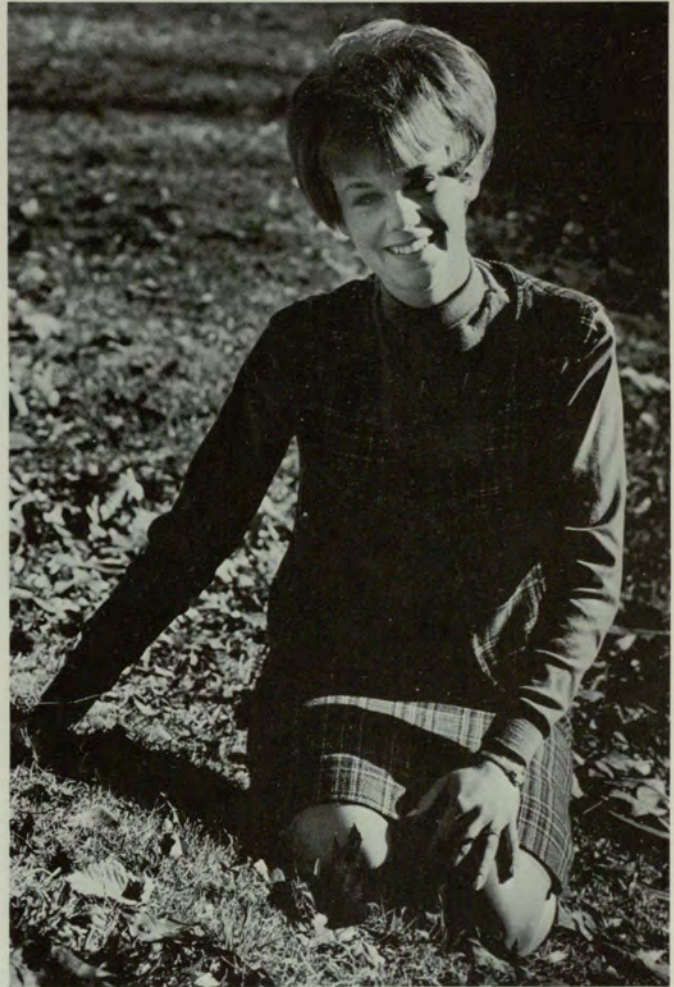




## JUDY KAPHEN

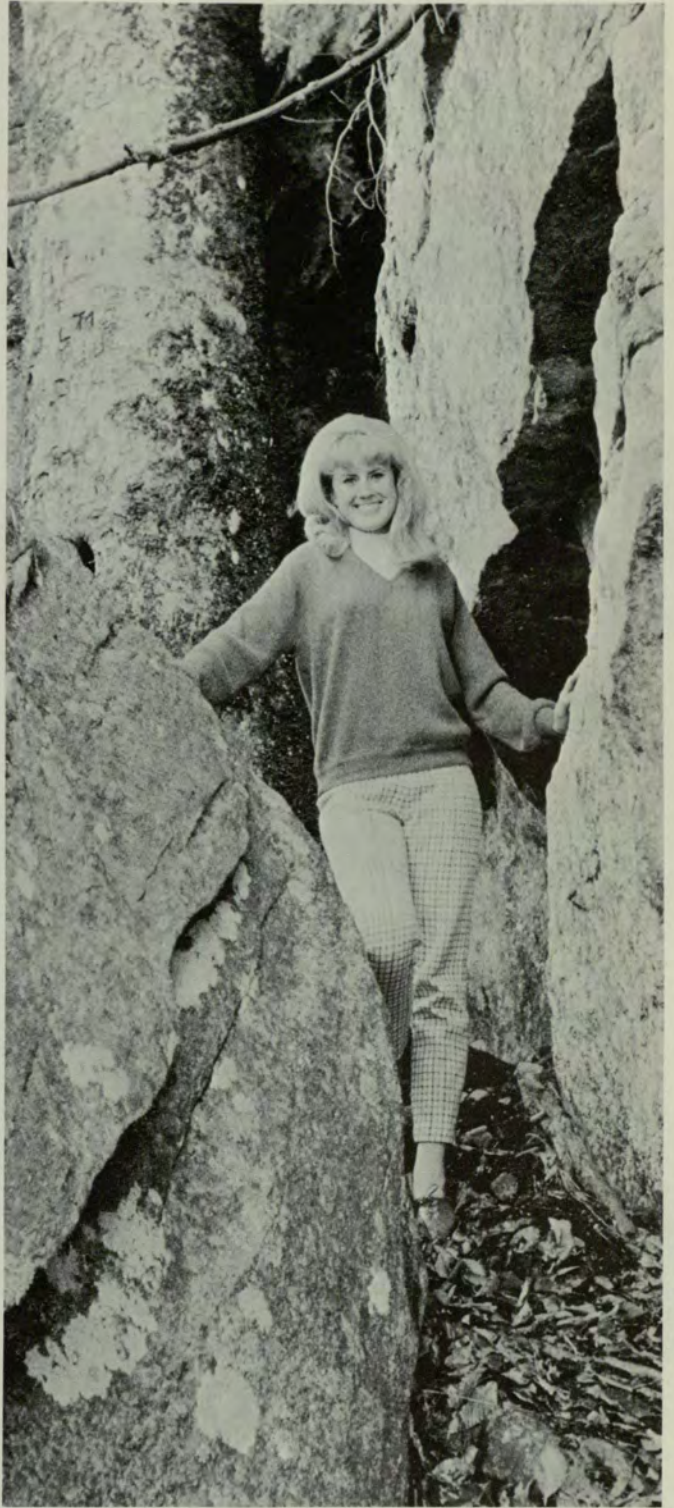


# CAROL LEIKER

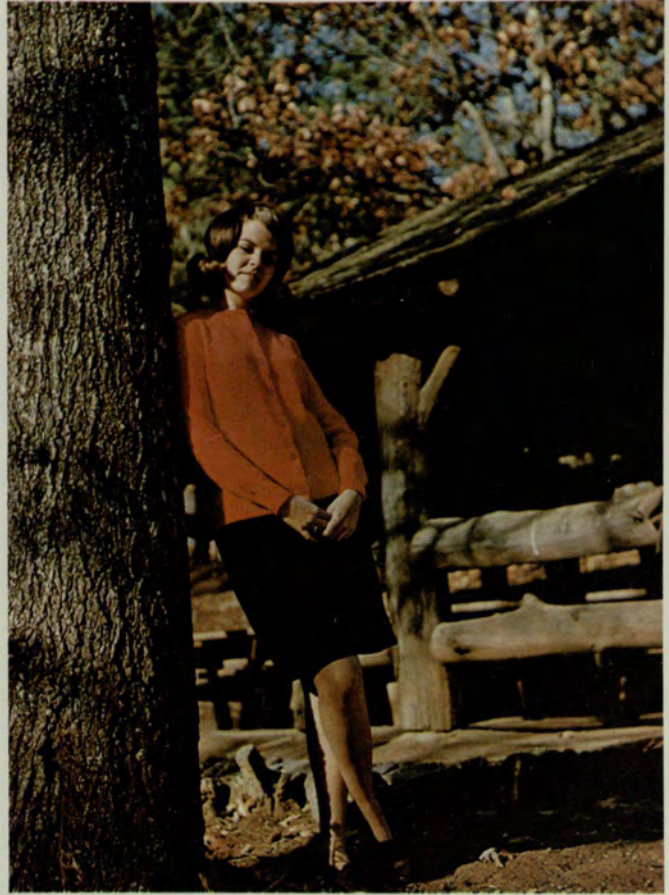
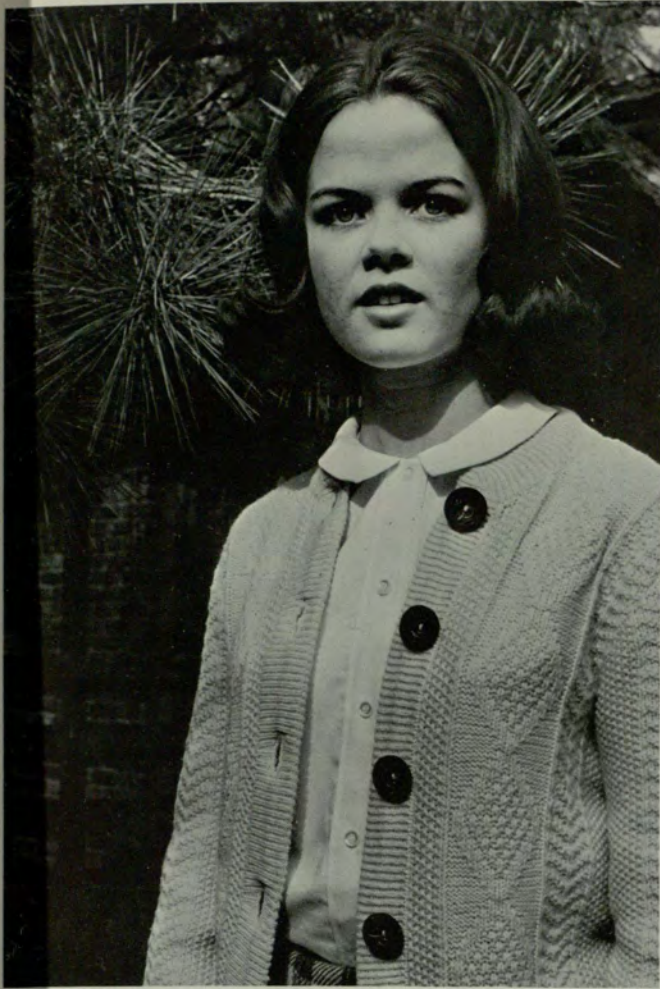


# ANGELA HENDERSON

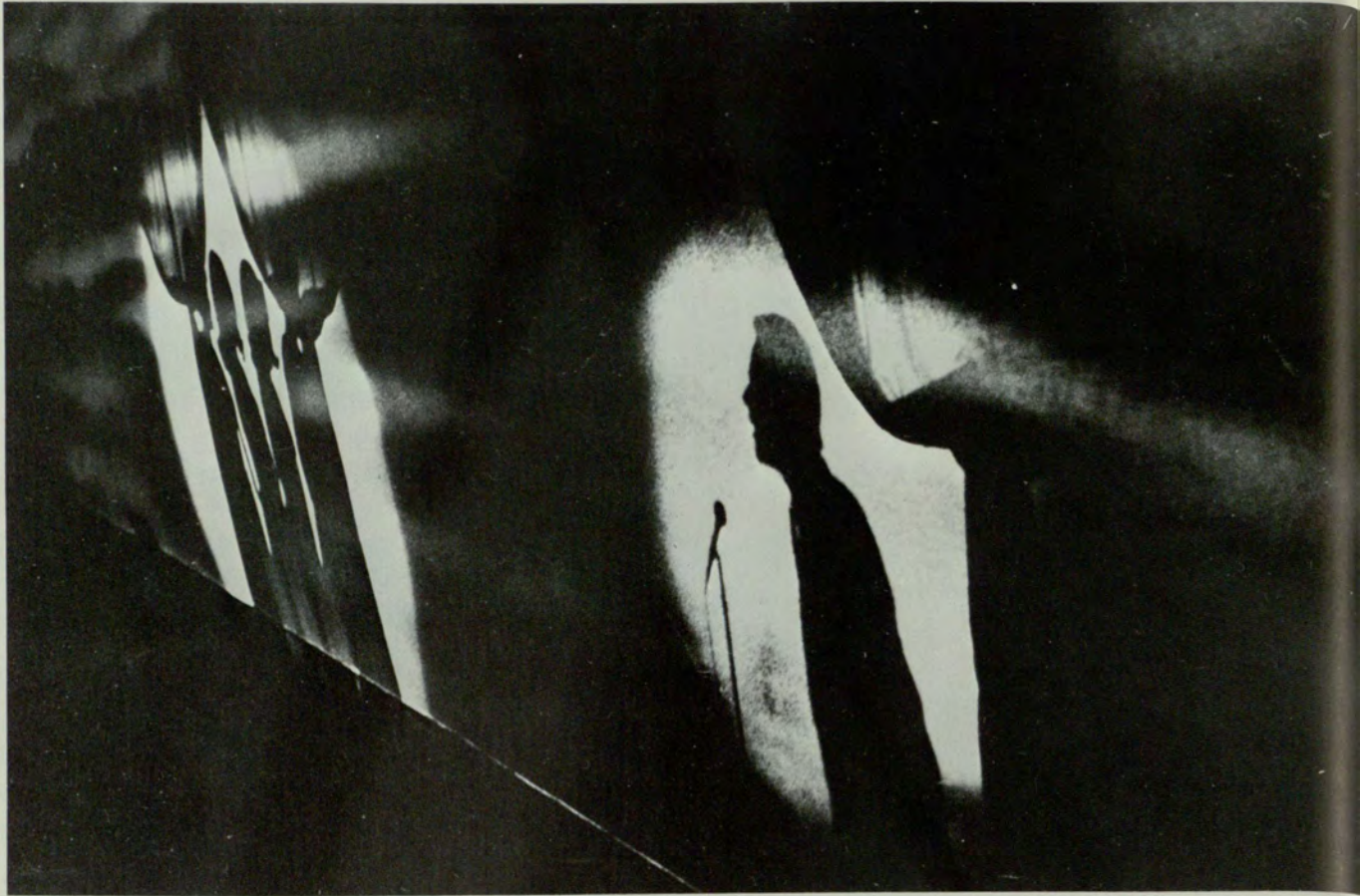

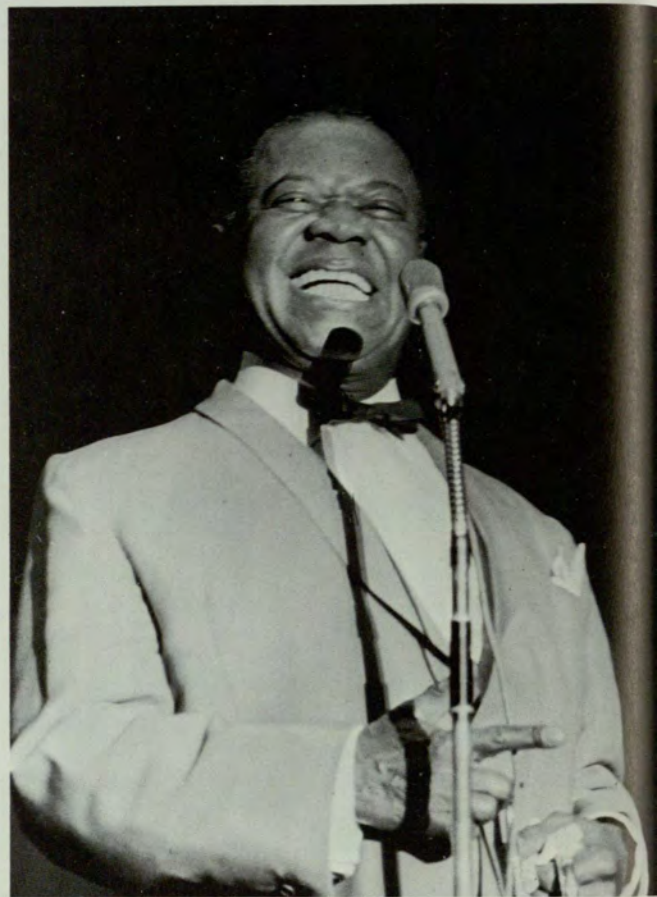
### Louis Armstrong Sings During Georgia State's Homecoming

Folk-singer Josh White, Jr. headlined the Mardi Gras concert which was one of the best at Georgia State.



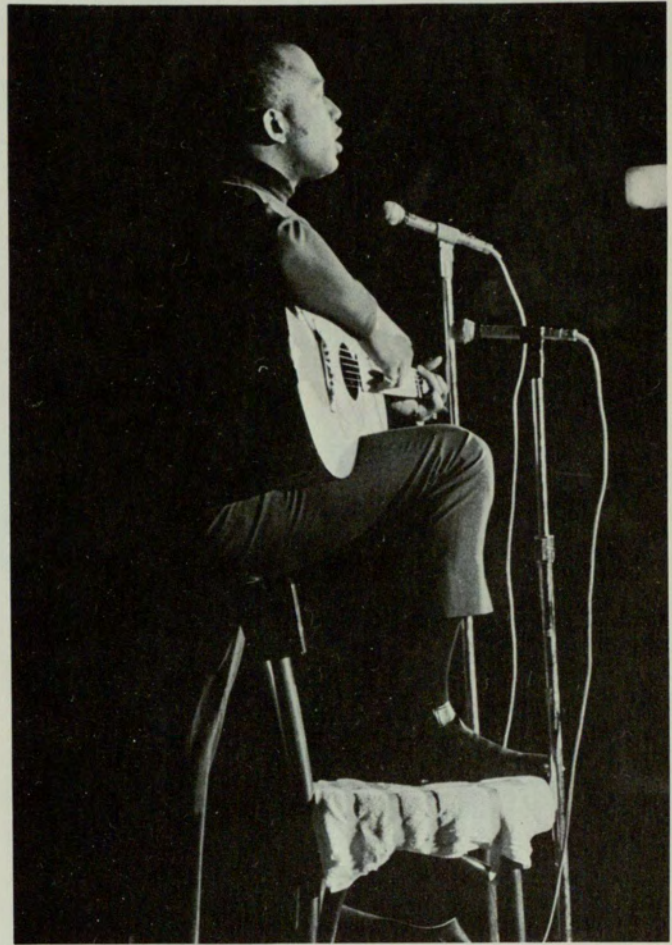

## SCLC Leader Addresses State Student Body And Faculty

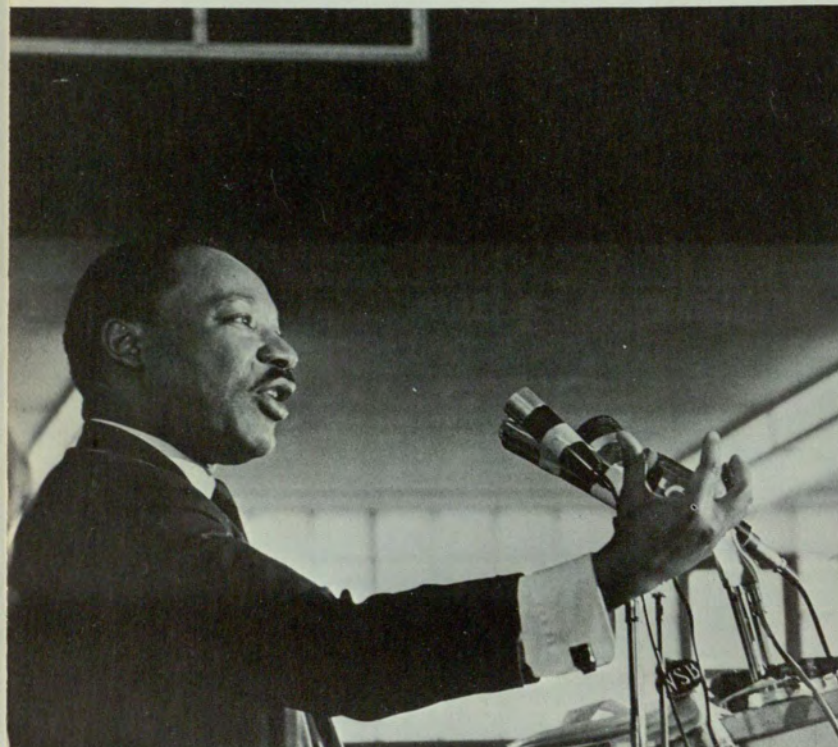
Many well-known persons come to Georgia State to speak before students groups. This year has been no exception.

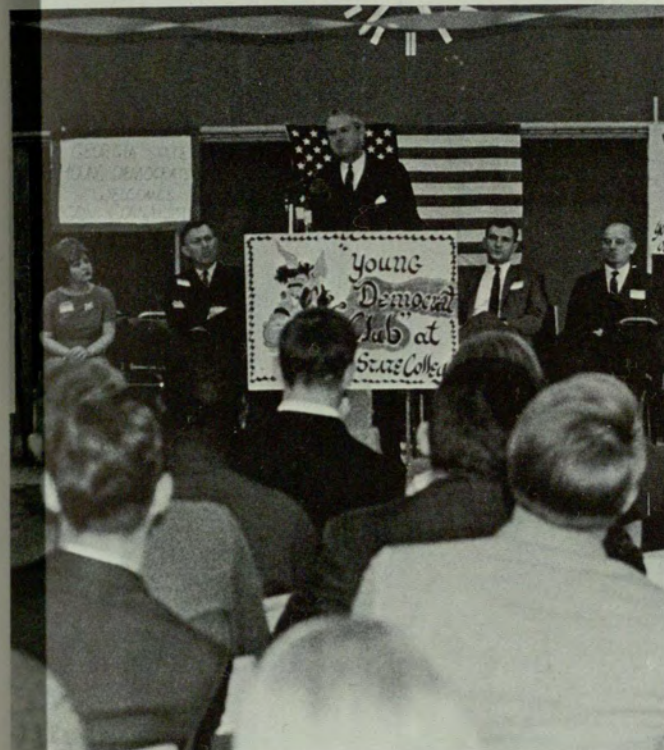

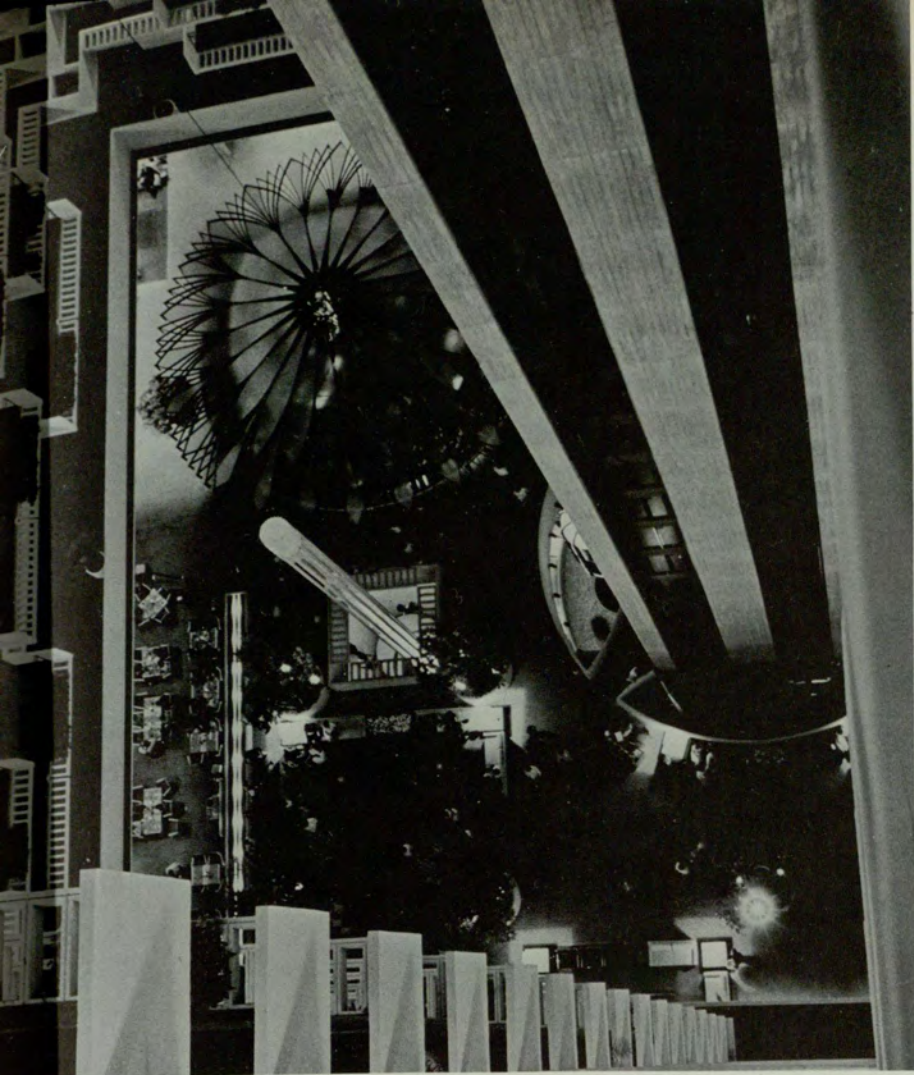
### University Of North Carolina Chancellor Gives Honors Address

