Some of these night clubs feature a live disc jockey from a local radio station; for example, Gary McKee from WQXI radio often spins records at Jeryl's at Powers Ferry Crossing along the perimeter outside Atlanta. 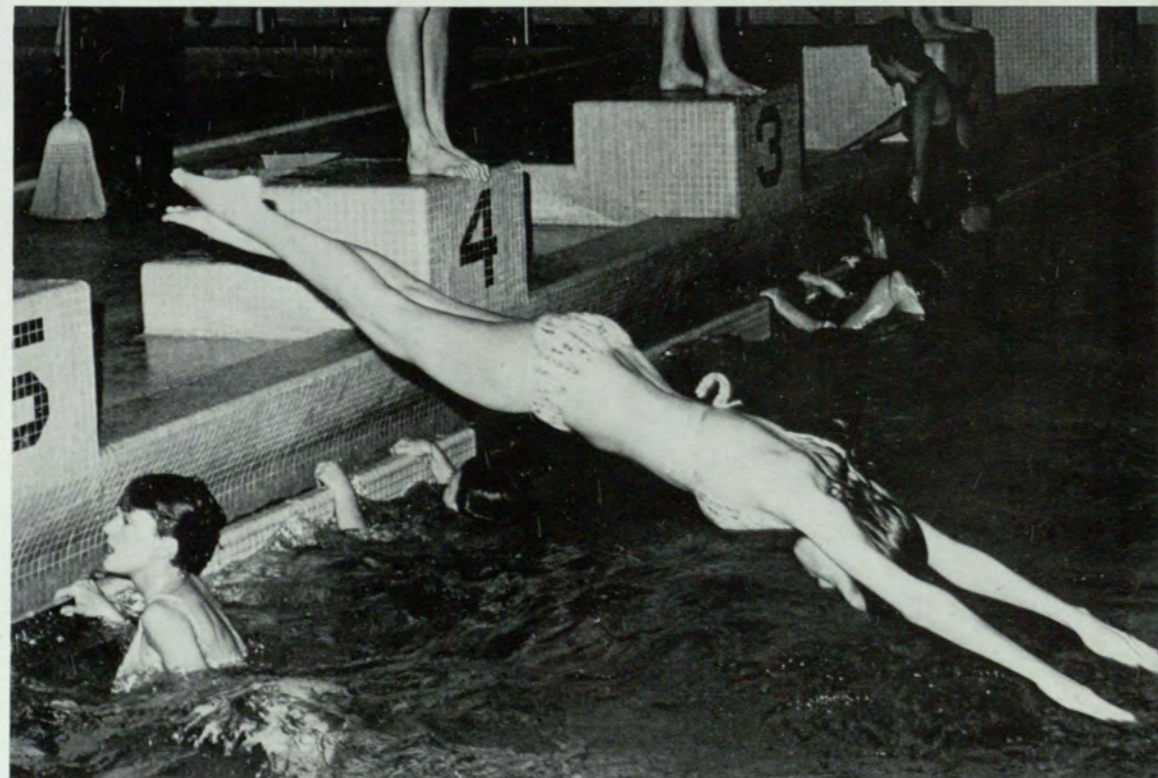
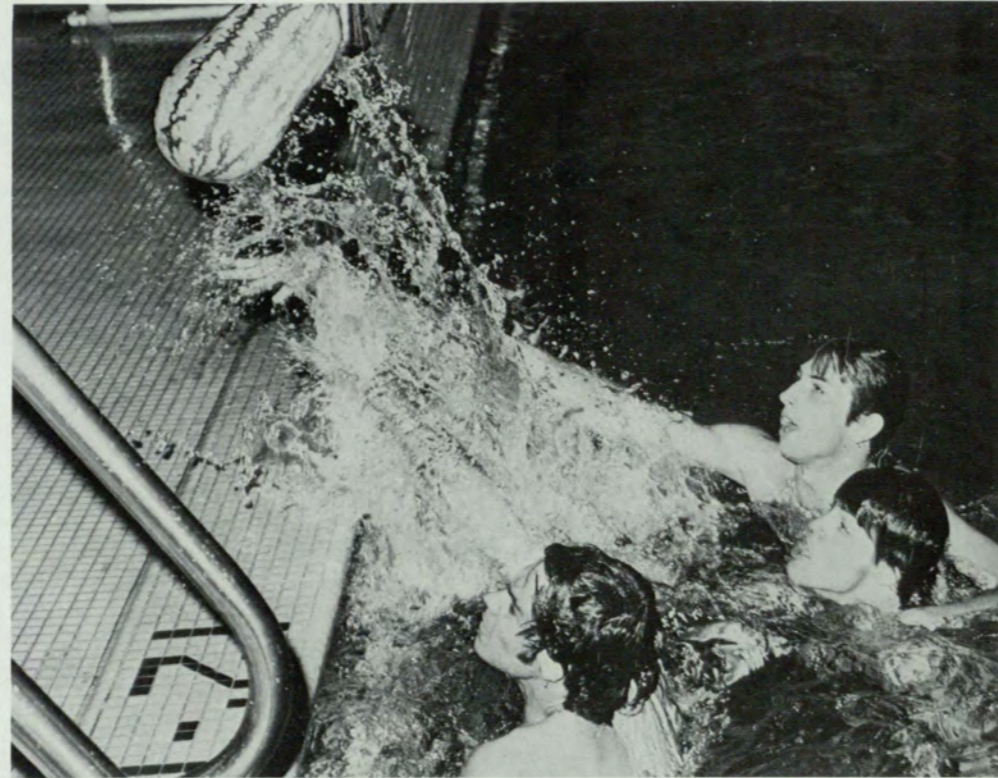
## Aquatic Games Cool Heated Greek Week Competition

While that went on, the sororities held a relay race at the other end of the building in the swimming pool.

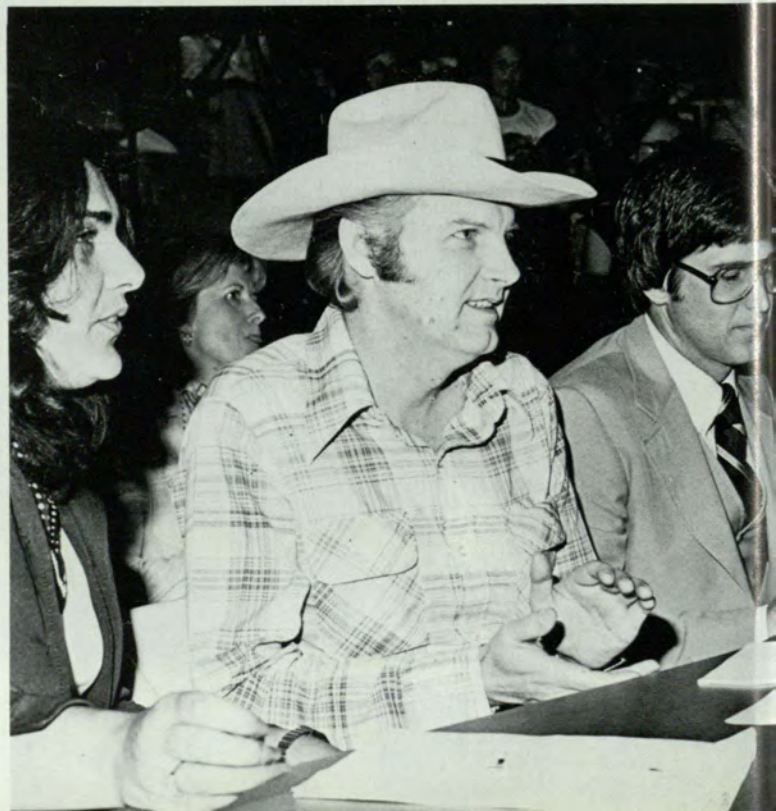

## Hurt Park Hosts Paraquat Protest

It was just like the good old days, the wonderful sixties full of riots and sit-ins and alleged "drug-oriented" rock and roll music. A smoke-in at Hurt Park right across from the A&M building was staged by Atlantans in an effort to make officials stop spraying crops with the chemical paraquat. Uniformed policemen were literally everywhere around Hurt Park, some on foot, some on horseback. Some plainclothes policemen were in the crowd that was listening to Cruis-O-Matic play "Born to Be Wild." The Coalition for the Abolition of Marijuana Prohibition (CAMP) organized the demonstration which included a march down Courtland Street to the capitol and signs that proclaimed "We smoke pot. We like it a lot. Stop spraying it with paraquat."

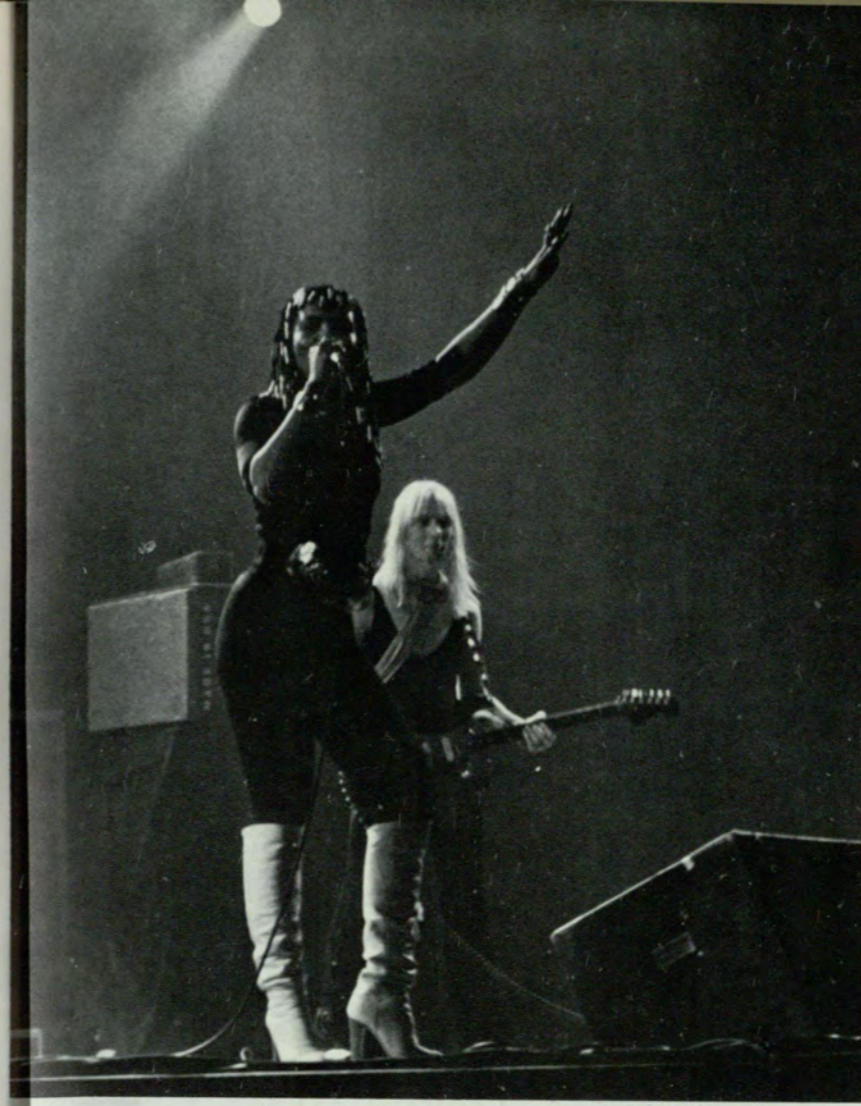

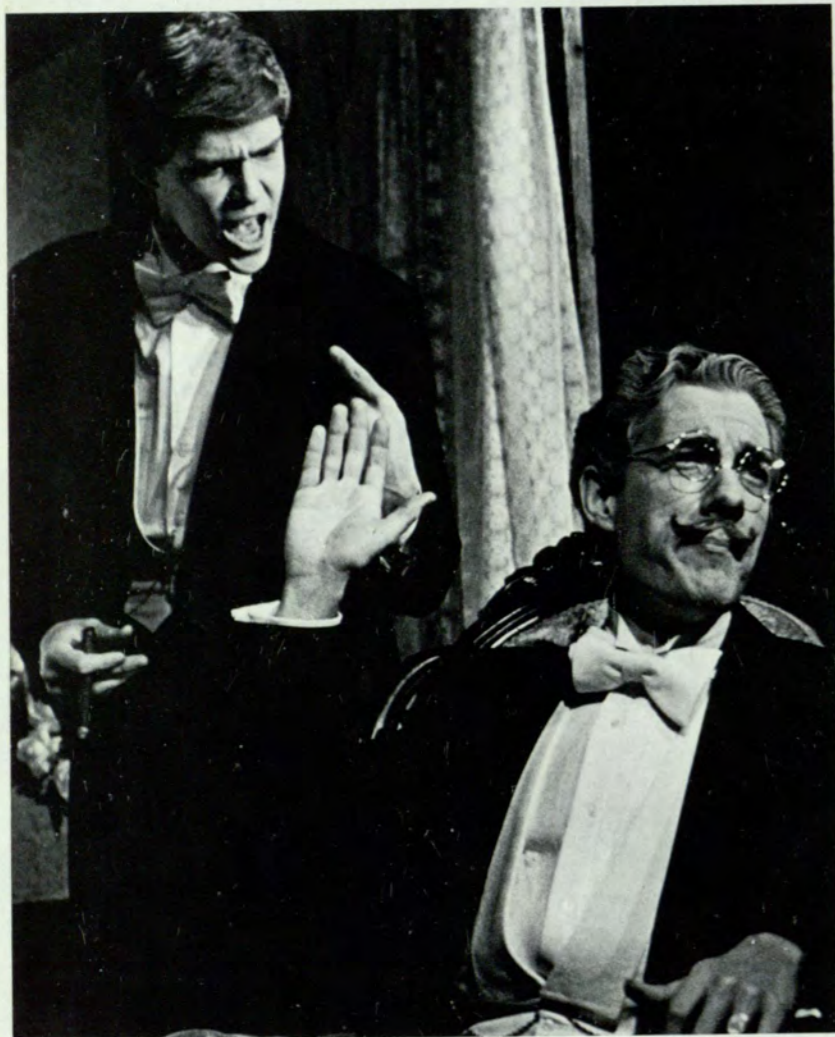
## "Little Foxes" Produced for Spring

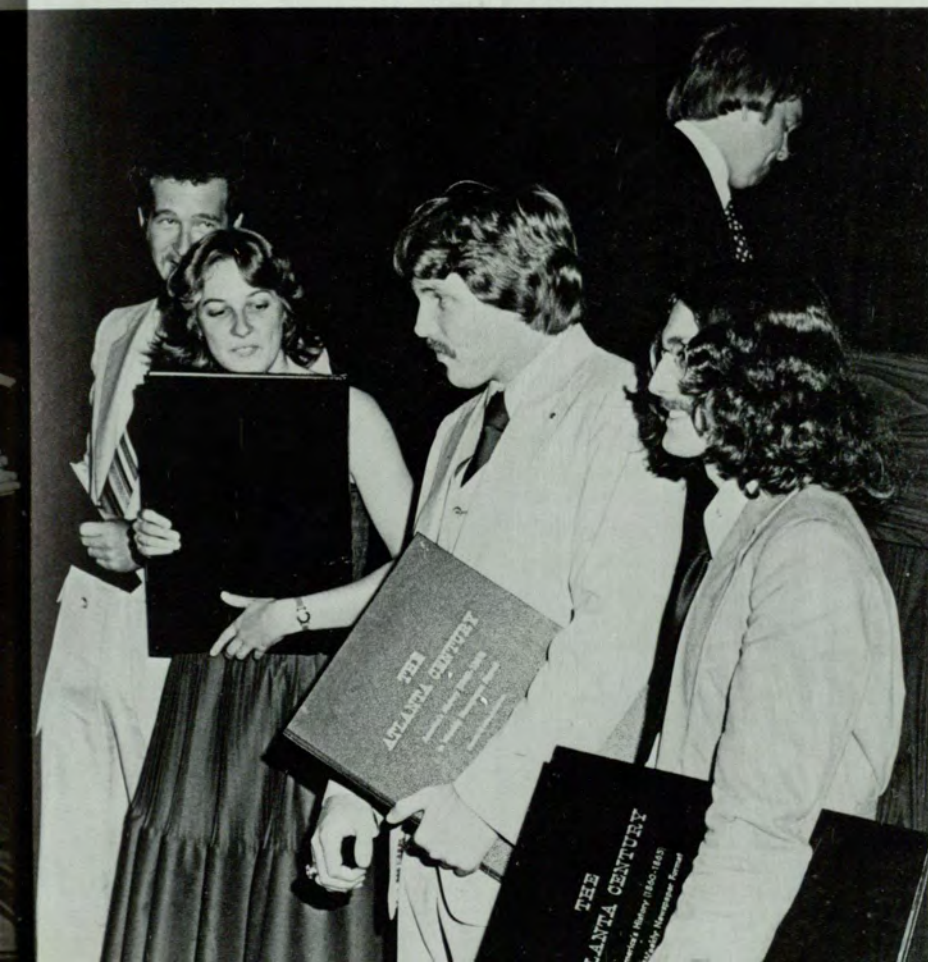

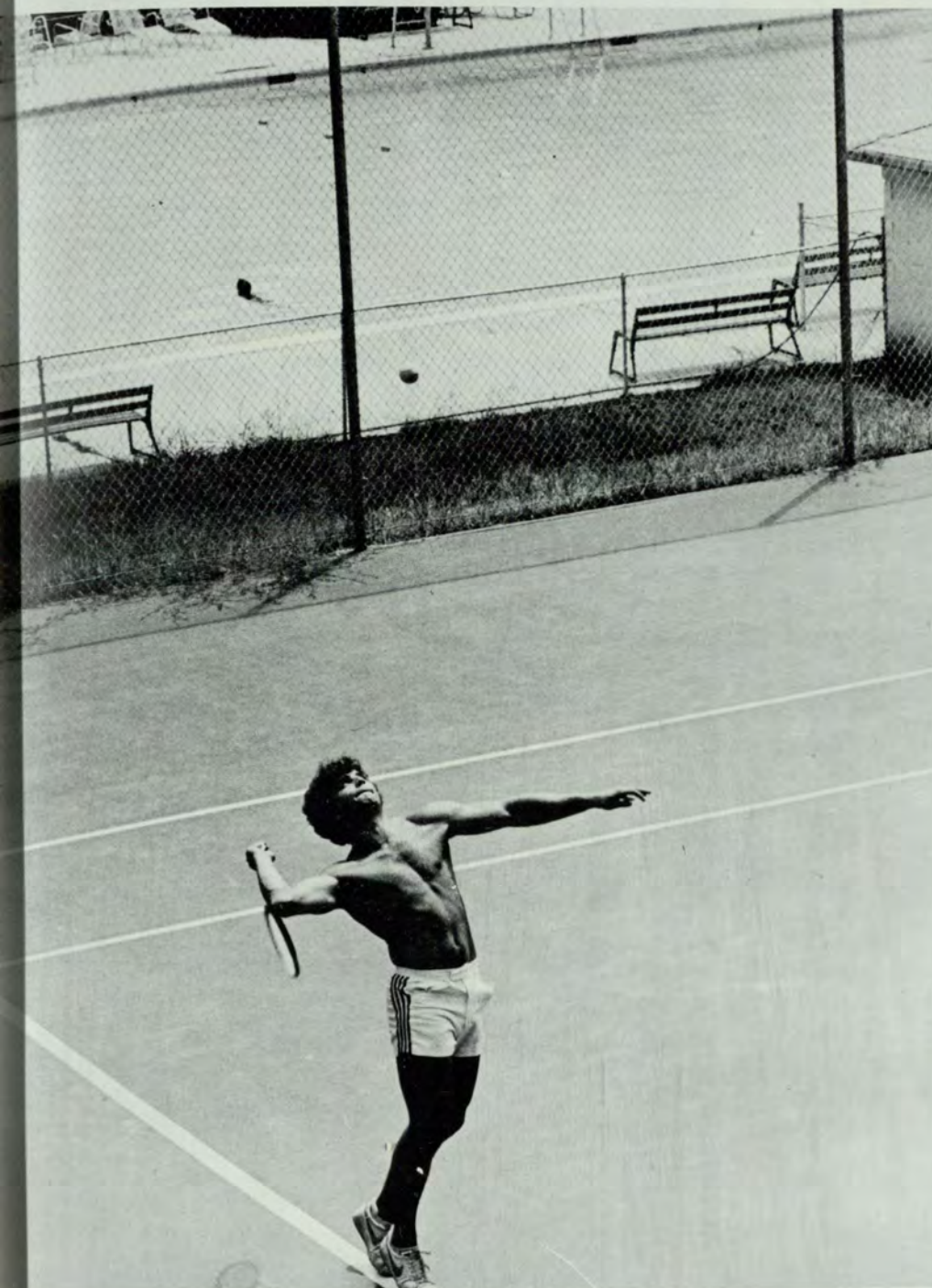
During the summer GSU students, faculty and staff frequented the Indian Creek Lodge which is a GSU recreational facility located in DeKalb County. All Georgia State University approved organizations, as well as faculty, staff and alumni groups may reserve the lodge for their own planned activities. The Lodge has tennis courts, a swimming pool, picnic areas, and ideal locations for badminton and volleyball.

Last summer a major controversy was finally settled when the student activity fee was increased from ten dollars to thirteen dollars. Before this final decision, however, there was much debate and involvement by students and administration. The athletics department appeared to be generally in favor of the three dollar increase, which was originally planned to be a five dollar increase, because they felt the money could help build a more competitive sports program. Many students, however, were opposed to a fee increase of any amount because they claimed that they did not participate in that many programs planned for GSU students. Most campus organizations were generally agreeable to the increase because they felt it would enable them to operate with a more realistic budget due to inflation. Since the increase has come to pass, GSU has been able to continue offering a wide variety of entertainment and discounts for students.

Another issue raised was whether or not we would get a pub on campus. Apparently, not yet. The Student Government Association rejected a bill that would have recommended the sale of alcoholic beverages on campus. It was close — the bill was defeated by a 10-11 vote, with one abstention. So, Georgia State students still have to walk to the Ivy Street Library to enjoy "Happy Hour."

In an effort to be closer to students "Feedback" boxes were put around campus by the SGA during summer quarter last year. These were to solicit comments and complaints from those in the GSU community.

Incept is the orientation program for new students at Georgia State. The program is run entirely by GSU students; the faculty adviser is Dean King Buttermore. Inceptors are chosen after the process of submitting applications and being interviewed.

These Inceptors prepare at least four two day — one night programs for giving as much information to new students as possible. Several one-day programs for transfer students are also a part of Incept. Georgia State's Incept program is considered to be one of the most successful such programs in the country.

The schedule is tightly packed with such activities as advisement and registration for the Inceptees' first quarter at GSU, Marketplace, welcoming speeches by faculty and administrators, and an overnight stay at the Marriott Hotel.

