The Mardi Gras festivities were combined into one night this year. Both the carnival and dance were held February 25 in the Exhibition Hall of the Municipal Auditorium.



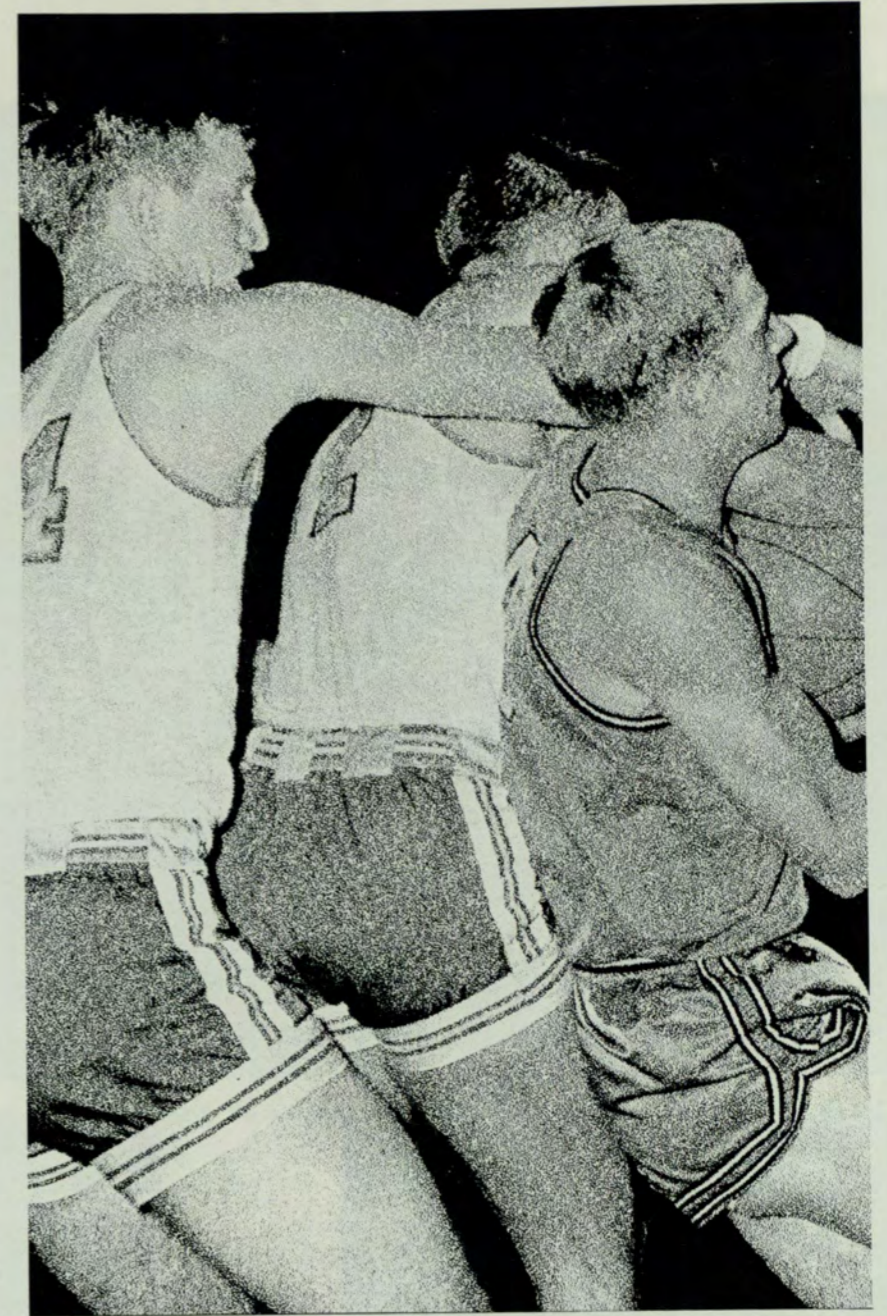

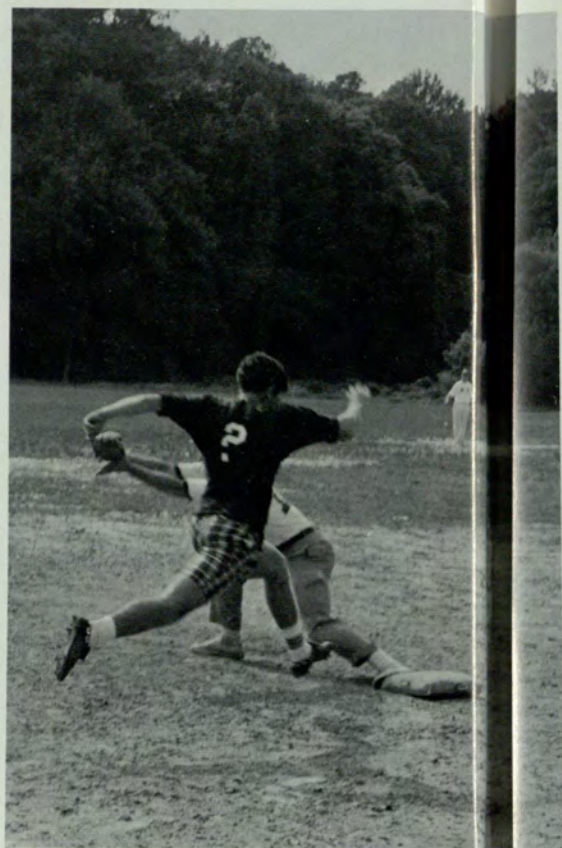


Interfraternity Softball

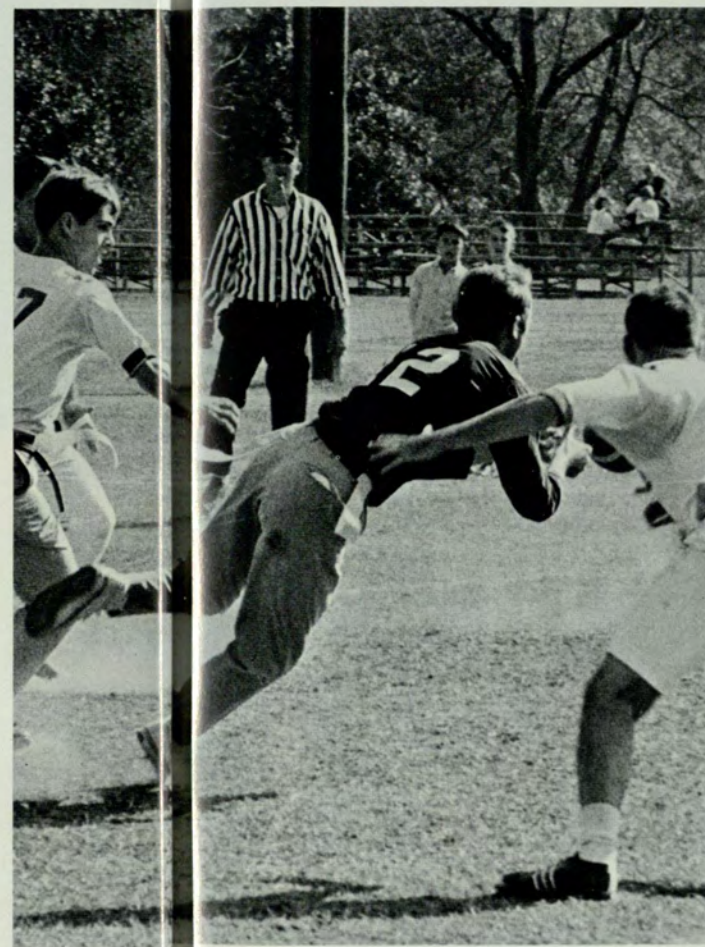

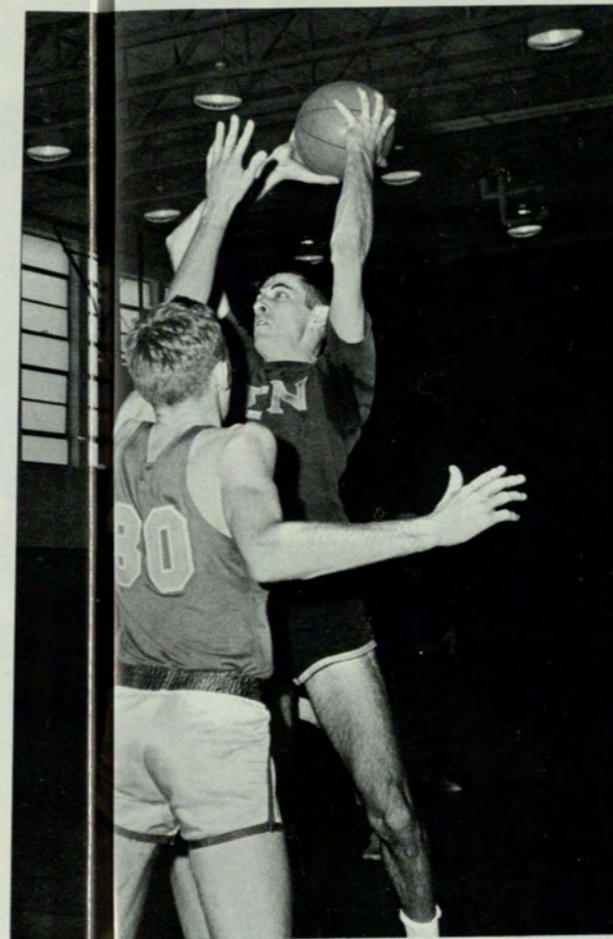

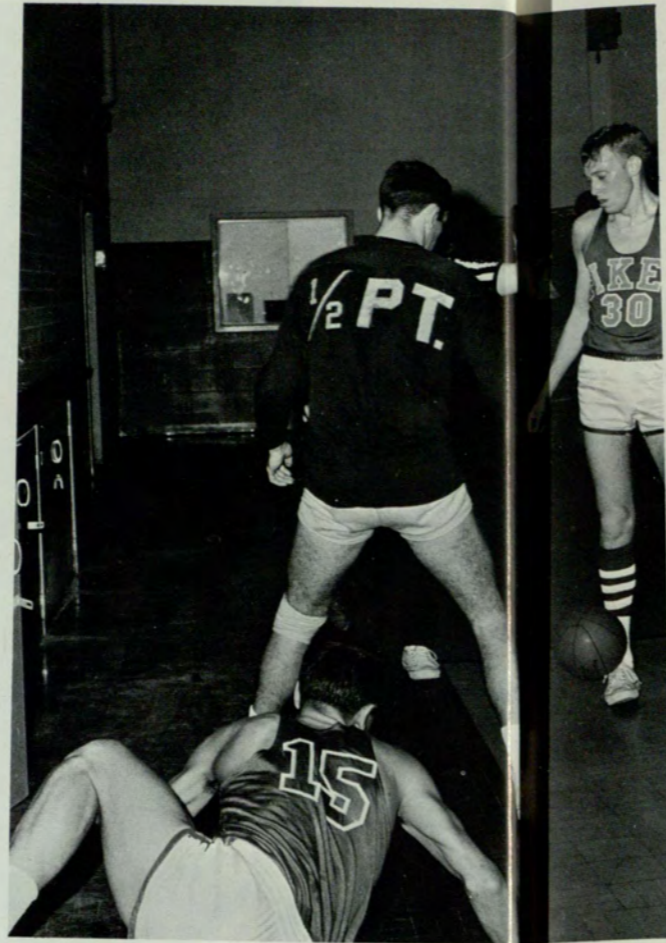
Interfraternity Basketball

Alpha Xi Delta

On April 17, 1893, at Lombard College in Galesburg, Illinois, Alpha Xi Delta Fraternity was formally recognized. The ten young women who founded the fraternity did so not merely to have a closer group of friends at college who would provide a "home away from home," but also to provide a means whereby they could contribute more to their college and in turn more fully reap the benefits of higher education. Their ideal of sisterhood has been continually passed on to succeeding chapters of Alpha Xi Delta everywhere.

The Delta Xi Chapter of Alpha Xi Delta is now in its third year at Georgia State and is active in both the service and social aspects of college life. During the past year Alpha Xi Deltas have