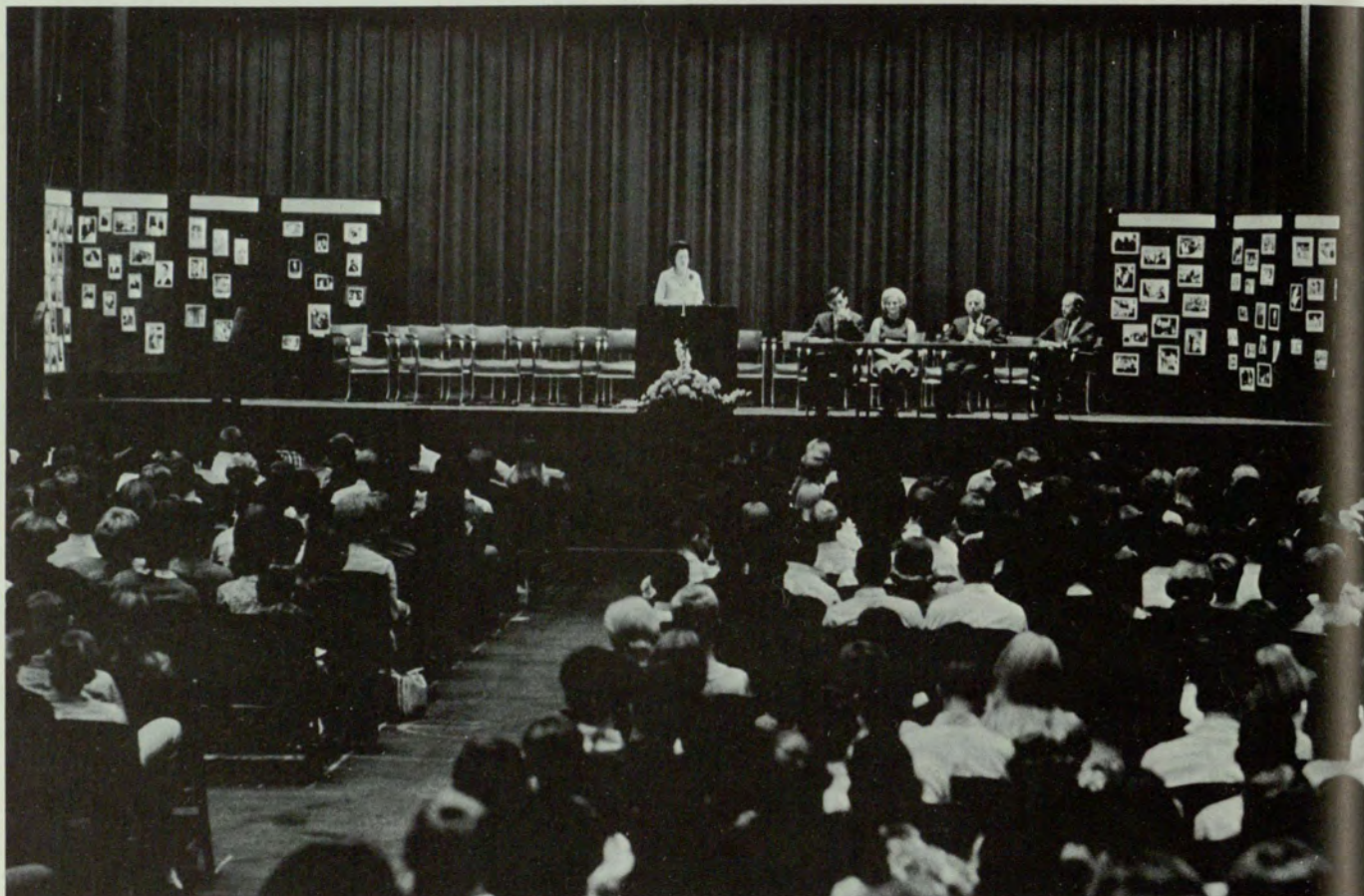
Football Game, Skits, Campfire,

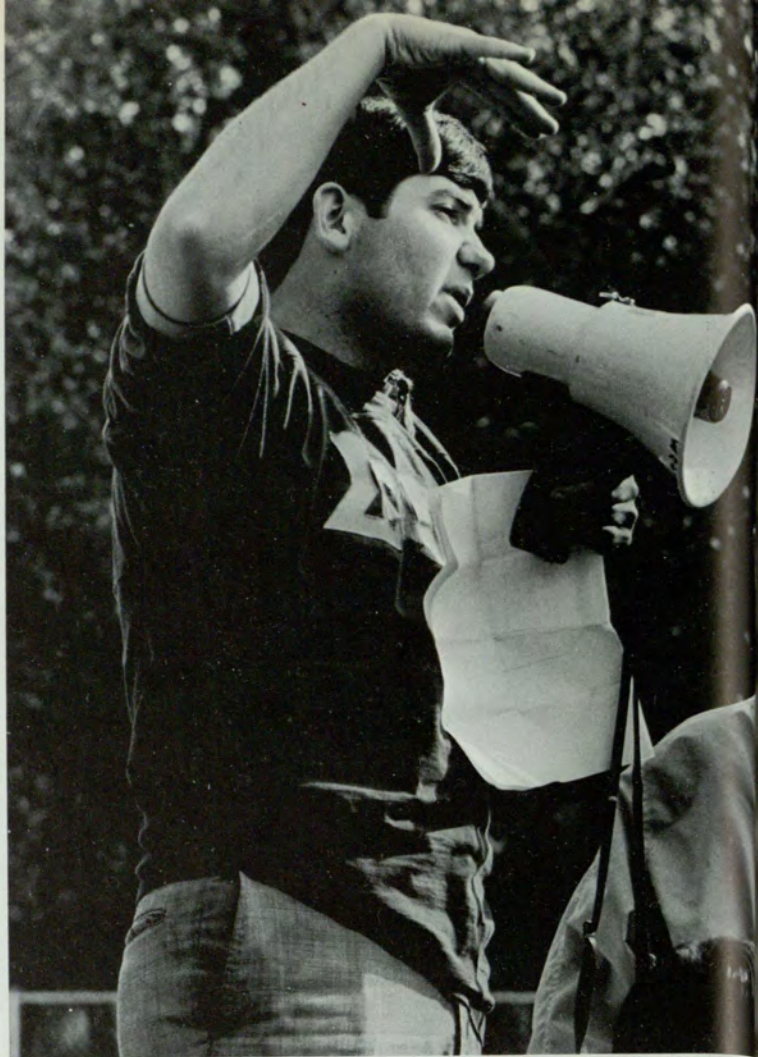

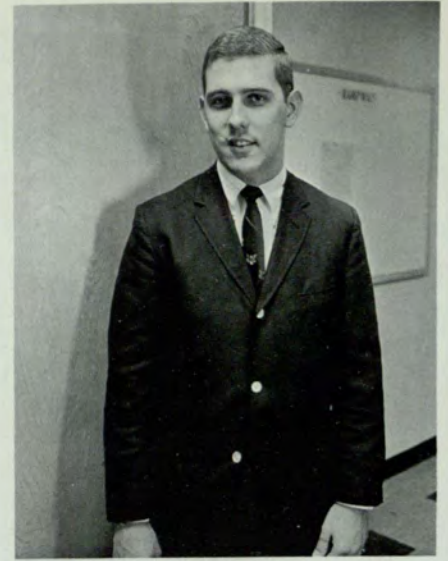
# WHO'S WHO

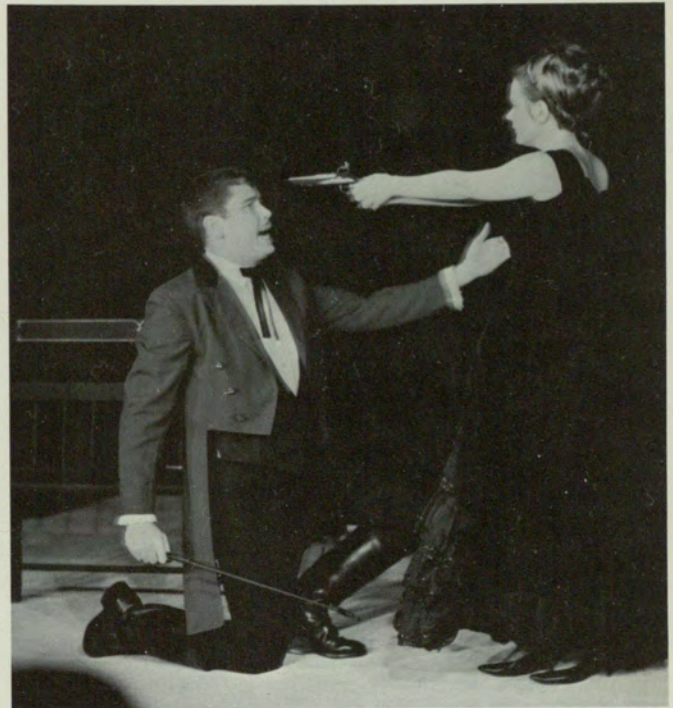

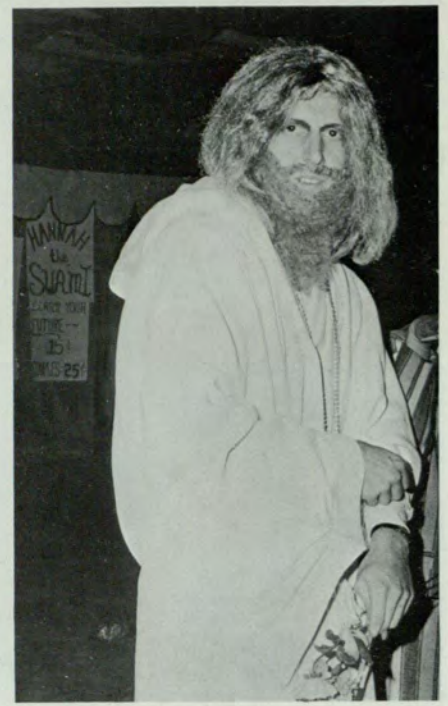

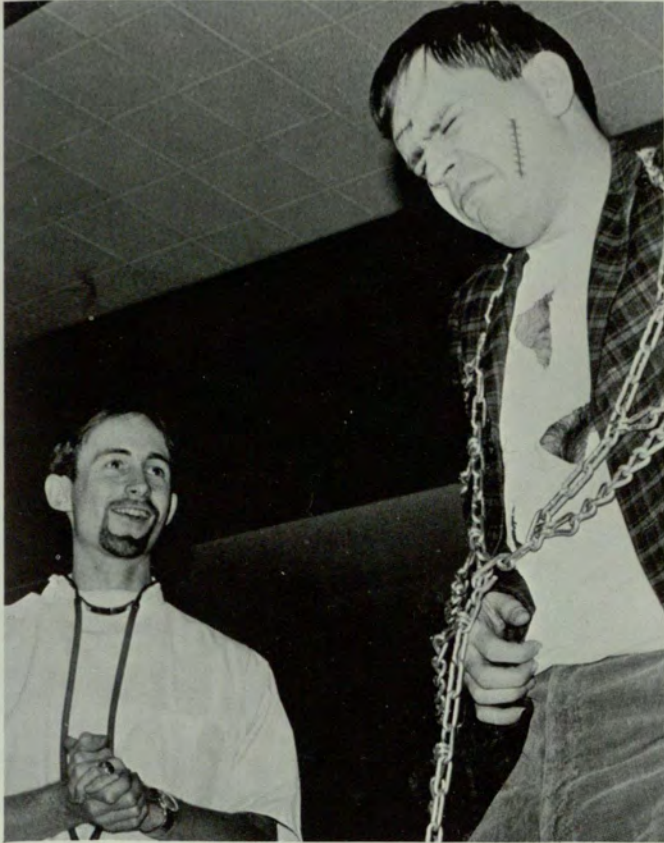

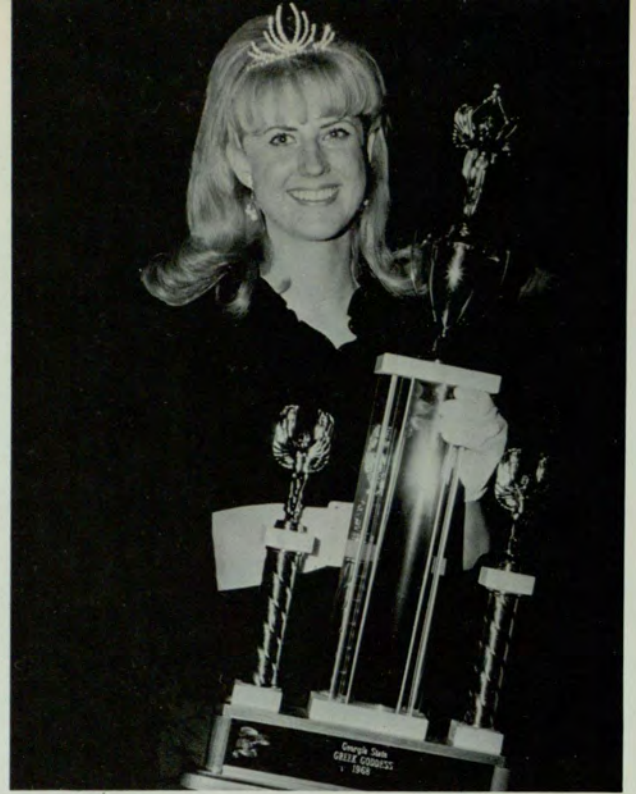

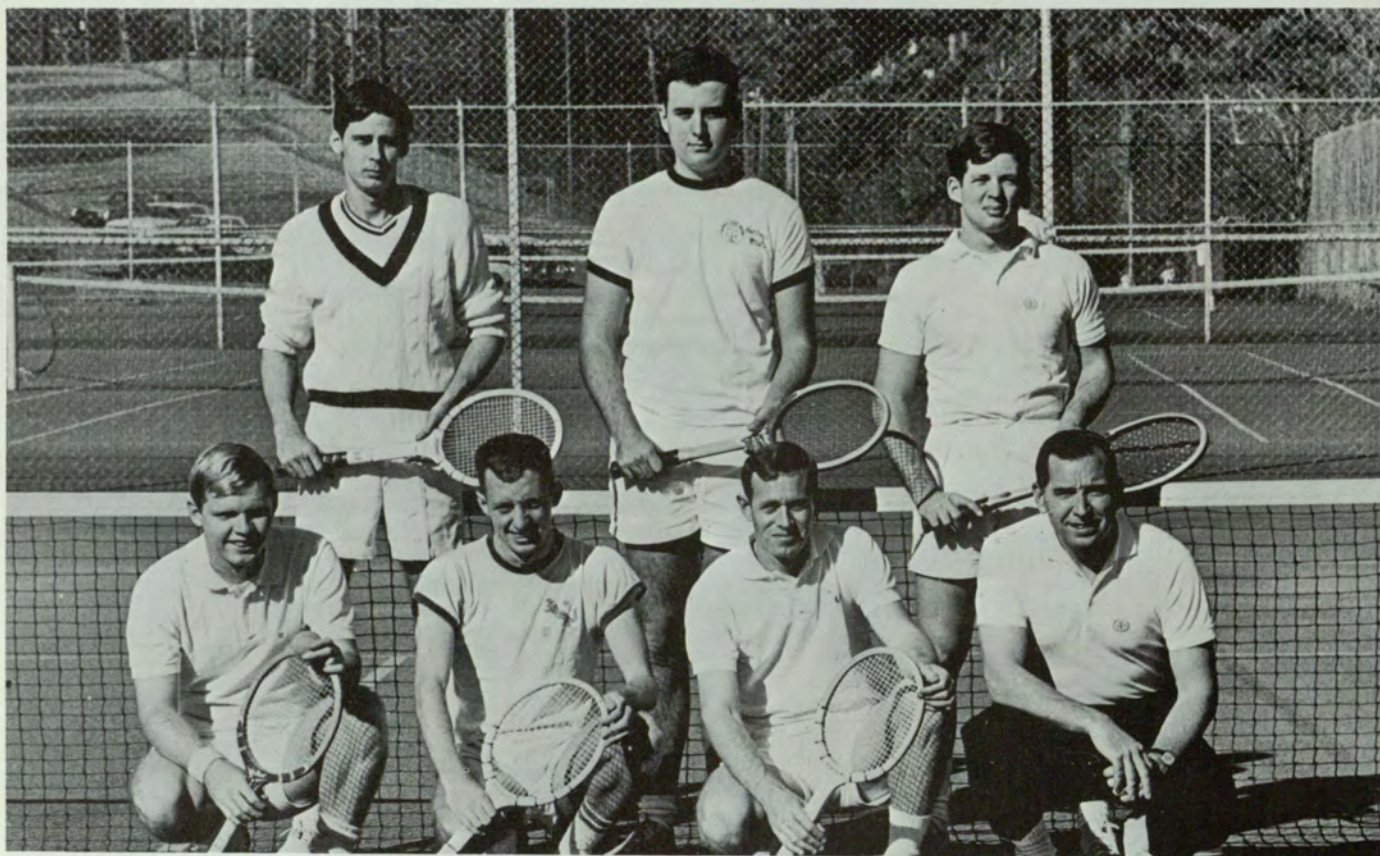
# TENNIS

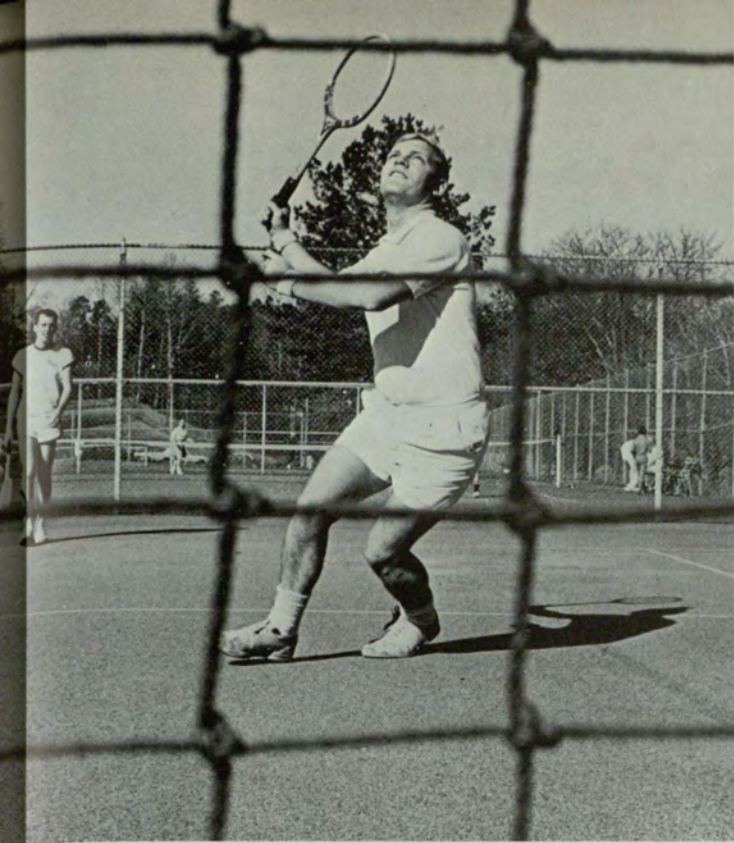

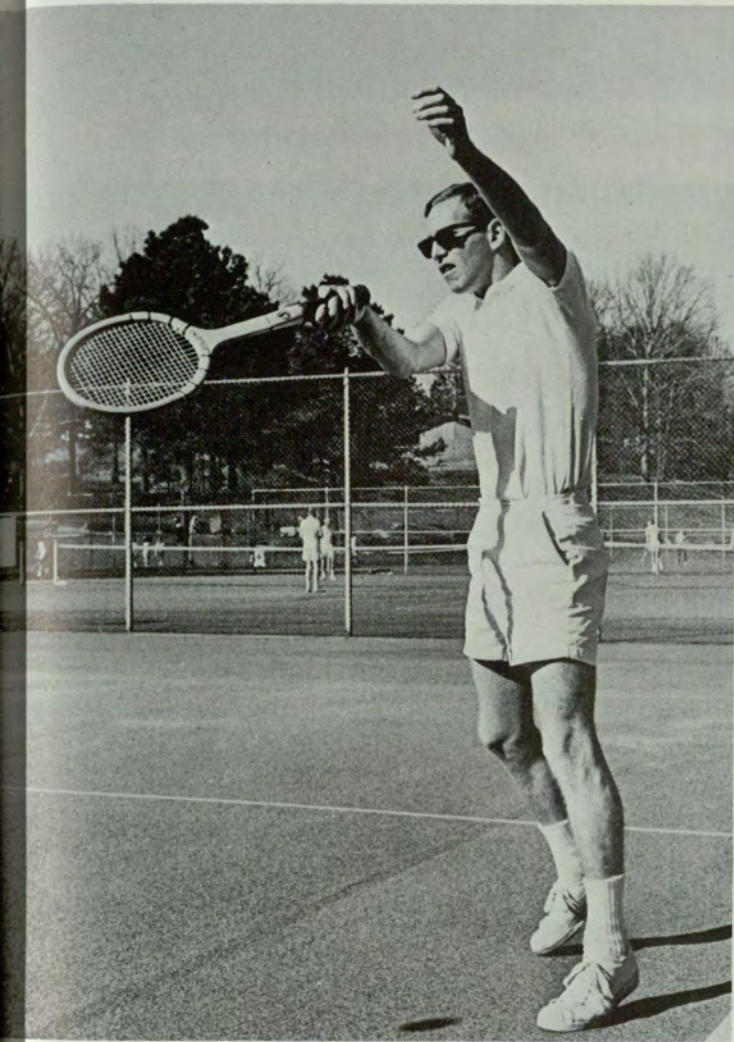

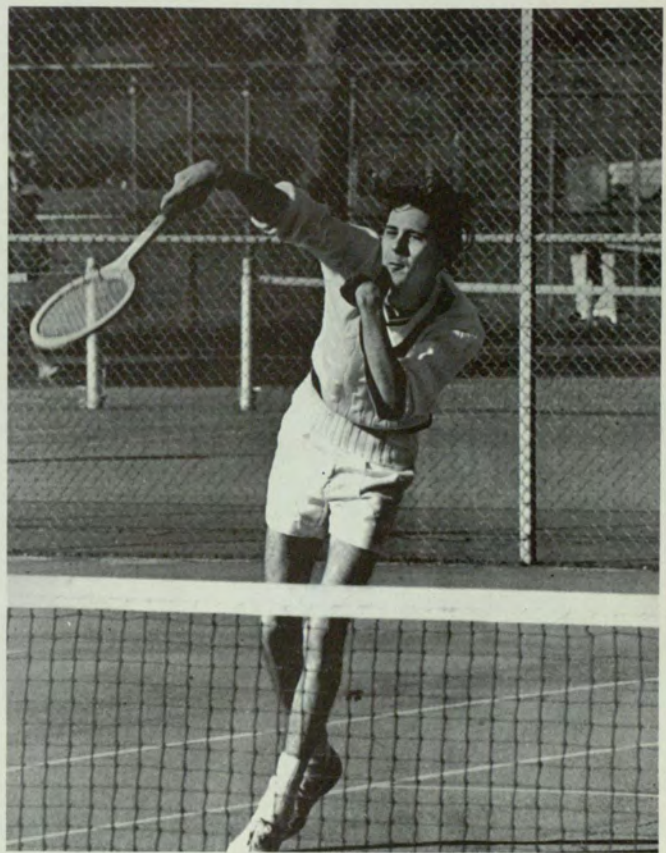

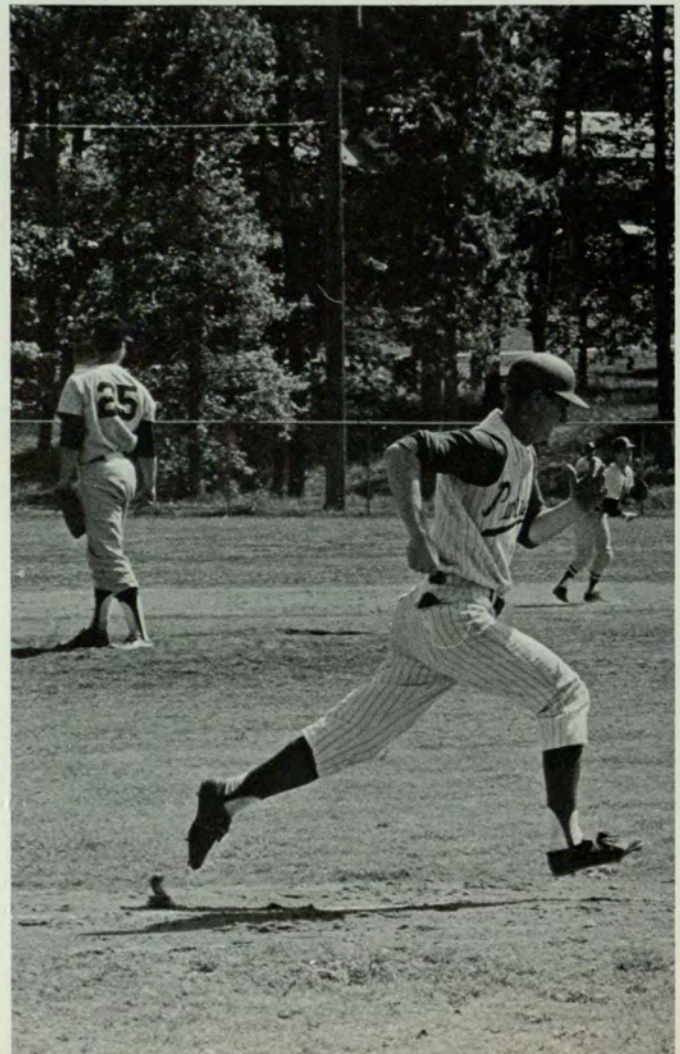

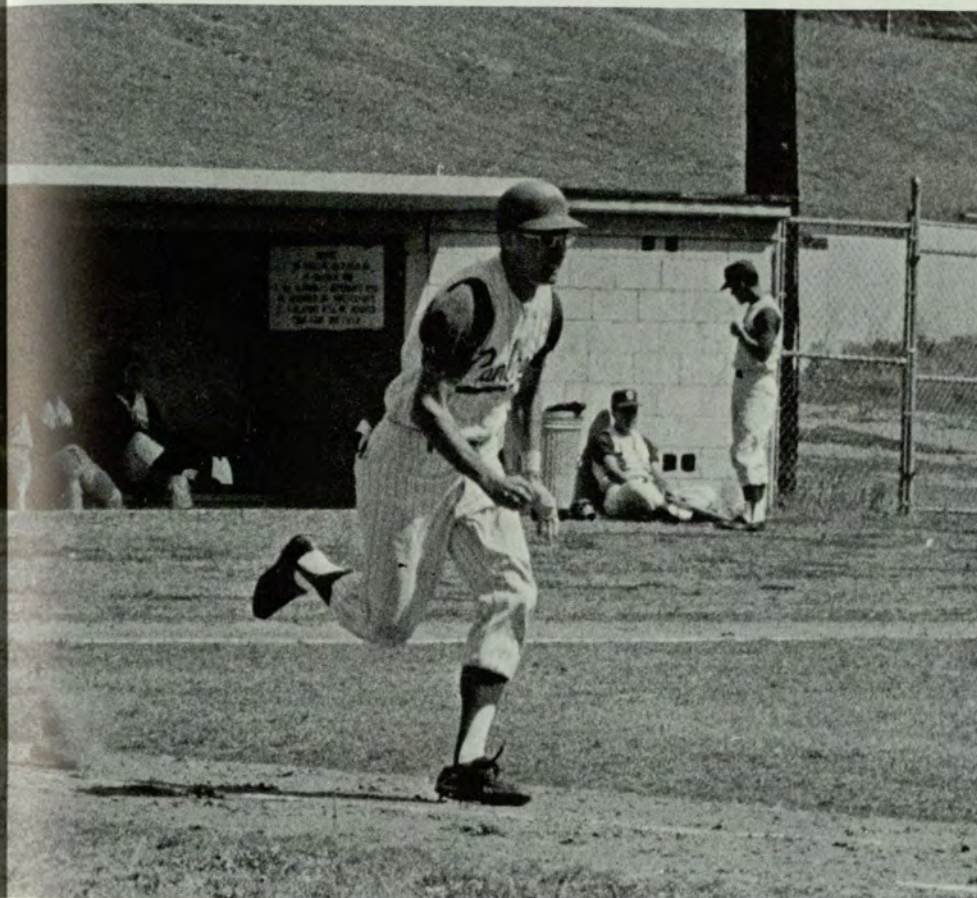

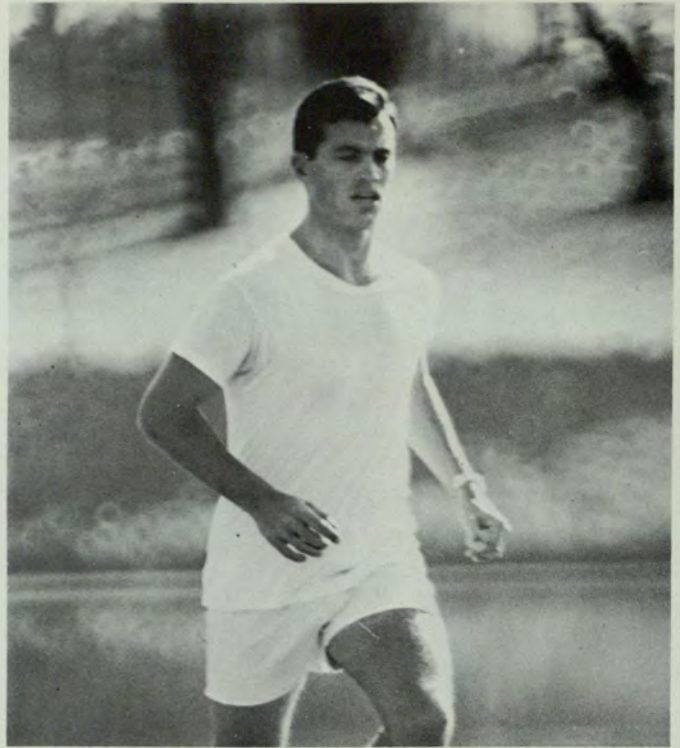

