



#### Dedication

As Dean of Students at Georgia State College, Dr. William M. Suttles is the counselor and helper of countless students in their progress through the College, and they remember him always with humane warmth and great respect. Knowing his concern for their welfare and his desire to be of assistance to them, students besiege his office from the rising of the sun to the going down of the sun, seeking a chance to consult him, to talk over their problems with him, to draw comfort from having a conversation with him. And even when he is unable to offer a solution to their difficulties, they go away with a better heart for their affairs than they have had before speaking with him.

When Dr. Suttles acts in his capacity as College disciplinarian, the students feel that they have been dealt with by a kind man who is sympathetic with them and their plight but who also has a moral conviction about what proper and good conduct is. He assesses blame carefully and apportions penalty justly, always bearing in mind what he must bear in mind as a Christian Gentleman: that humankind seems to be by nature a little less than flawless.

After his schooling in the public schools of Atlanta and Fulton County, Dr. Suttles enrolled at Mercer University for a year, transferring to the Georgia Evening College, one of the earlier names of Georgia State College, from which he received the degree of Bachelor of Commercial Science. He has since received these degrees: Bachelor of Divinity from Yale, Master of Theology and Master of Religious Education from Emory, and Doctor of Education at Alabama Polytechnic Institute.

In addition to his service in education, Dr. Suttles also serves in religion. Ordained at eighteen, he has been a preacher ever since and is currently the pastor at the Haralson and Luthersville Baptist Churches. He was chosen as Georgia Rural Minister of the Year in 1959.

Dr. Suttles believes in community service. For example he is on the Board of Directors of the Atlanta Kiwanis Club. He has served in such positions as Chairman of the Committee on Manpower and Education of the Georgia Nuclear Advisory Commission and as Chairman of the George M. Sparks Scholarship Fund. He is a Lieutenant-Colonel on Governor Vandiver's staff. During the War of 1939-1945, he served as a Lieutenant junior grade in the Chaplain Corps, USNR.

In 1950 Dr. Suttles married Julia Lanette Lovorn of Hapeville, and she is a true helpmate to her husband. Charming lady that she is, she aids and comforts him in his life and work.

People who know Dr. Suttles admire and respect him greatly. They are aware that he possesses character, and character in these days is a much admired and all-toorarely-possessed virtue.

Considering Dr. Suttles' nature and his personal inclination, one might well quote verse fifty-eight from the fifteenth chapter of *First Corinthians*: "Therefore, my beloved brethren, be ye steadfast, unmovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, forasmuch as ye know that your labor is not in vain in the Lord." Dr. Suttles has done his work always as a part of the Christian life.

We are fortunate at Georgia State College to have so capable, so wise, and so good a man as Dr. Suttles for our Dean of Students.






NOAH N. LANGDALE, JR. President of Georgia State College








The stage crew emplaces the lights and equipment in preparation for a presentation.