held chairmanships for events such as Greek Week and Spring Festival, the co-chairmanship of guides for Freshman Orientation, and a group leader in the Student Leadership Conference. An Alpha Xi is also President of Panhellenic.

Others held the offices of Secretary and of Historian of Alpha Lambda Delta and were members of Crimson Key, Who's Who, and Phi Chi Theta. They have also held offices in the Student Government Association.

This year an Alpha Xi was runner-up to Miss Freshman. Alpha Xi Deltas have also been members of various beauty courts such as Greek Week and the Rampway Court. They have the Sweetheart of Delta Sigma Pi and members of the sweetheart courts of other fraternities. Included among the activities sponsored during the year by Alpha Xi Delta is an annual house-party, an Apple Polishing Party for the professors, a Mother and Father Daughter Tea, a Christmas party for underprivileged children, and a pre-initiation pledge swap and party with a social fraternity.

One of the primary goals of the sorority is participation and service in campus activities, and every year Alpha Xi Deltas seek to reemphasize them by continuing to widen their horizons.

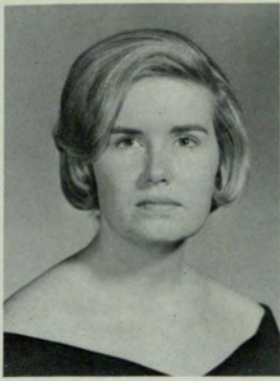

In a dusty attic room at Barnard College of Columbia University in 1897, Alpha Omicron Pi began. It was founded by four girls dedicated to preserving their friendship on a lasting basis. Gamma Sigma chapter was founded at Georgia State in October 1956 on the same basis.

At State, AOPi has always been active in campus affairs. AOPi's have been sweethearts of almost every fraternity on campus, in most of the scholastic organizations, and won almost every beauty title.

During the past year, AOPi's were selected Greek Goddess, Mardi Gras Queen, on the May Day Court, military sponsor, second runner up to Miss Georgia State College and one of the Ten Best Dressed Girls on campus.

AOPi's are well represented in scholastic and professional organizations as well as the Student Government Association. An AOPi is president of Alpha Lambda Delta, corresponding secretary of Phi Chi Theta, secretary-treasurer of the senior class and junior class senator. AOPi is also represented in Crimson Key, General Council, and the collegiate Who's Who. AOPi has editors on both the Signal and Rampway.