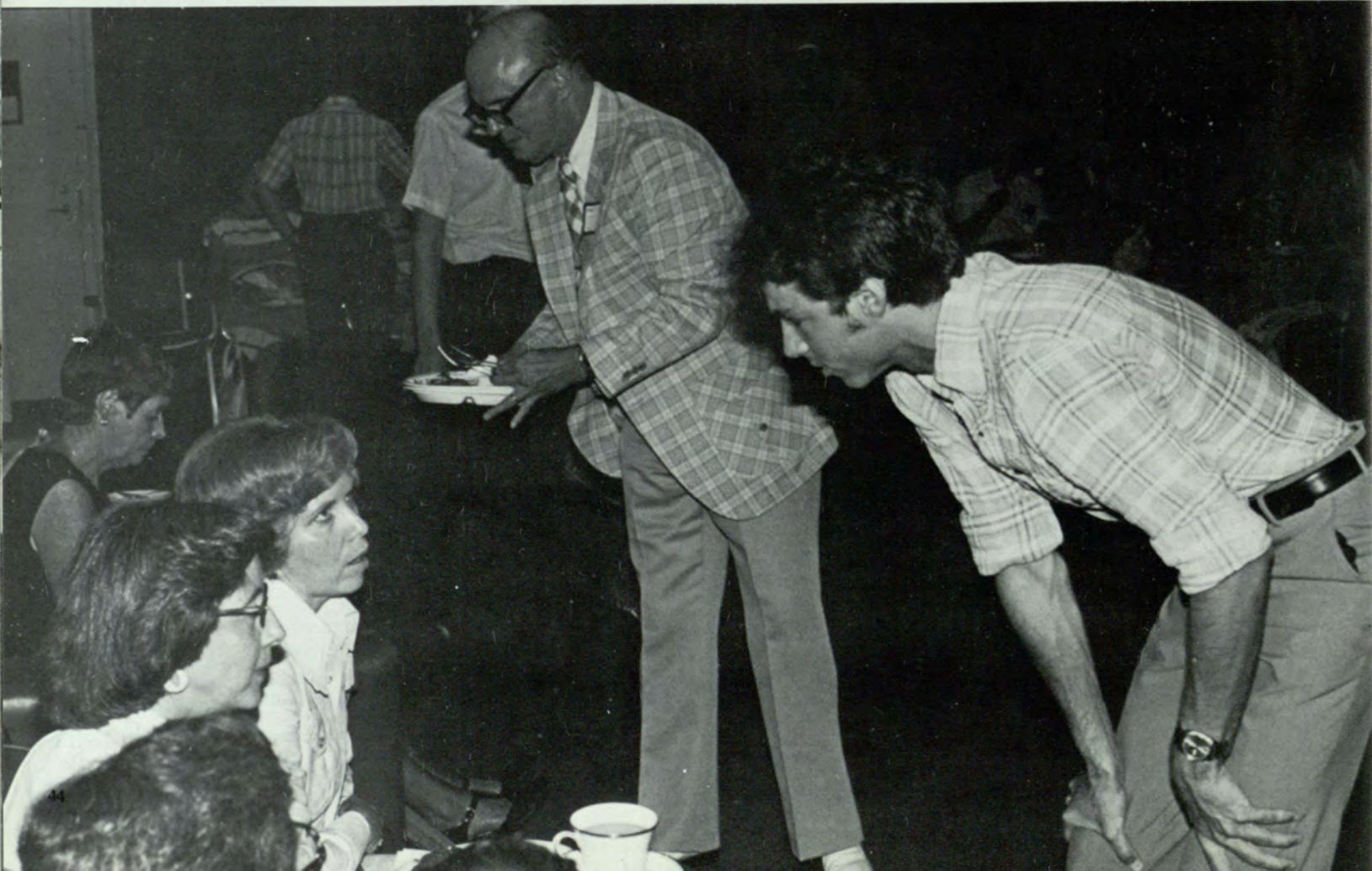


## Incoming Students Collect Freebies at Marketplace

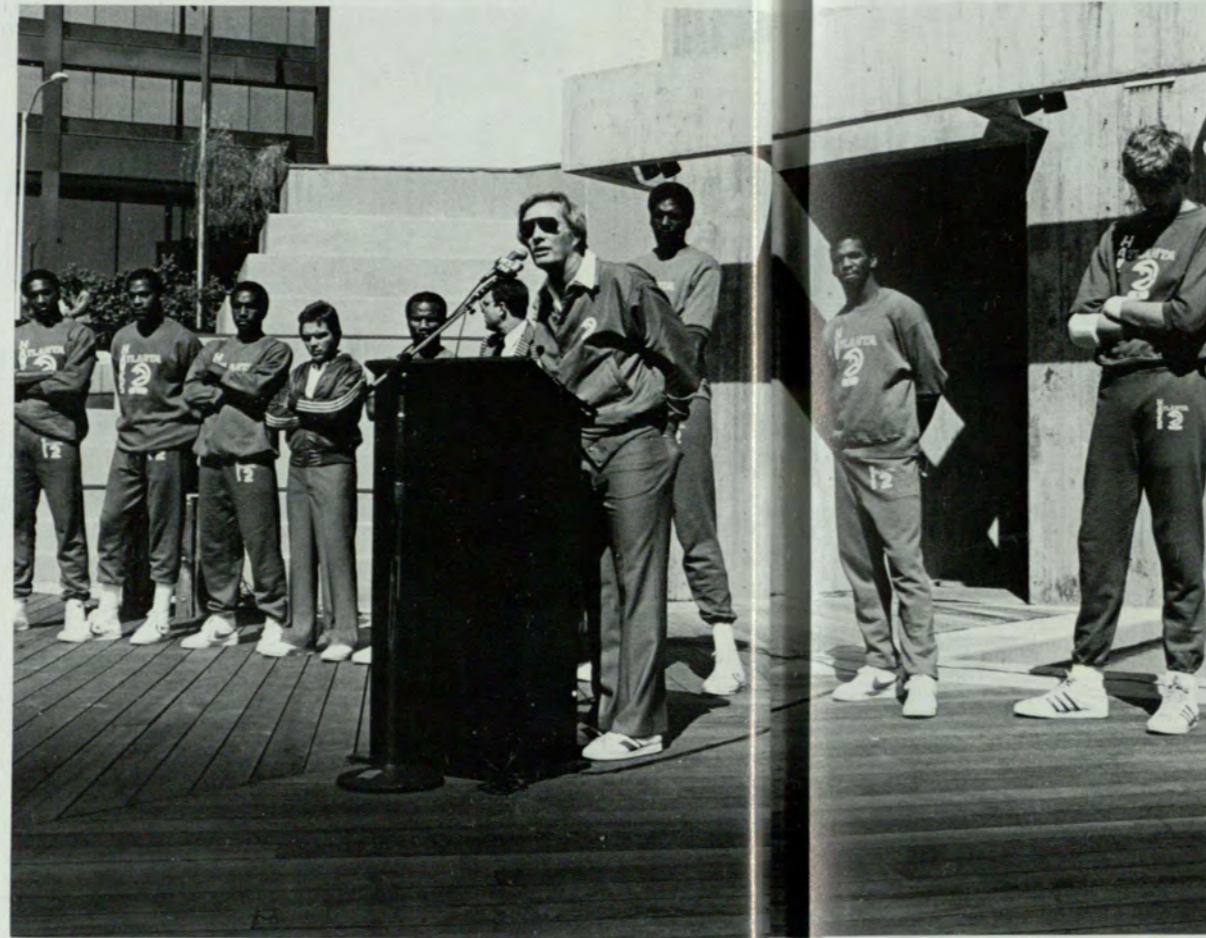
## Handicapped Get Boost as Former Skier Speaks

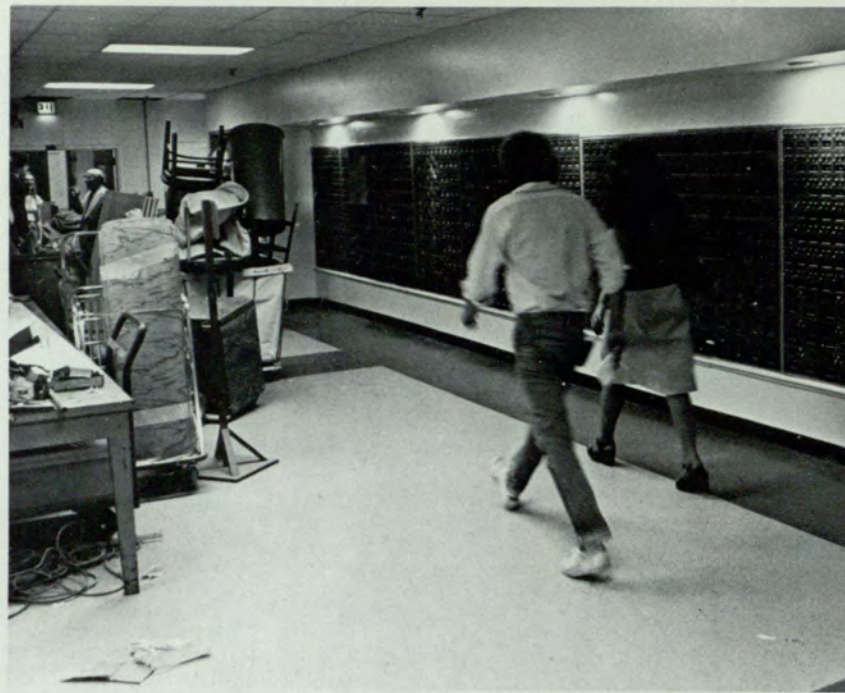


## Refectory Gets Bright New Face

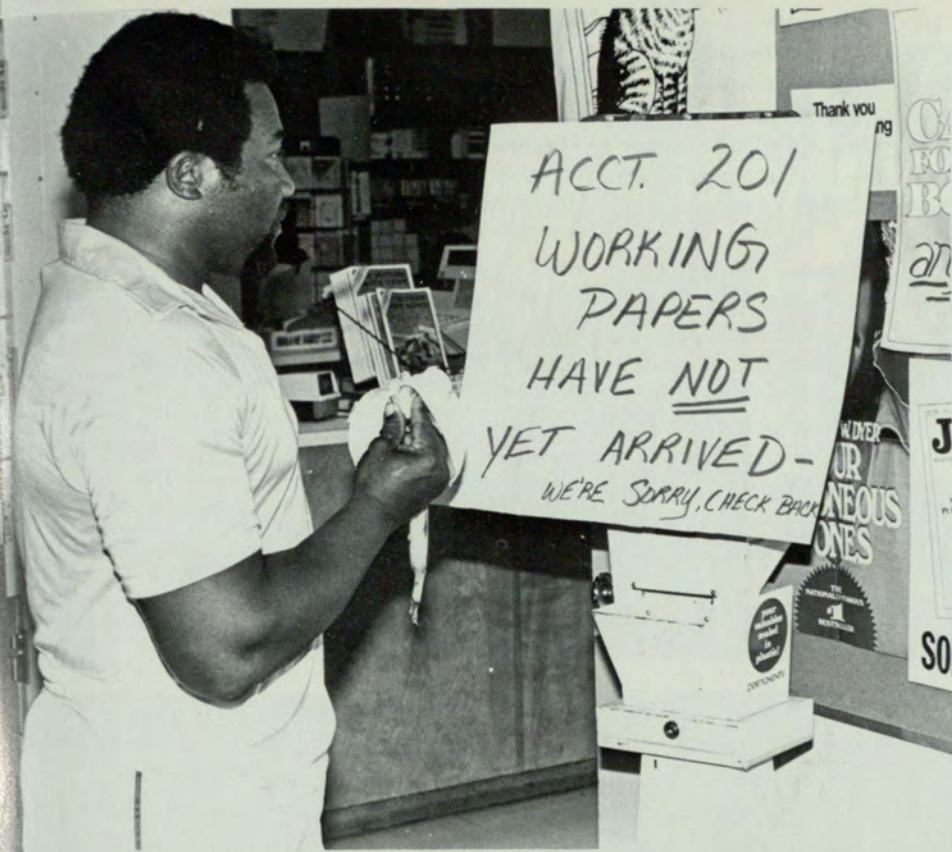

## Welcomes and Introductions

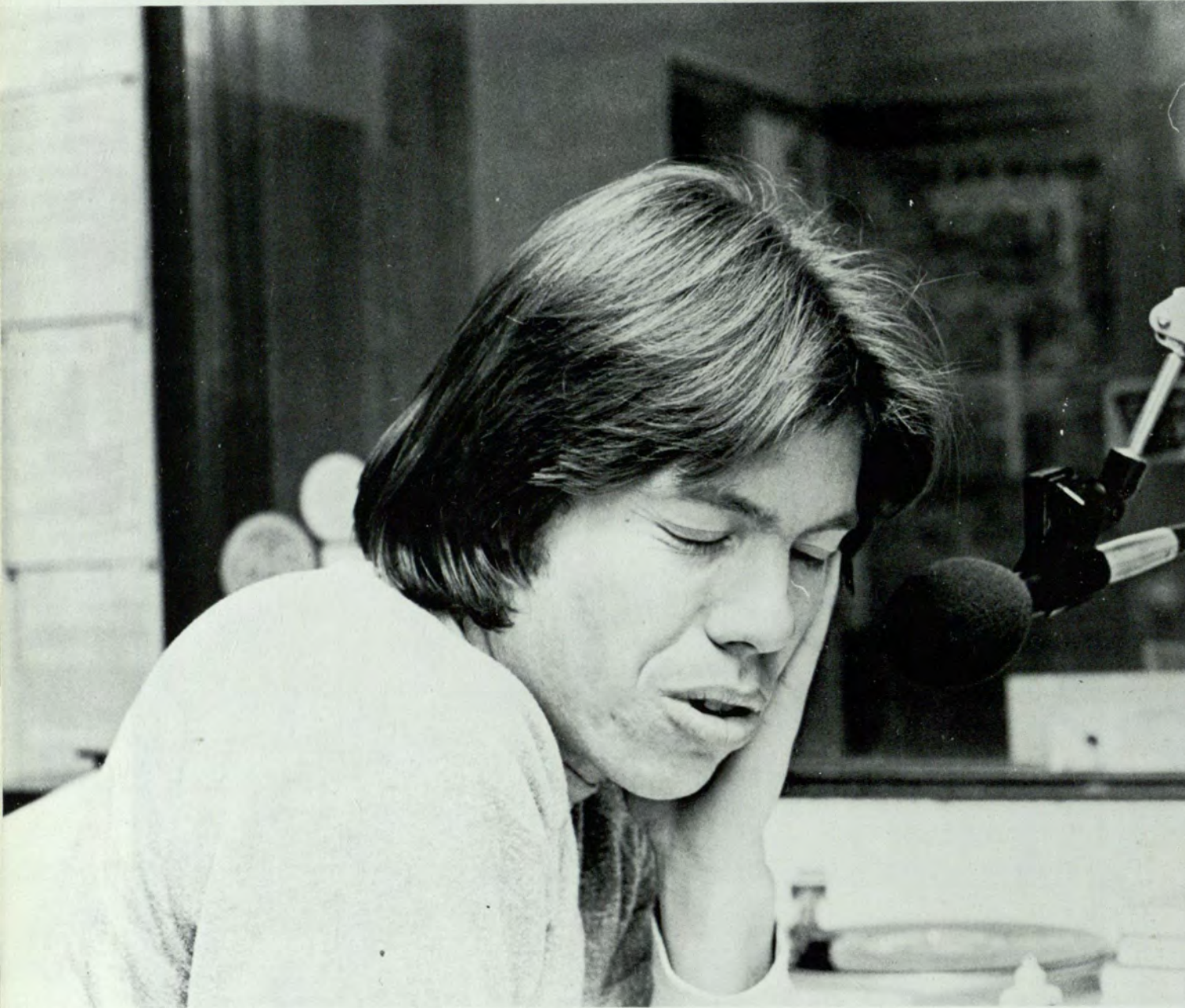

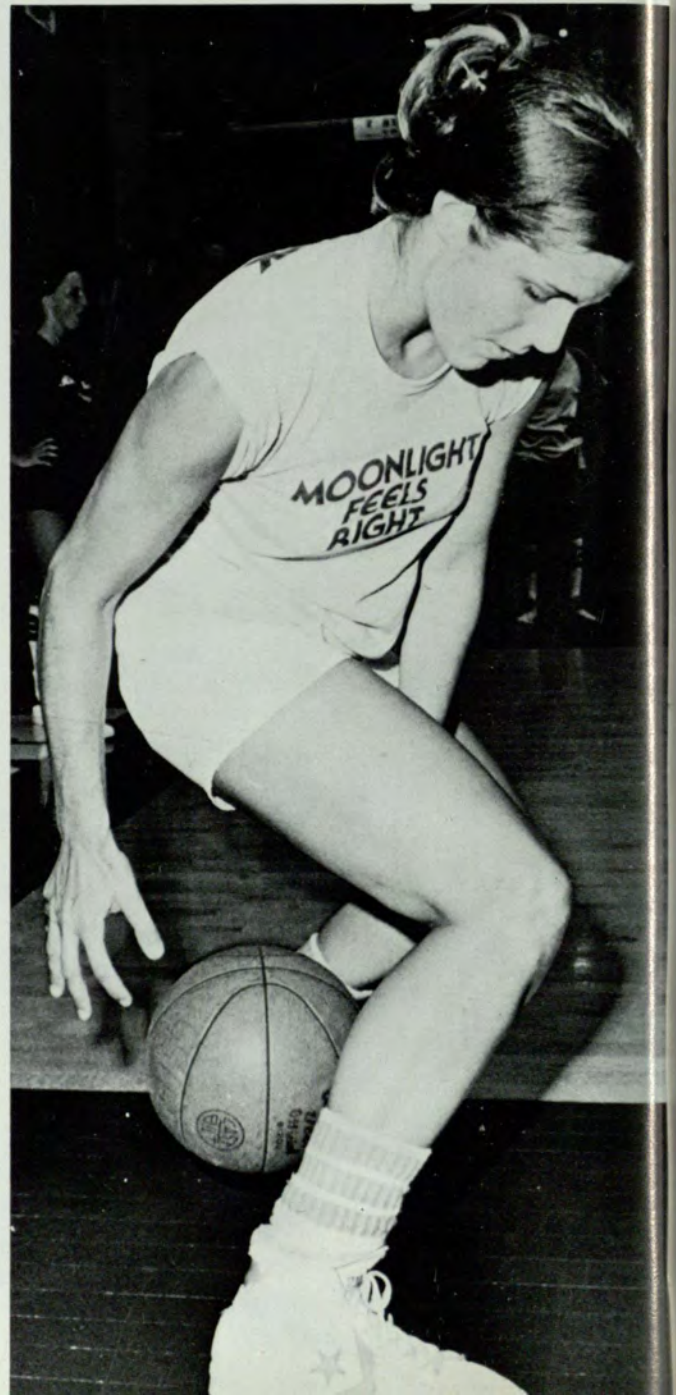


## Back in the Swing

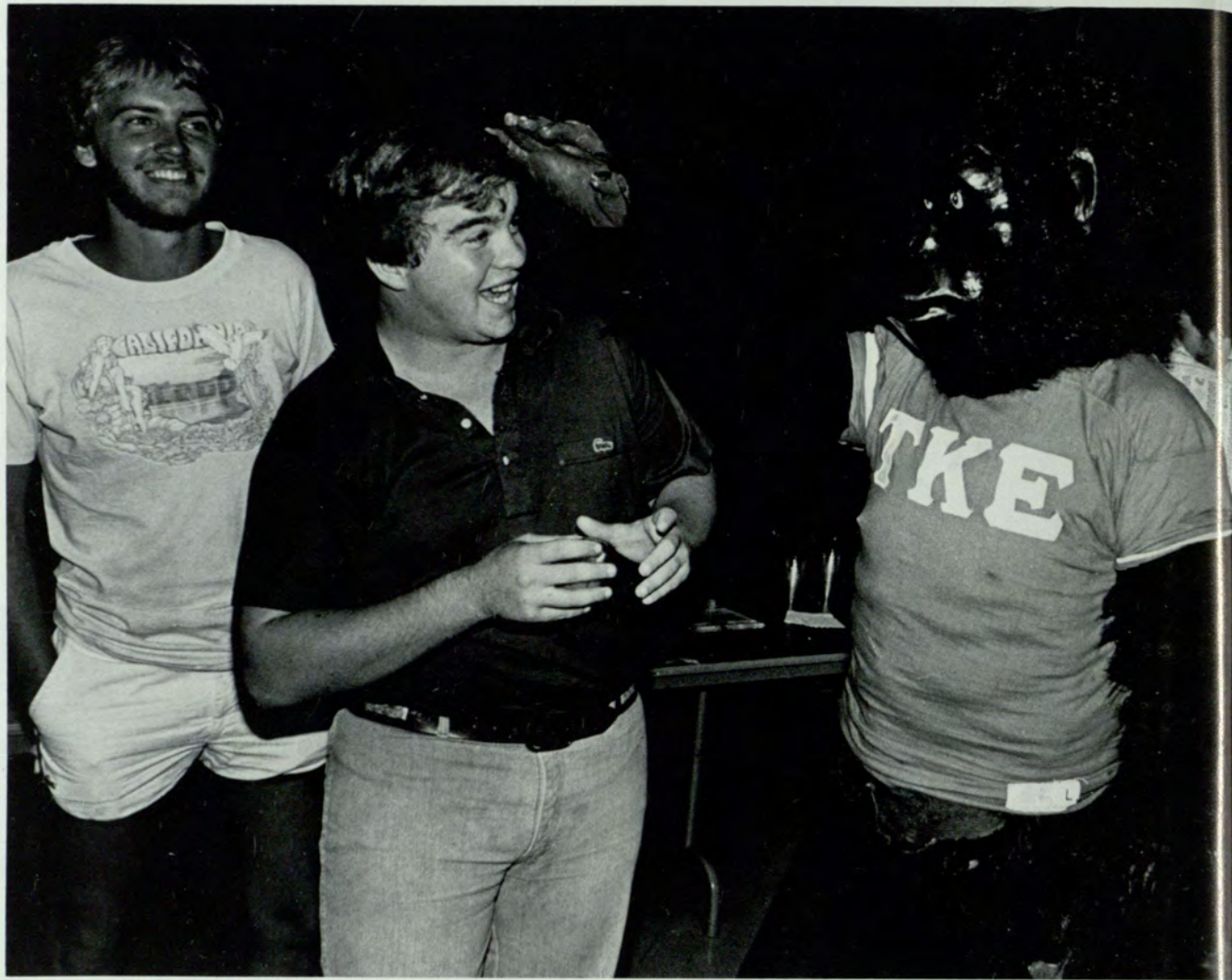

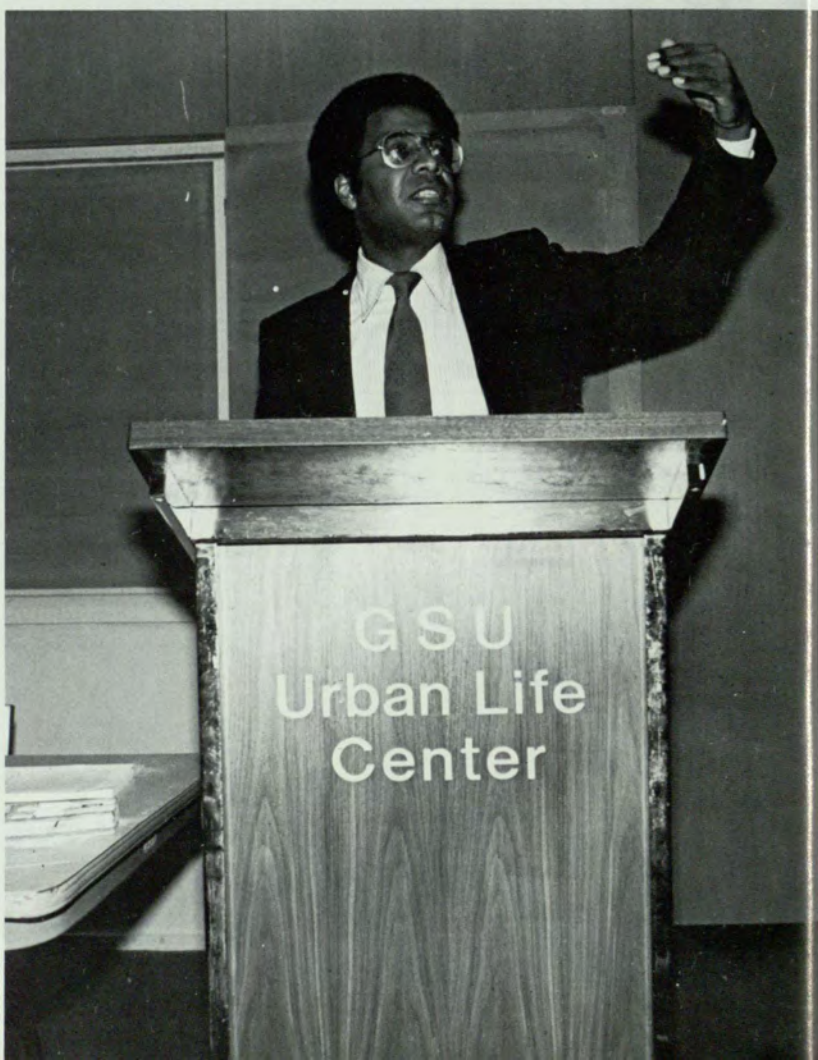


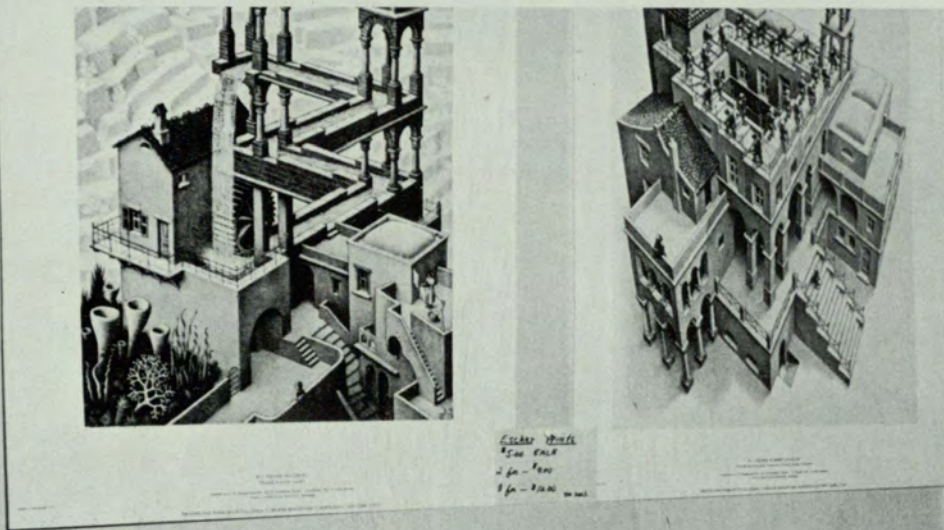
## Supreme Court's "Bakke Decision" Heatedly Debated

