DEDICATION

Dr. Dozier Copeland Cade is a man of gentleness and determination, of humility and wisdom, of charity and faith. He deserves the old-fashioned designation of *gentleman and scholar*.

As Director of Public Relations and Head of the Department of Journalism at the College, Dr. Cade works indefatigably in the interest of the welfare of the students and of the faculty. He is ever ready to expend his intelligence and his energy to assure the College of the very best possible presentation of truth for our health and prosperity.

A native of Eufaula, Alabama, Dr. Cade took his public school education in the Eufaula High School, his A.B. degree from the University of Alabama, his M.S.J. degree from Northwestern University, and his Ph.D. degree from State University of Iowa. He is the only person in the state of Georgia who has a Ph.D. in journalism. During his undergraduate career, he participated in student life in many capacities and offices. He is a member of Sigma Alpha Epsilon social fraternity, a member of Phi Beta Kappa honor society, and a member of Sigma Delta Chi journalism society.

Dr. Cade's teaching experience has been at Emory University, Northwestern University, and Georgia State. His newspaper experience has been with the *Eufaula Tribune*, the *Tuscaloosa News*, the *Chicago Daily News*, and the *Atlanta Journal*. He is an editor of the *Journalism Quarterly* and author of a collaborative textbook in journalism.

During the War of 1939-1945, Dr. Cade was a soldier in the China-Burma-India theater where he served with bravery and distinction and was decorated by Generalissimo Chiang Kai-shek with the Special Breast Order of the Cloud and Banner, a major Chinese Government Medal.

Dr. Cade is nationally noted in the world of journalism and is listed in *Who's Who in the Midwest*, *Who's Who in the South and Southwest*, *Who's Who in Public Relations*, *Who's Who in American Education*, and the *Directory of American Scholars*.

In youth Dr. Cade married Miss Catherine Tomlinson Woodman, a charming and beautiful lady, who is a perfect helpmeet for him. They have two children, Woody and Jimmy.

Dr. Cade is a Christian man whose strong Presbyterian outlook gives him conscience and courage. He is always prepared to come to a careful decision and to do his duty.

Here are a few sentences from an unsolicited letter written to Dr. Cade by a former student whom he had taught and advised. "This letter is written to express in a small way my profound appreciation for the help you have given me over the years in getting my career straightened out . . . However none of this would have come true had you not taken an interest in me and helped me over some of the obstacles in my way . . . Of all the people and advisers I have known, you have played a more important part in my life than anyone else." Such a statement needs no comment.

We at Georgia State College are very fortunate to have so capable, so good, so kind a man as Dr. Cade among us.

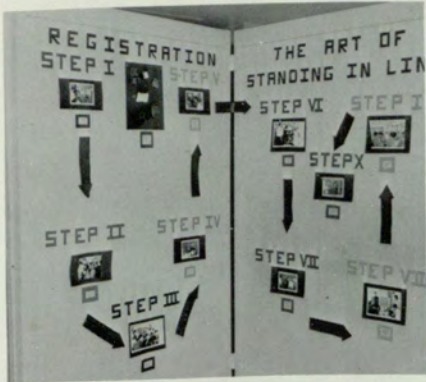

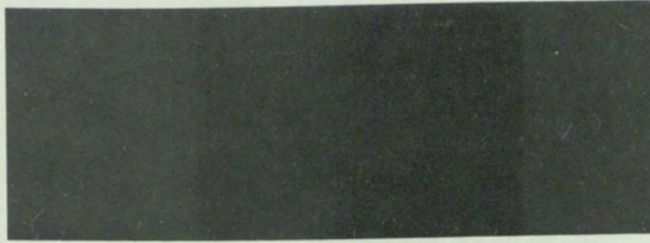

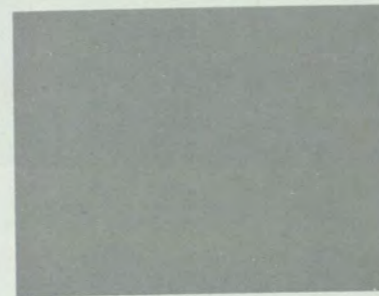

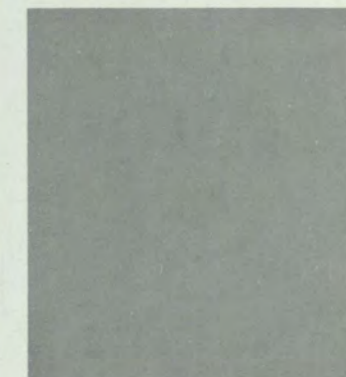

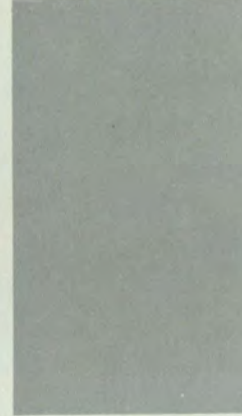

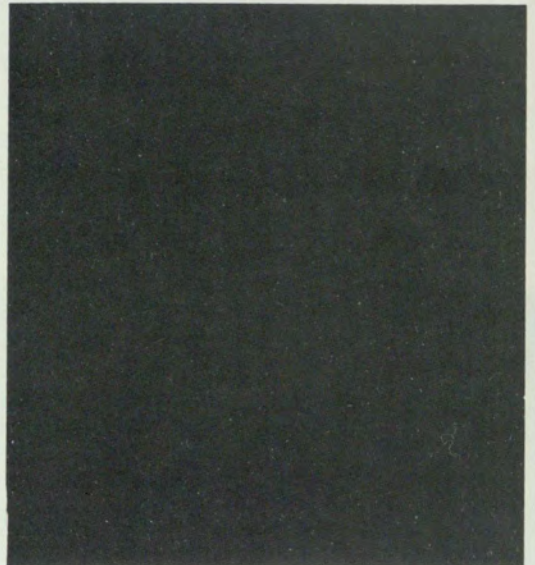