Delta Zeta has received the Kappa Sigma trophy for the Most Outstanding Sorority on Campus for five years. Among their outstanding honors are the Scholarship Cup for 1965, and many memberships and offices in scholastic honorary societies of Crimson Key, Alpha Lambda Delta, and the collegiate Who's Who. Offices in the Student Government Association, both day and night school, as Chief Justice and Secretary are held by Delta Zetas, as well as class offices. School of Arts and Sciences

The primary purpose of the School of Arts and Sciences is to afford the student a liberal education, which by its nature is broad rather than narrow, devoted to intellectual development and discipline rather than to the acquisition of technical skills. It should give the student some knowledge of the achievements of the human mind, with special reference to the Western civilization of which both the ancient world and contemporary America are parts; of the historical and cultural backgrounds essential to a true understanding of our world; above all, of orderly thinking processes and of a scale of values by which he can distinguish the permanent from the trivial, the substantial from the pretentious, the good from the bad. To that end he will need some familiarity with historical and political studies, the sciences, and the arts. As a human being and as a citizen he will find this training of lasting significance. As a member of a profession he will find here desirable backgrounds—for scholarship and teaching in all fields of knowledge; for law and medicine, which stress increasingly the value of broad intellectual training; for journalism, and government service, and diplomacy. The curricula require a number of courses deemed essential, individually and as a group, to the intellectual competence at which the liberal education aims; in addition to these, the student has electives which he may use to further his general knowledge or to specialize in certain fields.

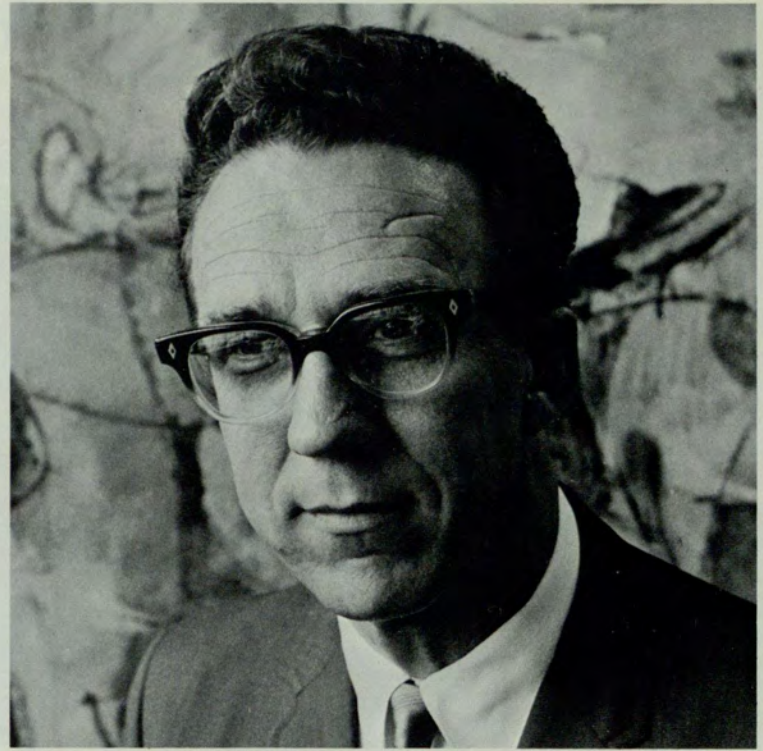
On the undergraduate level, the School of Arts and Sciences offers the Bachelor of Arts degree, the Bachelor of Science degree, and the Bachelor of Music degree. Students enrolled in the School of Arts and Sciences may also prepare and become certified to teach on the elementary and secondary levels through programs which meet the requirements of the State Department of Education of Georgia. Through its Division of Graduate Studies the School of Arts and Sciences offers the Master of Arts degree in economics, English, history, mathematics, and political science; the Master of Science degree in biology and mathematics; the Master of Arts for Teachers degree; and the Sixth Year Program for Teachers. It has recently been authorized to grant the Bachelor of Science in Education degree in the area of Special Education, the Master of Education degree, the Bachelor of Arts degree with major in Education, the Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree, and the Bachelor of Visual Arts degree.



About two hundred art majors are studying drawing, painting, advertising design, ceramics and crafts, art education, art history, and a host of other art courses on an undergraduate level at Georgia State College. The degree program is aimed toward preparation for graduate work in art and development of basic skills and knowledge that is directed toward professional excellence.

The Department occupies the seventh floor and part of the sixth floor of Kell Hall. A program of exhibition is presented each year in the Art Gallery, which is located on the first floor of Kell Hall. Here students may study original examples of art in a variety of media and styles. Too, Atlanta with its galleries, museums, advertising agencies, art studios and printing houses further enriches the general art climate for students of art at Georgia State.

Within the next one or two years a building for the Arts is expected to be completed, which will permit richer and broader programs in the arts. Beginning in 1966 the Bachelor of Visual Arts will be added to the Bachelor of Arts with major in Art.