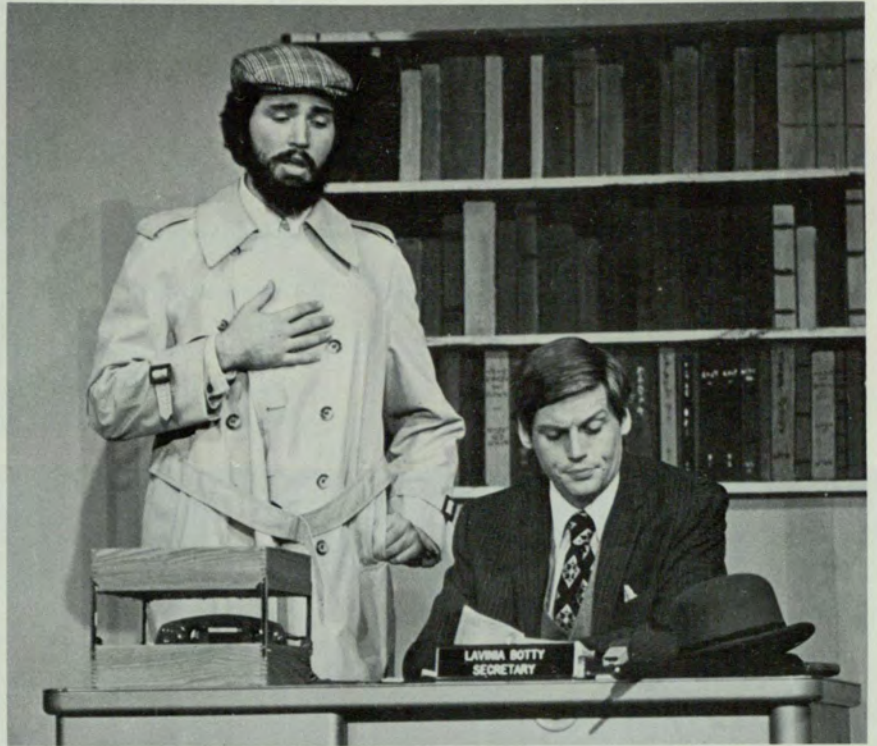
## "The Private Ear" and "The Public Eye"

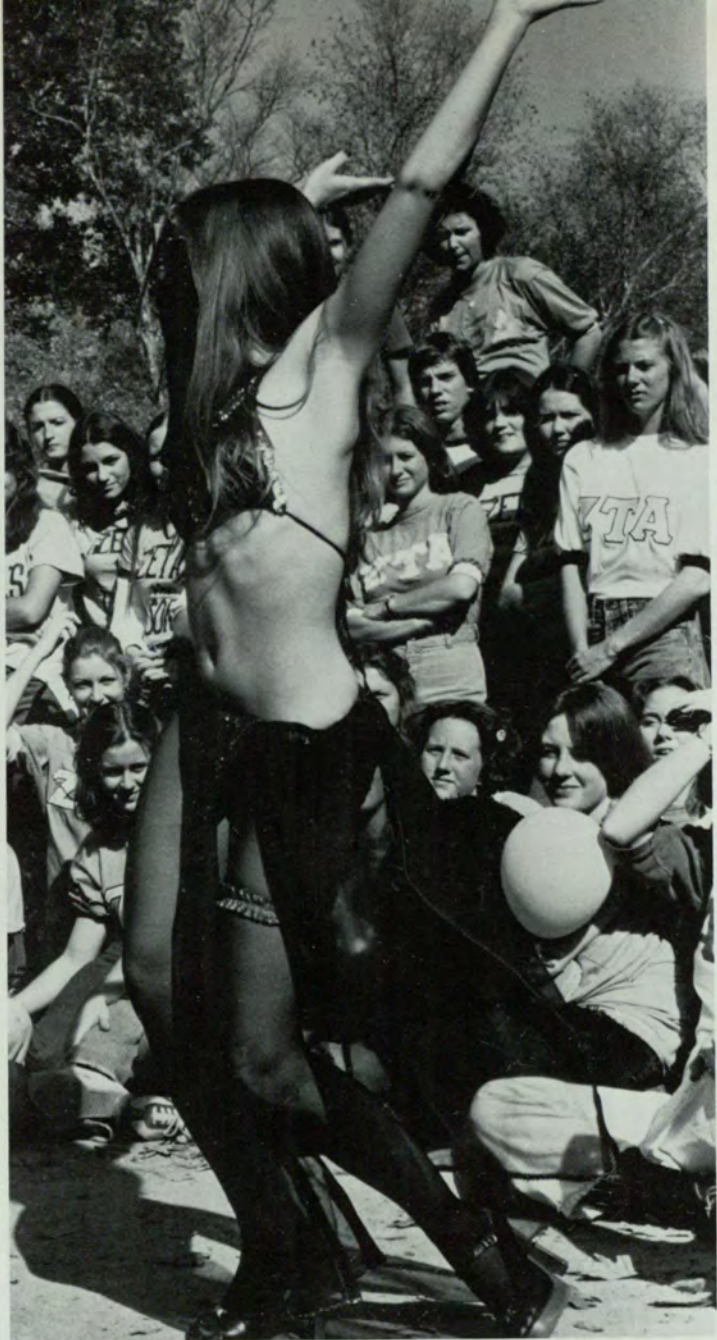

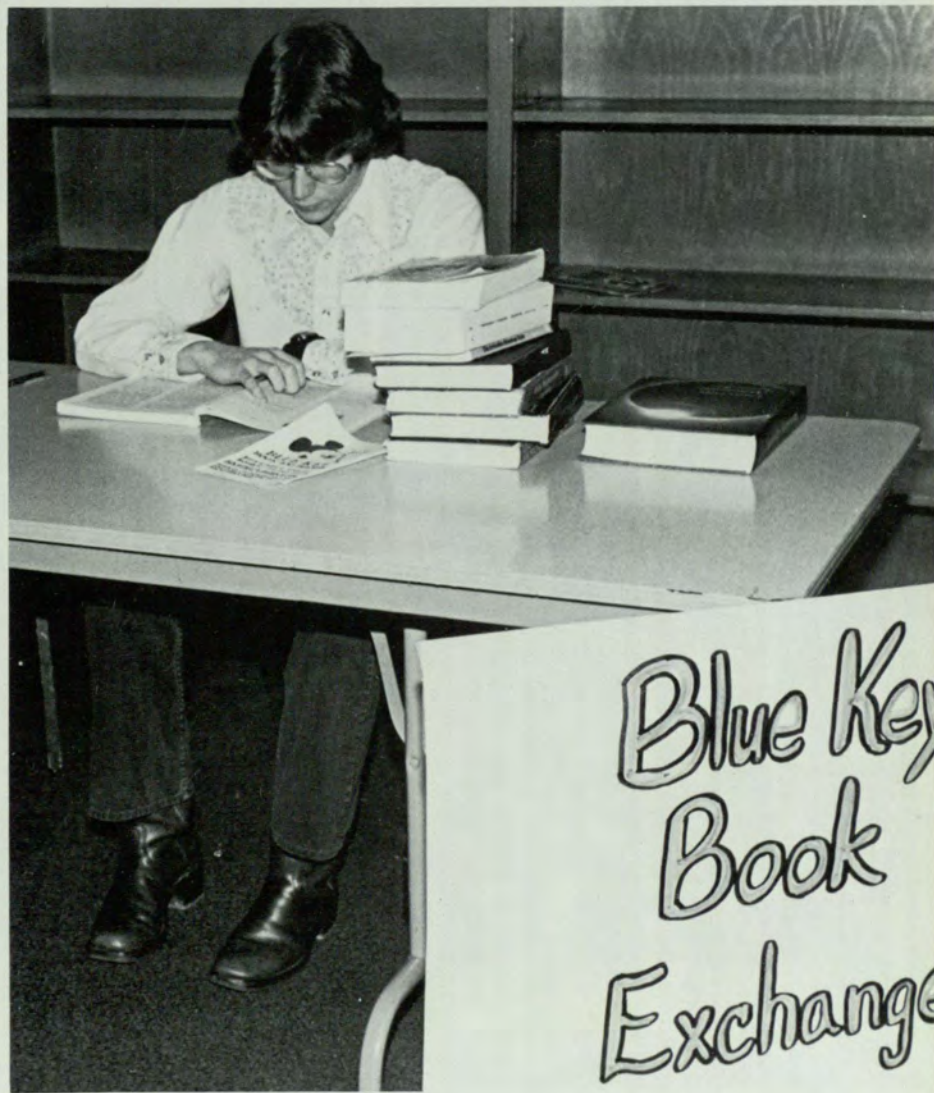
Mrs. Maggie Matthews, who retired last fall from the Dean of Students staff, was

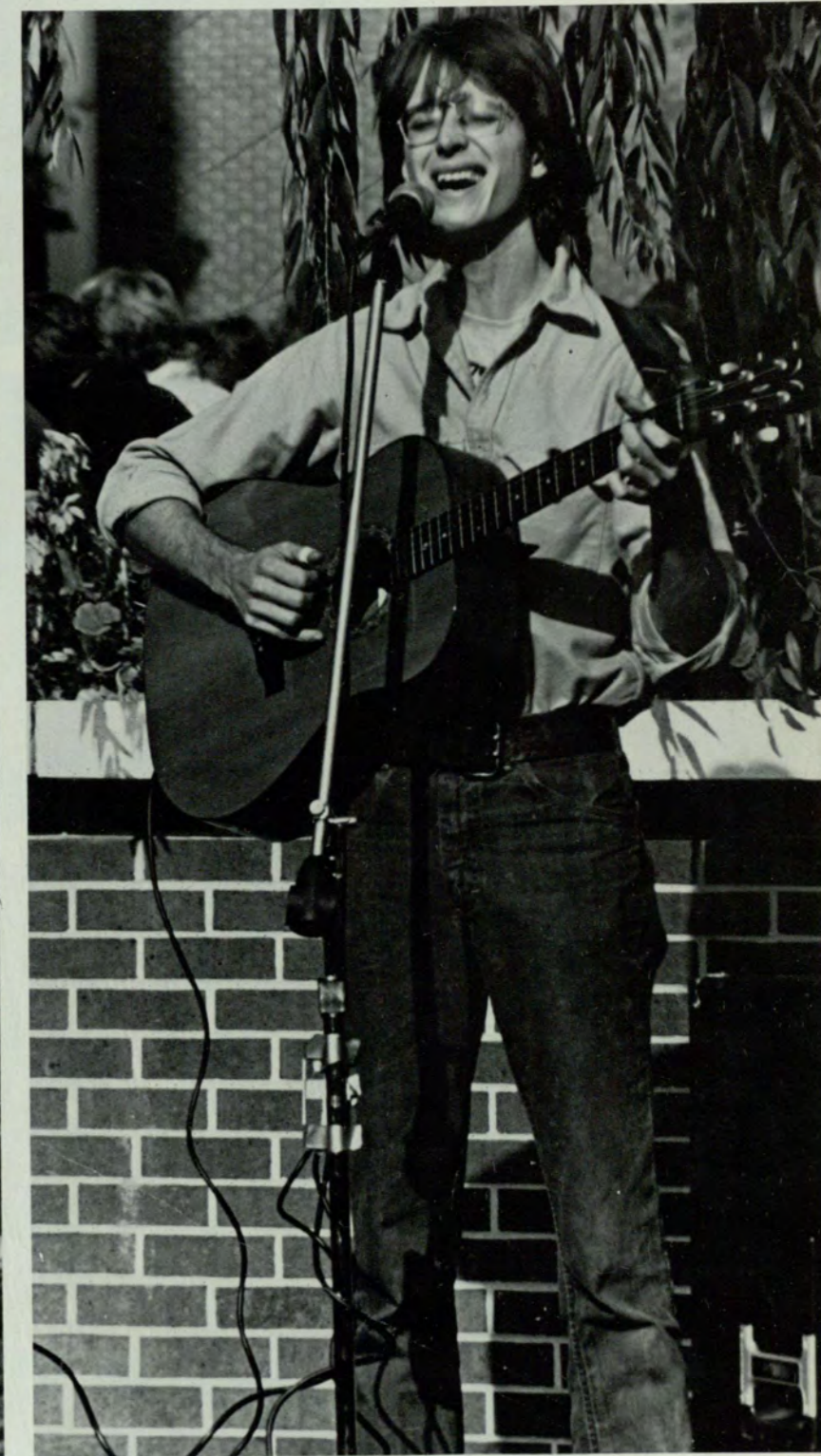
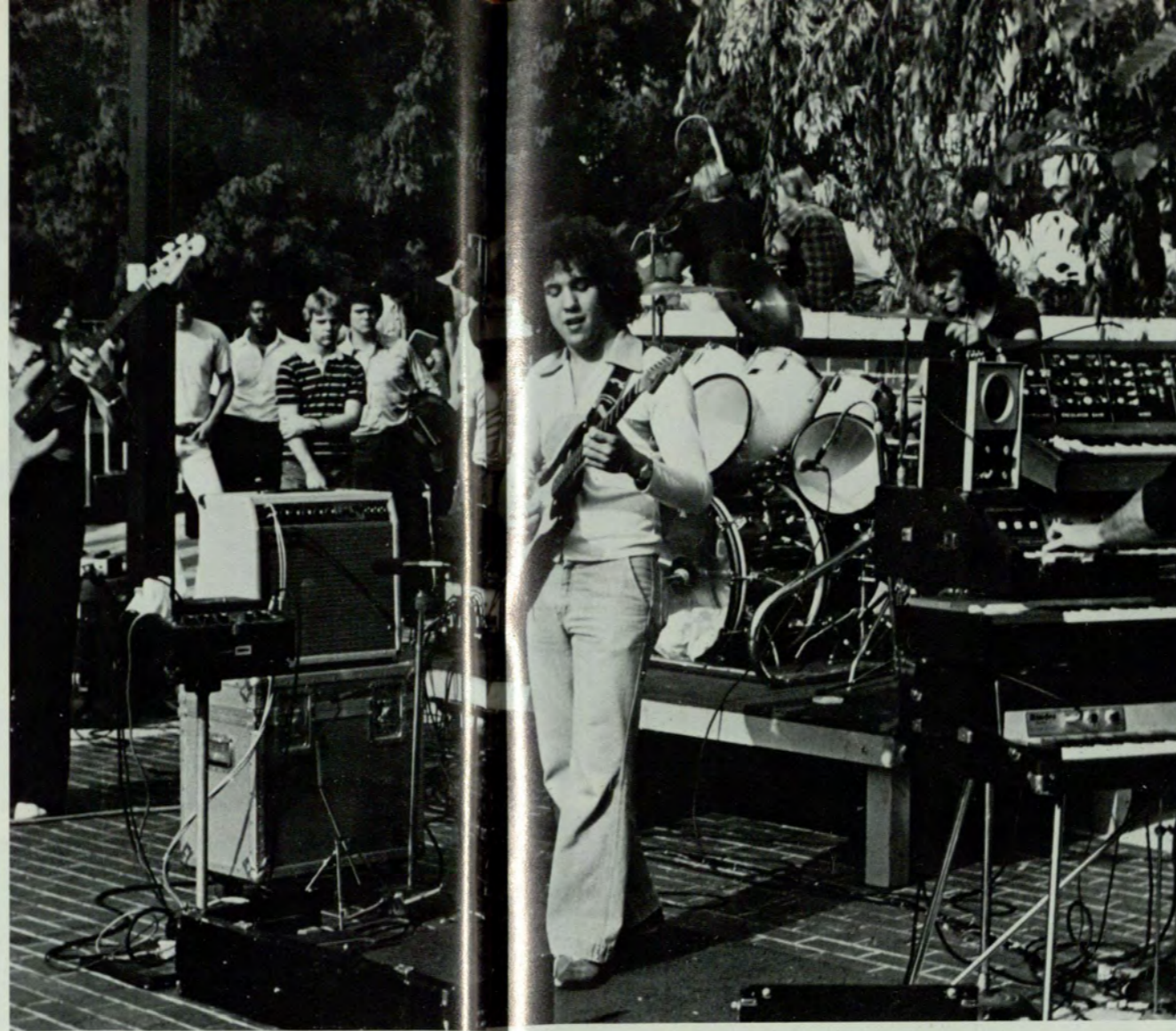