The individual meets with Furman, Clemson, Georgia Tech, and the University of Georgia were all very close, but the Panthers gave in to each with a score of 33-25. Definite progress was displayed when the Panthers pushed from a mere 5th place in the Aldridge Meet to a 1st place in the Atlanta Track Club Marathon. 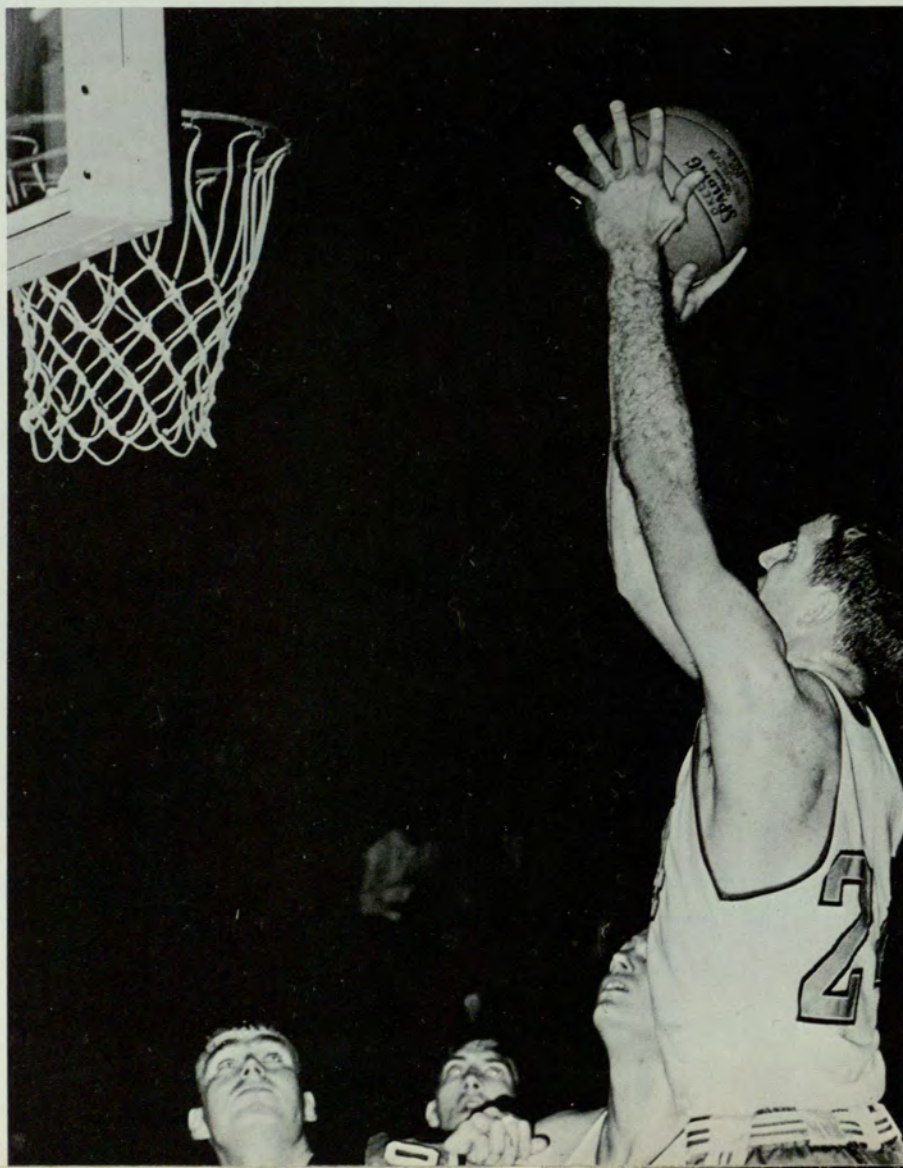

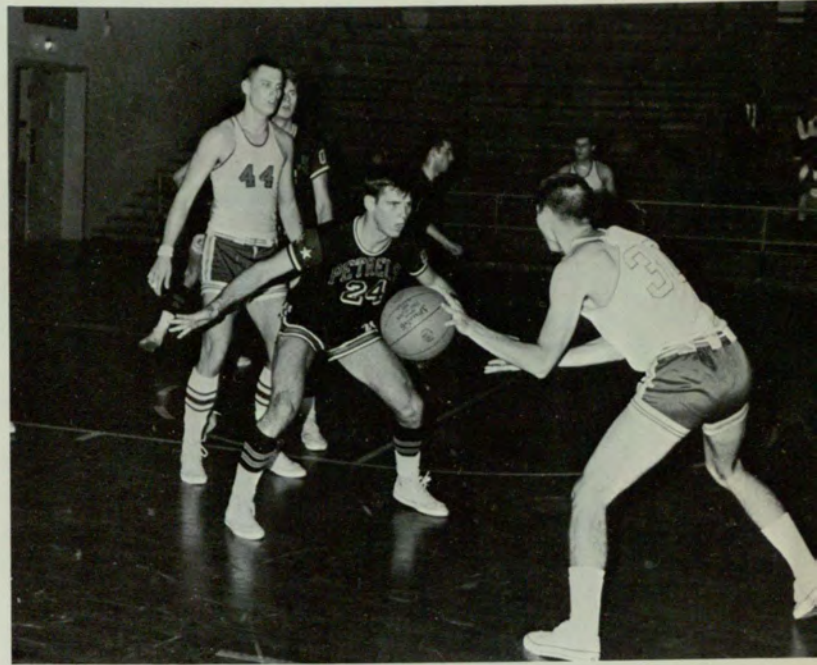

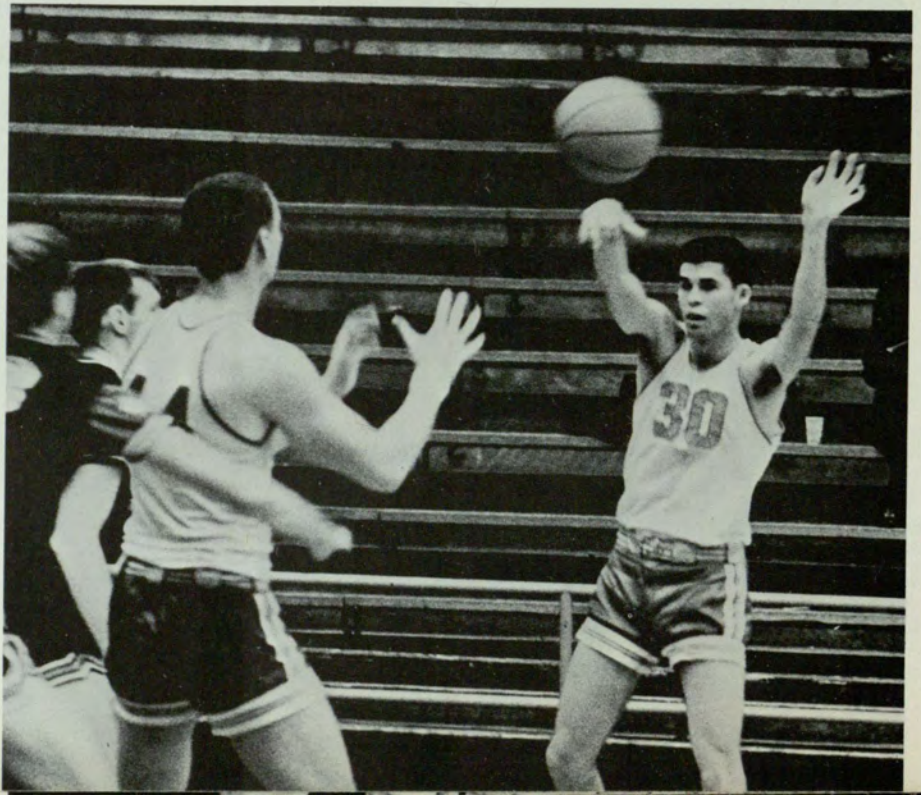


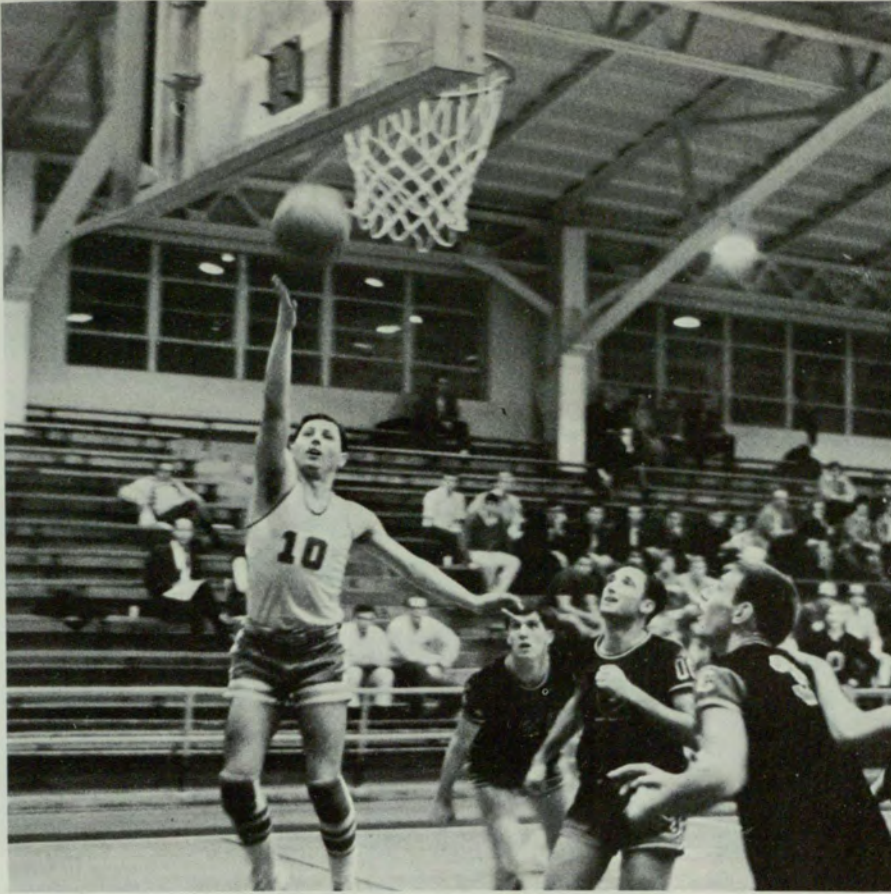

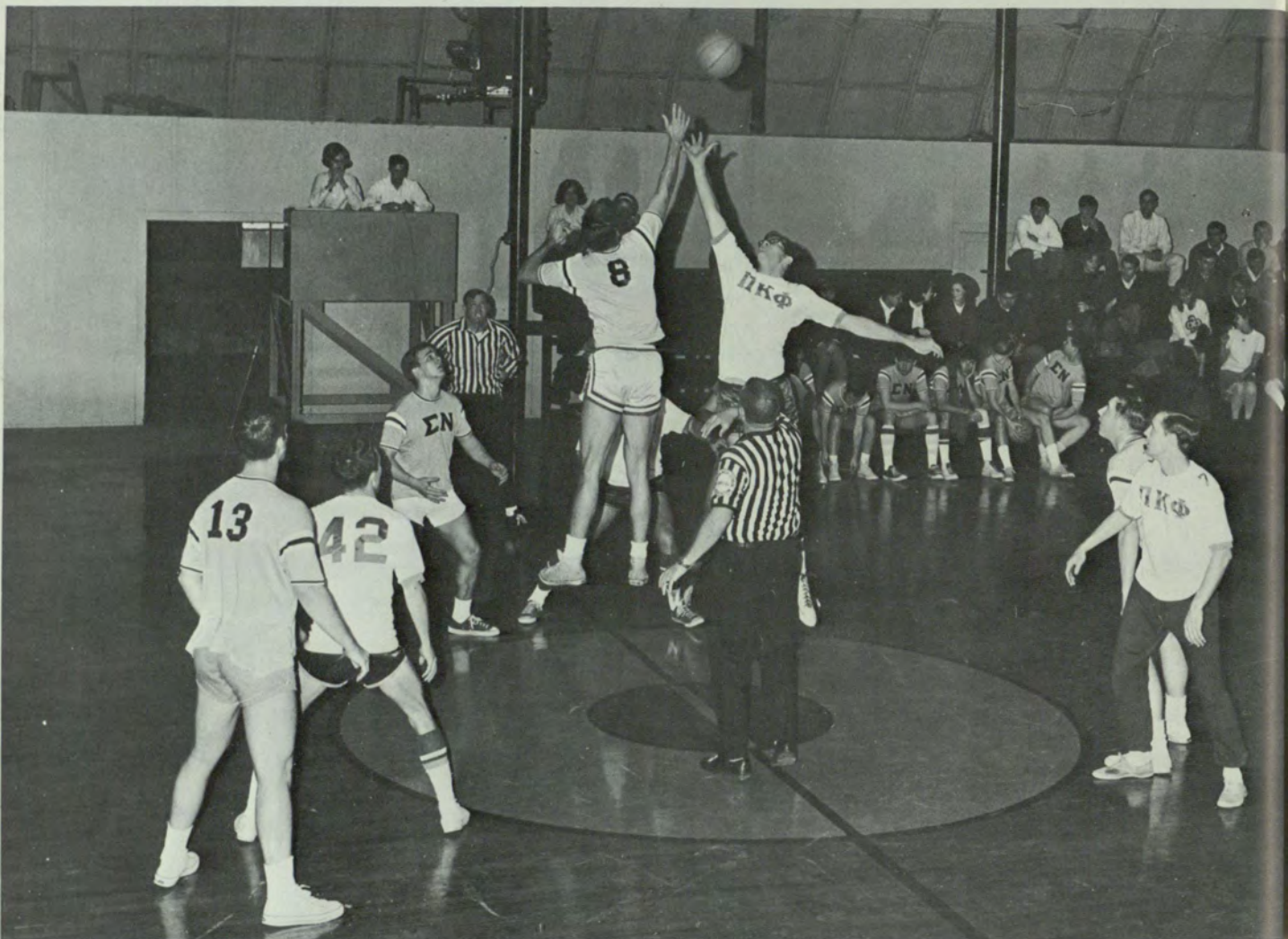

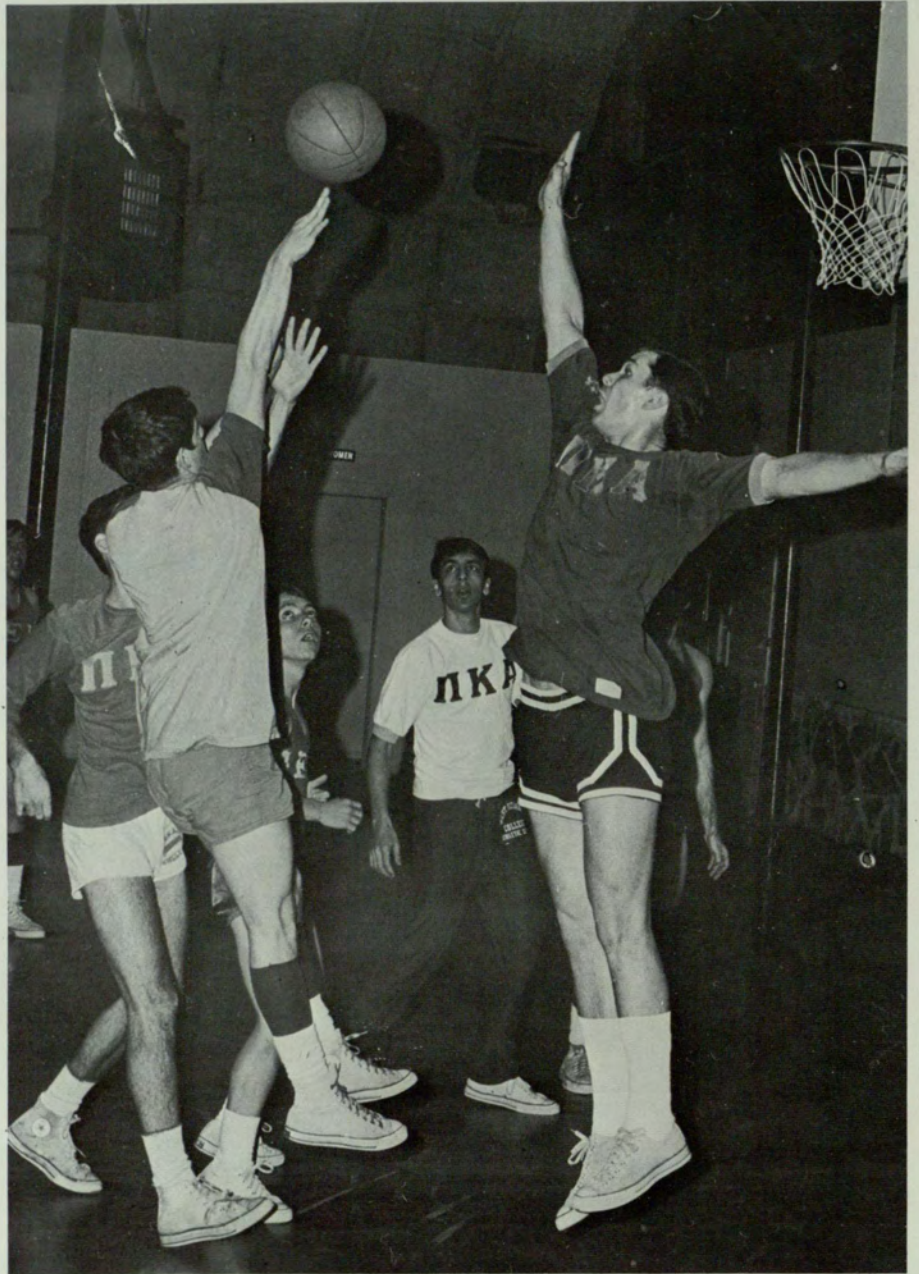

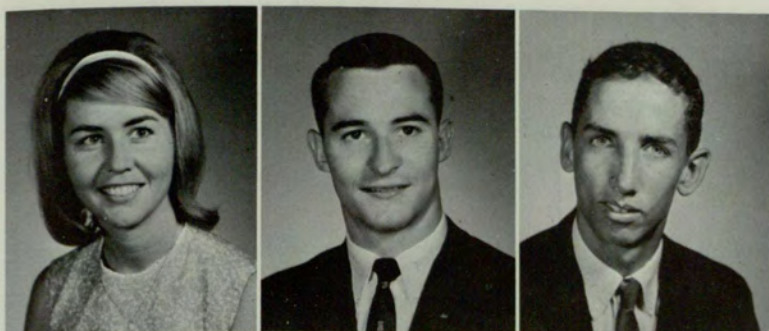


## GENERAL COUNCIL

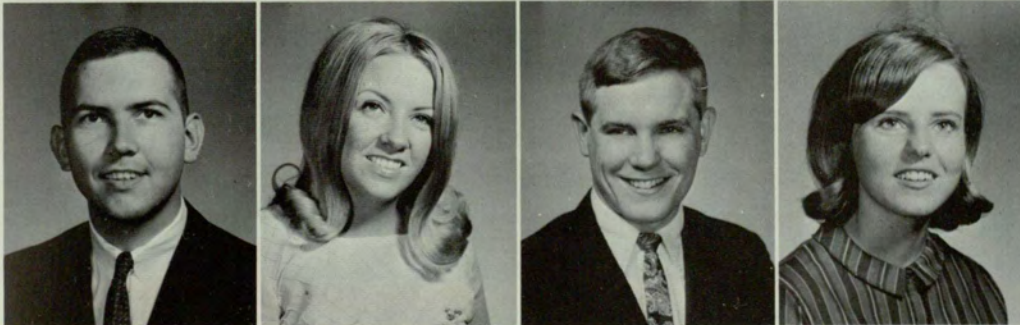

The SIGNAL has consistently won the Georgia College Press Association awards for General Excellence, Best Feature and Best Editorial of any college newspaper published in the state.