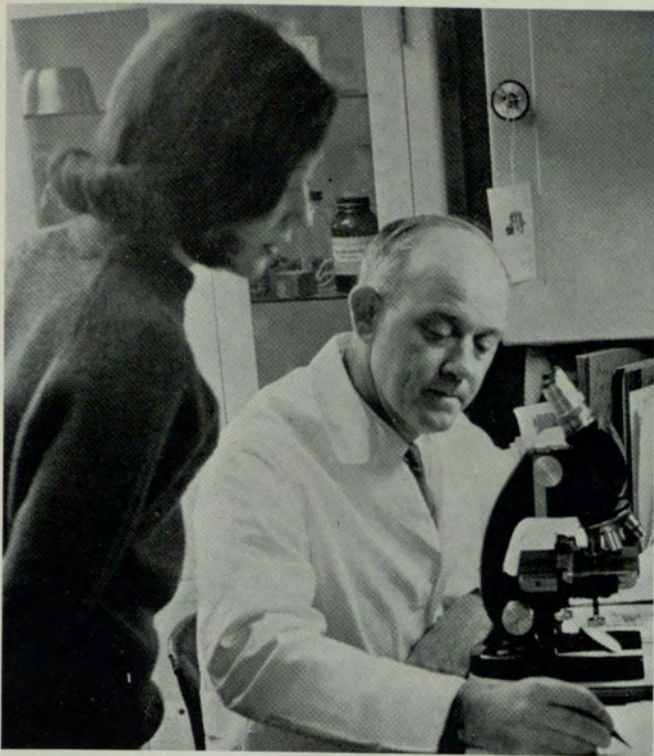

Knowledge and understanding of the world in which man lives is the goal of the Department of Biology. Areas of study include biology or a study of the biological principles of animals and plants; botany or an extensive study of the plant sciences; bacteriology or an extensive study of micro-organisms; and zoology or an extensive study of the animal sciences. Work in the laboratory is a large part of any field of biology and the labs are maintained and taught as a part of every course in the Department of Biology. Students may elect to pursue a Bachelor of Science degree in Biology or in Medical Technology; or pre-professional courses in pre-medicine, pre-dentistry, and pre-pharmacy.

The courses in general chemistry attempt to combine the cultural aspects of the subject with the laying of a foundation of basic training for those who will continue with more advanced work in preparation for careers in chemistry, medicine, chemical engineering, pharmacy, and so forth.

The cultural value of elementary chemistry lies chiefly in showing how a measure of order and meaning can be obtained from our otherwise bewildering observations in the world of matter. In the development of these unifying concepts, the study affords splendid illustrations of the methods of scientific logic.

Advanced courses are not without their cultural value, but there is more emphasis on the development of technical knowledge and experience which is necessary in chemistry and related fields. Georgia State's undergraduate program trains the student for work in research, control, and testing laboratories as well as for executive positions requiring a chemical background.

The Department of Chemistry at Georgia State College has enlarged its facilities for laboratory work. It has purchased a large amount of experimental equipment to enhance the opportunities for a graduate with a degree in chemistry from Georgia State.

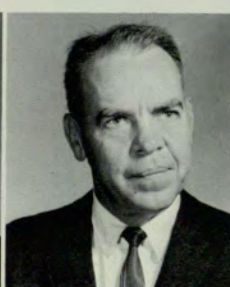

English Department

Introductory courses in English are designed to improve the student's ability to analyze and to organize ideas, to write effective expository prose, and to read various types of literature with appreciative understanding.

Advanced courses offer opportunities to develop skill in critical and creative writing, to gain knowledge of the structure and evolution of the English language, to trace the history of English and American literature, to examine and apply theories of criticism, and to study intensively the works of major authors.

Literature, broadly defined, presents the best that has been thought and said in the world. The literature of England and America are not only extremely rich but are also readily accessible. Through their study one may expect to enlarge and to discipline both the imagination and the emotions, to increase the understanding of human problems and character, and to gain aesthetic satisfaction through a participation in the ordered experience which the artist presents. The companion study of language sharpens the powers of observation, gives insight into the functions of language in human society, proposes problems of meaning and expression, and encourages the objective analysis of methods of communication.

Many of those who concentrate in English find a close relationship between its disciplines and their vocational aims. Business and industry, as well as the professions, put increasing stress upon the importance of clear writing and speaking, and offer opportunities for employment to persons who have specialized in the techniques of communication. In recognition of this, English courses are regularly included in pre-professional programs of all kinds.