## Music and Magic Fill Octoberfest

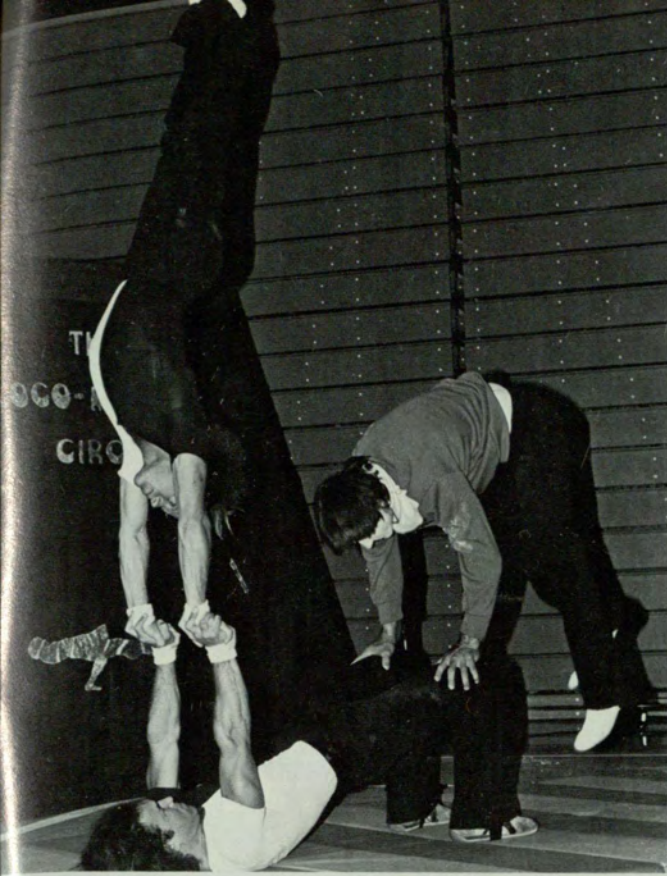

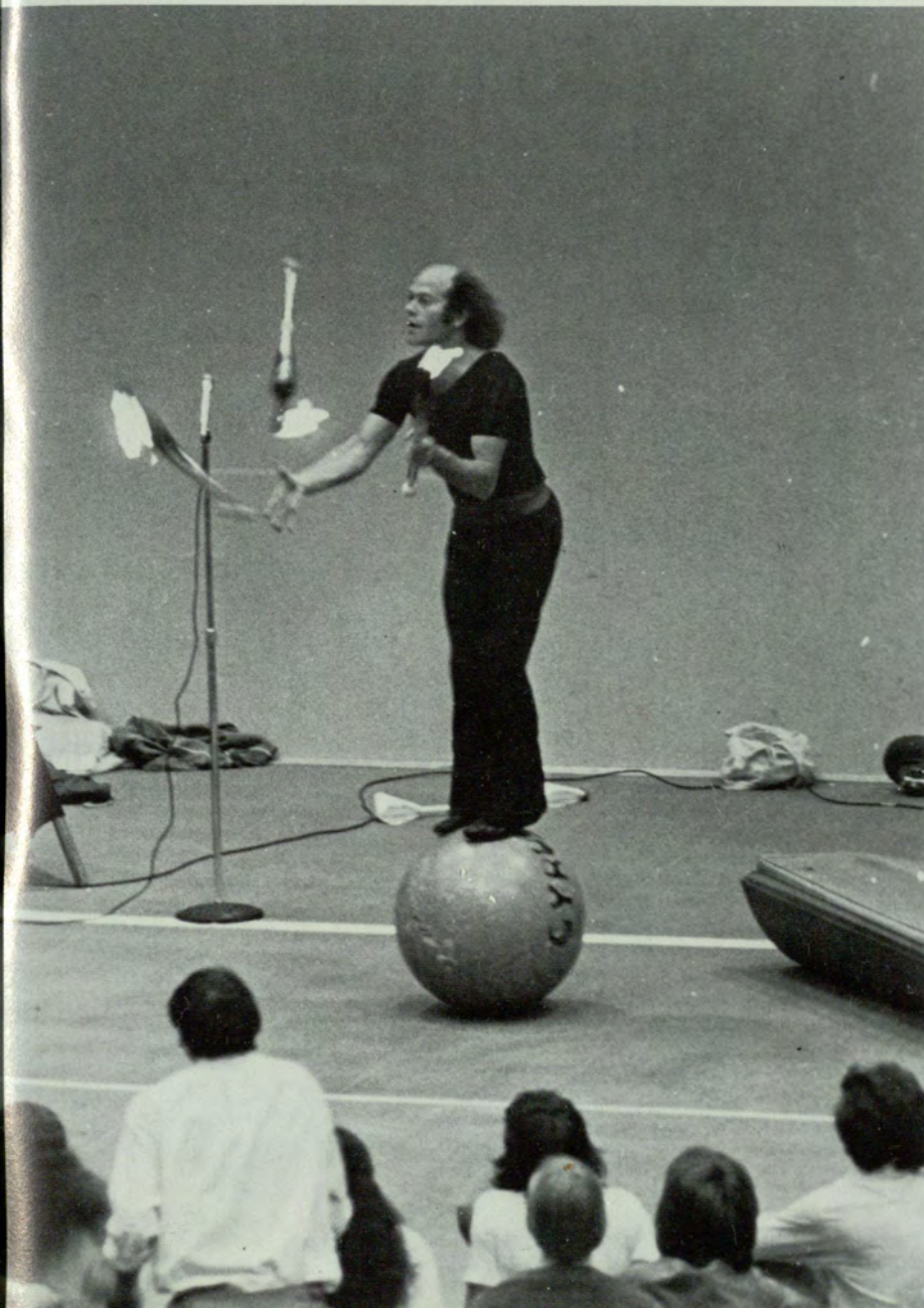

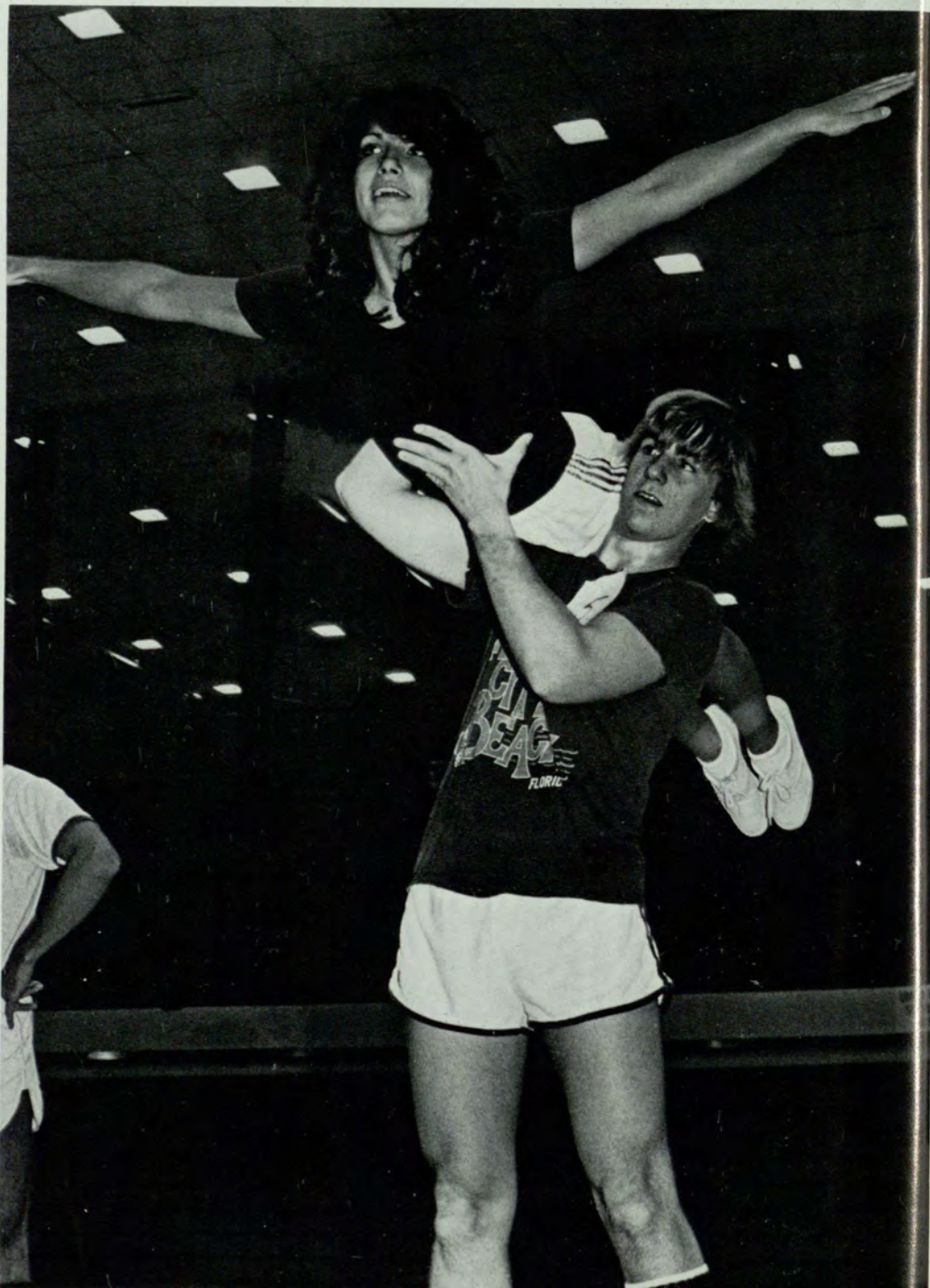


# Cheerleaders Jump for Small Omni Crowds

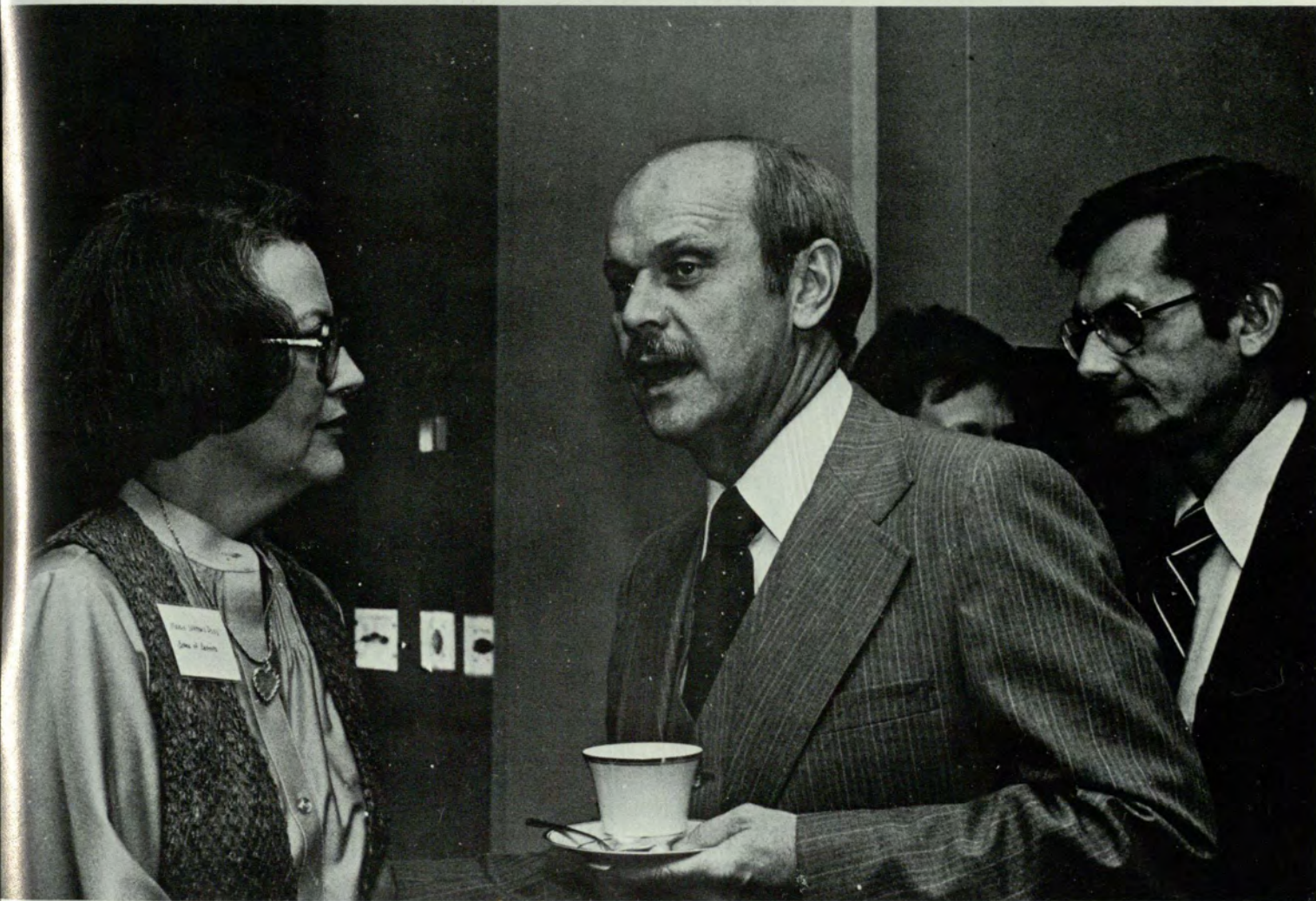




## Busbee Selects GSU Alumna for Regents Seat

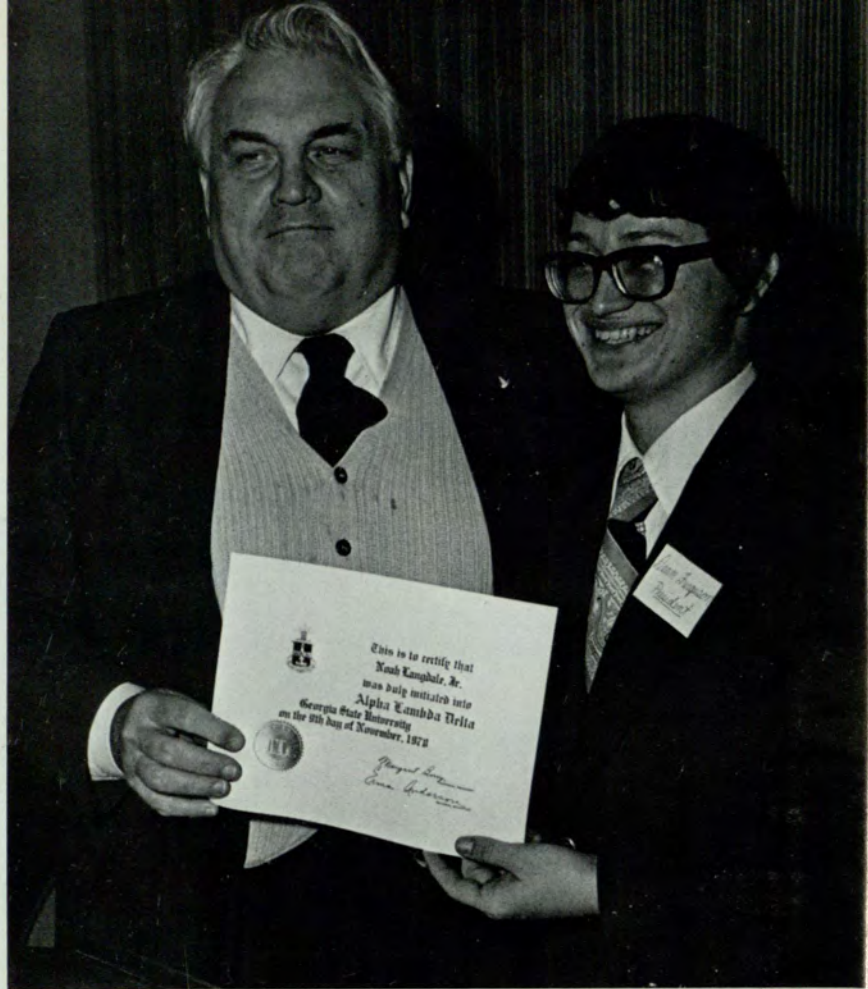

# Student Lobbyists Go for Three Major Properties

The Student Government Association formed a lobbying committee to work at the 1979 session of the Georgia General Assembly. The main focus of the lobbying committee was the acquisition of the James Earl Carter Presidential Library, the Lawyer's Title Building, and the Municipal Auditorium. The lobbying committee is comprised of Georgia State students who are interested in contacting legislators and encouraging the legislators to include the acquisition of the three target projects in the Board of Regents' budget. Virginia Clark headed efforts to get the Carter Presidential Library located in Atlanta. Alan Samchock served as GSU's contact at the legislature, and Lucy Goldthwaite directed the overall lobbying effort.

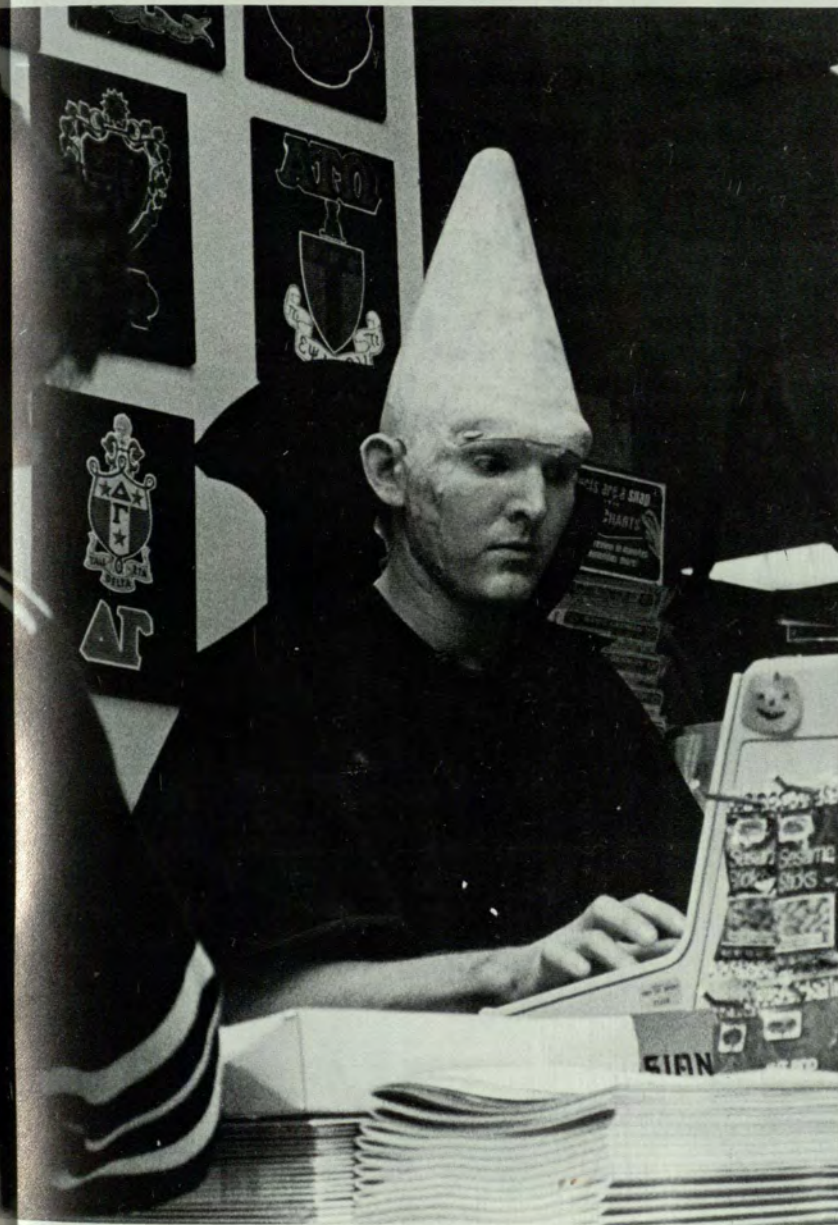
David Doverspike, vice president of the SGA during the 1978-79 term, served as chairman of the lobbying committee.

In January the Atlanta City Council passed a resolution urging the Board of Regents and the Georgia Legislature to support a law school at Georgia State. If a day and night law school was accredited at GSU students could more readily afford to attend law school.

Daily classes were lengthened from fifty minutes to fifty-five minutes beginning winter quarter 1979 in order to comply with the Veteran's Administration requirement that all students receiving financial aid attend 2,500 class-minutes per quarter per course. In other words,

one has five minutes to get from the third floor in the Business Administration building, dash across the plaza and up five flights of stairs in the General Classroom building (waiting for an elevator takes forever). The five minute extension to classes was unanimously opposed by the SGA in addition to other student leaders and specific groups on campus.

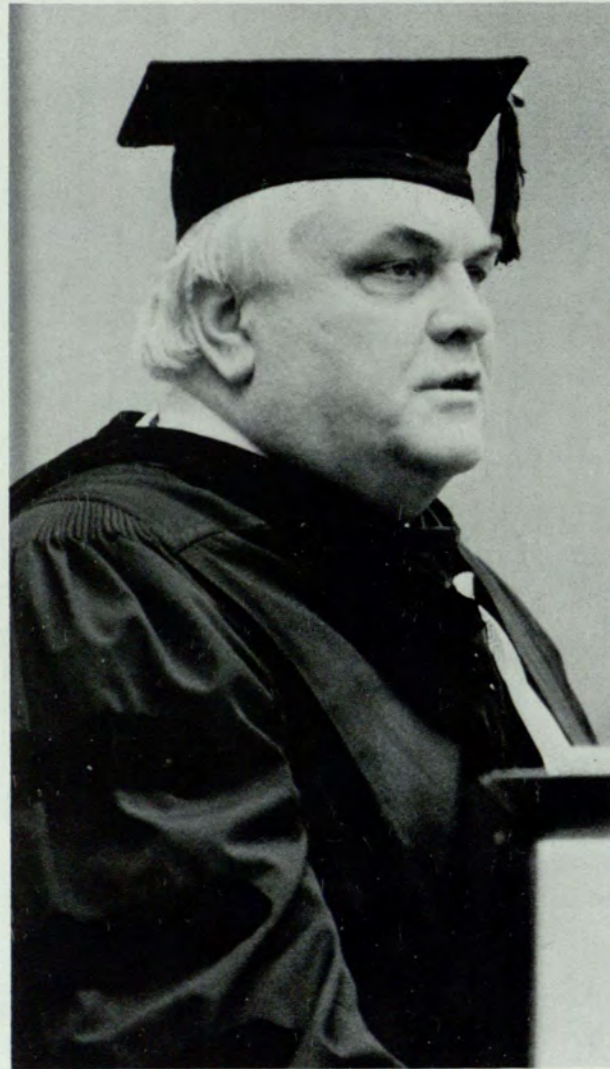
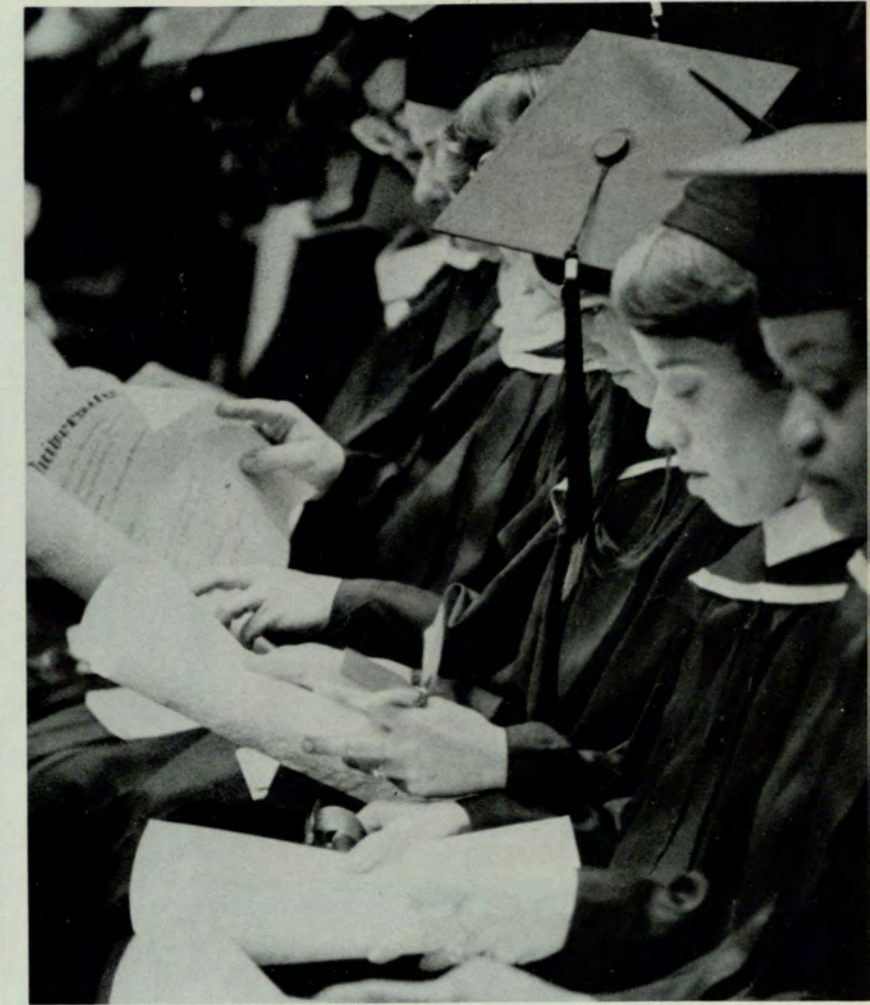
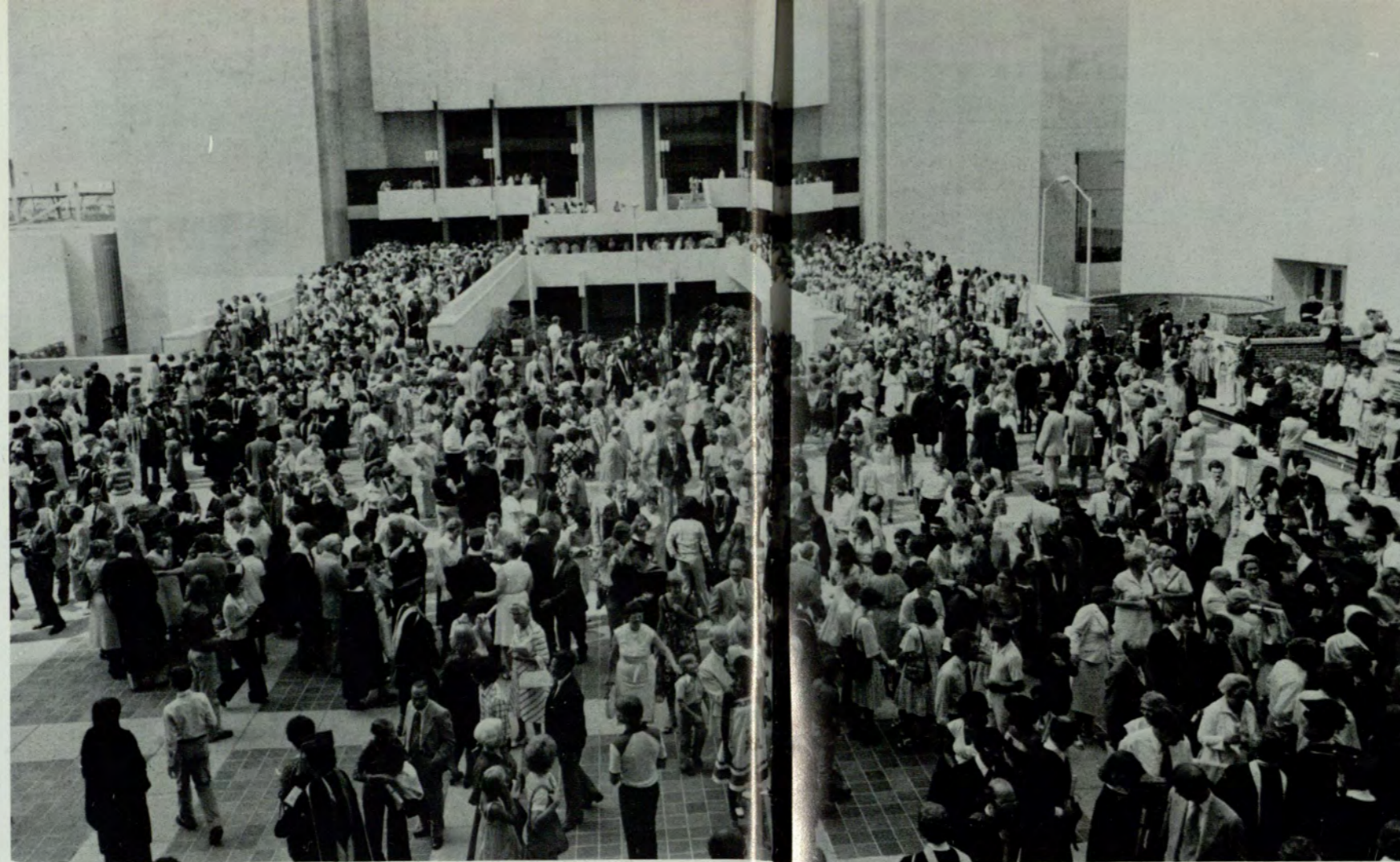

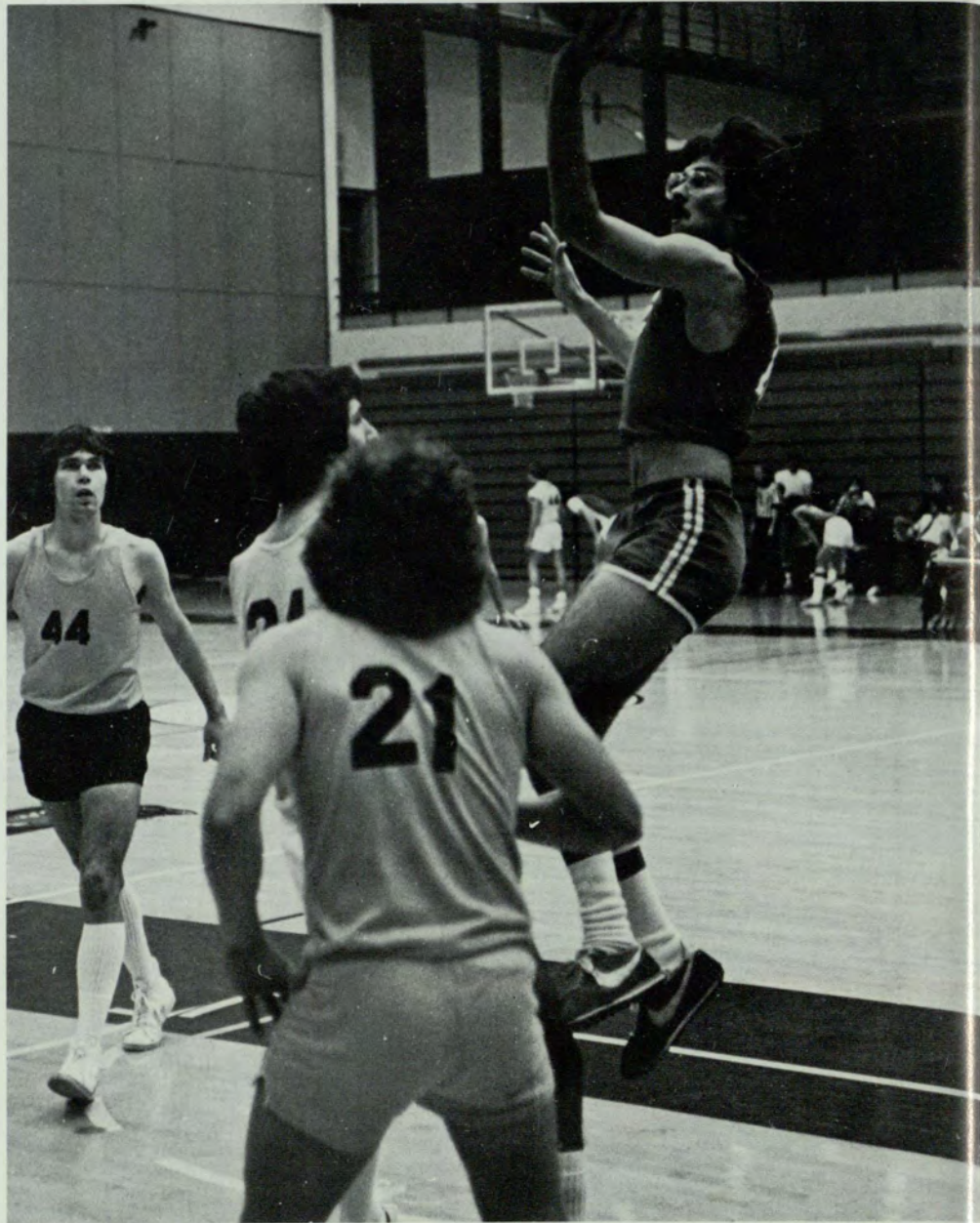


## Graduation — At Last!

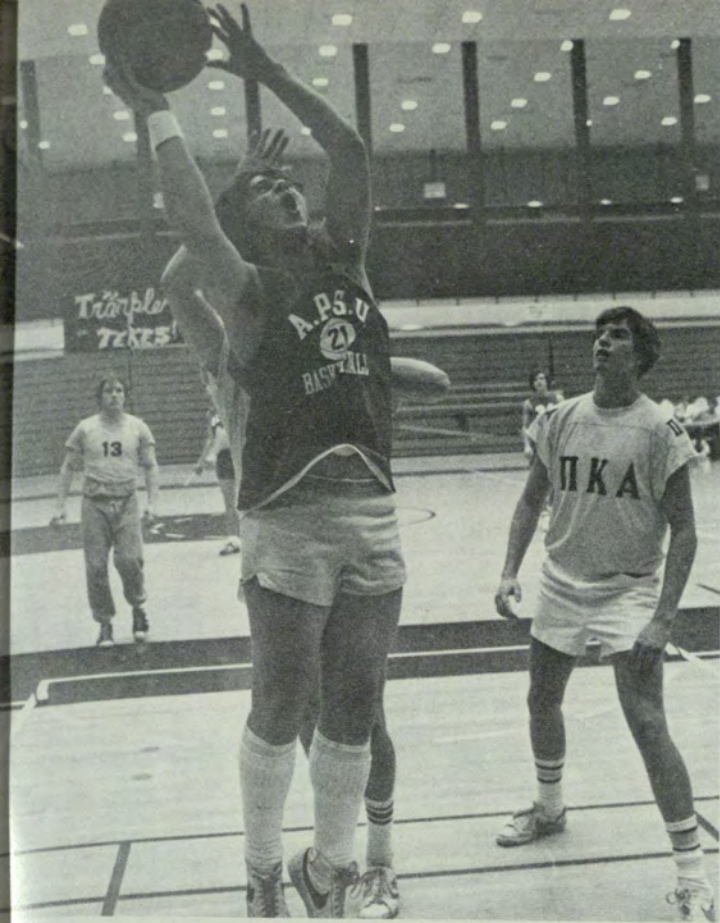




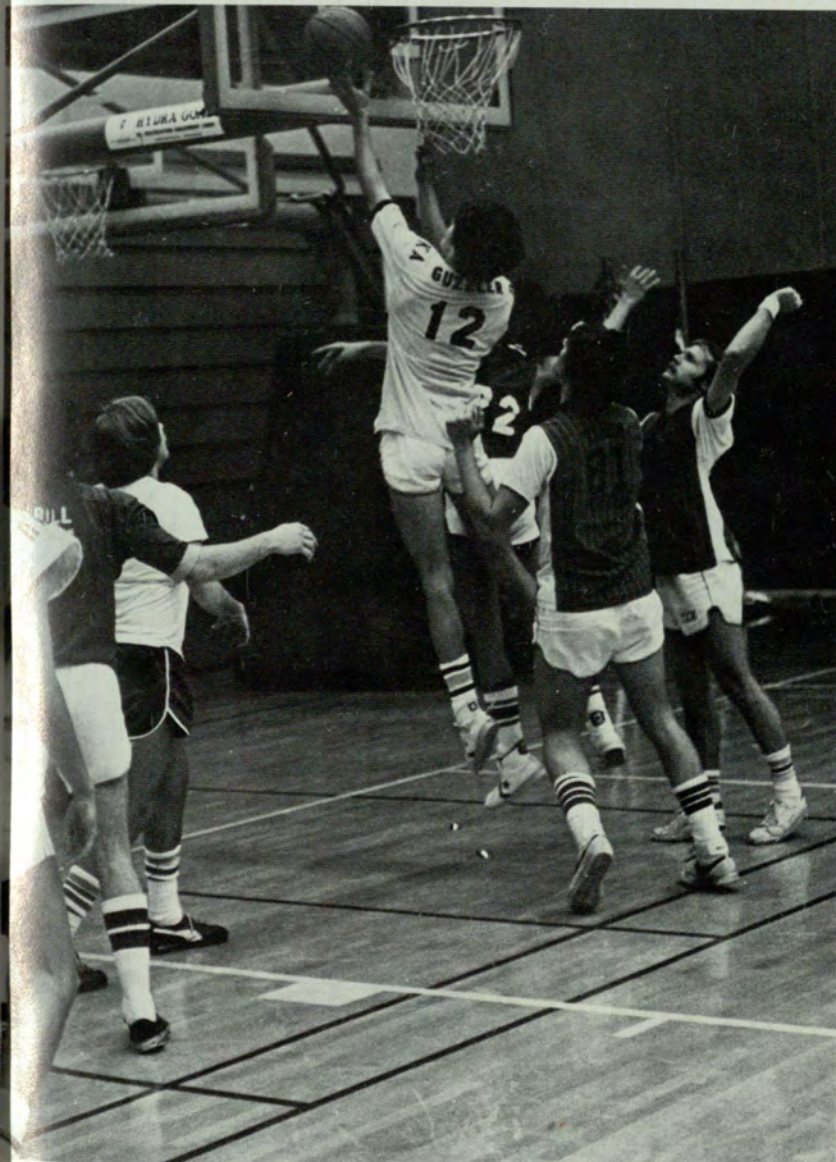

Intramurals include flag football, table tennis, pool, bumper pool, basketball, wrestling, bowling, and volleyball.