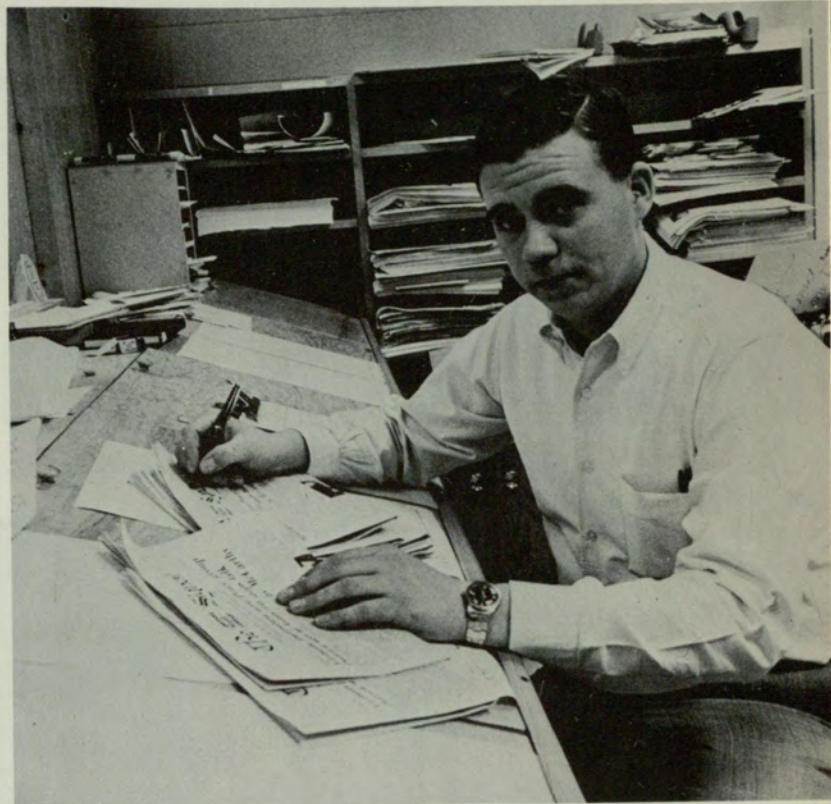

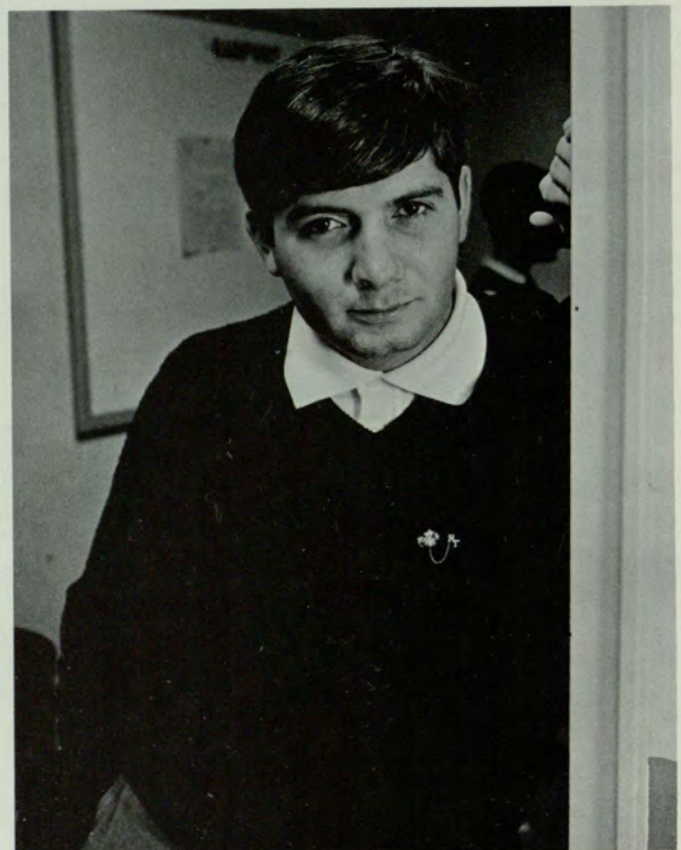
## RAMPWAY

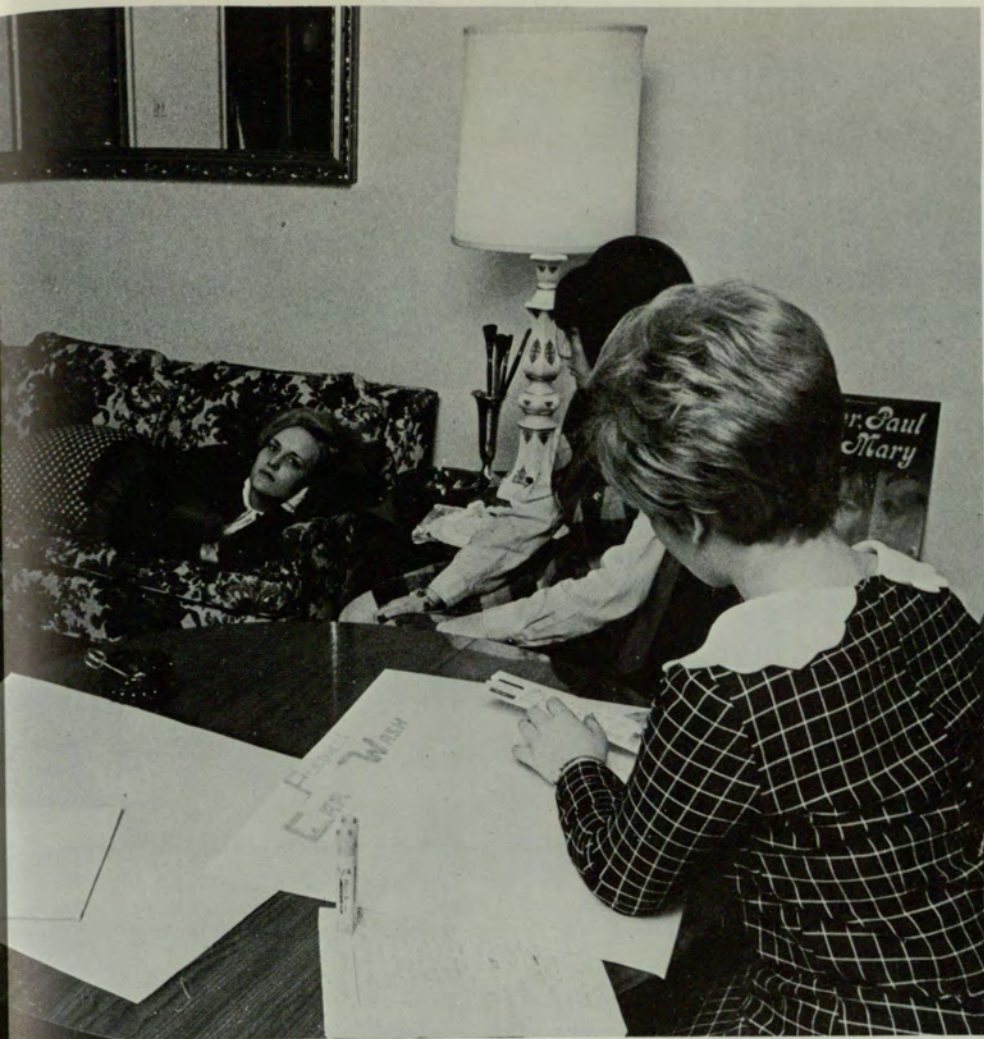

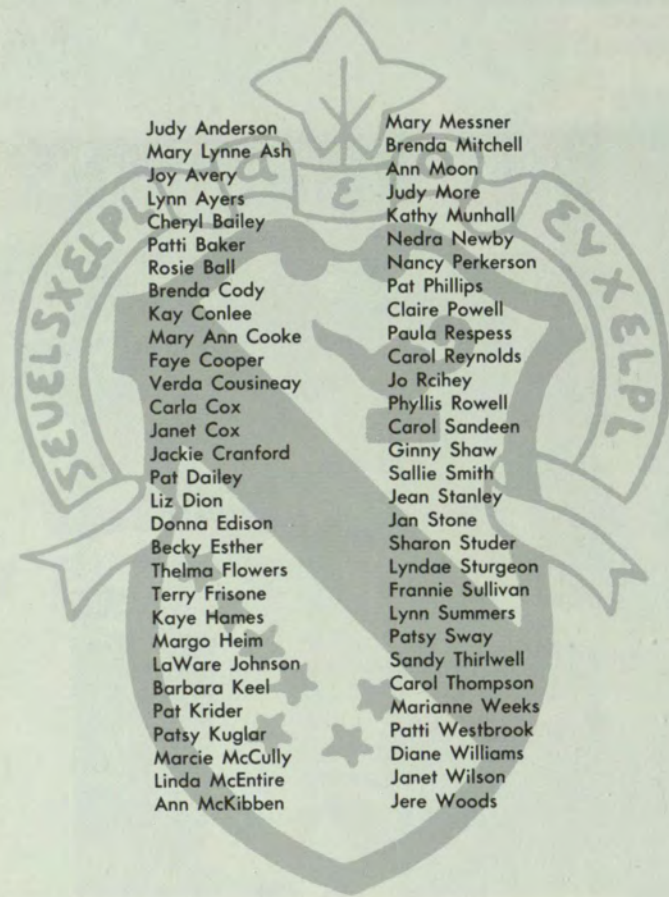

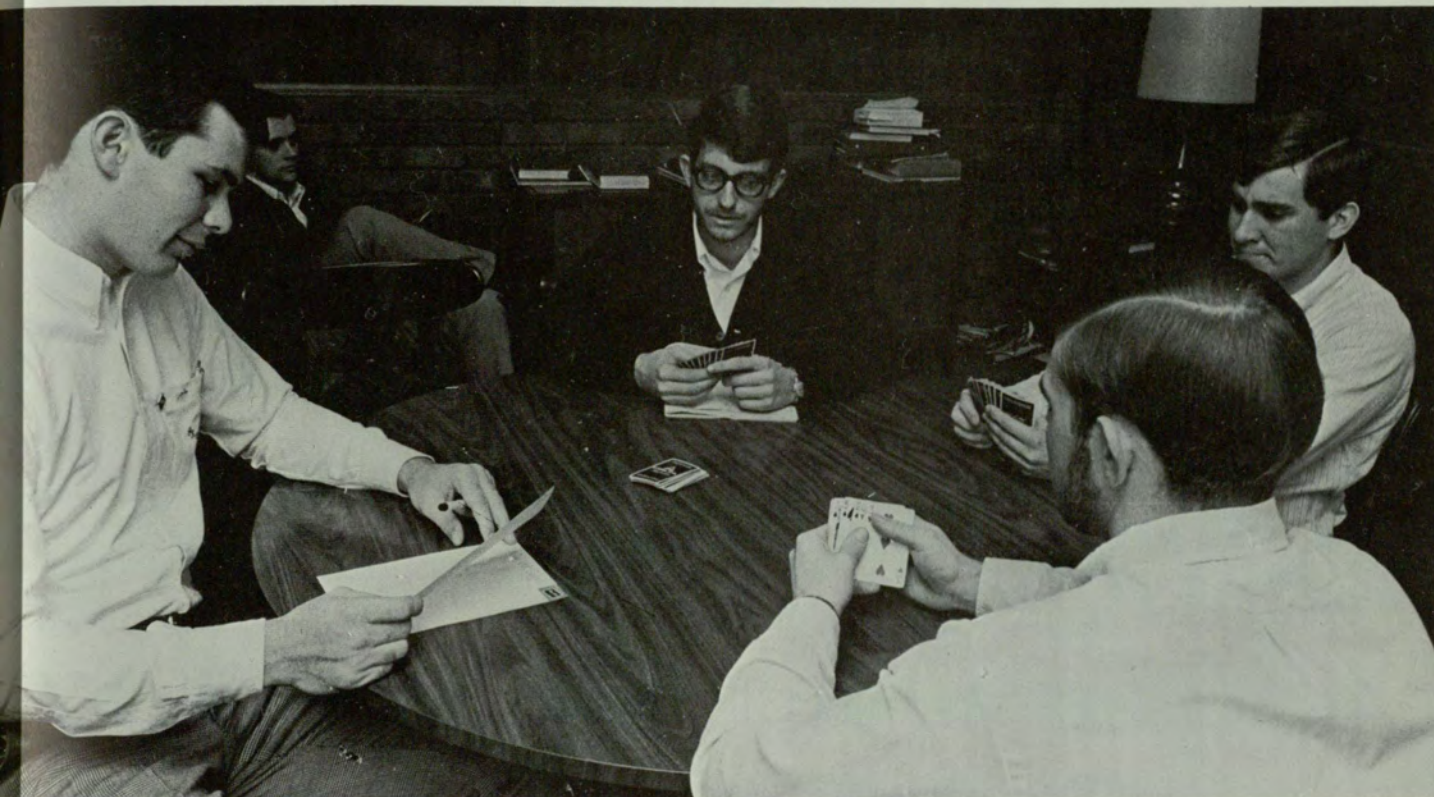

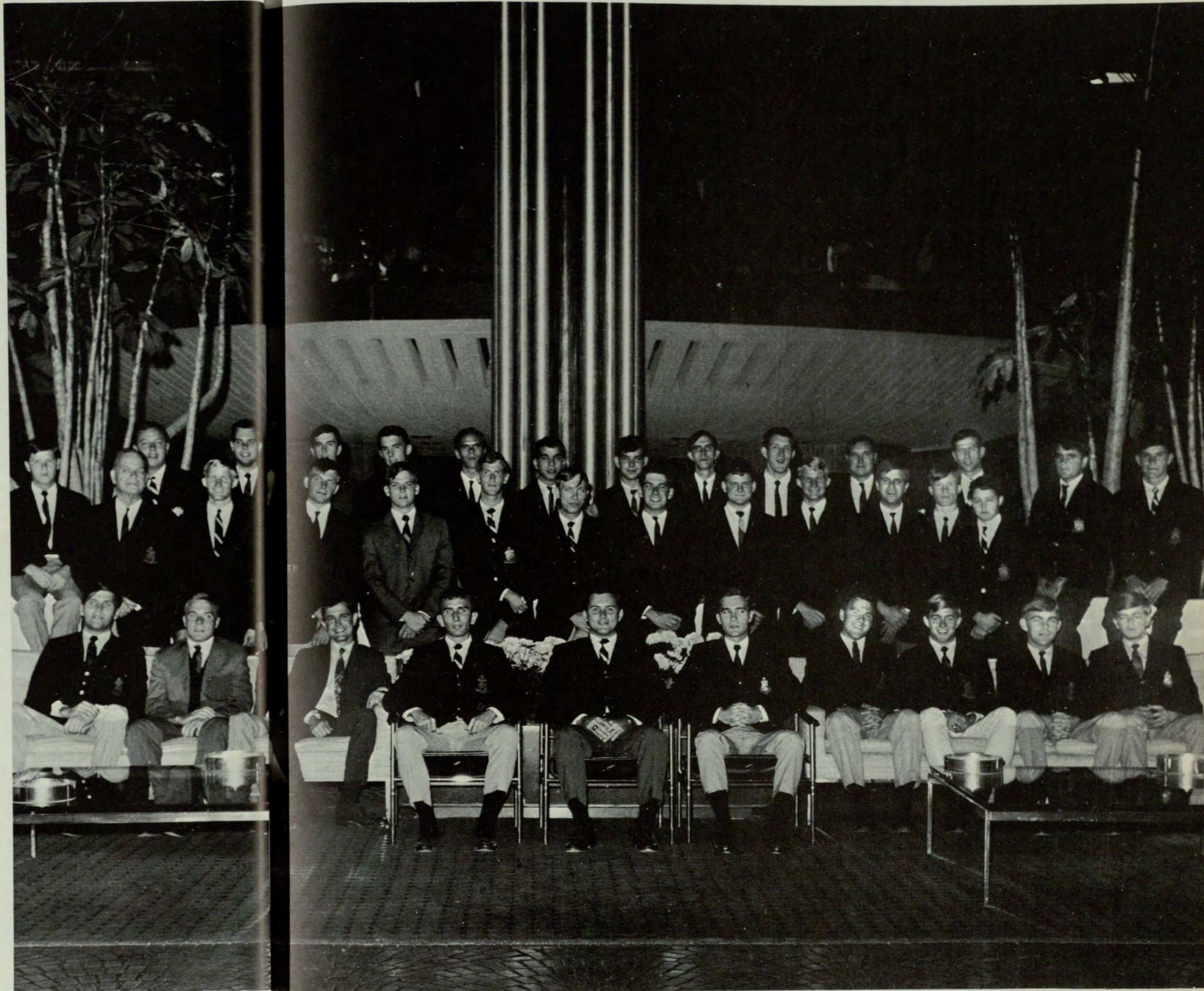

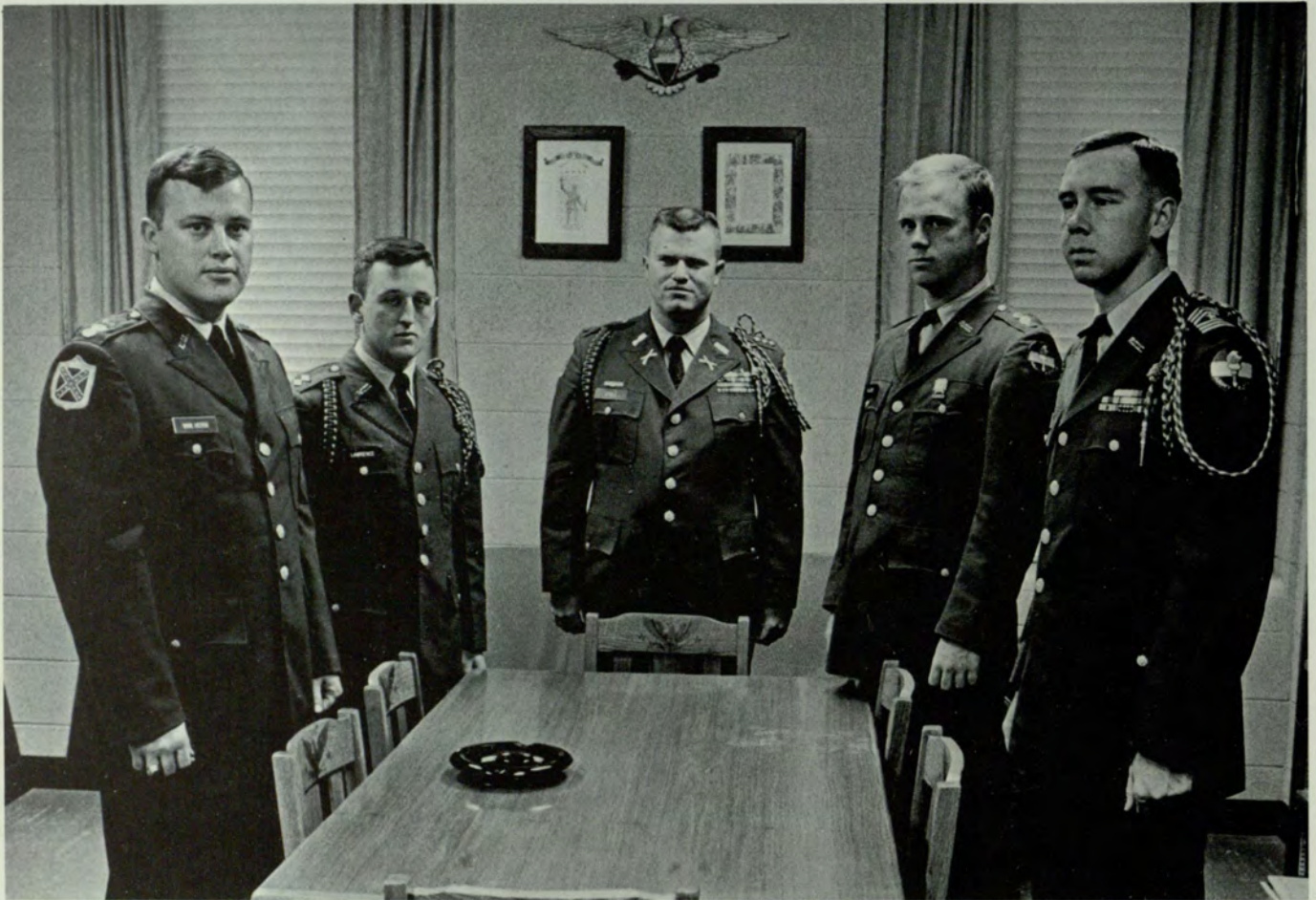
## From Student To 2nd Lieutenant

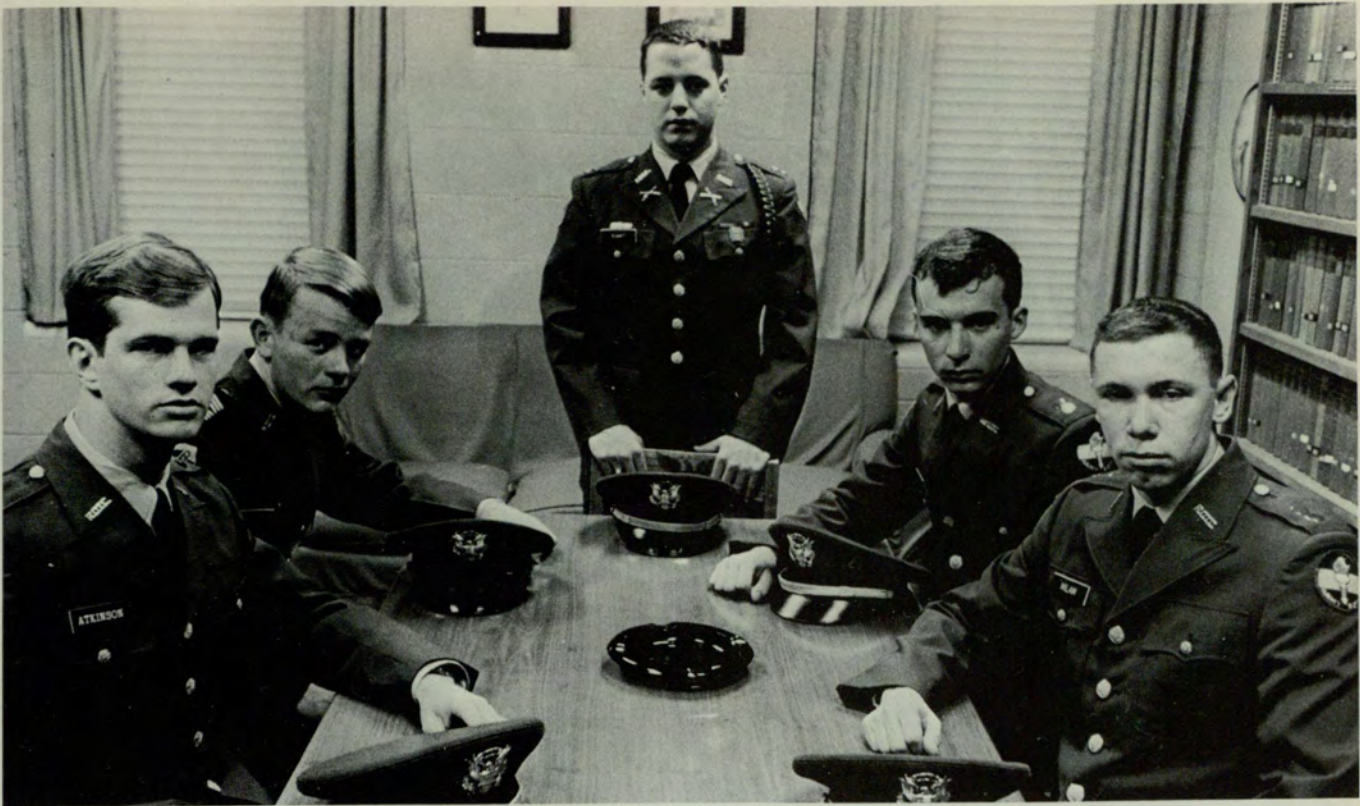

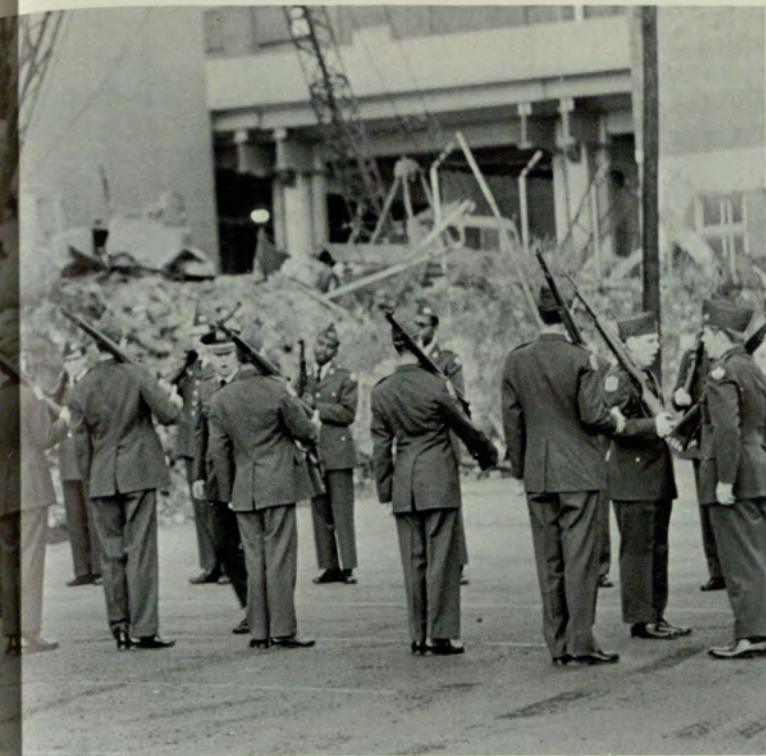

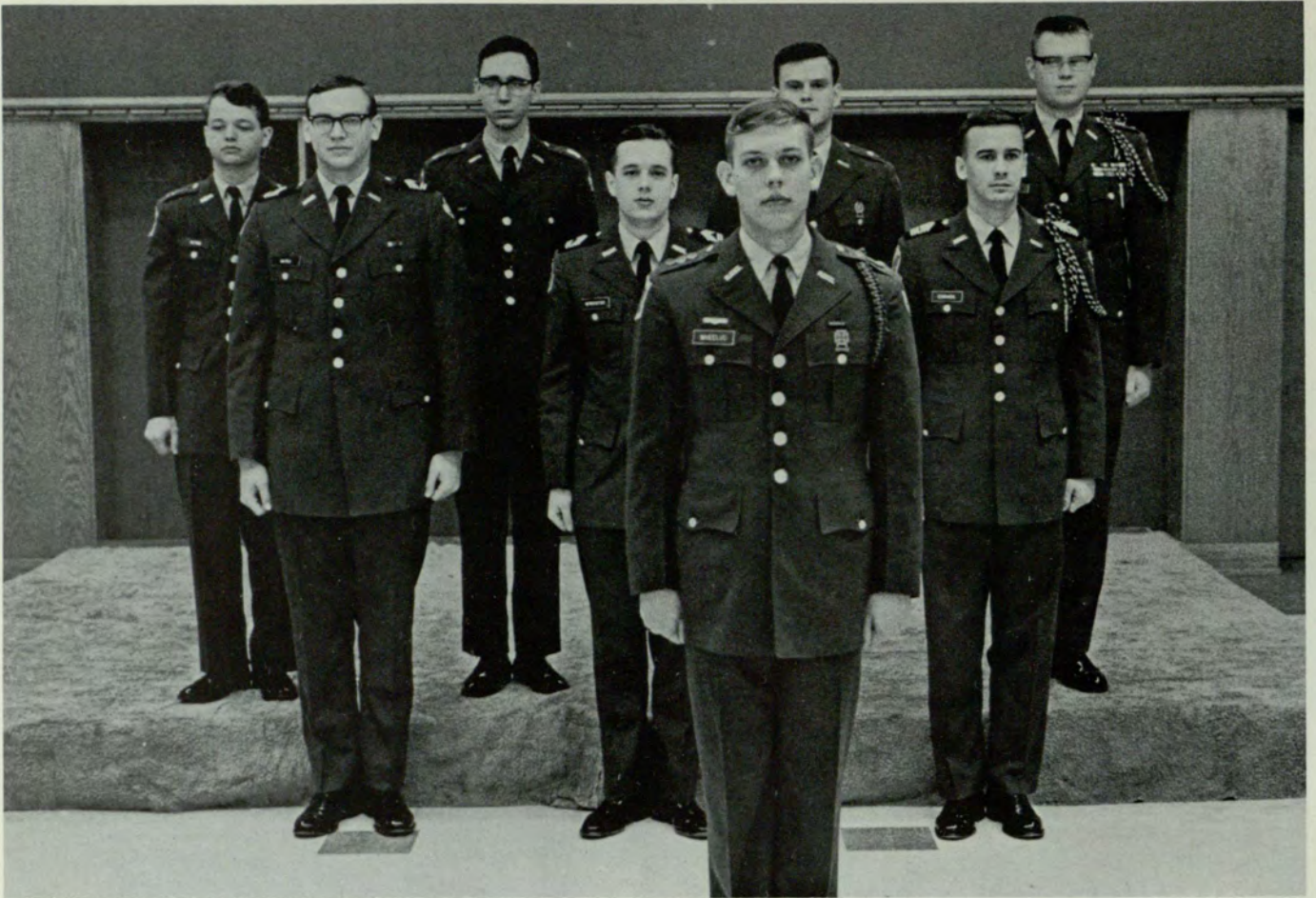

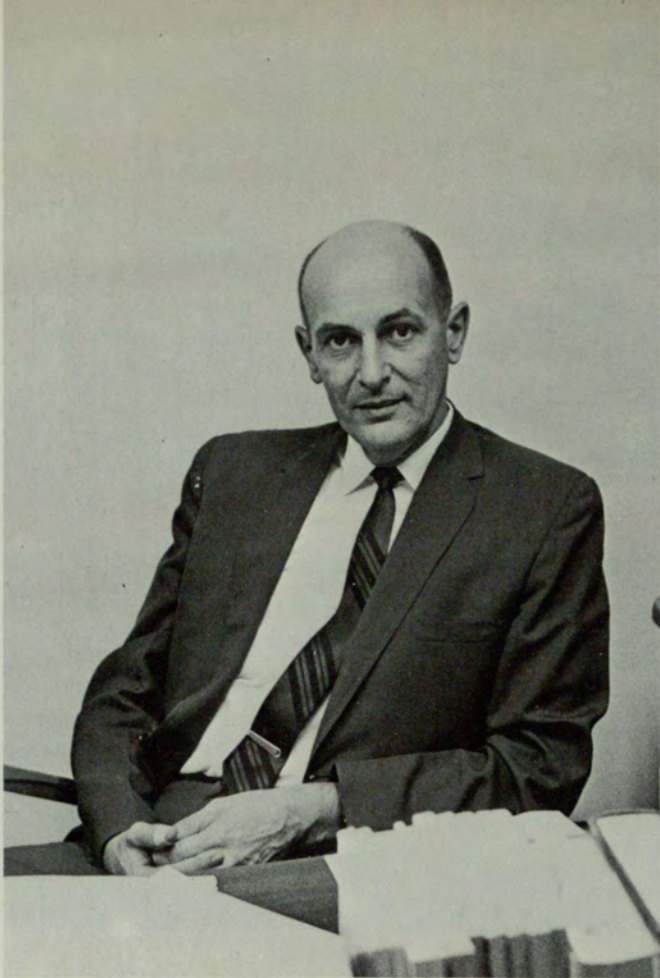
### This School Offers Doctoral Programs And Liberal Education

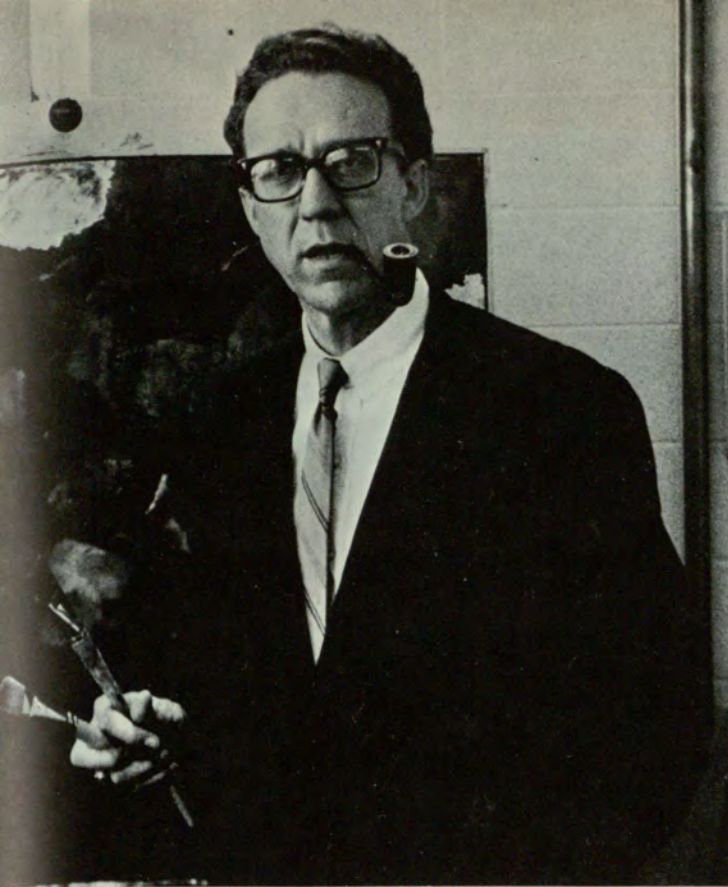
### New Department Has Own Museum With World Famous Collections

This year, the Department of Anthropology became separate and independent of geography and geology. The department presently has three full-time faculty members, offering a complete undergraduate major program, and hoping to add a permanent department head.

Recent activities and acquisitions by the department range from data and artifacts from several archaeological sites in the state, a portion of Huntington's Collection of human skeletal material from the Smithsonian Institution, and a basic collection of casts of human fossils remain from the University of Pennsylvania. There is a variety of ethnographic specimens for the department's own museum including collections from Nigeria, Cameroon and northeastern Canada.

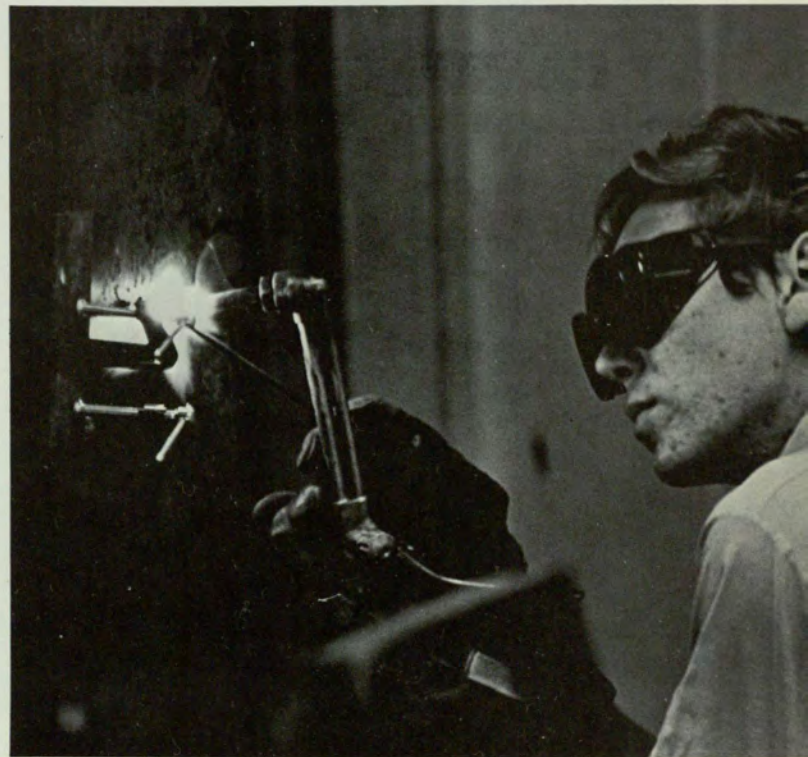

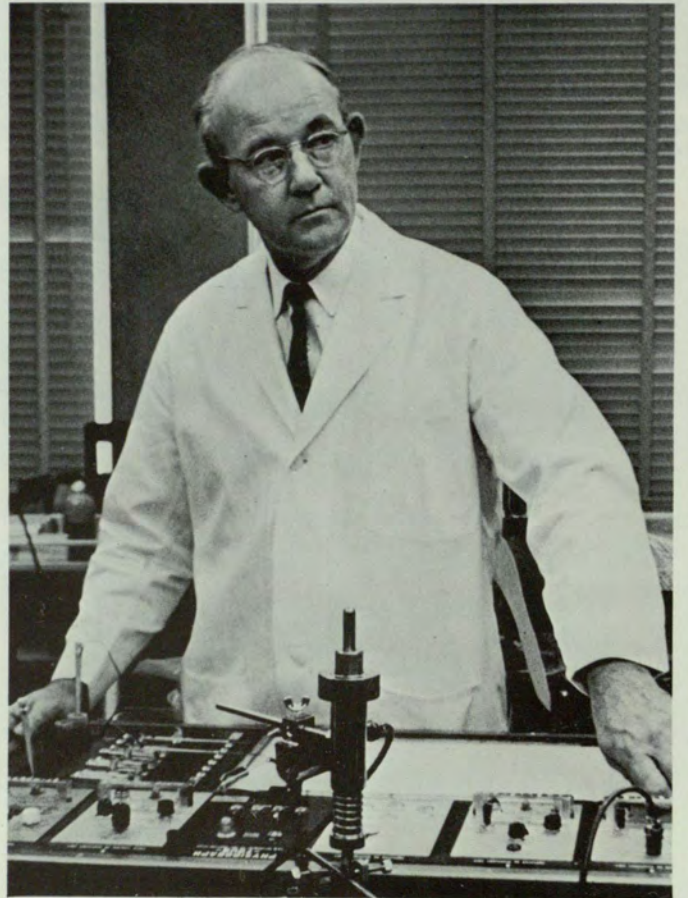

