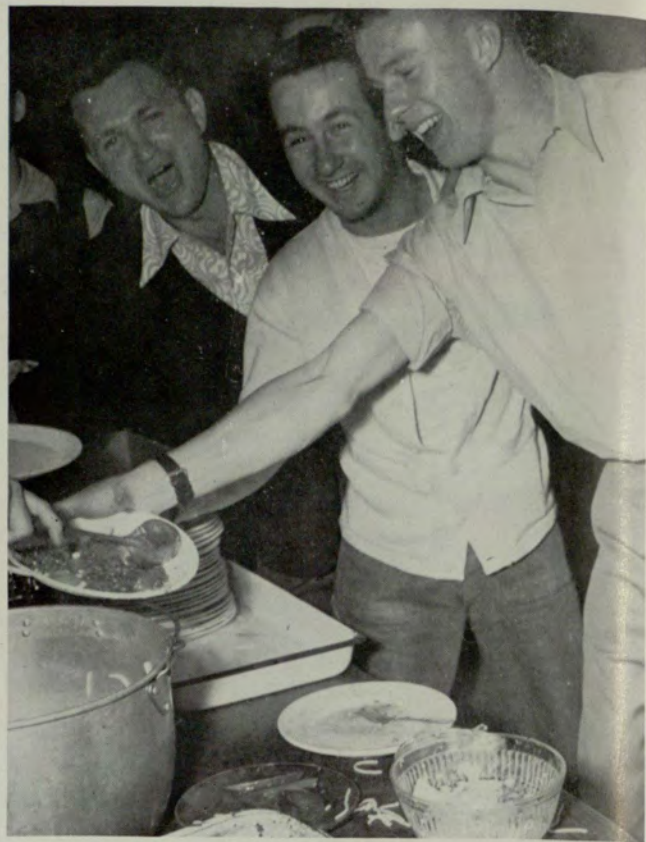