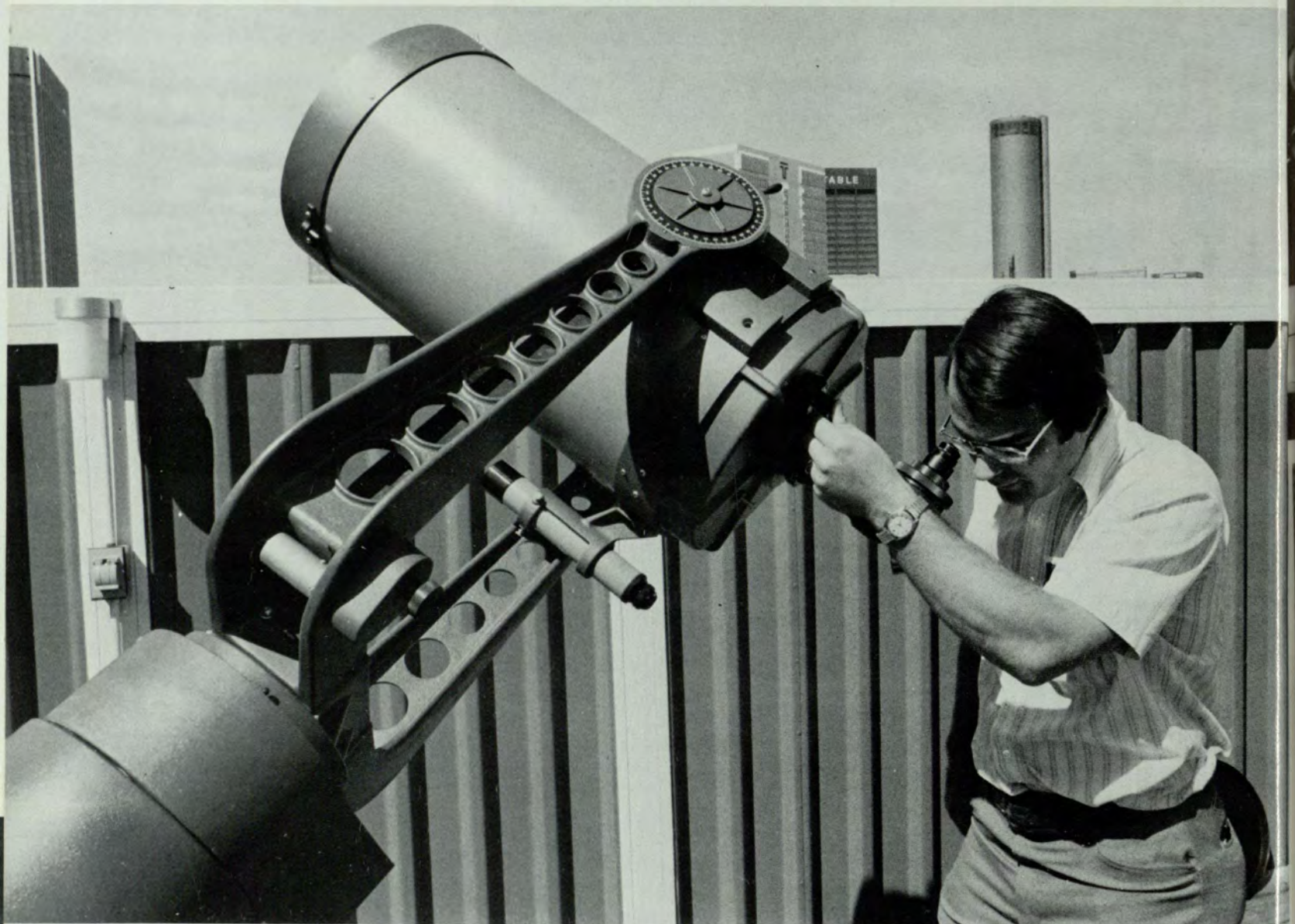

## Model United Nations Draws 600 Local Participants



The World Affairs Council, a Committee of the Student Government Association, sponsored the sixth annual Model United Nations at Georgia State last December. Over 600 high school students from approximately 60 high schools in metro Atlanta participated in the three-day conference in the Urban Life Center. Seventy-nine countries were represented by the students involved in this model. The model UN exposes several thousand high school students to GSU and many of these students have stated that their Model UN experience has influenced their choice of which college to attend. The World Affairs Council is a student organization here on campus whose purpose, function and activities are decided by the

students. Dr. James D. McBrayer of the Department of Political Science is the faculty advisor.

That's not King Kong atop the Urban Life Building. That's Georgia State's new observatory. Completed last summer, the observatory houses two telescopes: an 8-inch lens diameter and a 14-inch lens diameter. The equipment is shielded behind a six-foot plexiglass windscreen and is mounted on a 3,600 square foot platform. Also crowning the Urban Life Center is the recently completed urban weather station which opened in October 1978. The weather station measures temperature, rainfall, dew point, wind speed and direction, and barometric pressure. The measure-

ment equipment is linked to the university's computer center, which provides a printout of these five variables every hour. This information is available to official weather agencies and the University's geography and physical plant departments. The equipment includes a solar radiation device to measure the amount of light from the sun and the reflection of that light from downtown buildings.

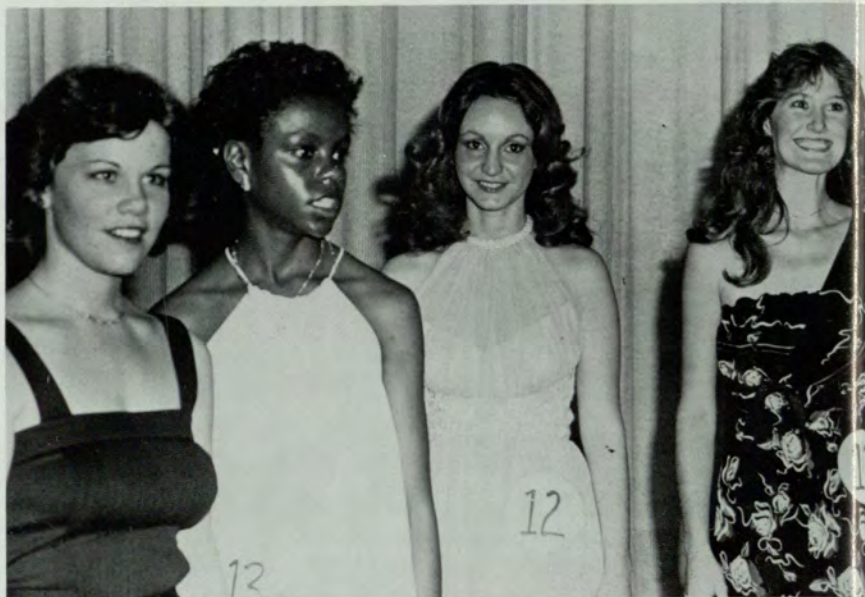

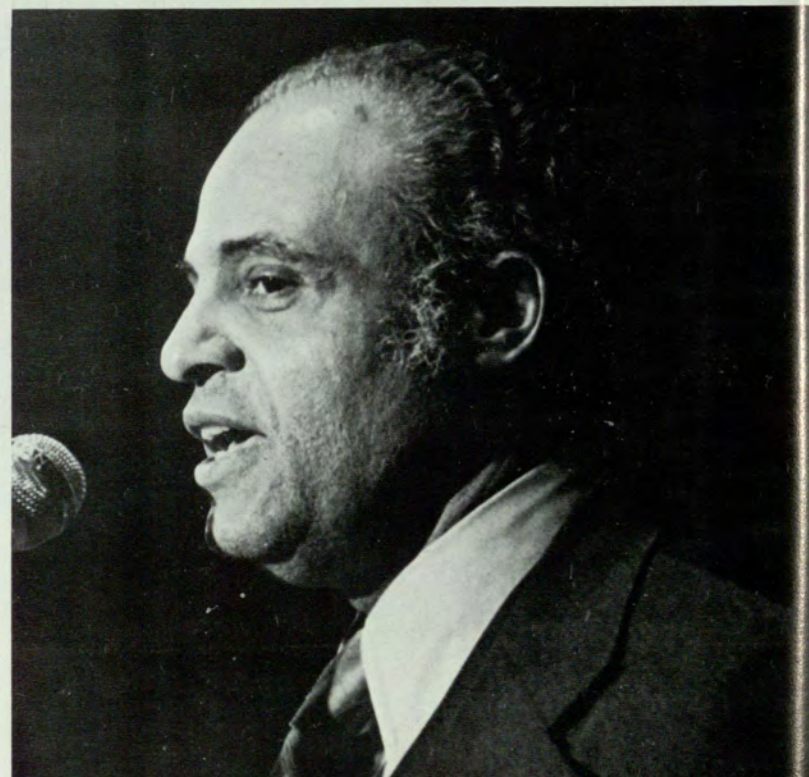

A graduate student here at Georgia State was yet another speaker on campus. Robert McBath of the History Department gave a hilarious presentation on Sir P. G. Wodehouse's "Pighooey!" in the Student Center Theatre during ten o'clock break winter quarter.

and with a party at the Agora Ballroom where the *B-52's* and the *Brains* were among the entertainers. General Manager James Tarbox has had new problems to deal with such as non-commercial radio station de-regulation by the FCC, yet he and his staff have maintained WRAS's reputation as Atlanta's progressive stereo alternative. WRAS is a student operated, 24-hour station with studios on the second floor of the Student Center.

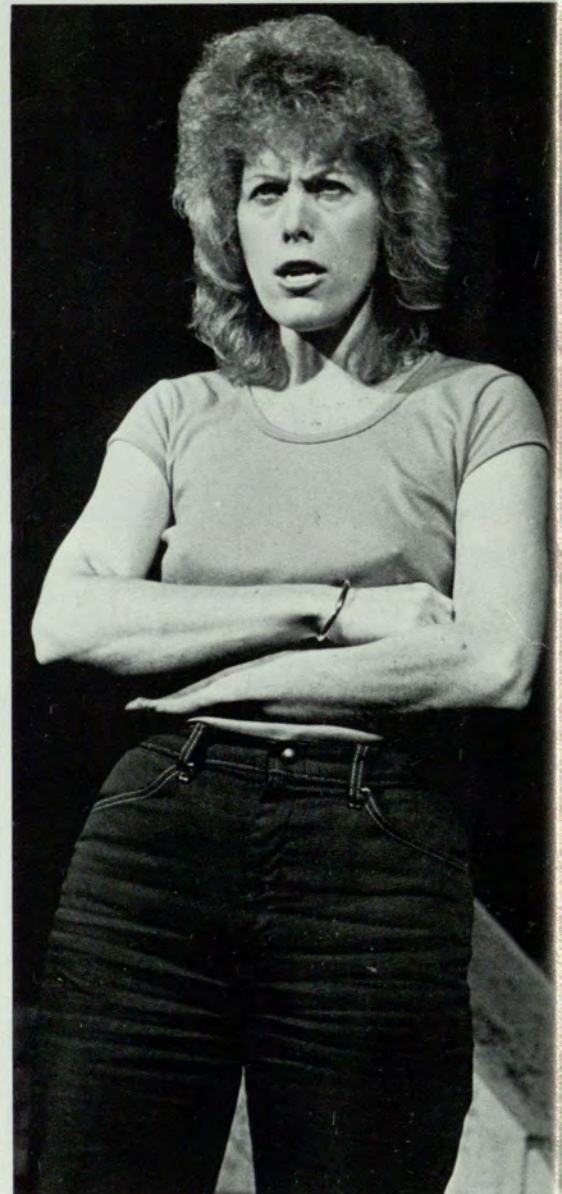


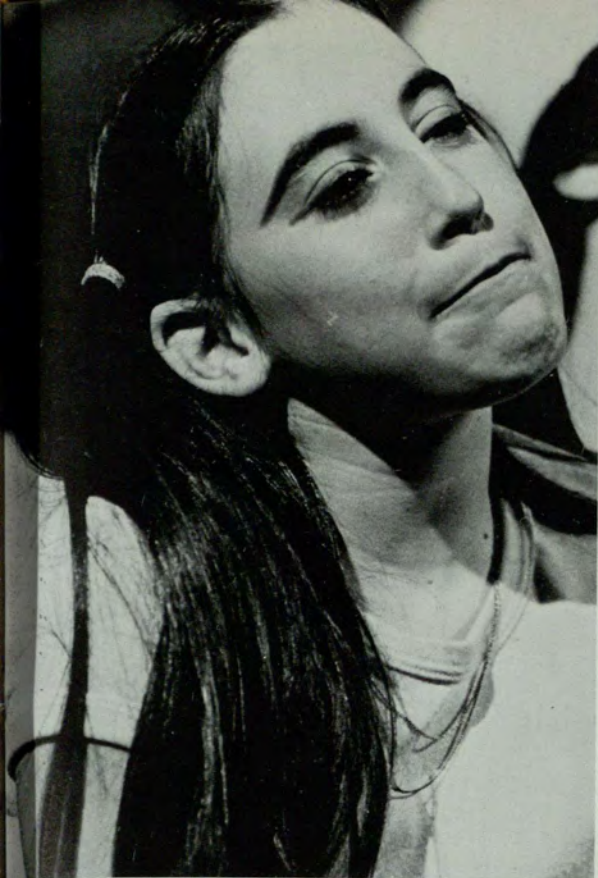
## "Free to Be . . . You and Me"

# Fight Night Raises Funds for Olympics

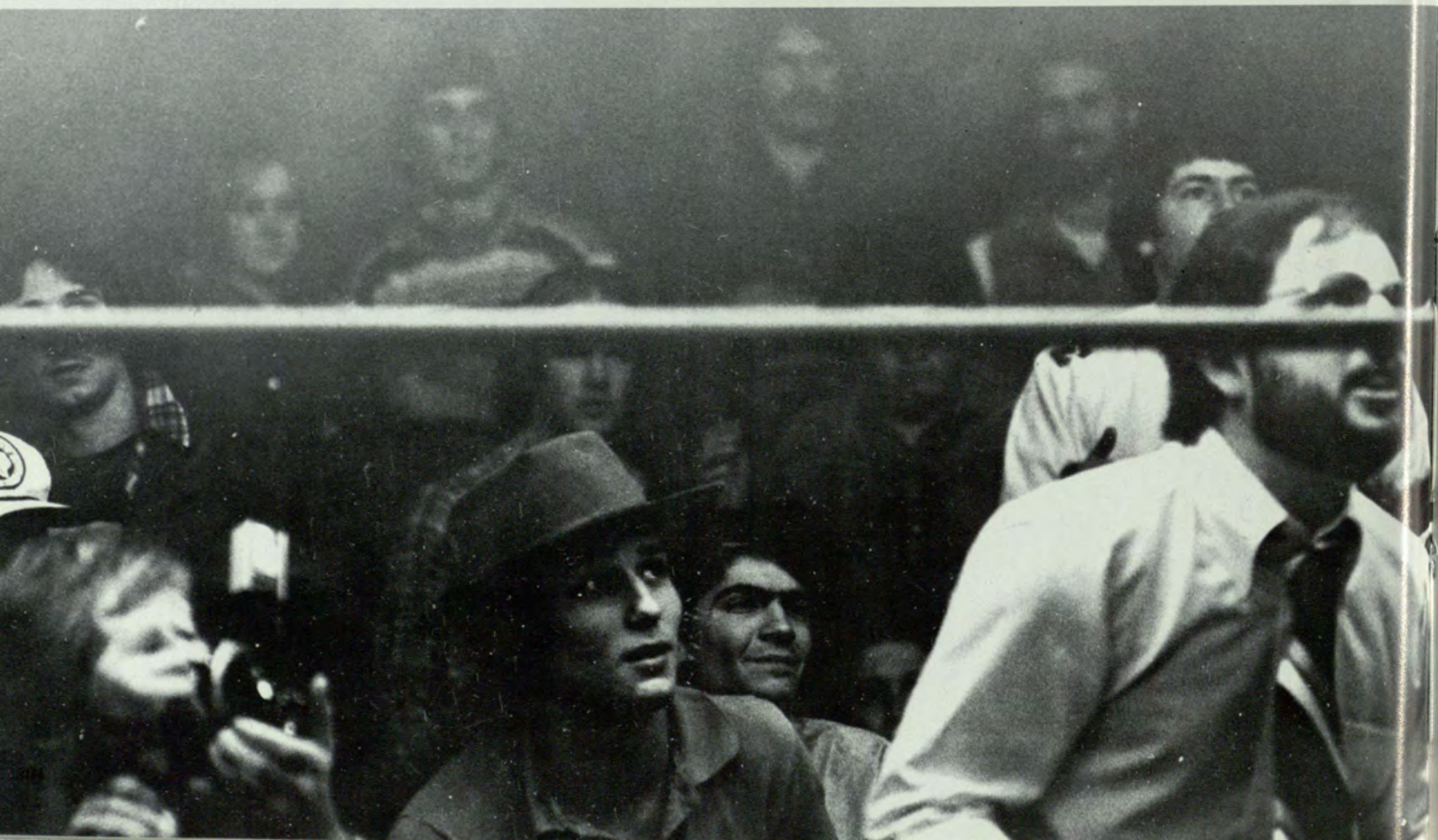

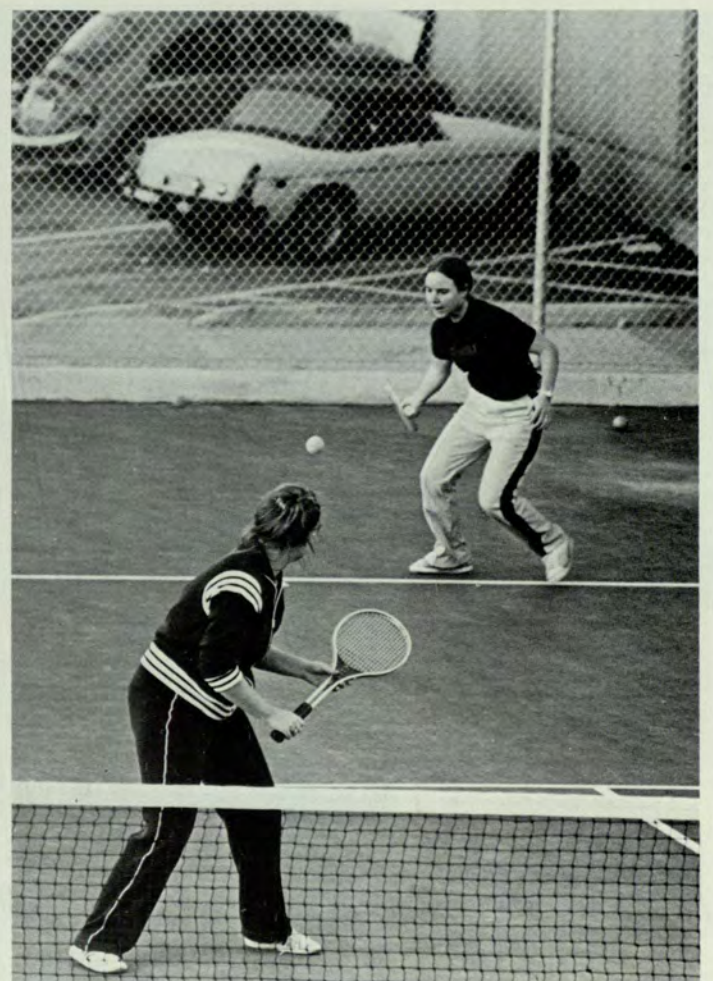
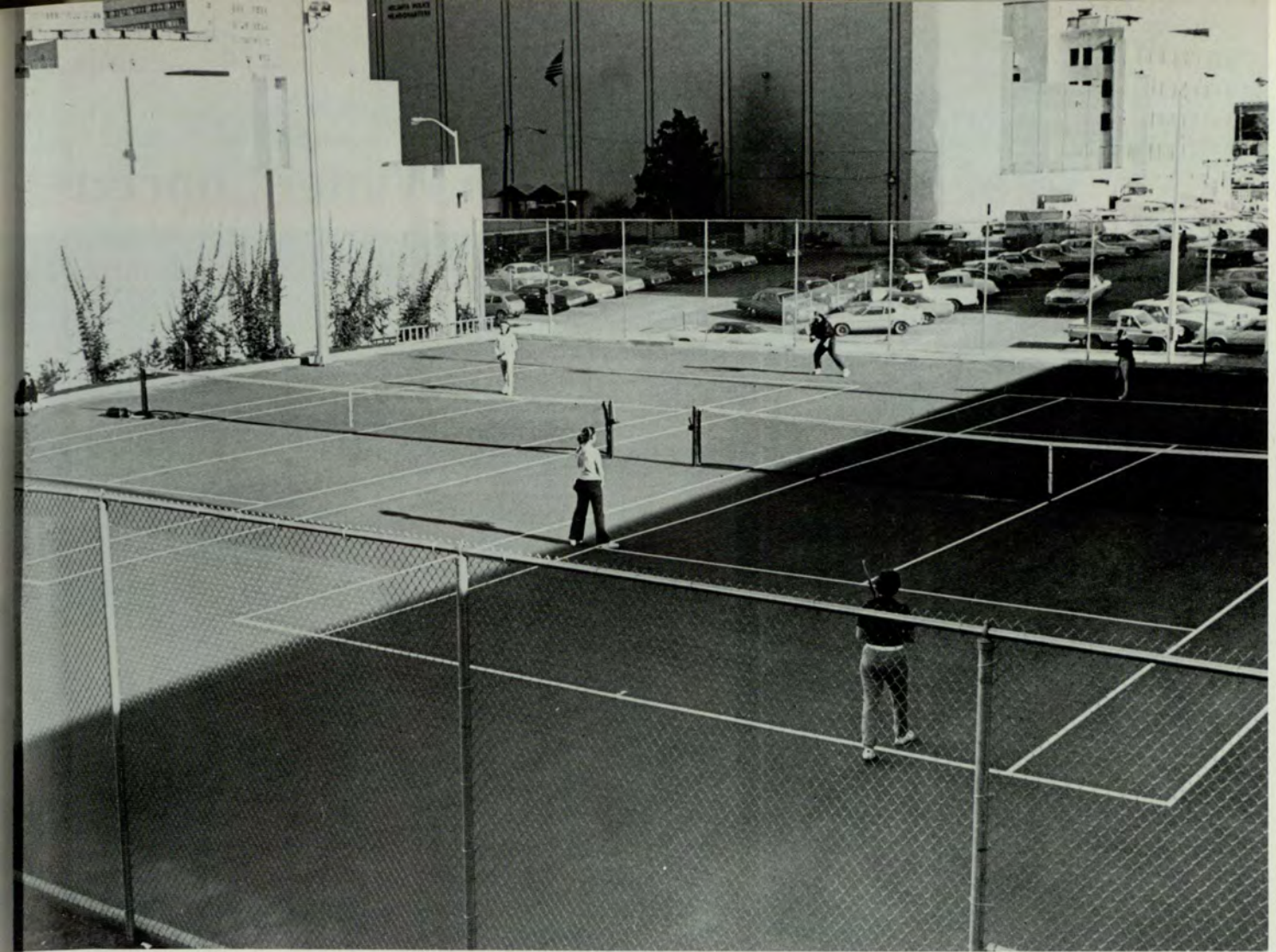
Fight Night featured a total of thirteen fights as Theta Chi of Georgia Tech and Pi Kappa Alpha of Georgia State dominated the event.