## Eight Hundred Students Enroll In Introductory Level Courses

One of the main goals of the Biology Department is to help the student understand the world in which he lives. An average of eight hundred students enroll in the department each quarter. Many of these students take introductory courses which are designed to give a concept of biological principles and to instruct the student in the fundamentals of the biology of living organisms. Introductory courses in anatomy, physiology and microbiology are presented to nursing students. The other students in the department are specializing in biology at both the undergraduate and the graduate levels. A.M.S. or a M.A.T. is offered to a student at the graduate level with the opportunity to concentrate in various specialities on many levels.

## State's Doctor Of Philosophy Program Is Now In Third Year

The Department of Economics will give the first Ph.D. Degrees ever conferred by Georgia State College in the summer of 1968. The program, approved by the Board of Regents in recognition of the nation's need for trained economists in teaching, business and government positions, has grown from nineteen to thirty-six students. The faculty of the department has increased from thirteen to twenty-two members.

In conjunction with its Doctor of Philosophy program in its third year, the department has organized an Economics Society for both graduate and undergraduate majors. The department also sponsors an annual Conference on Economic Affairs and the Malanos Lecture series delivered by distinguished economists to students and faculty at Georgia State.

# FOREIGN LANGUAGES

## Two Quarters Of Work Finished In One With Fluency In Speech

The department has successfully started this year a special series in French, German, and Spanish in which two quarters' work is done in one quarter to attain greater fluency in a shorter period of time. 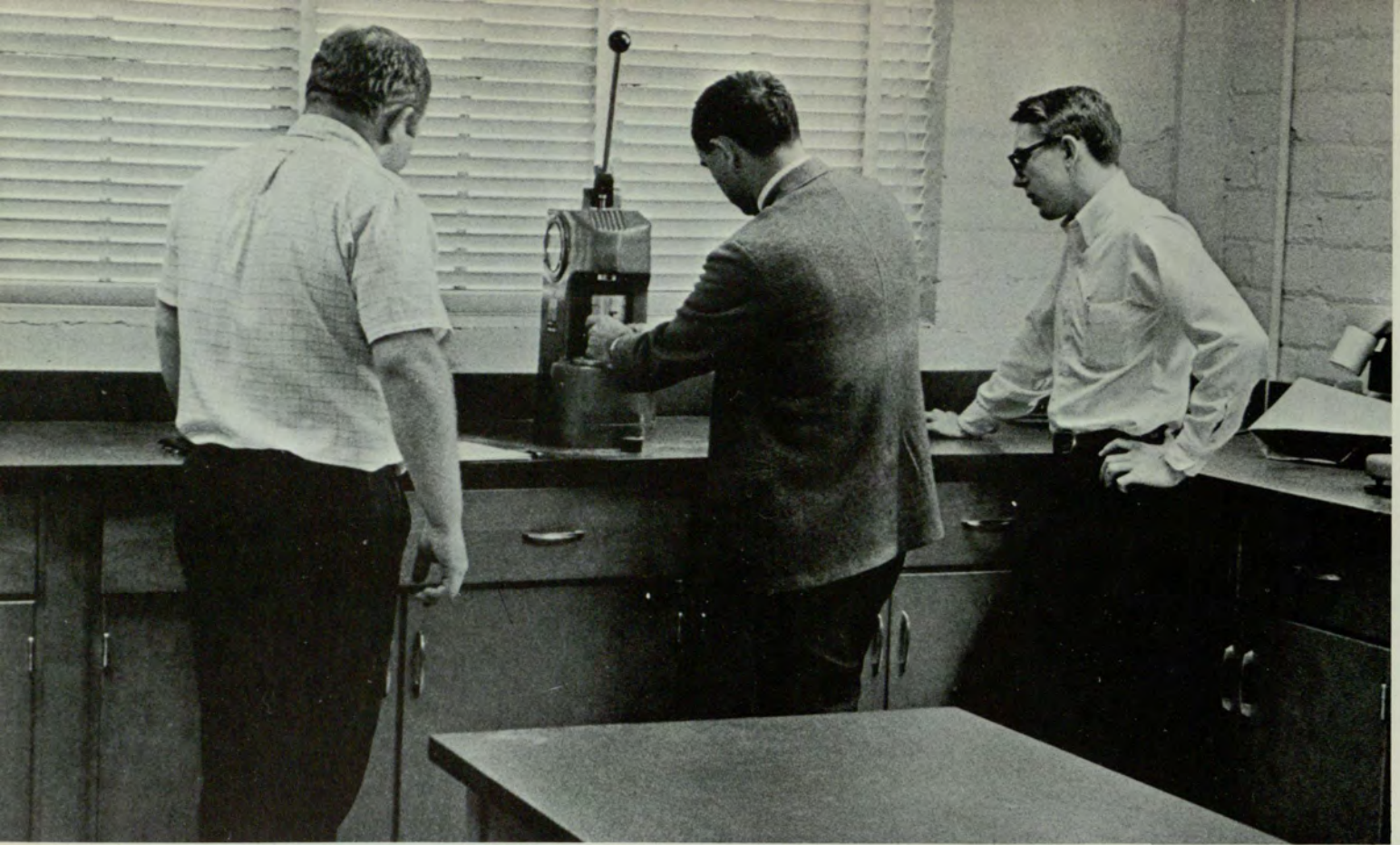