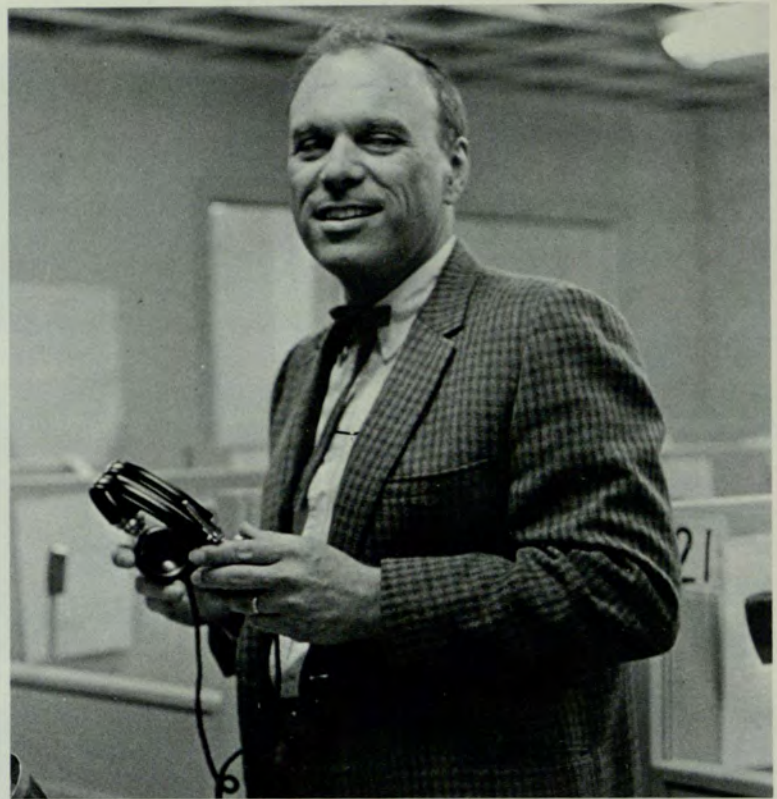

Foreign Language Department

The Department of Foreign Languages at Georgia State College currently offers a field of concentration in either the German, French, or Spanish languages. Elementary and intermediate courses are also offered in Latin and Italian. Elementary and intermediate courses in Russian were offered starting in September, 1965. Prospective teachers for the elementary and secondary schools have the opportunity to prepare for a teaching career in any of the languages in which a major is offered. The latest in language laboratory equipment supplements all levels of classroom instruction.

It is increasingly evident that foreign language study is an opportunity for the student to obtain an understanding and appreciation of the character and significance of foreign culture and civilization. This can best be achieved by emphasizing both the active, communicative side of a language and the written, historical record of its literature. A successful language program—the goal of the College—will also attempt to integrate this conception of language study into the patterns of modern life and society.

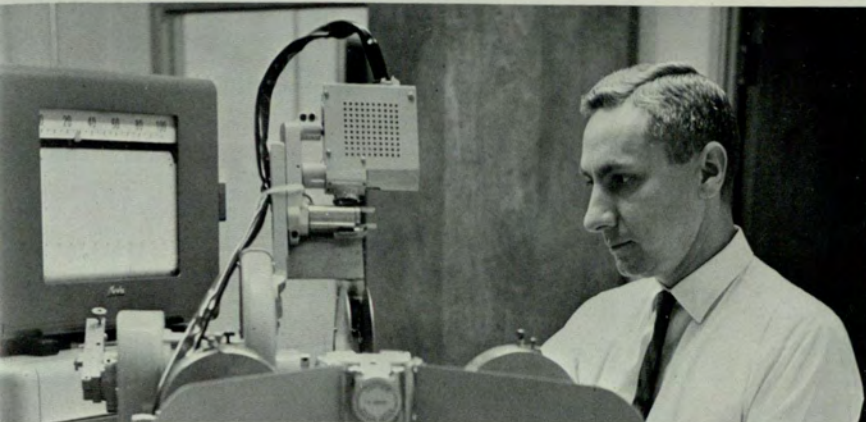


Department of Geology, Geography and Anthropology

Geology is the science of the earth and is concerned with the study of rocks and their structures, and with earth history as disclosed by rock formations and fossils. Graduate geologists are found today in mining, petroleum, mineral exploration, research, teaching, ground water and surface water studies, soil analysis, and engineering.

The general objective of geographic study is an understanding of the various parts of the world, their inhabitants, and their resources. Such broad knowledge is a valuable adjunct for the appreciation of world problems and of intelligent citizenship. Professional careers in geography may be followed by teaching on various levels, in public service, and in business.

Anthropology is the science which deals with the evolution of man as a biological organism; with the origin, development, and integration of the customs, techniques, and beliefs that make up the ways of life of human social groups; and with the inter-relationship of these biological and cultural factors in human behavior.

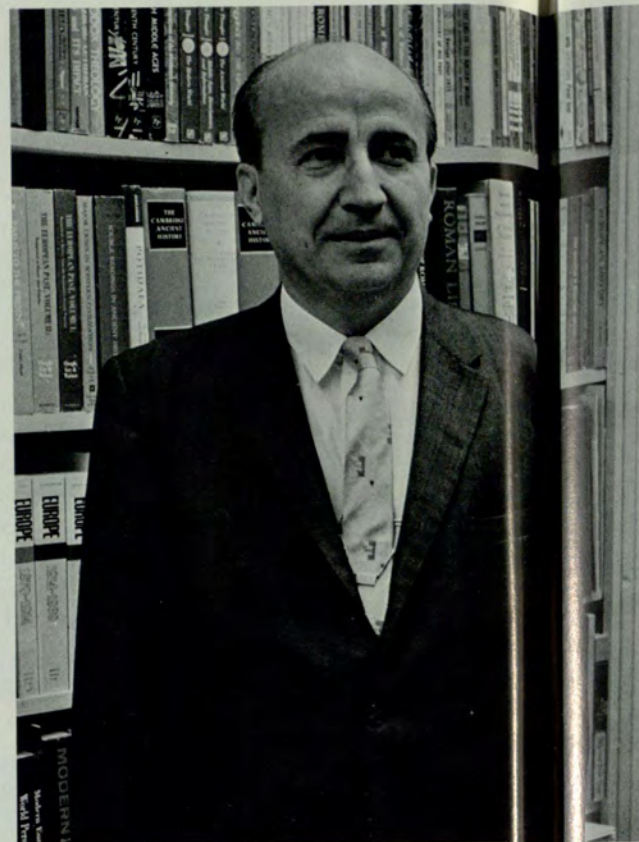

Journalism Department

The Department of Journalism at Georgia State College offers a major which prepares students for newspaper, radio, television, magazine, or public relations careers. Also, some of the Journalism courses are designed so that a non-Journalism student may take them as general education courses.