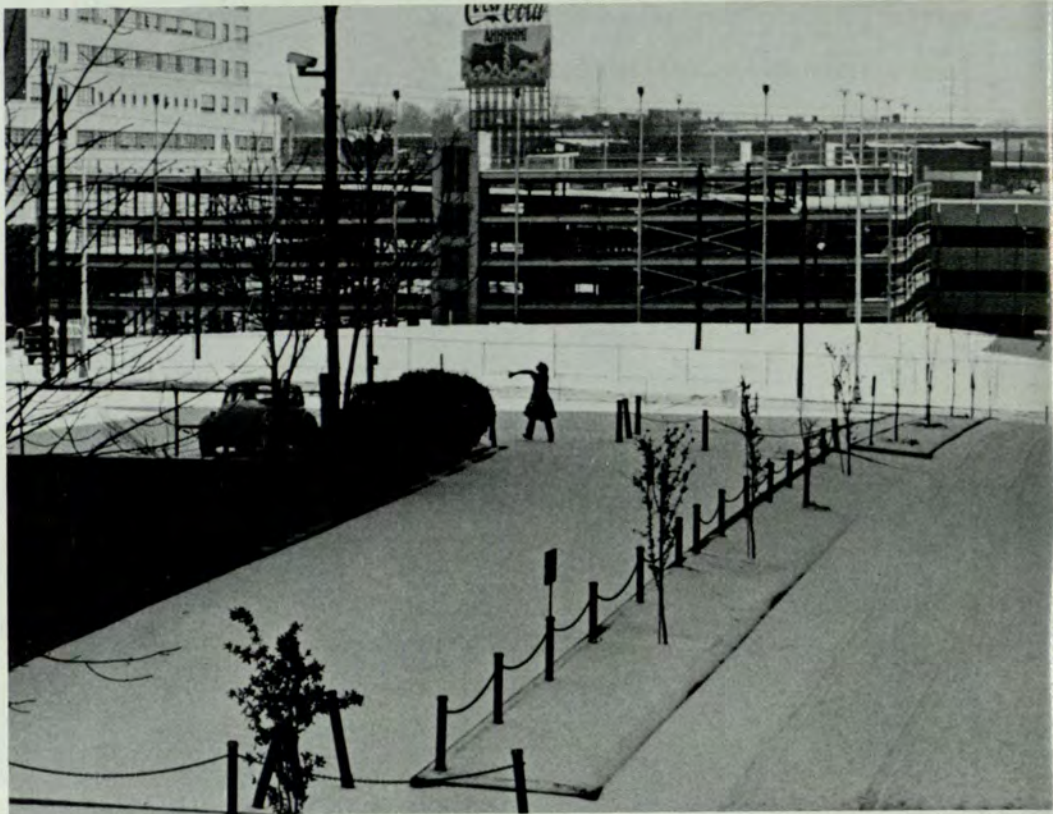




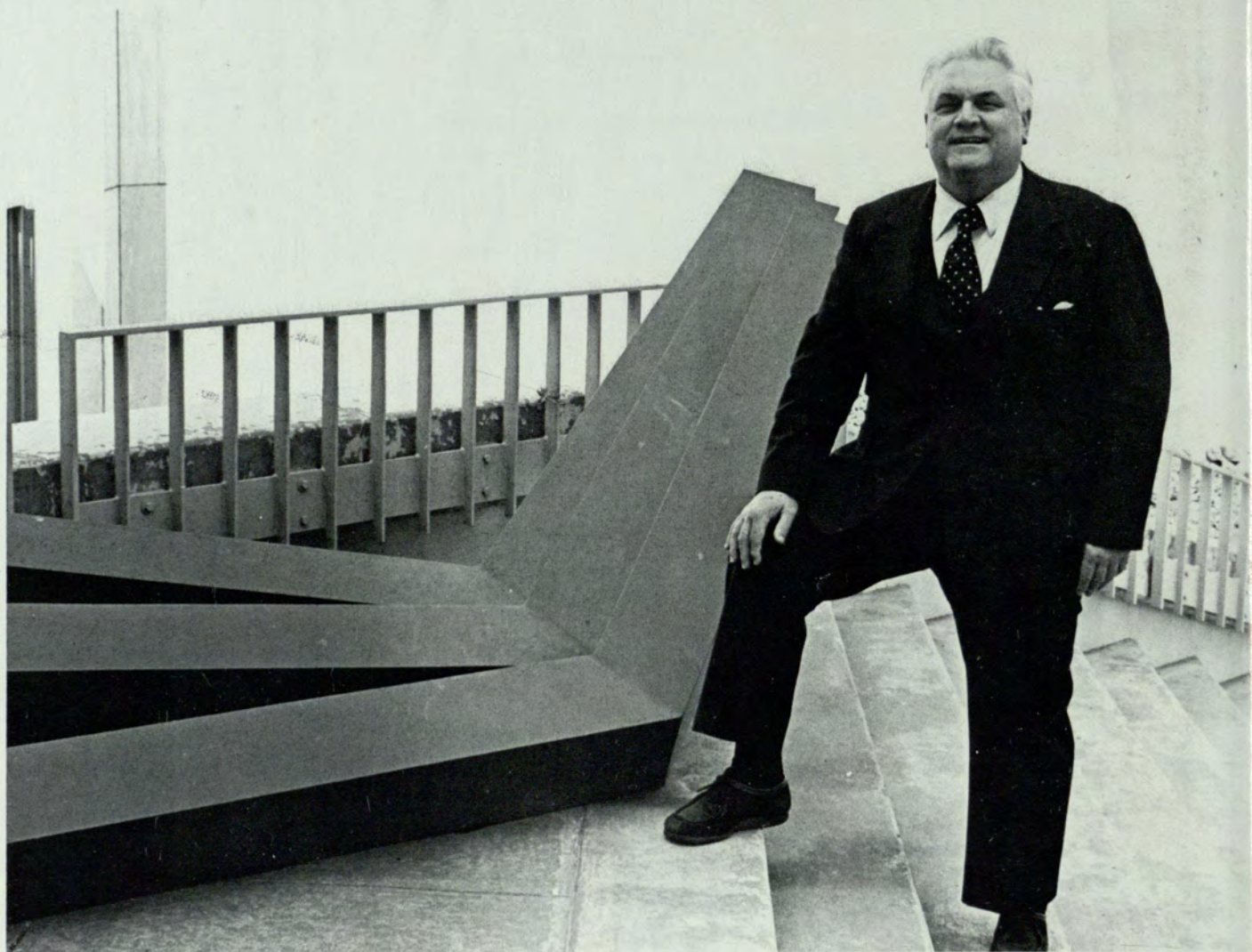
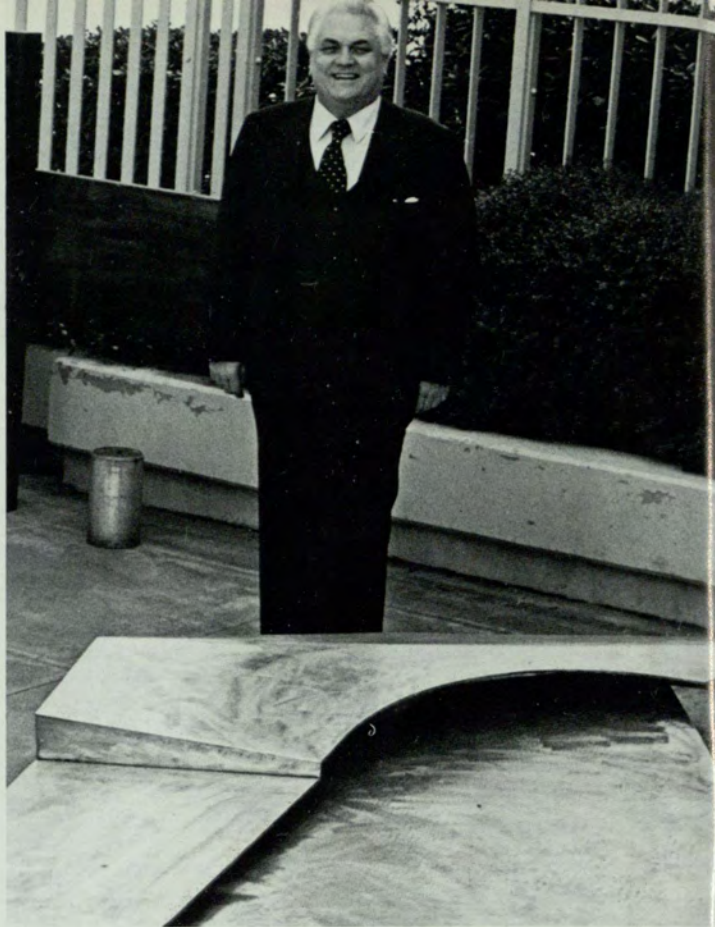
# Mother Nature Dumps Record Sleet Storm on Atlanta

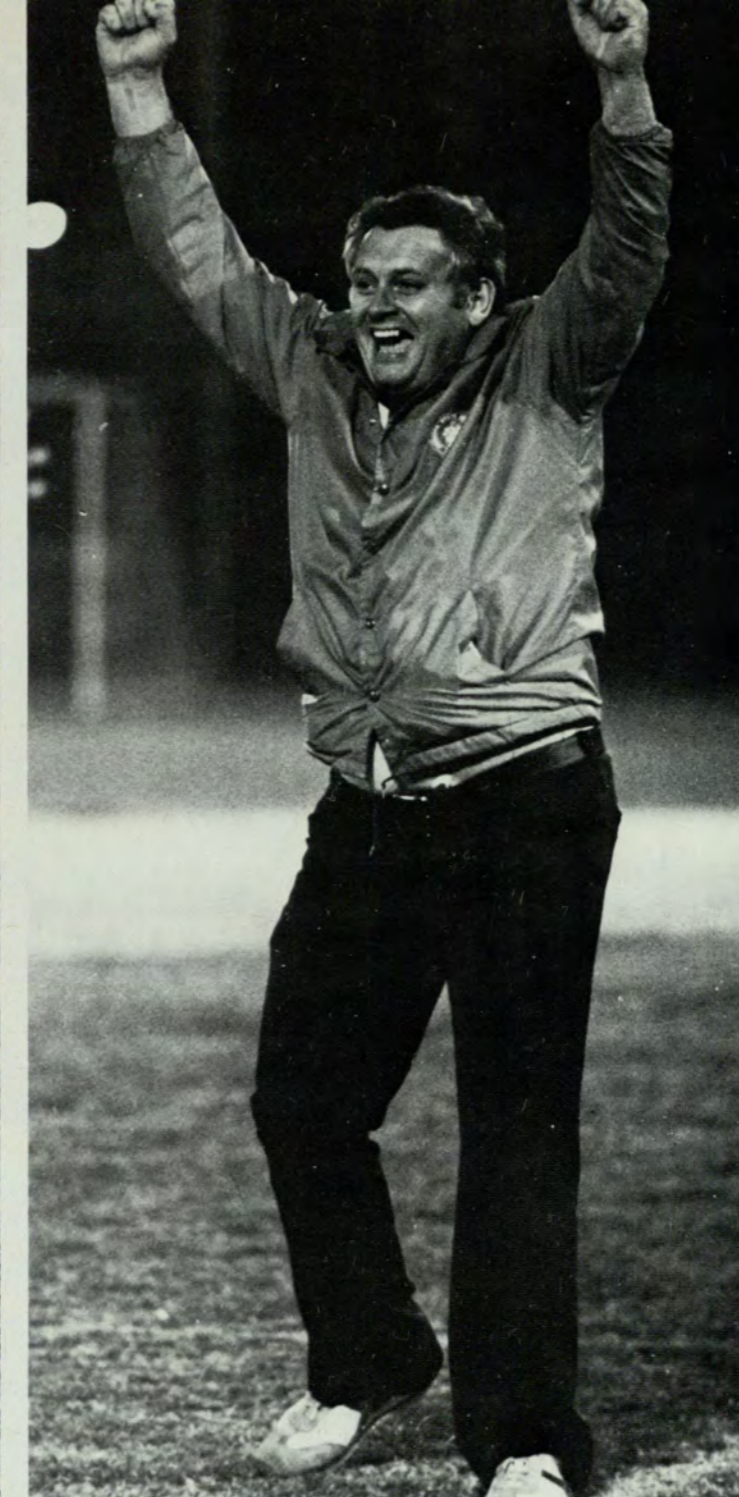
## Soccer

The Georgia State University Soccer Team, starting as many as four freshmen most of the year, became the surprise team of the Sun Belt Conference in 1978, finishing second behind Jacksonville with a 10-5-0 won-loss-tied record.

Led by seniors Bobby Moody and Gary Levengood, who were the top two scorers with 18 and 17 points respectively, GSU put together a nine-game winning streak, which saw the Panthers knock off highly regarded South Carolina, 2-0, behind the superb play of sophomore goalkeeper Jeff Leach.

Leach, along with teammates Levengood, Moody and freshman Ty Martin, was named to the All-Conference Team following the tournament, which Jacksonville won by edging out GSU, 2-1.



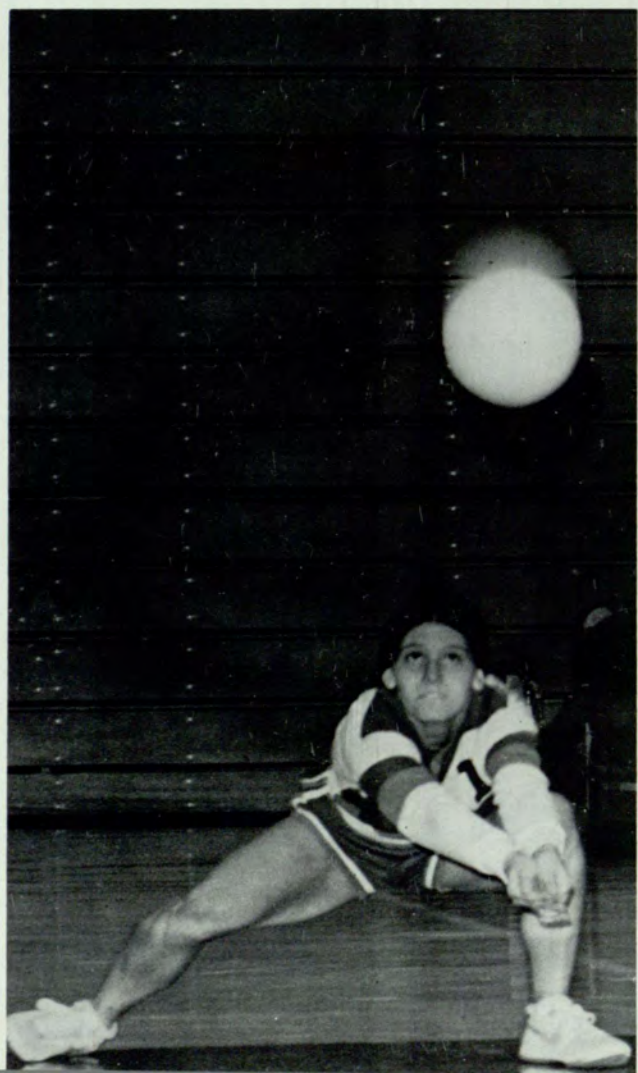


## Soccer

Thus, the Lady Panthers are looking forward to next year with the hope of getting a shot in the national tournament after the southern regionals.

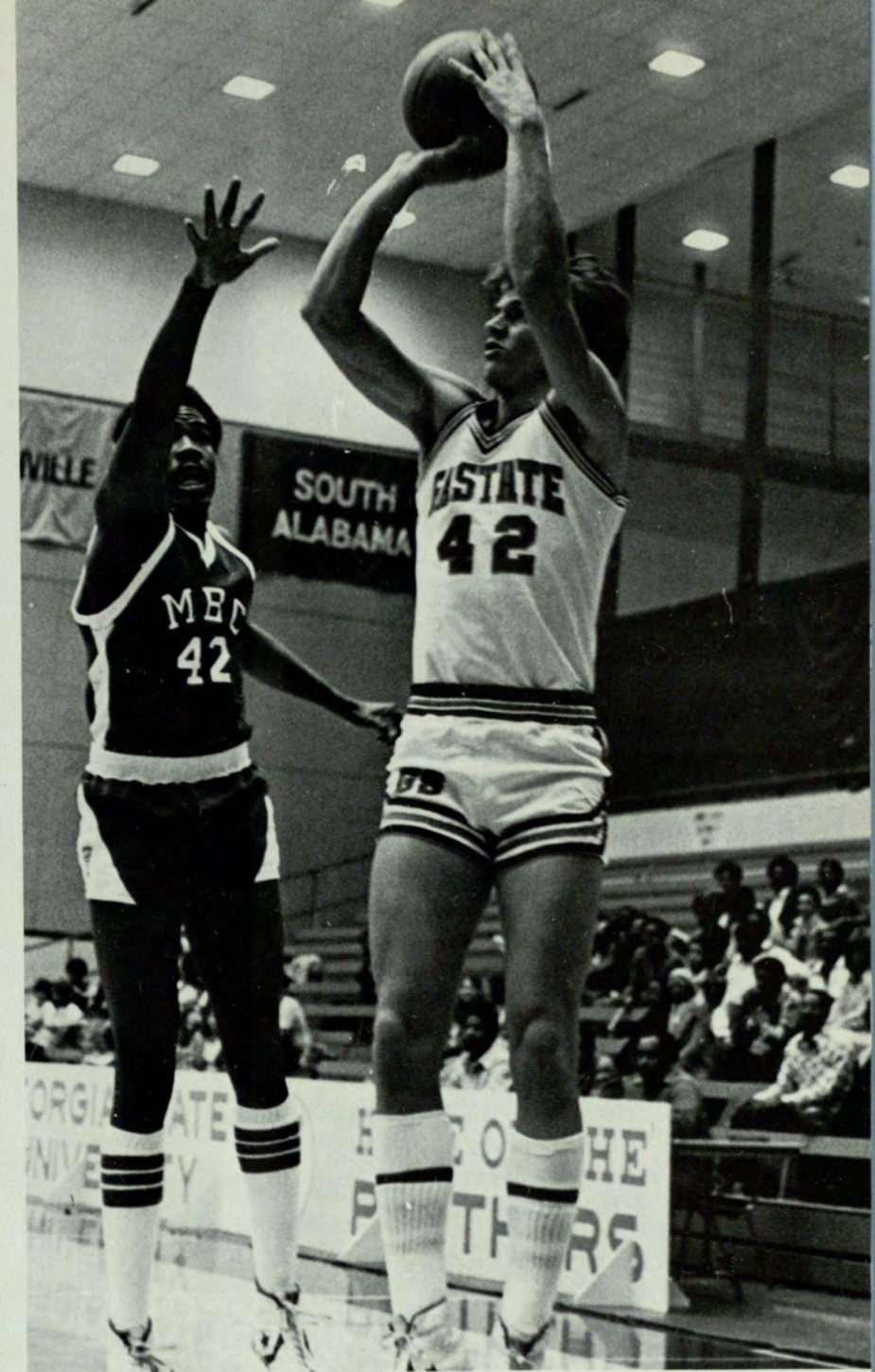
## Men's Basketball

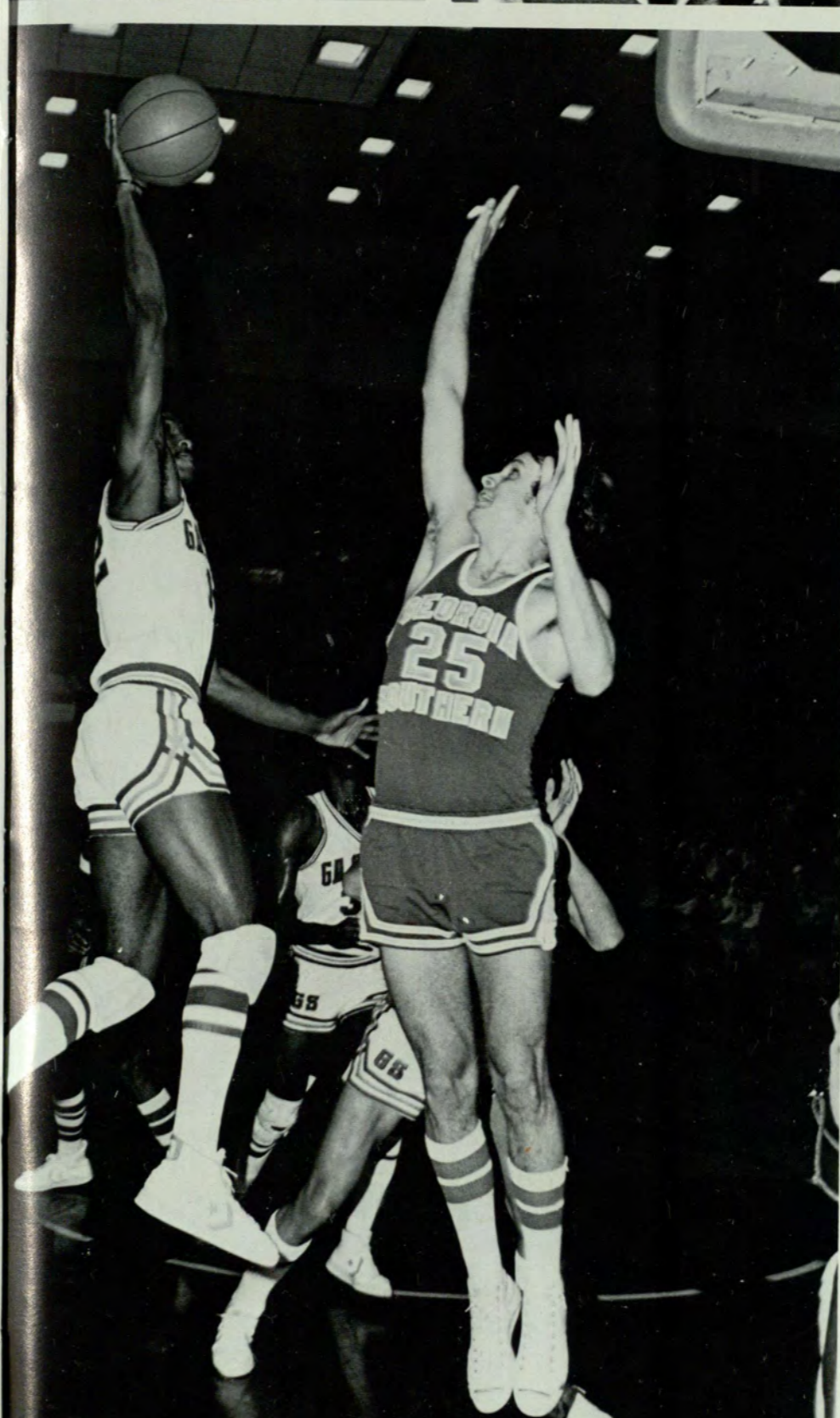
The 1978-79 version of the Georgia State University Panthers came into the season with high hopes.

GSU had a 5-21 record in 1977-78 but Coach Roger Couch had just completed a good recruiting year, picking up such players as junior college transfer Don Ross and former Cobb County star Mark Gulmire. Ross was considered by everyone knowing anything about the Panthers to be a great asset to the team at forward. Gulmire too was to be a help in the middle.

No, 1978-79 was not a very good year for GSU men's basketball. Many close to the program think, however, that brighter days are not too far away for the Panthers.