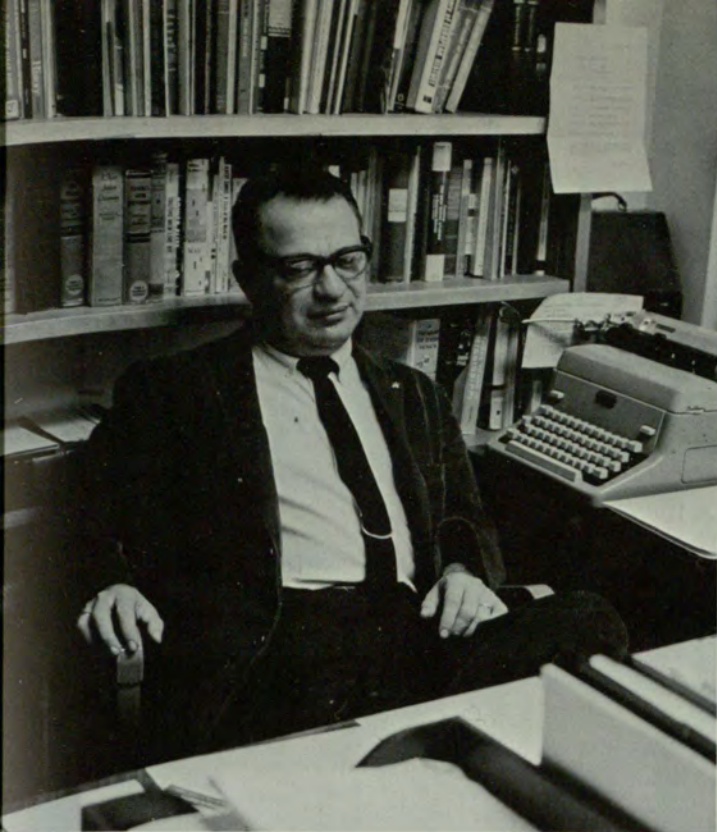


# HISTORY

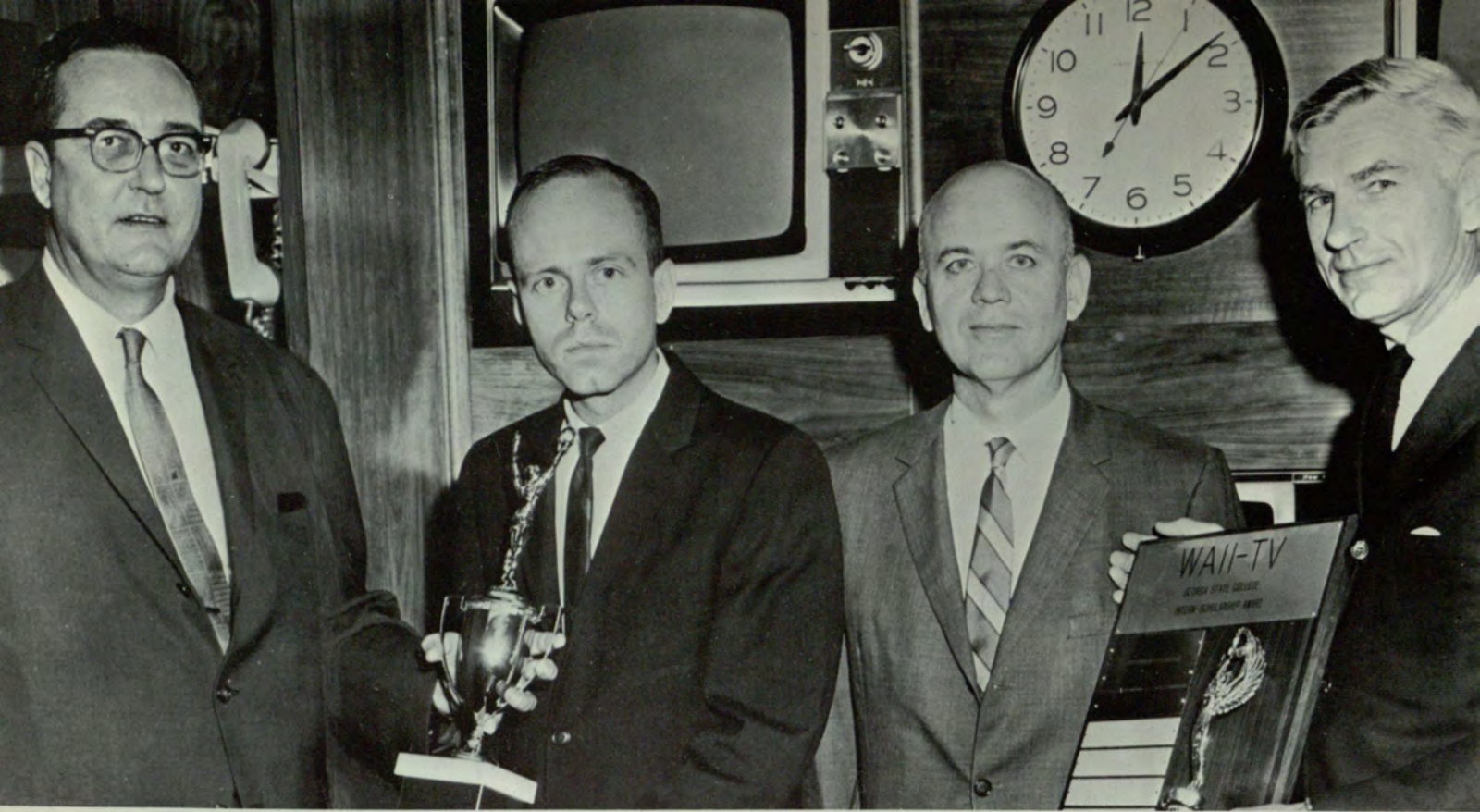

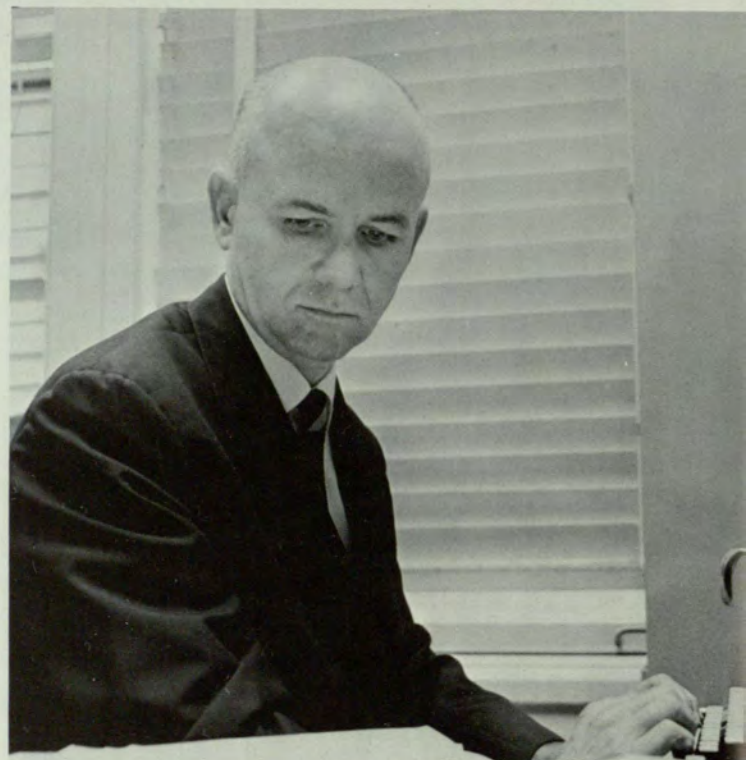

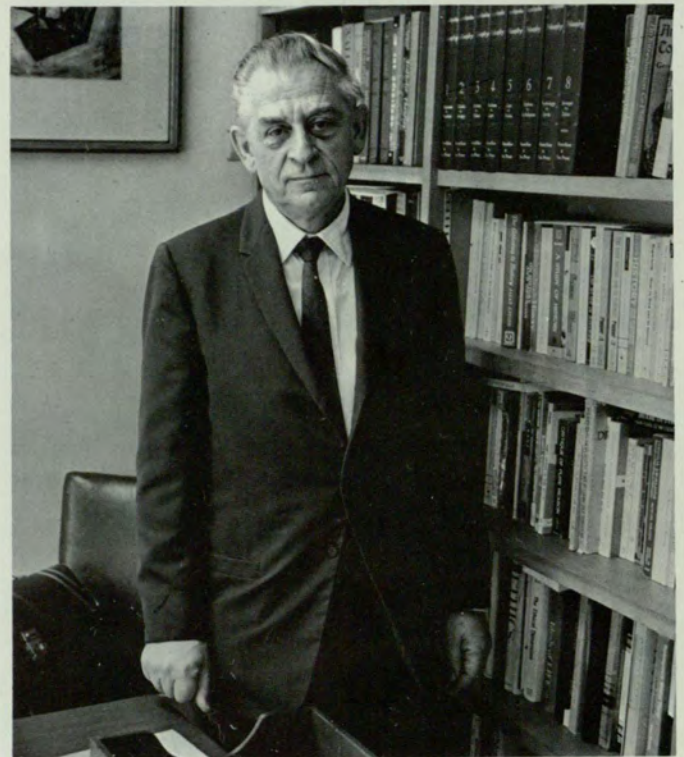
# PHILOSOPHY

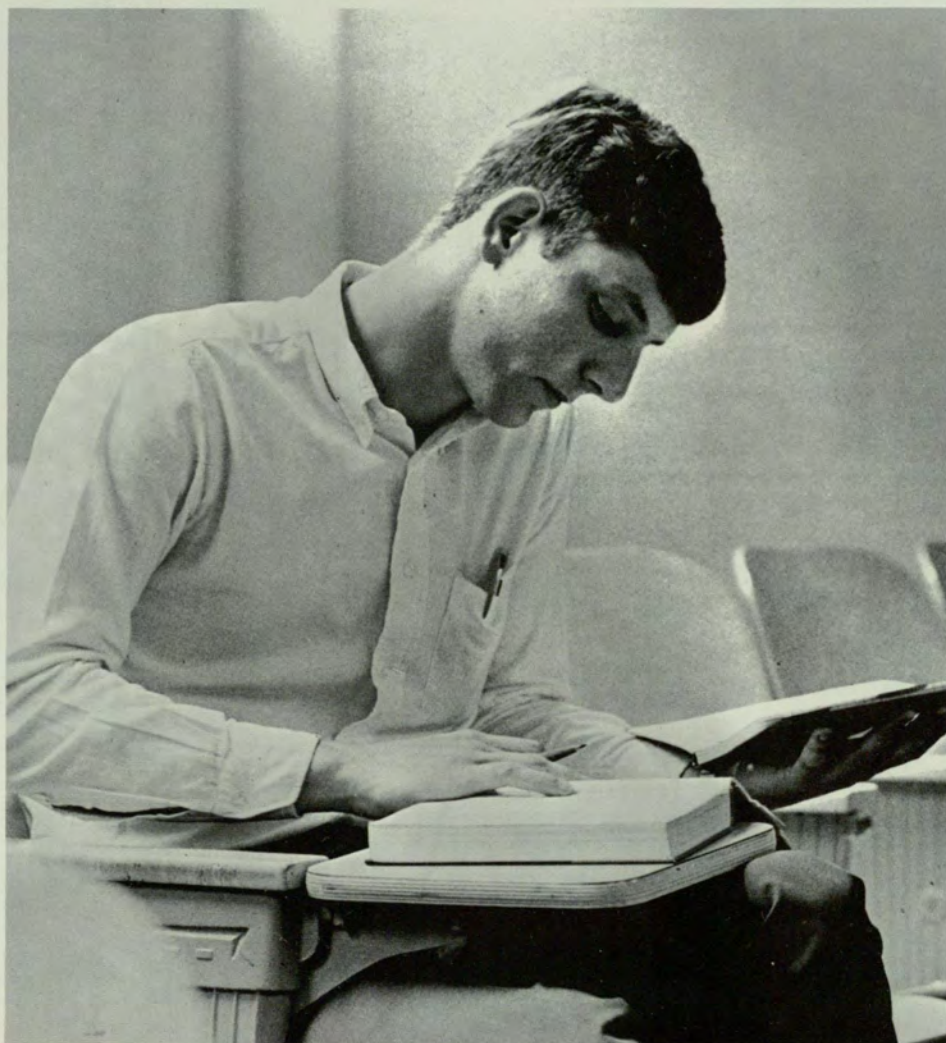
## Grants From Various Sources To Strengthen The Department

The Department of Physics, with the aid of a grant from the National Science Foundation has completely revamped the laboratories associated with the calculus-level beginning physics sequence.

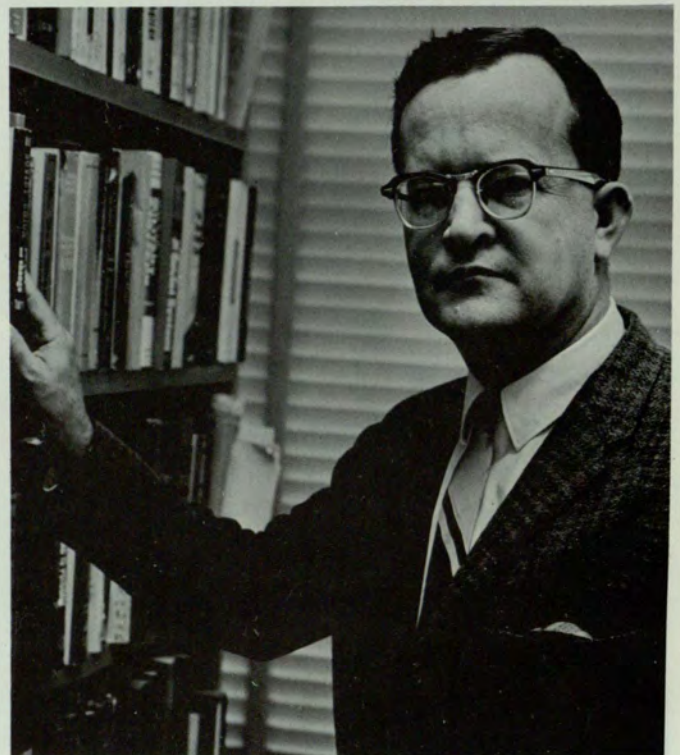

## Dr. Kline And Five Others Are Added To Department's Faculty

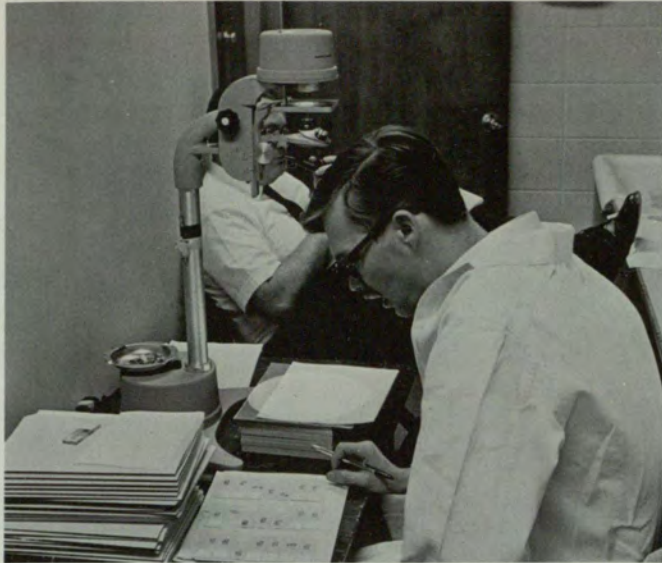

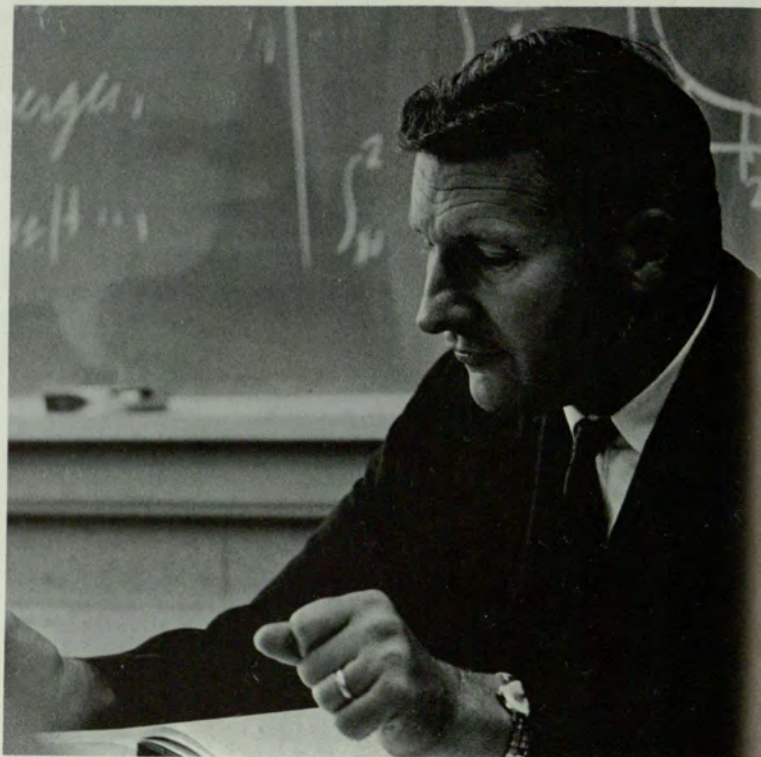

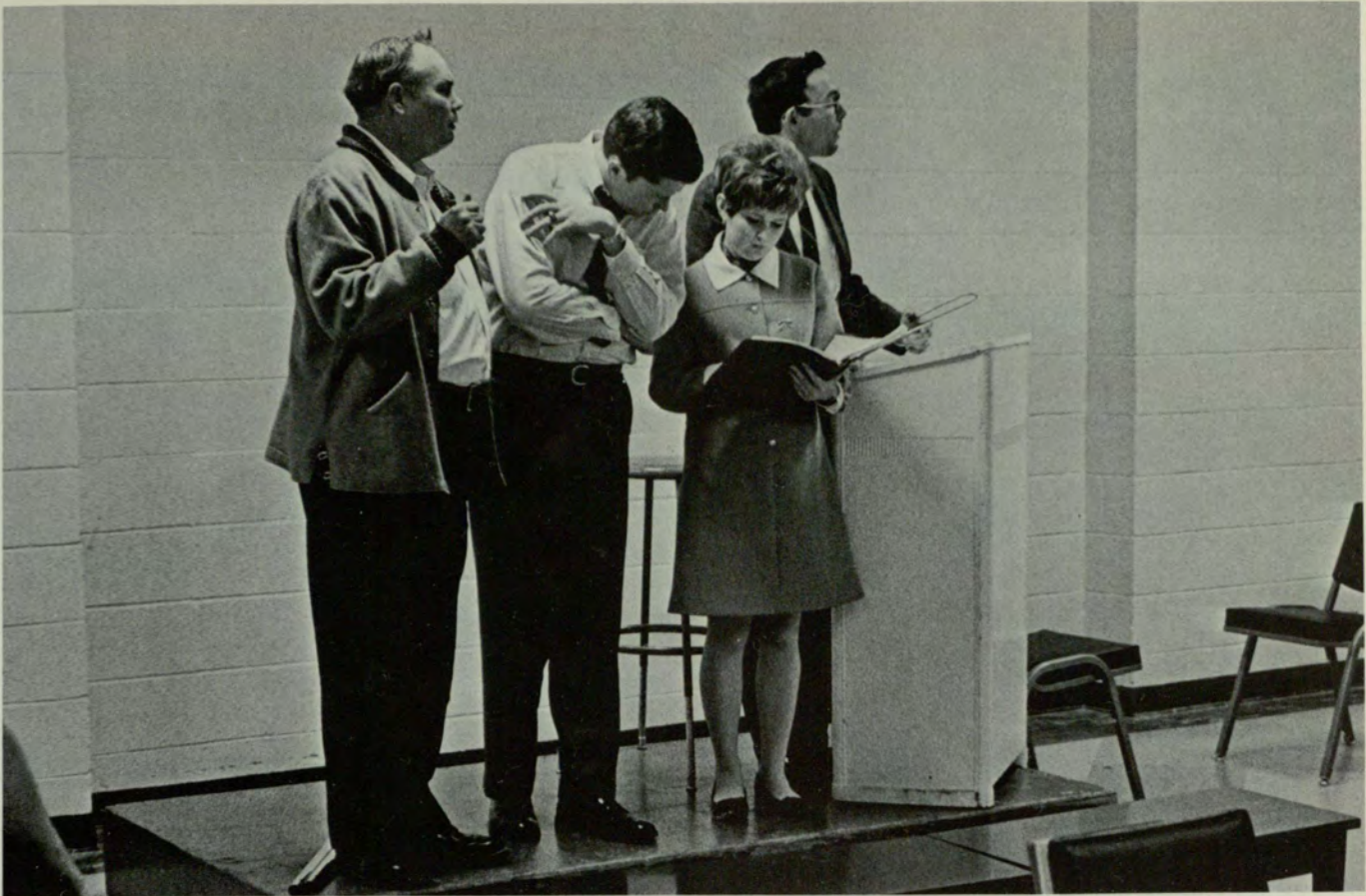

## Graduate Program Is Expanded And Additions Made To Faculty

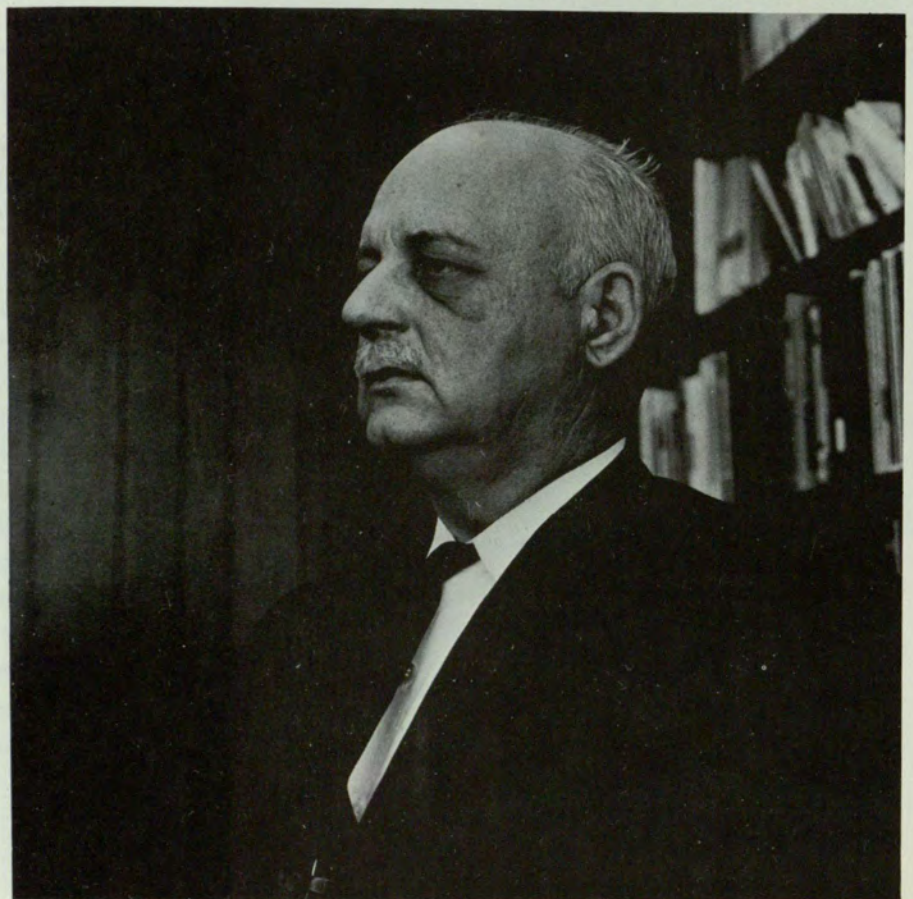

During this year our computer capacity has expanded with the addition of an IBM 1401 that has already been put into operation.