The College was authorized by the Board of Regents of the University System of Georgia in December, 1963, to offer a Journalism major within the Bachelor of Arts degree program. Thus Georgia State became the second educational institution in Georgia offering a major in journalism.

The Department's objective is to turn out good writers and editors with a strong liberal arts—social sciences background. To supplement classroom instruction, the Department uses the metropolitan area of Atlanta, with the help and facilities of the news media, as a "living laboratory" for its students. Journalism students gain practical experience on the Georgia State Signal and on the WPLO-FM radio station, which is programmed by students.

In August 1964, the College was voted to membership in the American Society of Journalism School Administration—even before the College had graduated its first Journalism major.

Mathematics Department

The mathematics department teaches the mathematics courses leading to five degrees with a major in mathematics. These degrees are the two undergraduate degrees, bachelor of arts and bachelor of science, and master of arts for teachers. In addition to this function the mathematics department is a service department to the students in the School of Business Administration, and students in the sciences of the School of Arts and Sciences. The department also teaches the courses which impart essential knowledge of mathematics to all students of the college.

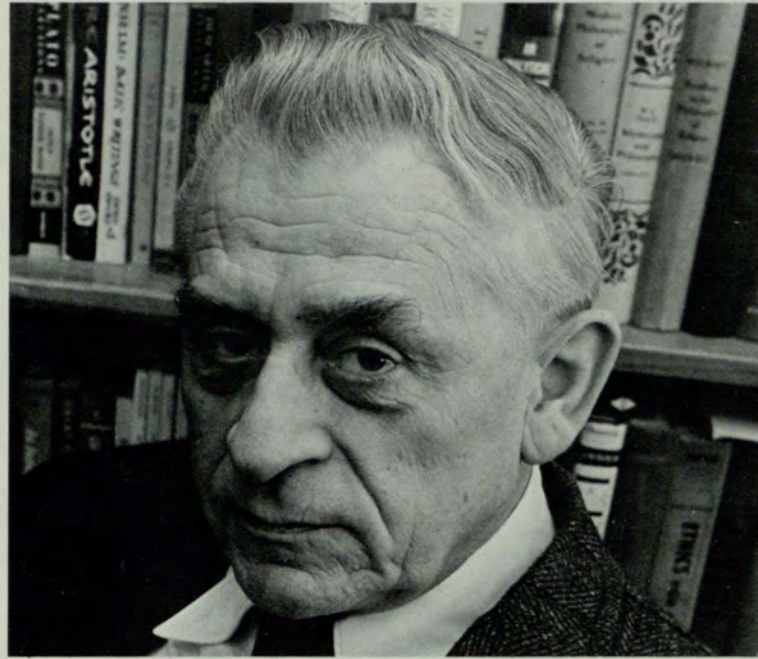

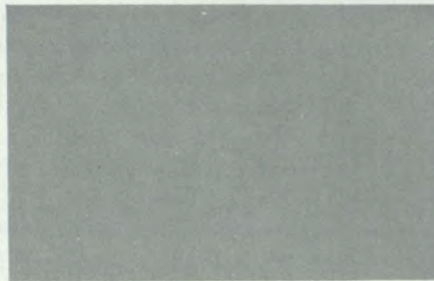
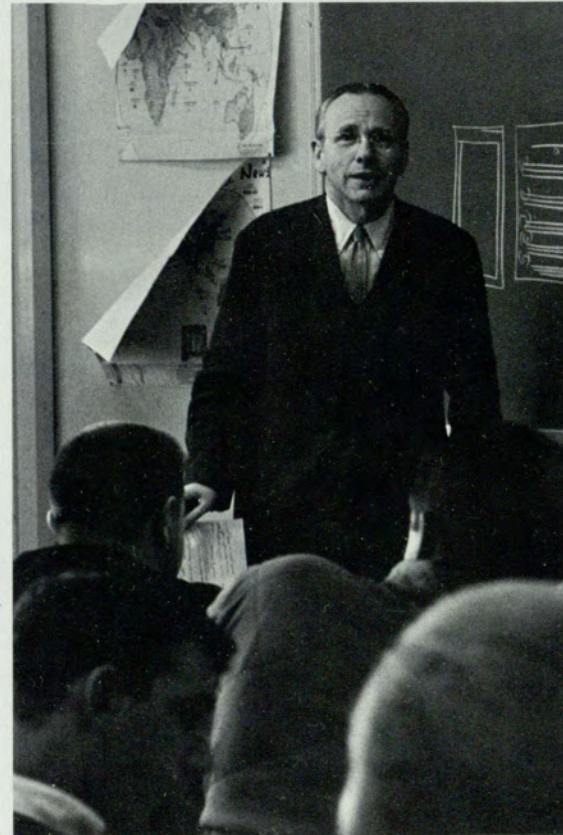
School of Business Administration

Curricula in the School of Business Administration are designed to give broad experience in the liberal arts and applied sciences as preparation for productive living and progress toward executive responsibilities. The student will find his studies spread over diverse disciplines throughout his four years so that he may maximize his opportunities to apply concepts, wide-range facts, opinions, and techniques to the art of decision making. Whether a student's objective be that of proprietor or partner in a firm, executive in a private institution, or officer in a public or quasi-public institution, the core work presented is basic to the appreciation and practice of the administrative function.