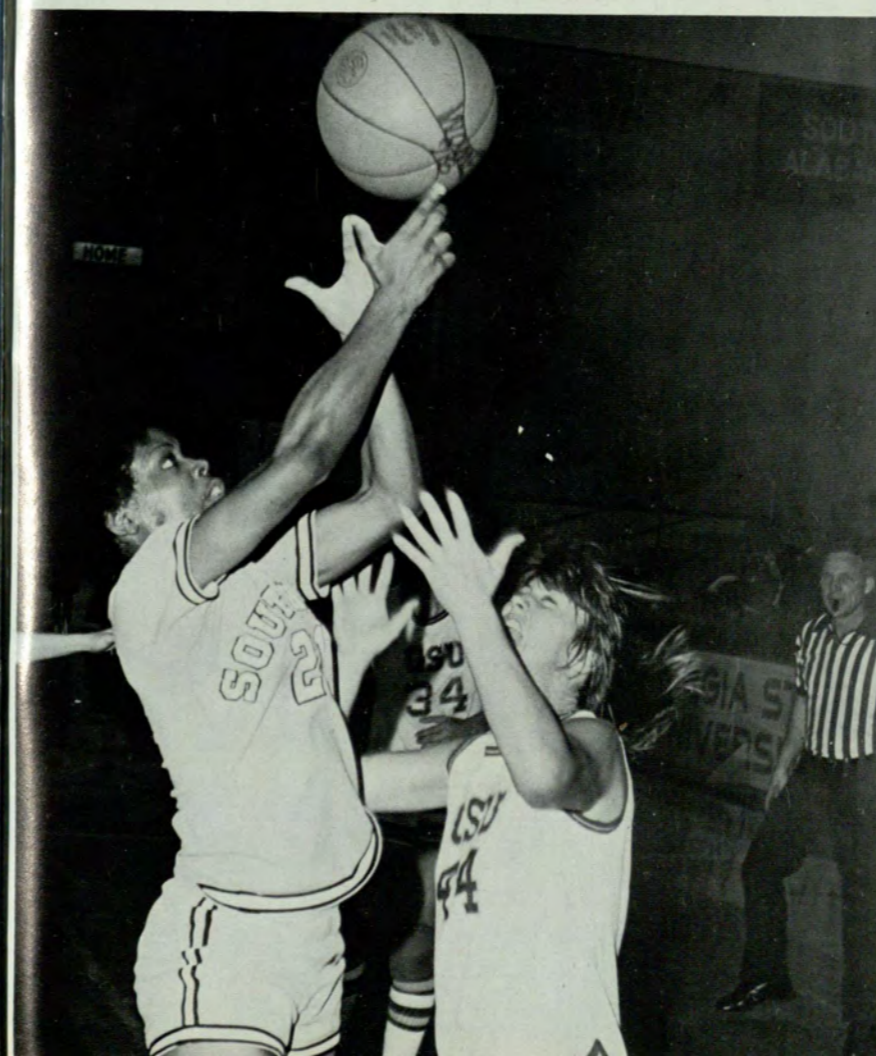
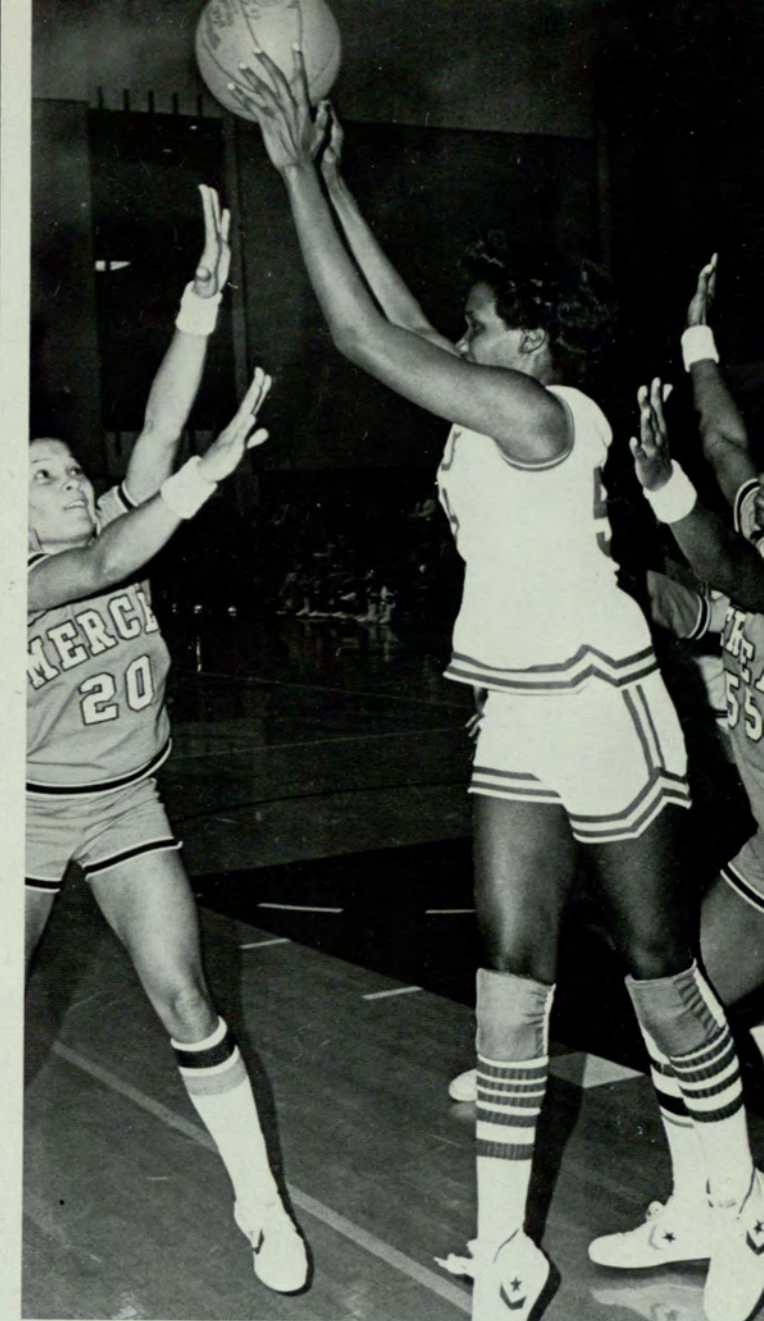
## Women's Basketball

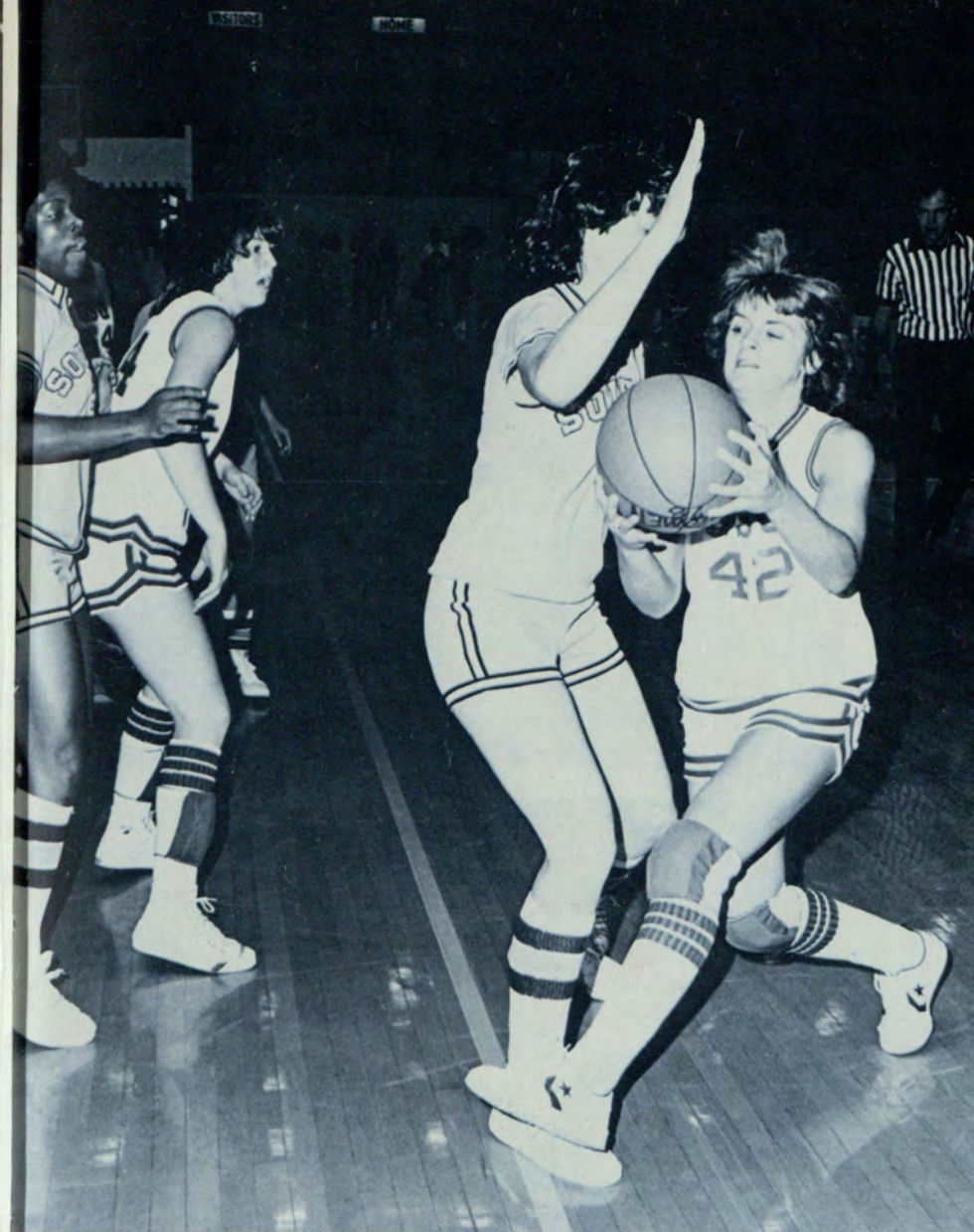

## Swimming

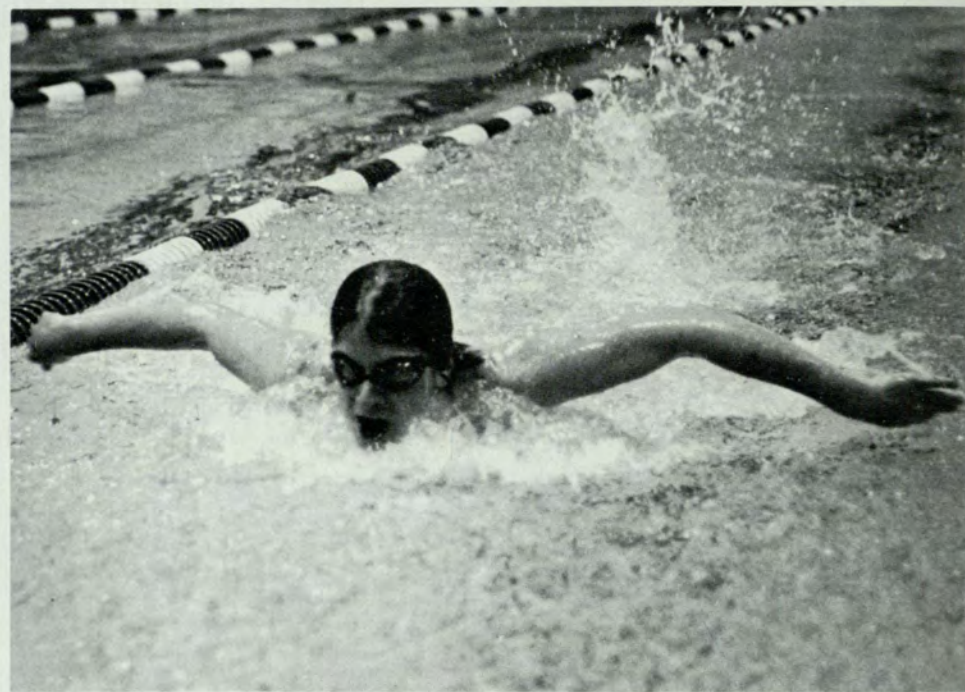
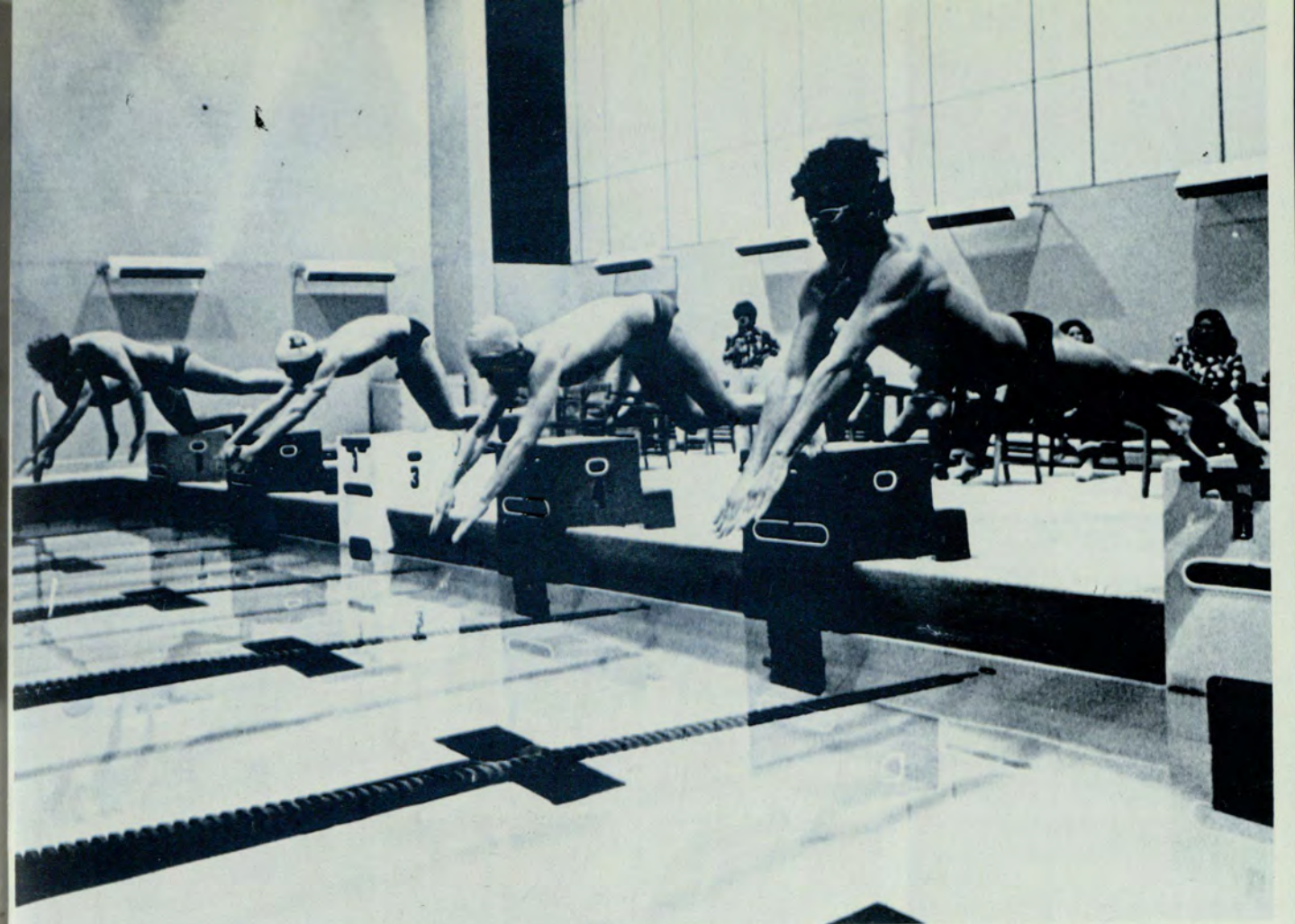
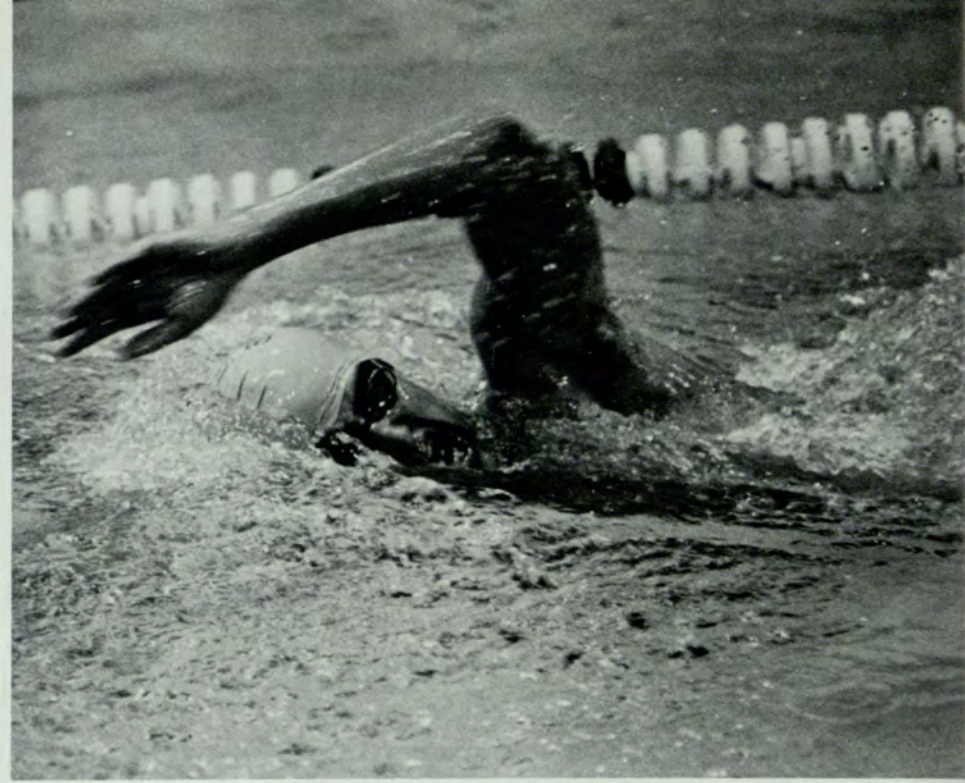

Football, basketball, baseball . . . these are a big part of the sports world that get heavy coverage by the media for individual excellence, and rightly so.

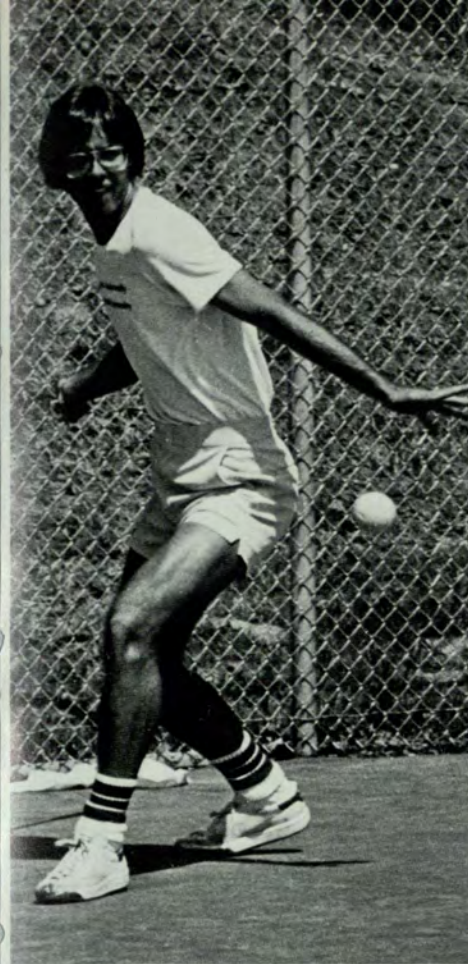
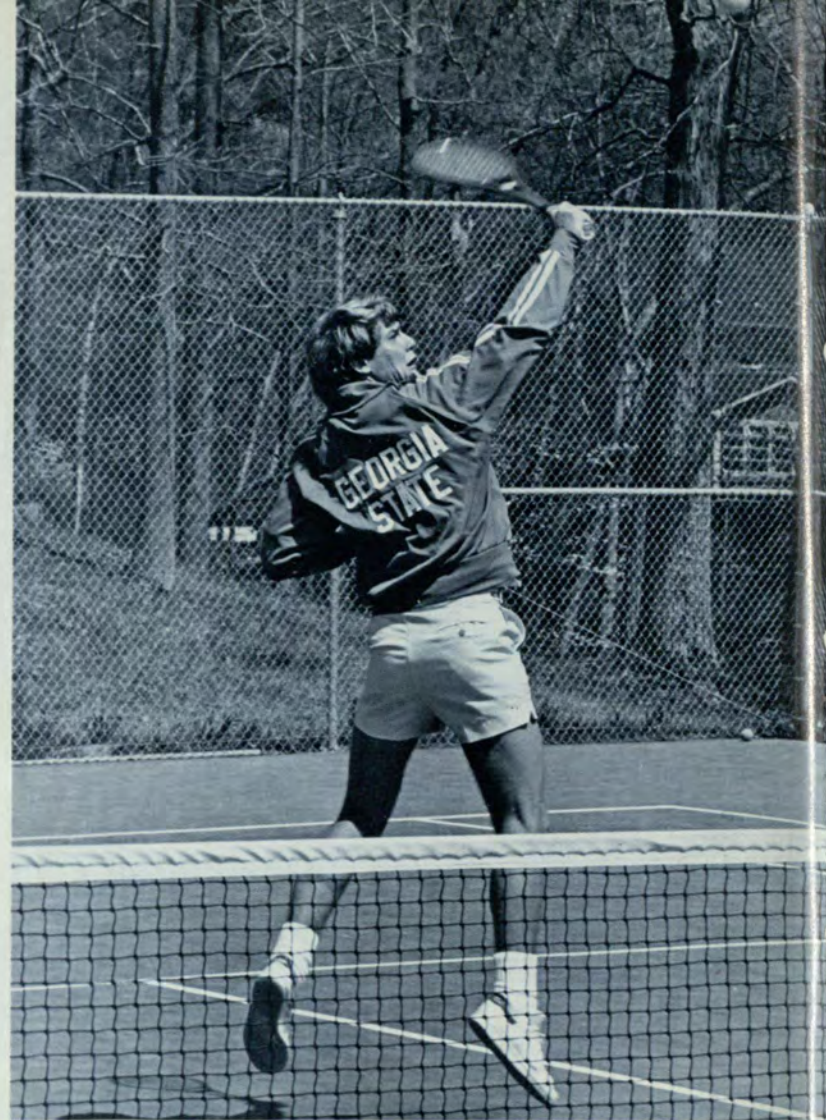
But there are many other sports that also require individual excellence that don't get much coverage by the media. And right in the middle of this group is cross country.

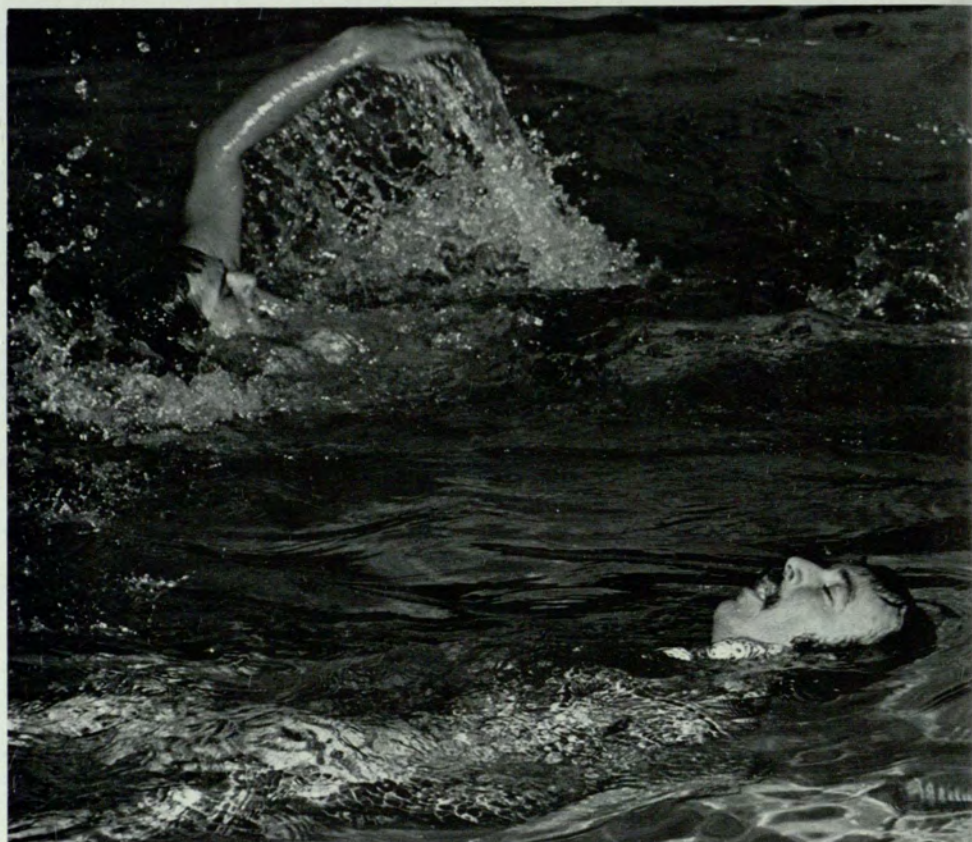
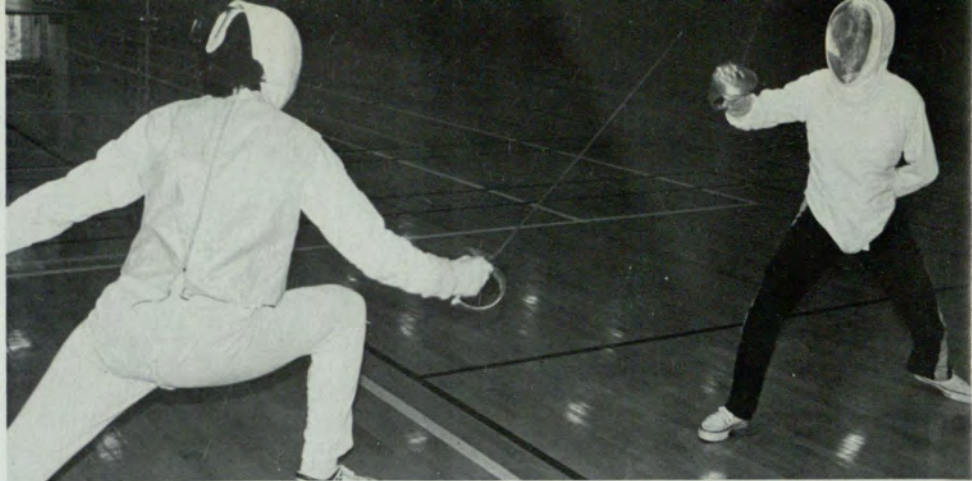






## Recreational Services

Baseball once again became a part of Georgia State University's intercollegiate athletics program for the first time since 1972. Former major league baseball pitcher Jack Humphrey was named head baseball coach last August. The 34-year-old Portland, Oregon native signed several players to scholarships shortly after he was named coach to provide him with a "solid" first year team. Preparation began with workouts and scrimmages last fall. As a member of the Sun Belt Conference, GSU must field a baseball team this year. And baseball fans have the promise of Coach Jack Humphrey that Georgia State will have a quality baseball team.