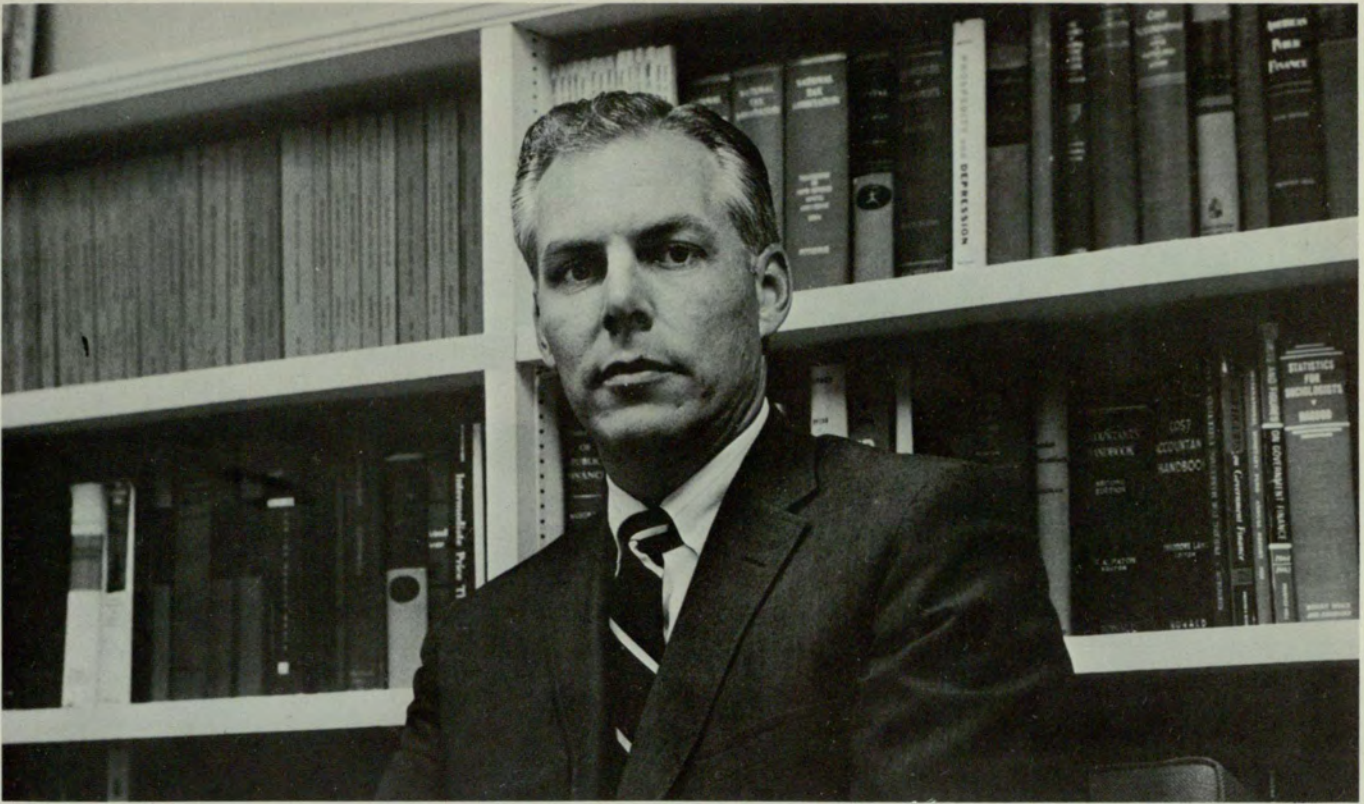

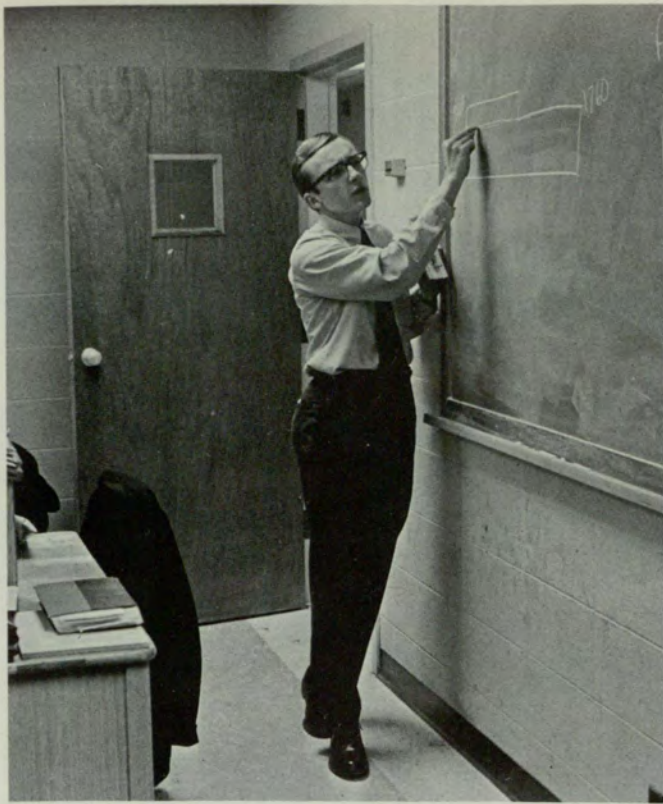

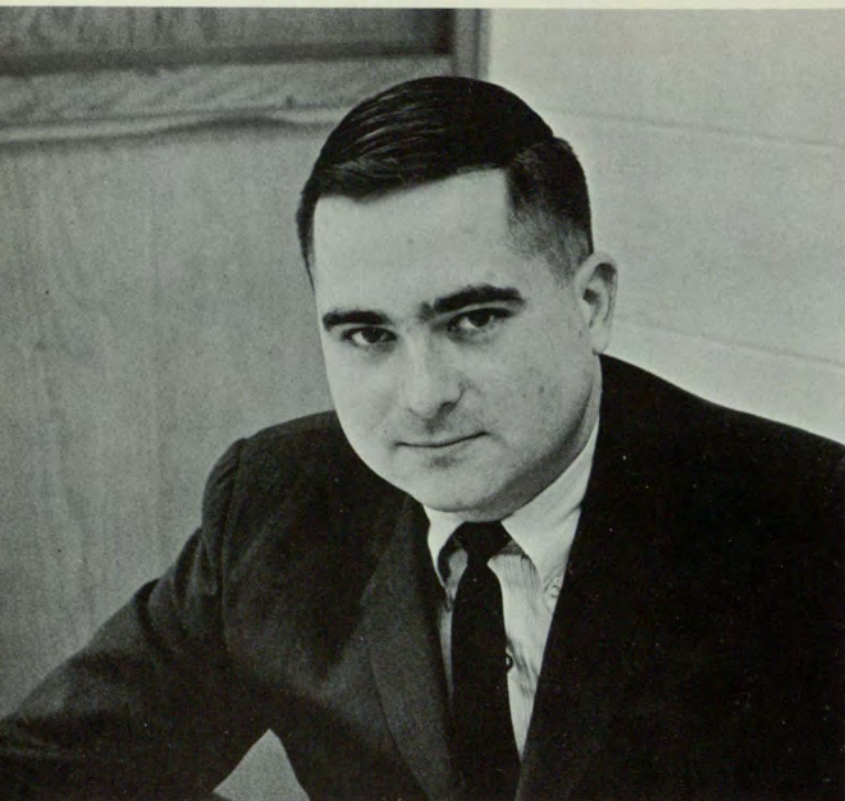
## FINANCE

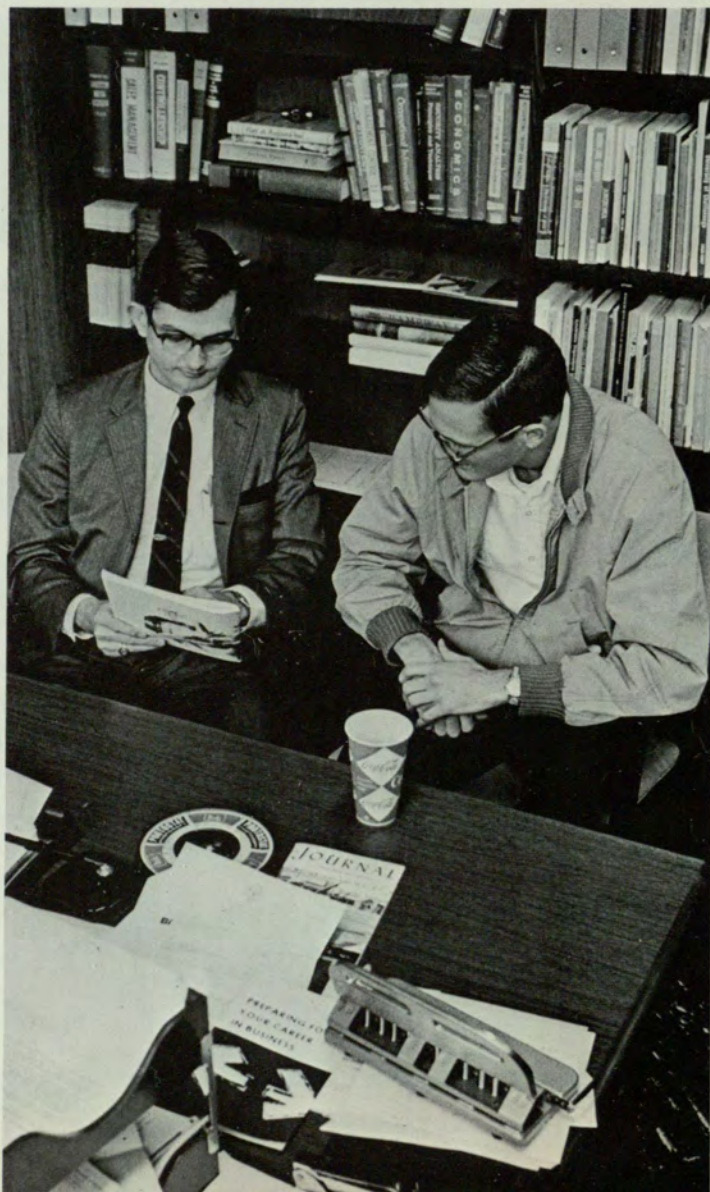

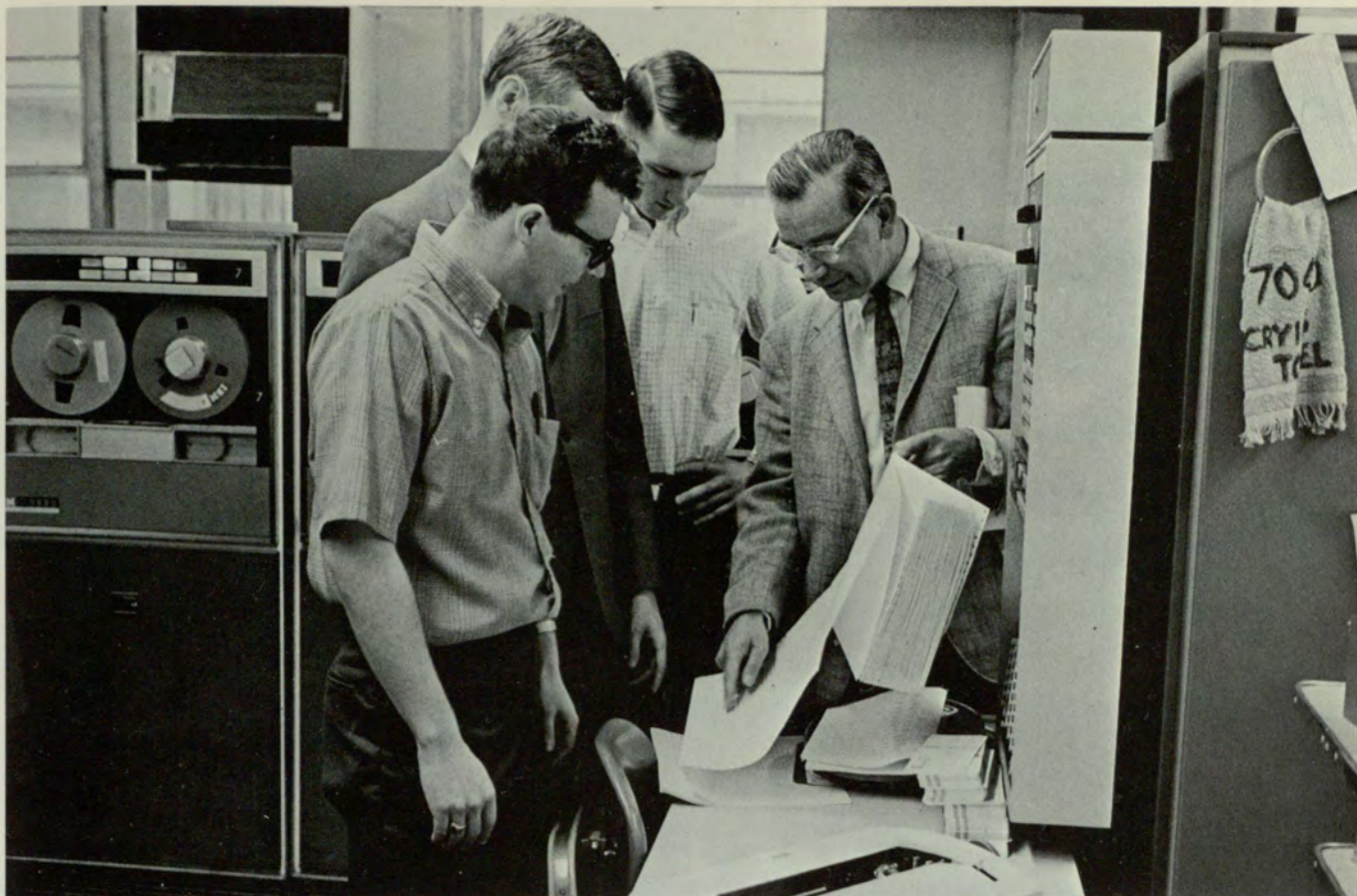

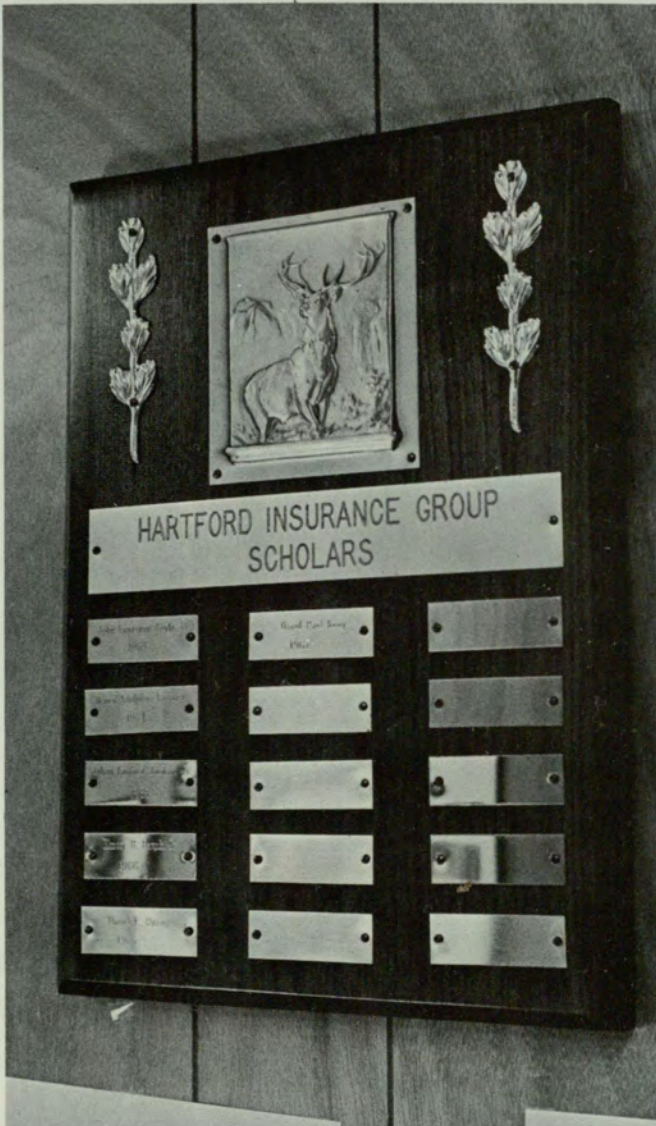
## Department Initiates Master Program And Gets Consultant

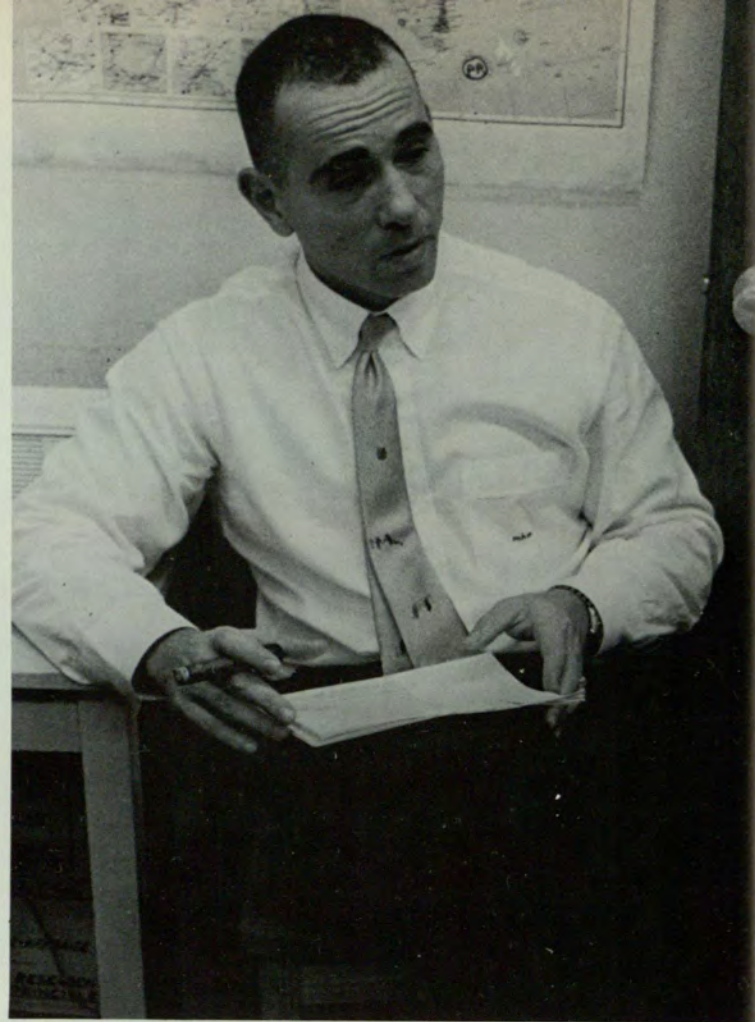

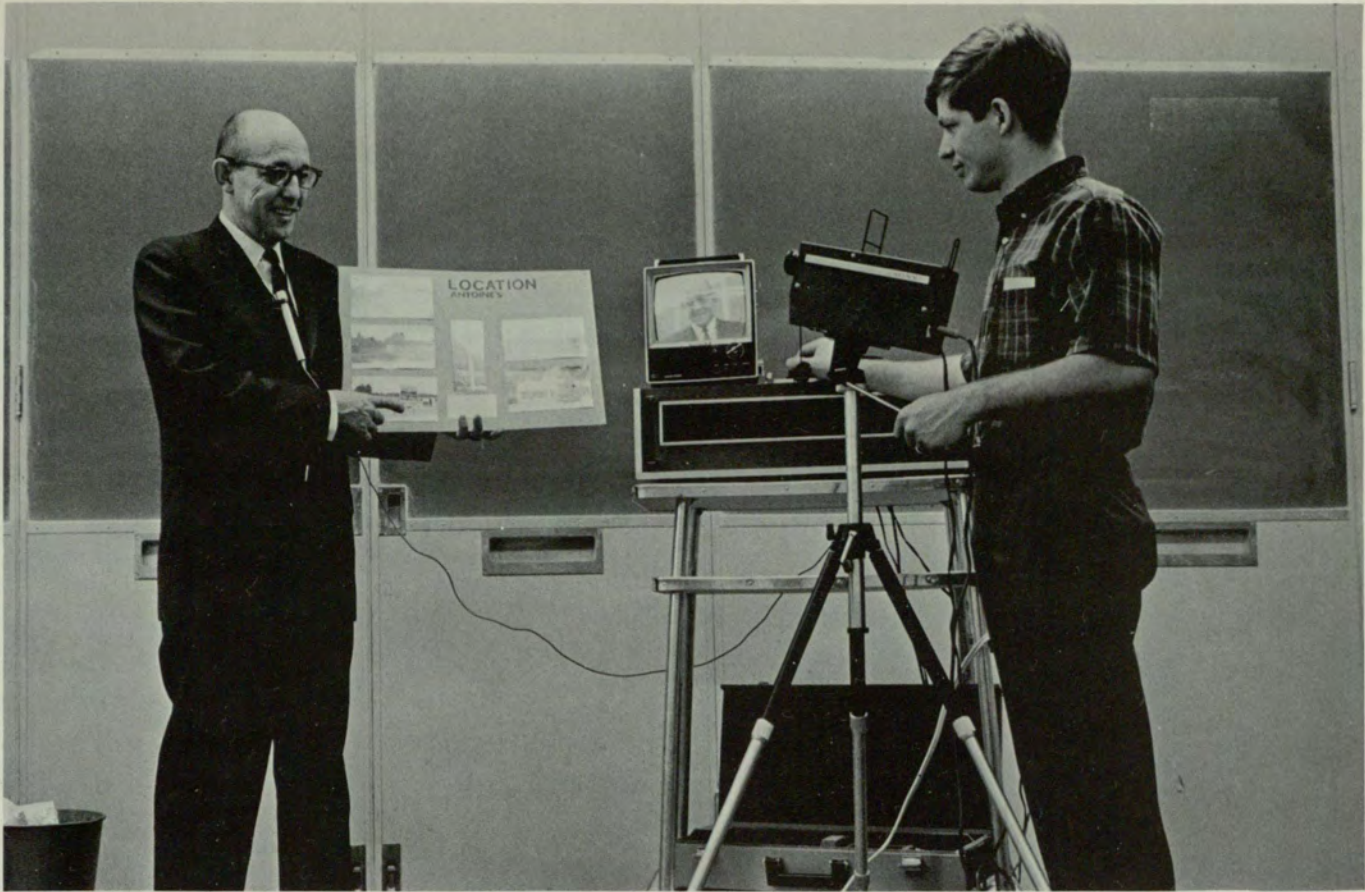

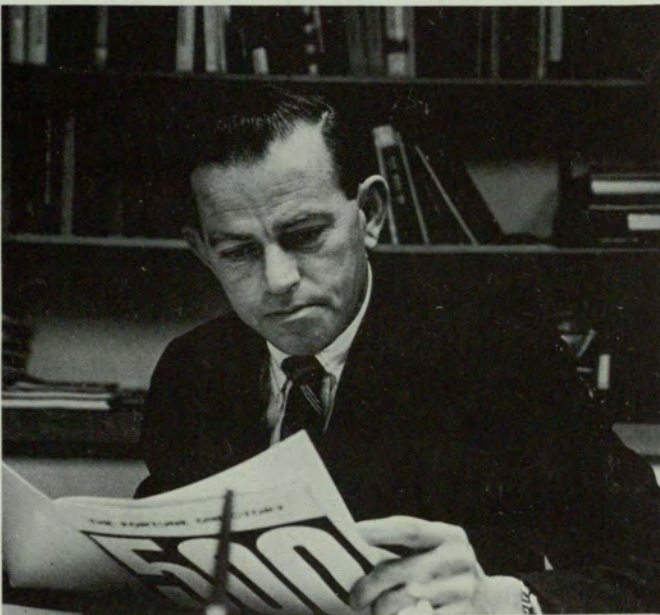

This year Georgia State's Marketing Department inaugurated special instruction in creative communication. The instructional vehicle is two Sony Closed Circuit TV Units. These are used as tools to help marketing students improve the persuasive skills in realistic selling situations.

Although nervous at first, students soon learned to overcome fears associated with communicating in public situations. The net result is more poise, self-assurance and command over others, and overall greater personal effectiveness.

The Marketing Department continues to offer a well-rounded education via courses, cases, projects, discussions, and talks presented by staff members.

# QUAN. METHODS

## Department In Second Year Is Now The Largest In The Nation

The Department of Quantitative Methods entered into its second year of existence with a faculty more than twice the size of last year's. On the national scene, the department is now the largest in the nation. In addition to consultation services being offered to schools throughout the country on curricula development and recruitment practices, the department has undertaken the project of teaching faculties in schools of business, the mathematical decision making field.

On the local scene, dramatic innovations in the curricula at the bachelors, masters and doctoral levels are being implemented, and, as a result, Georgia State College is producing people sophisticated in an entirely new branch of quantitative analysis.