The School of Business Administration is organized into seven departments, a Bureau of Business and Economic Research, and the Computing and Data Processing Center. The Computing and Data Processing Center was established in the School of Business Administration in 1959. The Center has the dual purpose of offering instruction to the students and faculty of the college in the use of computer facilities and of assisting faculty and students with research activities. In the accomplishment of its objectives the Center will acquaint the students with one of the newest instruments of science and industry, the electronic computer.

The Bureau of Business and Economic Research was organized in 1950 to conduct research in business and economics. Its basic policy is to increase both basic and applied knowledge in the areas of general economics, business operations, and regional economic development. The Bureau publishes each month a periodical, *The Atlanta Economic Review*, which includes information on business trends and articles of business and economics.

The degrees offered by the School of Business Administration, which is a full member of the American Association of Collegiate Schools of Business, are the Bachelor of Business Administration, Master of Business Administration, Master of Actuarial Science, Master of Professional Accountancy, Master of Business Education, Master of Hospital Administration, Doctor of Business Administration, and Doctor of Philosophy.

Modern man is faced with a host of economic problems, personal and public, and almost every social problem has economic aspects. Insurance Department

The purpose of the courses offered in the Department of Insurance is to provide the student with an education that will satisfy professional needs. There are three areas of concentration in the Department of Insurance. The area of risk and insurance seeks to provide each student with an understanding of the pervasive nature of risk in our economic and social life, and to give him a fundamental understanding of insurance as a device for dealing with risk in business. In the United States the insurance industry is the second largest employer, hence the opportunities for careers in insurance are surprisingly favorable.

The area of Actuarial Science seeks to educate students who wish a professional career in the insurance industry in the capacity of a specialist whose function it is to make the mathematical calculations necessary to maintain the insurance business on a sound financial basis. The actuarial science program of the Department is recognized as the center for actuarial education in this part of the United States.

The academic goal of the law area is to acquaint the prospective businessman with substantive principles of law governing commercial transactions and their proper relationship with the social and economic objectives of business. Another important function of the professors in the law area is to counsel with students interested in careers in law.

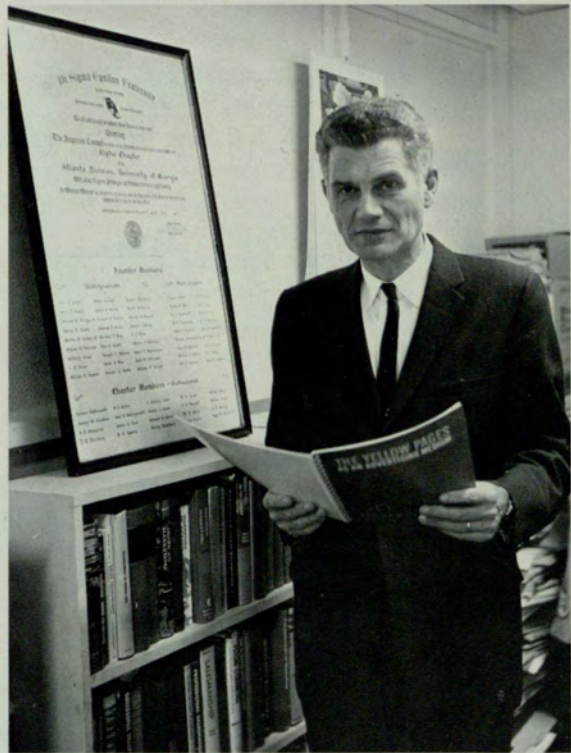

The Placement Office at Georgia State indicates there are now more job openings in Marketing than any other area.

Courses in its use are scheduled regularly, and students and faculty are encouraged to make use of the facilities in their research and teaching.

In tomorrow's world, much that is today's drudgery will be accomplished by machines. In the day-to-day operation of businesses, the electronic computer has already made great and far-reaching changes in both the handling of business data and the manager's approach to his problems. Mathematics, once the tool of the scientist and the engineer, is today an indispensable part of the knowledge of the modern accountant, sales manager, economist and company president. The computer, to such enlightened leaders is far more than a gigantic accounting machine; it is a means for insight never before available.

To natural and social scientists and mathematicians, the computer has opened doors to problem areas which, because of the massive volume of computations required, could not previously be investigated. It has also presented new methods for the solution of old problems and has become an area of research in its own right.

The Hospital Administration program at Georgia State College is structured in three major ways.