Meanwhile, women's sports at GSU received a boost with the creation of first women's softball team ever at Georgia State University. Patricia Nelson, backed with seventeen years of experience, was named last year as the coach of the GSU women's softball team. Coach Nelson also a graduate student at GSU was optimistic about the approaching season.

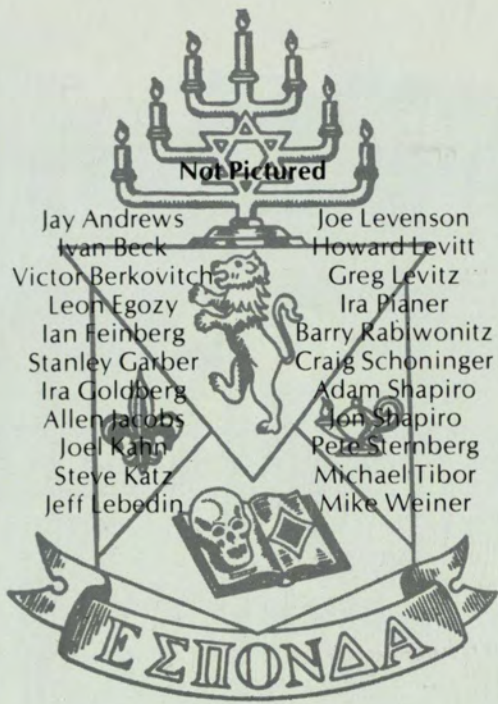

# Specifications

The 1979 *Rampway* was printed and bound by Taylor Publishing Company in Dallas, Texas. Offset lithography was used throughout. The paper stock is 80 pound Taylor enamel. First and last signatures are 100 pound enamel. Press-run was 9,000 copies.

**Cover and Endsheets:** The cover material is Tan Fabrikoid wrapped on a 15 point binder's board. The design is embossed and hand rubbed; the title has been applied by silk screening. The endsheets were printed 100 percent Brown #42 on 65 pound cover weight long grain stock.

**Photo Reproduction:** All black and white halftones were reproduced using a 150 line elliptical dot screen. All four-color was reproduced from actual size Cibachrome or Ektacolor prints. Prints were made by Kelly Mills from

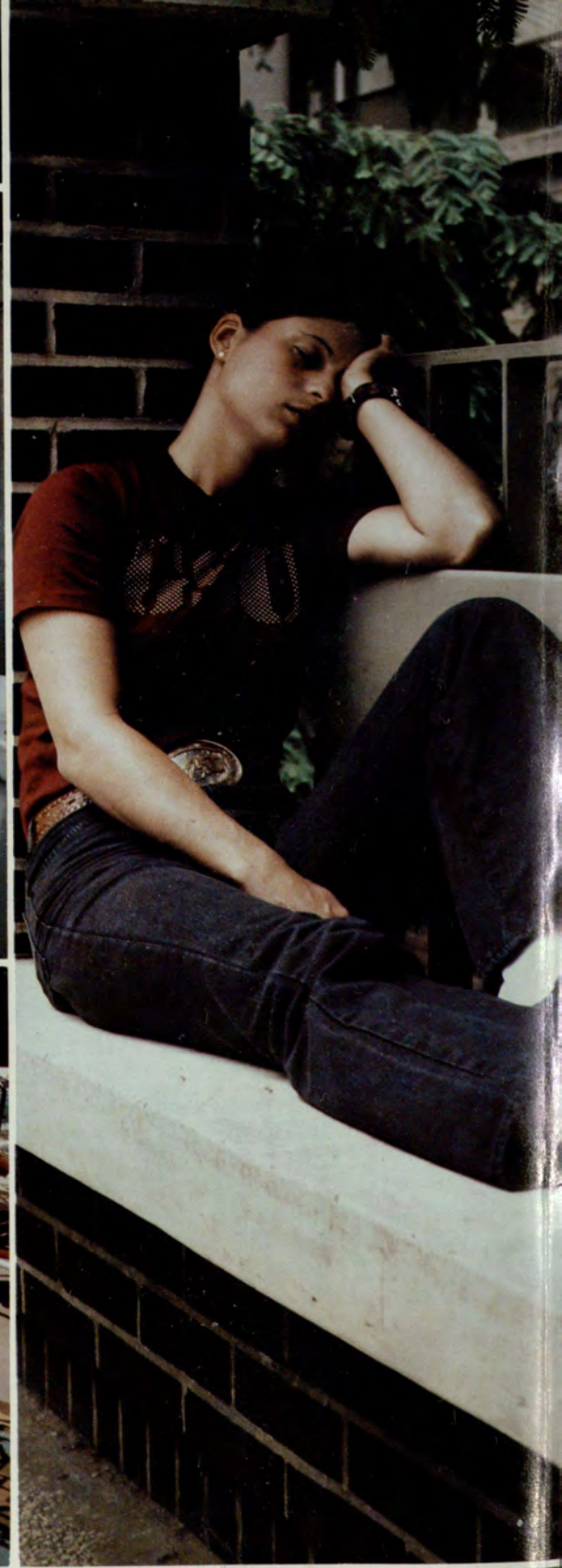
slides and color negatives. Color separations were made by Taylor Publishing Company's Hell Laser Scanner.

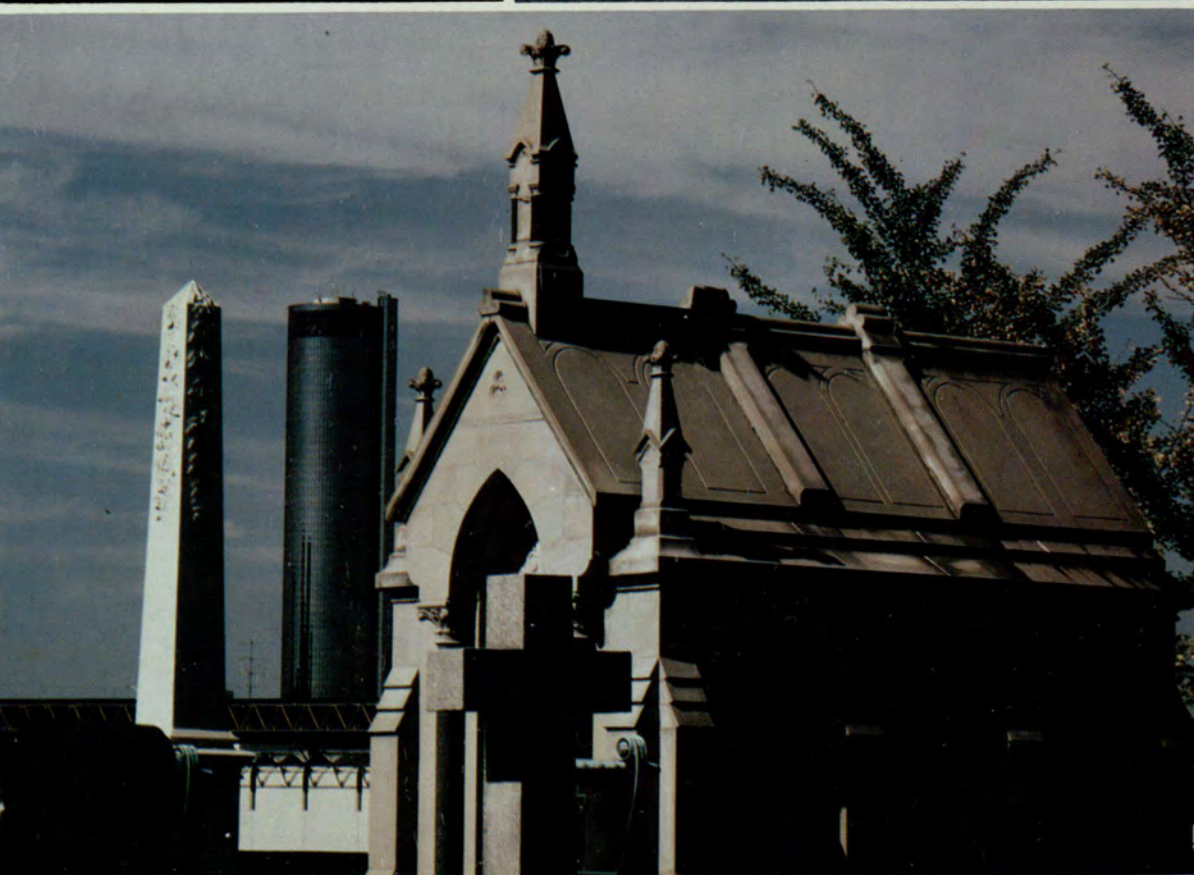
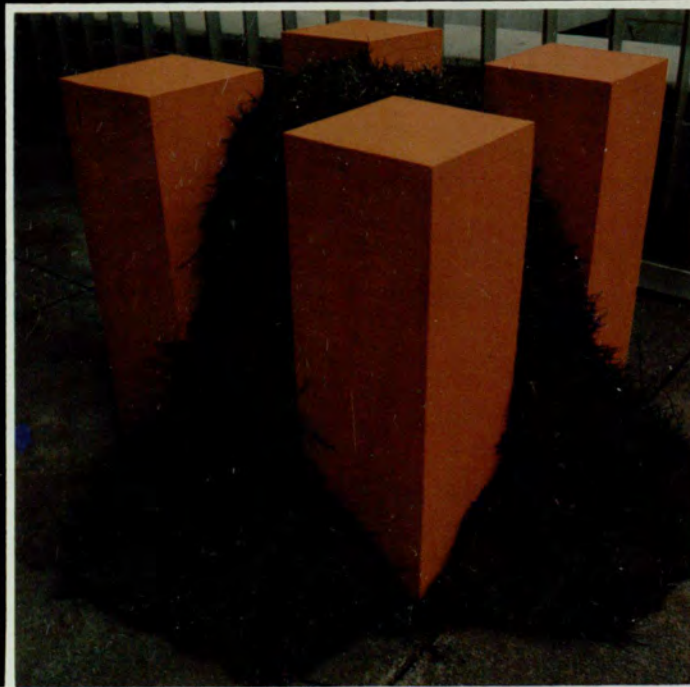


For individual recreation and exercise many GSU students are turning from tennis to racquetball. And in keeping with the demand, racquetball courts are springing up all over Atlanta. GSU also offers facilities for both of these sports as well as swimming, jogging and dozens of other sports activities for its community. Jogging is still popular; joggers are seen almost constantly on the outdoor track and on the sidewalks by the PE complex as they return from the



Oakland Cemetery. The joggers run in the gym during inclement weather.

For those less active there is Hurt Park and Central City Park where many GSU students eat lunch, study or relax between long breaks in their schedules. On a warm sunny day a few minutes past noon, Central City Park is jammed with students and nearby office workers. While sitting in either of the parks one or more of Atlanta's urban walls is



visible. These are a part of the campaign begun several years ago to bring interest back to downtown and to beautify some of the bare, exposed walls of some of the buildings.

Central City Park is a common place for musical or recreational programs and anti-anything demonstrations and protests. But whatever is happening there it never seems to deter the Hare Krishnas from chanting their message.





An addition to Central City Park was completed last year. An open air theatre was built across from the park area and next to the Candler Building. The amphitheatre has a wooden floor stage and a display of water fountains around and behind the stage. The first annual free Atlanta Jazz Festival took place in part at the amphitheatre last September. More events have been scheduled for this beautiful new facility.



The Student Government Association launched an all-out lobbying effort for the Municipal Auditorium across from Sparks Hall and the Lawyers Title Building a block from campus. Last fall the SGA Programs Board brought *Pablo Cruise* to GSU. The auditorium was the site of the concert which was opened by a local band, *White Face*.

The lobbying effort by students for the Municipal Auditorium and the Lawyers

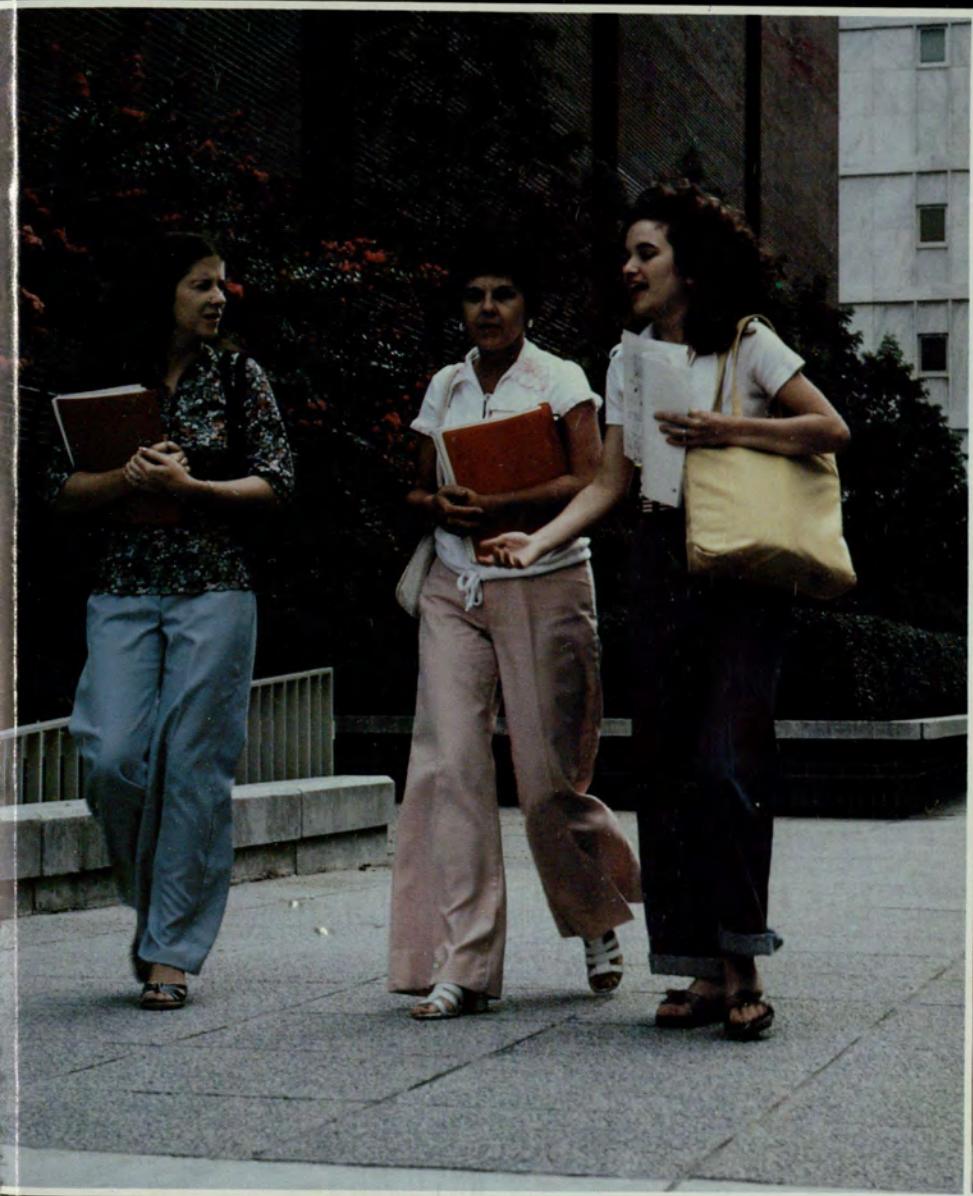


Title Building is to make the Georgia Board of Regents aware of GSU's need for more space and to persuade the Board to allocate funds for the purchase of these two structures by Georgia State University. In 1978 Marie Walters Dodd was named to the Georgia Board of Regents as the first alumna of GSU since 1975 to serve on the Board.

An event on Peachtree Street which has become a yearly tradition is the Peach-



tree Road Race on July 4th. This event receives nationwide attention and has had such participants as Frank Shorter and Lasse Viron, both of 1976 Olympic fame. Many GSU students and alumnae take part in this event as well. Last year alumna Lisa Lorraine Hoskins did well and finished high in the standings. The 6.2 mile course begins at Lenox Square and goes along Peachtree Road to Piedmont Park.



Atlanta has been in the political lime-light more often since Georgian Jimmy Carter was elected President of the United States. The election of a southerner was considered quite a feat and gave the entire south a boost in the national picture.

A result of Carter's presidency has been the increased exposure of Atlanta and Georgia to the rest of the nation. The



February visit of the Vice Premier of China, Deng Xiaoping, was a very important and historical event. The Vice Premier was squired around the City and its neighboring communities to visit the Ford Motor Assembly Plant in Hapeville, eat dinner at the Governor's mansion, and tour the computer center at Georgia Tech. One of the largest press entourages accompanied Deng Xiaoping on his trip through the United States.



Neighborhoods in Atlanta, such as Morningside and Inman Park, are being revitalized by Atlanta residents. Buying and refurbishing an old home in one of these or other neighborhoods near downtown is a popular, expensive and time consuming activity.

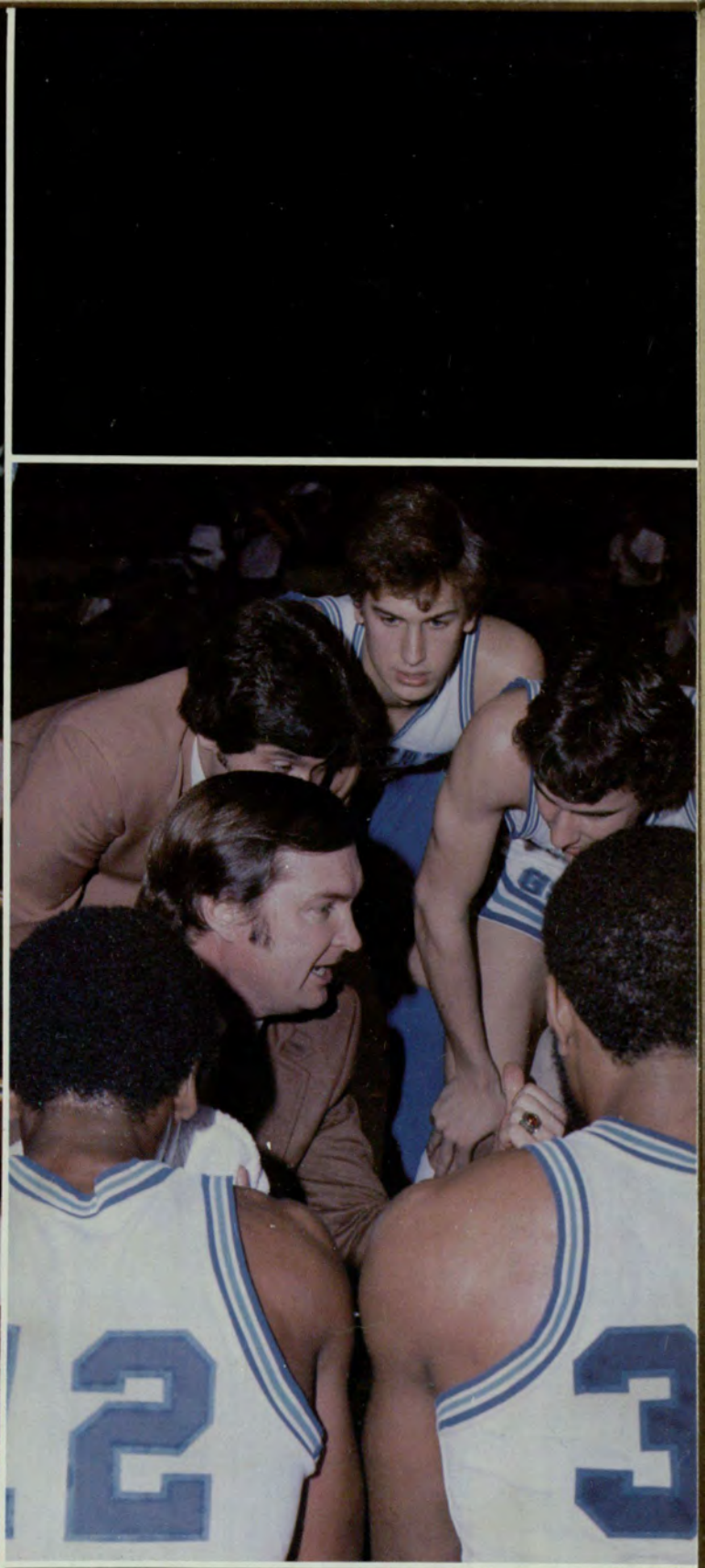
Campus life at Georgia State University consists of about twenty Greek social organizations and numerous other business, honorary and special interest

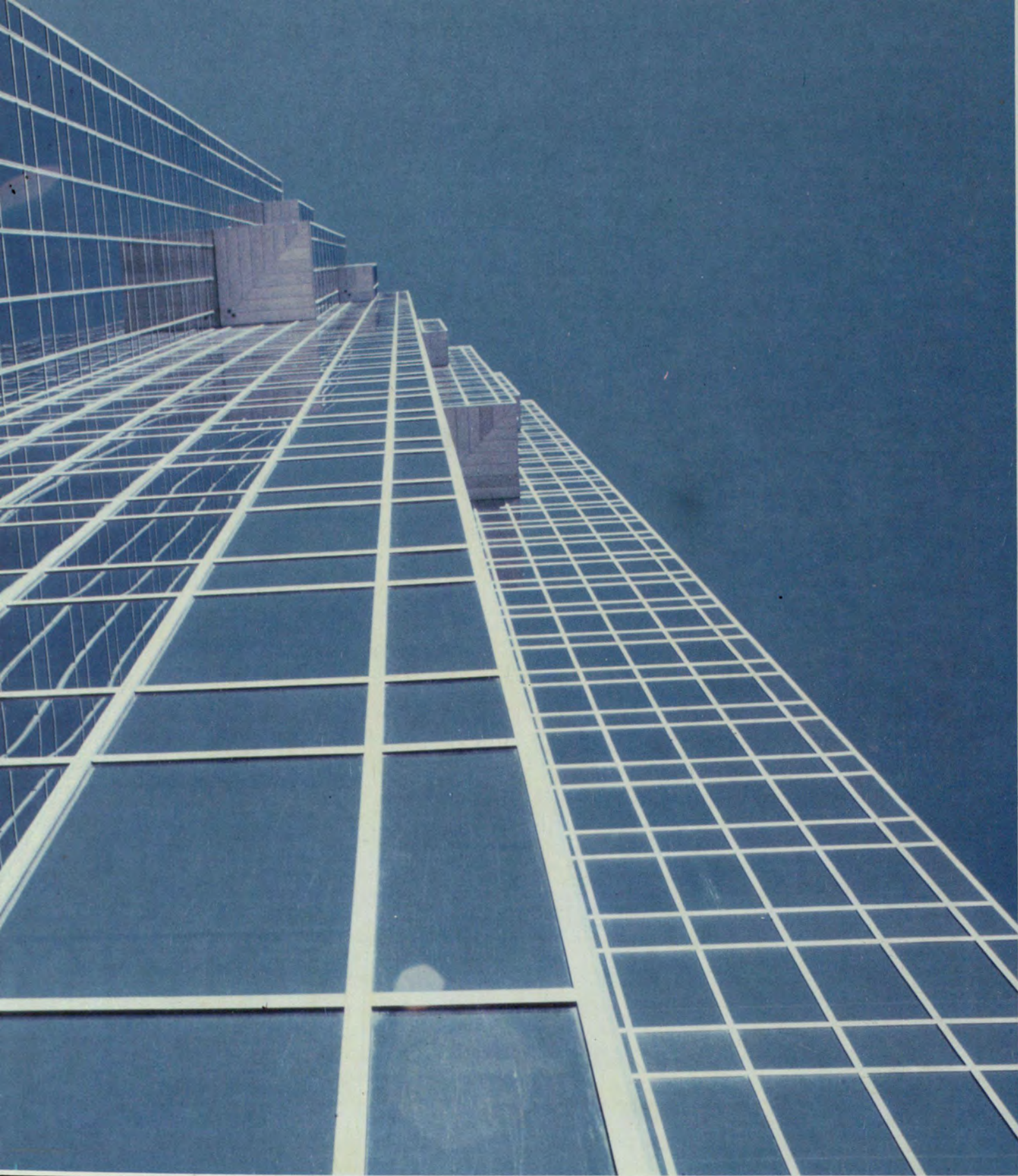
Academically, GSU has a tremendous reputation. For example, Art Department Chairman Joseph Perrin had two