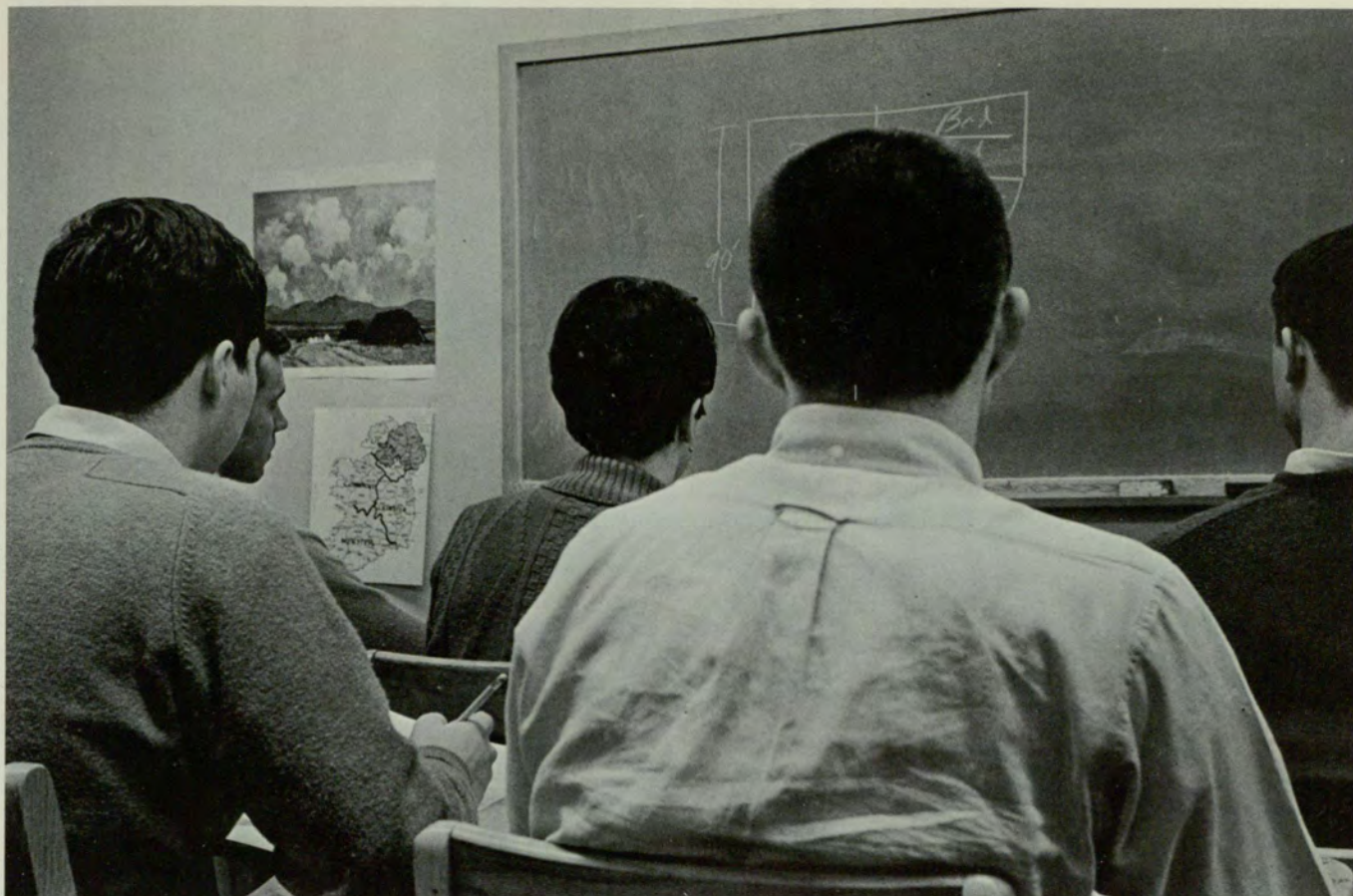

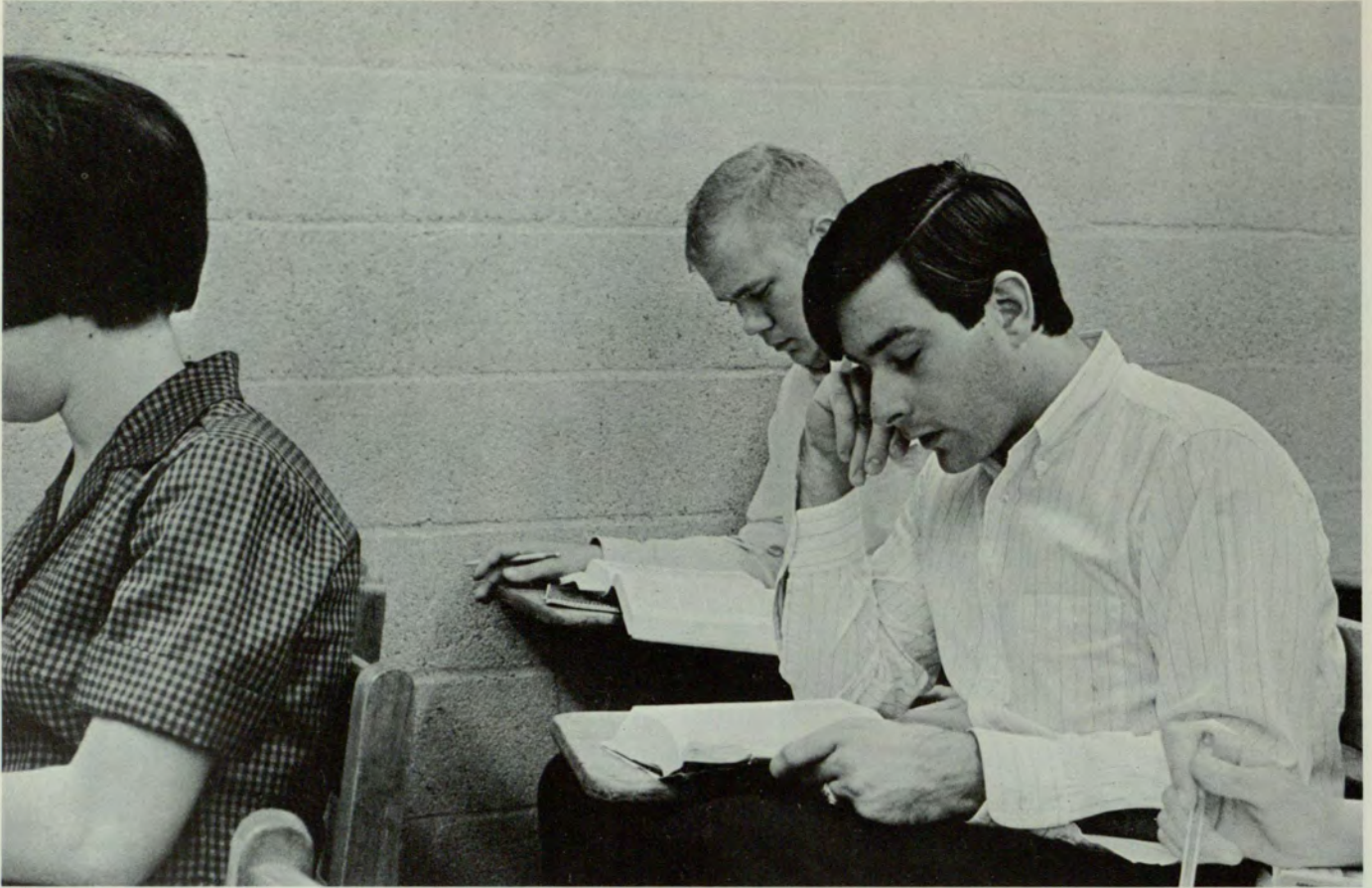
## REAL ESTATE

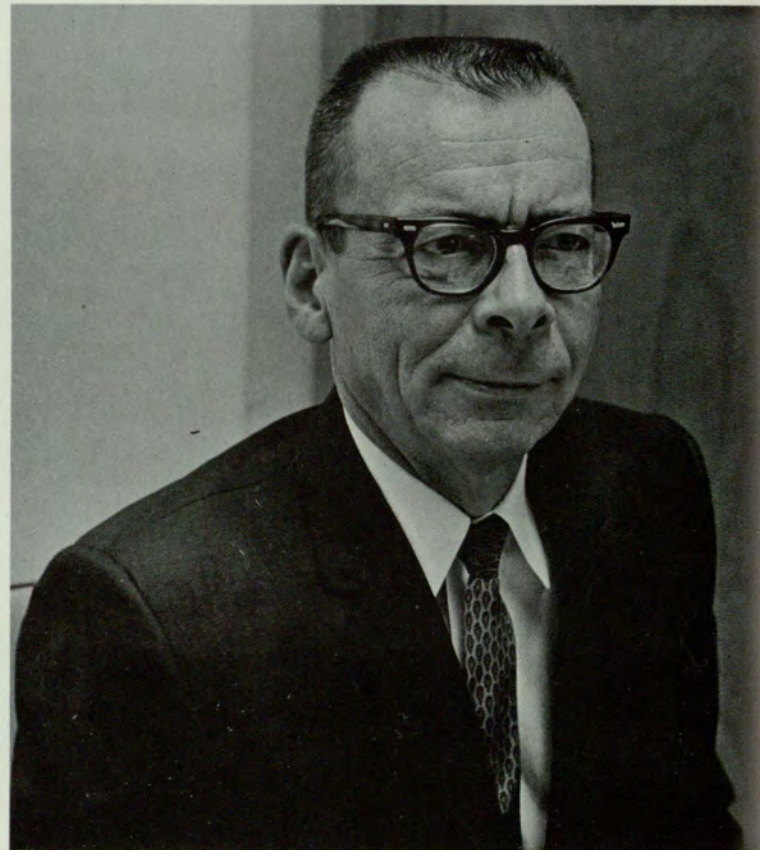

## EDUCATION

### New Curriculum Has Been Added With Emphasis On Development

In January 1967, the Board of Regents approved a School of Education for Georgia State, to be effective in September 1967. Authorization was given to develop programs leading to the doctorate. This has been a busy year with the faculty working to develop new programs and expanding present ones. Growth has been quite rapid in the fields of elementary education, special education, and counseling.

Special emphasis is being given to the development of more adequate curriculum facilities, and equipment for practical experiences for students. The acquisition of video tape equipment promises to improve the quality of professional preparation of teachers and other specialized personnel in this growing field.

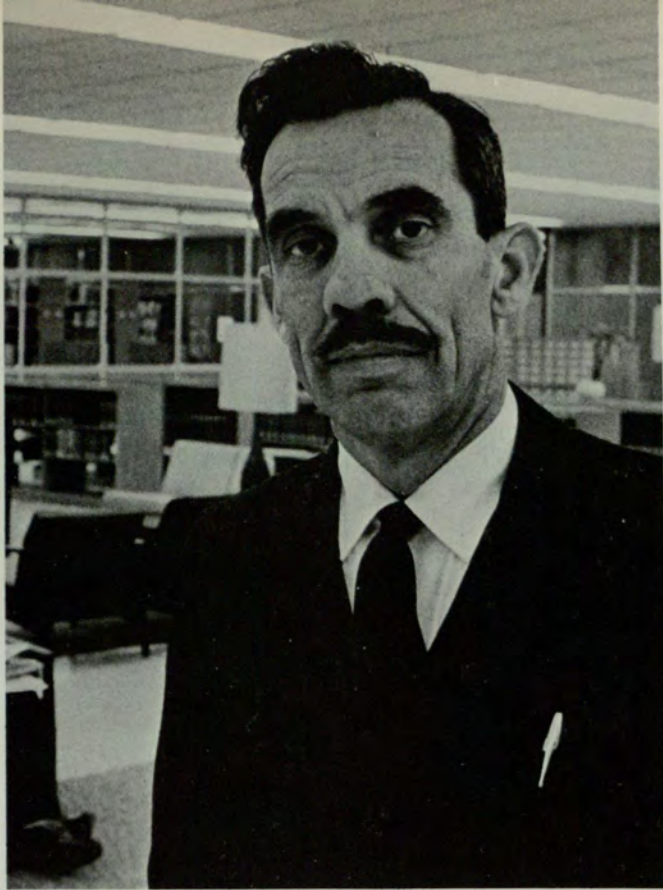
### Pre-Service And In-Service Courses Are Now Available

Completion of the new physical education building is expected sometime in 1970; it will house not only physical education facilities but also facilities for an expanded intercollegiate program for Ga. State.

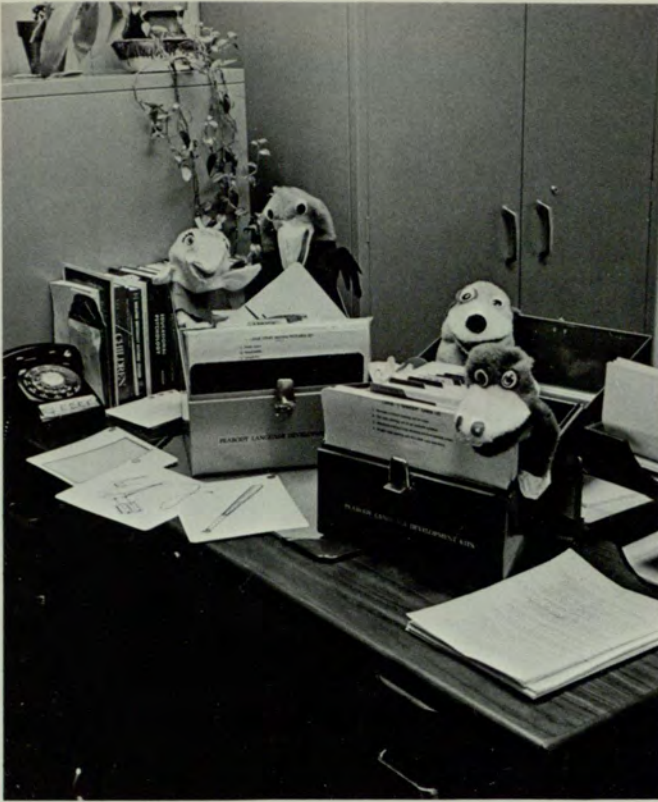

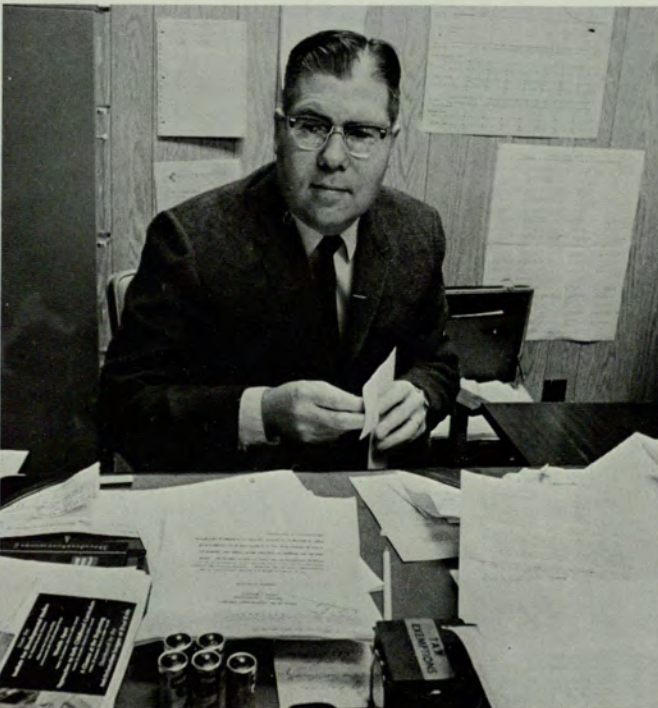

## SPECIAL EDUCATION

### Specialists In The Field For Child With Learning Problems

The Department of Special Education trains teaching specialists for children who need modifications in their capacity. These children may have learning disabilities, may be emotionally maladjusted or physically handicapped in varying degrees, or may be homebound during a convalescence. Major courses in Learning Disabilities, Mental Retardation, and Behavioral Disorders with core courses in Education are offered. On trips to rehabilitation centers, hospitals and residence homes, the students can meet with and observe special education teachers, psychologists, psychiatrists, and other specialists in the field.

## Become A Competent Secretary In New Four Quarters Program

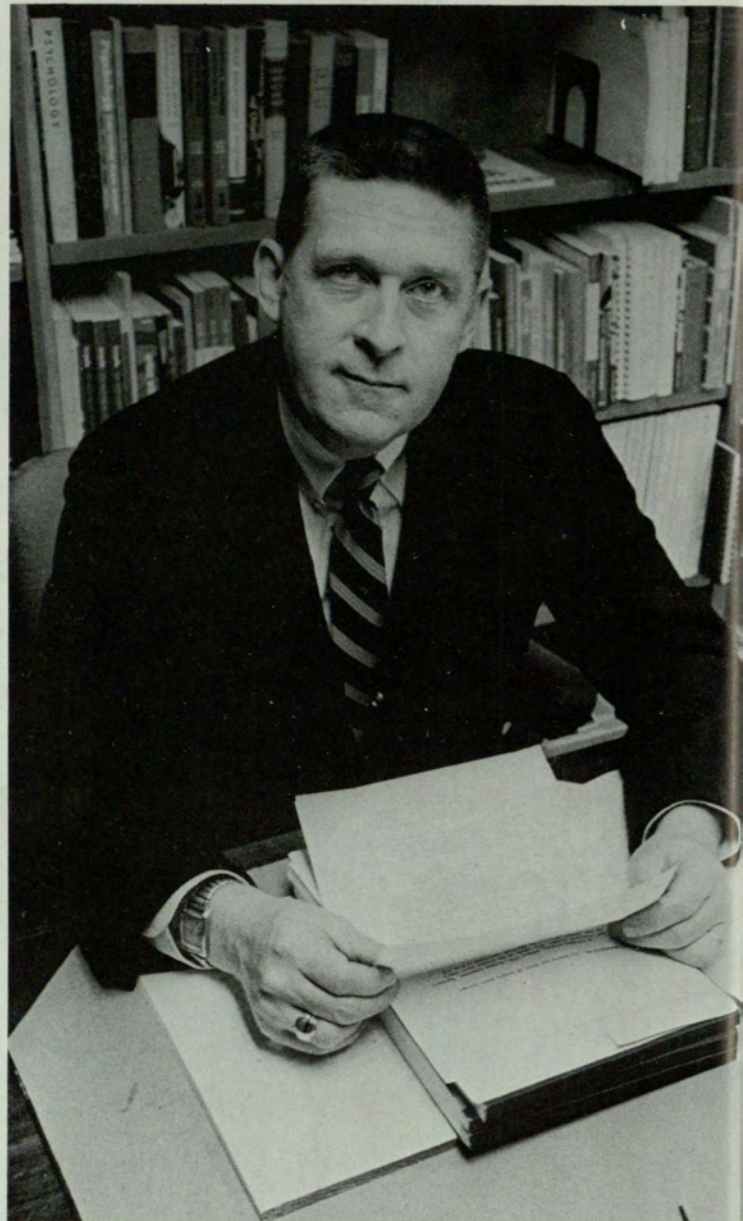
Two rather new features of the School of Special Studies that warrant special mention are the one year certificate program and the reading language courses.

He was a man of intelligence who could talk with a student about the principal subjects and conditions of life.

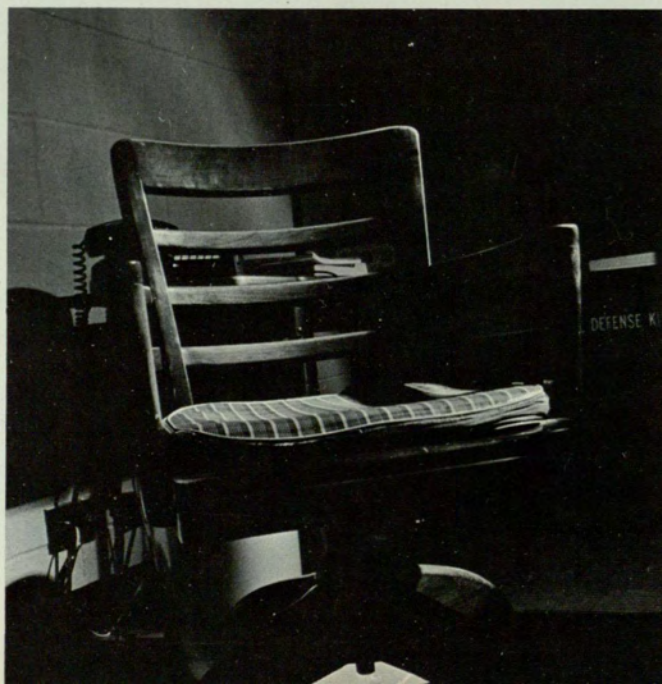
He was a man of integrity whose word, in an old-fashioned phrase, was his bond. Each student who dealt with him recognized his honesty.

Colonel William Paul David enriched life for those who had the privilege to know him.







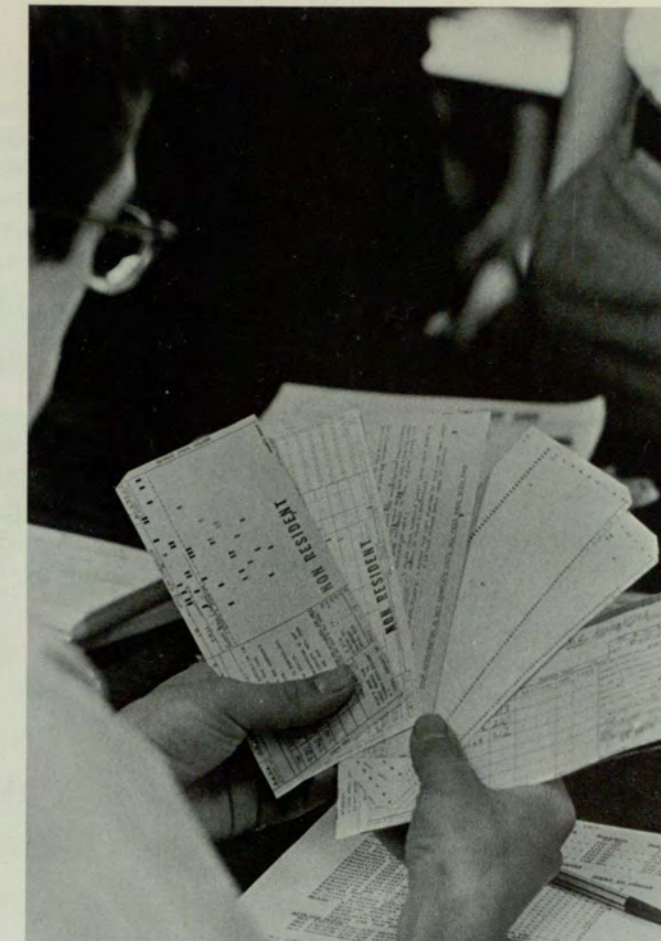

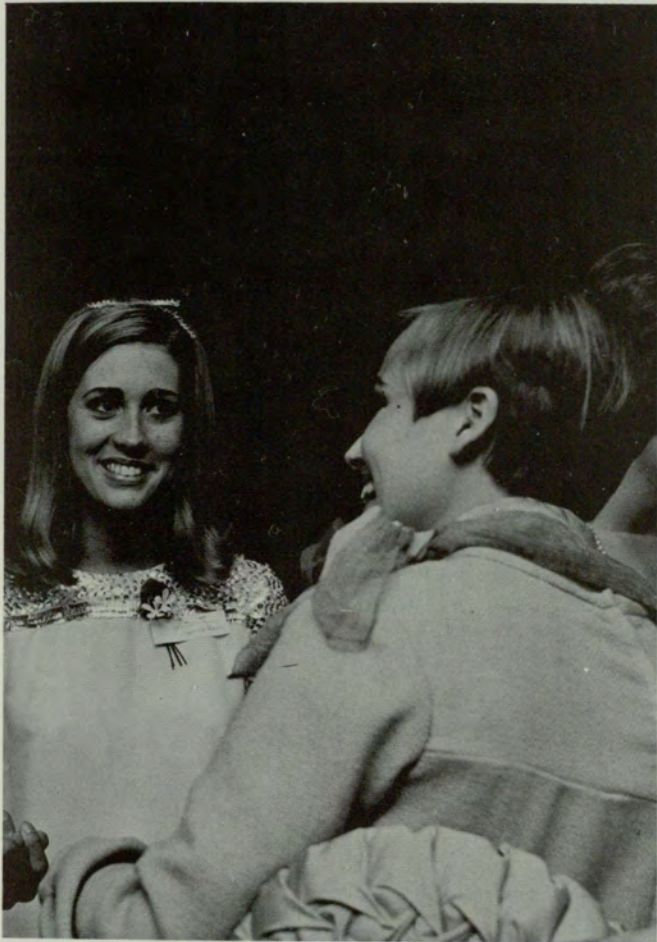

## HEALTH REGULATIONS REQUIRE YOU TO

# WASH YOUR HANDS

## BEFORE RETURNING TO WORK

No person who is affected with any disease in a communicable form or is a carrier of such disease shall work in any restaurant, and no restaurant shall employ any such person or any person suspected of being affected with any disease in a communicable form or of being a carrier of such disease. If the restaurant manager suspects that any employee has contracted any disease in a communicable form or has become a carrier of such disease he shall notify the health officer immediately. A placard containing this section shall be posted in all toilet rooms.

No person with any disease in a communicable form, or who is a carrier of such disease, shall work at any dairy farm, or milk plant in any capacity which brings him into contact with the production, handling, storage, or transportation of milk, milk products, containers, or equipment; and no dairy farm or milk plant shall employ in any such capacity any such person, or any person suspected of having any disease in a communicable form, or of being a carrier of such disease. Any producer or distributor of milk or milk products upon whose dairy farm, or in whose milk plant, any communicable disease occurs, or who suspects that any employee has contracted any disease in a communicable form or has become a carrier of such disease, shall notify the health officer immediately.

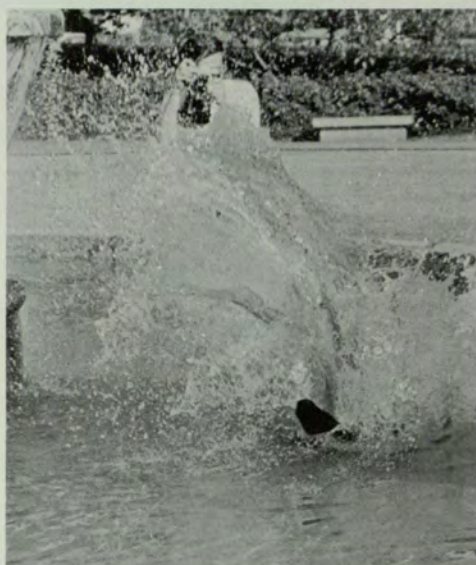

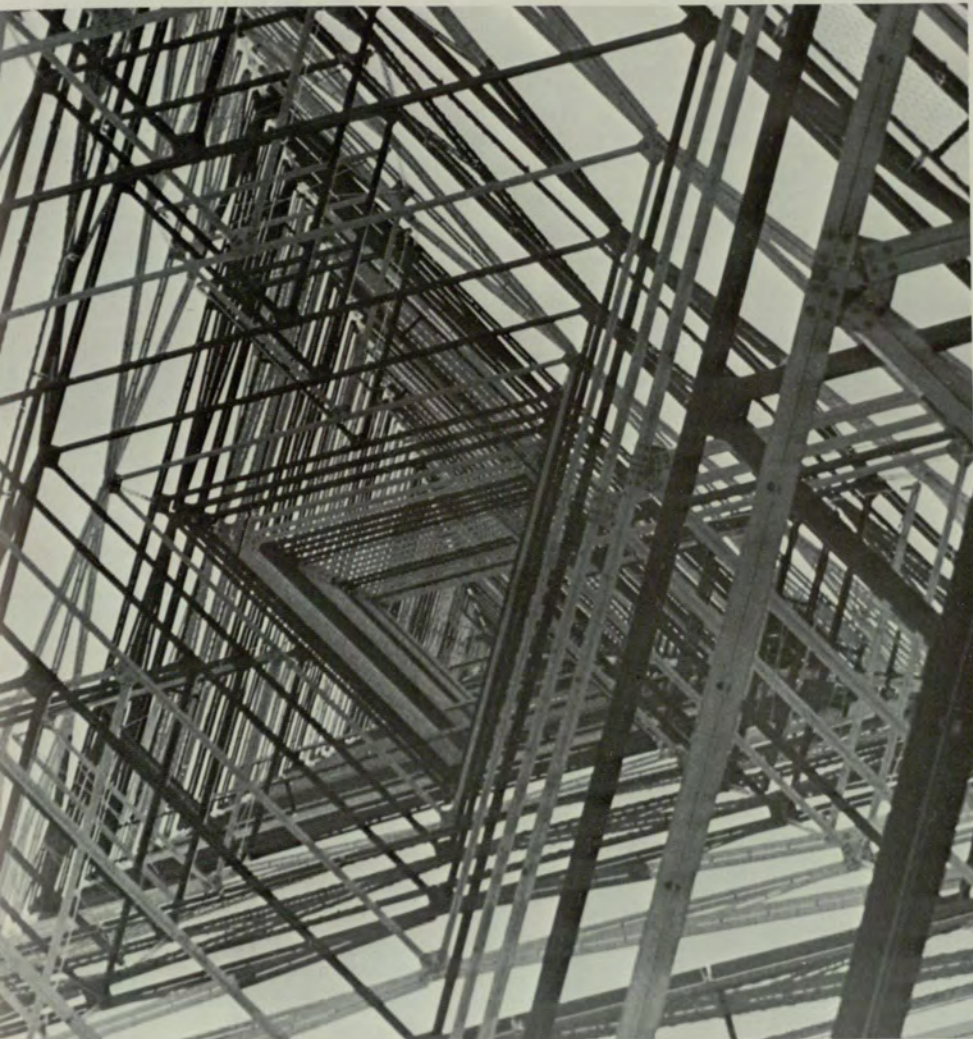
