


DAMES AT SEA

Last spring the G.S.U. Players presented *Dames at Sea*, a delightful spoof of the 1930's Busby Berkley musicals.


Dames at Sea played at the J.C. Camp Student Center Theatre from March 28-April 7 where it was well-received by Georgia State University and the public.



PI SIGMA EPSILON FASHION SHOW AND PIPE SMOKING CONTEST




HORN FROM FOREST TO CONCERT HALL


HEALTH FAIR



HERBIE MANN







Many Georgia State students no longer have to contend with traffic and parking problems. After five years of construction the Metropolitian Atlanta Rapid Transit Authority (MARTA) opened the first of its train lines on June 30, 1979. The east line, as it is known, runs from Avondale to Georgia State in 12 minutes. This includes stopping at seven stations where passengers may exit or enter. The air-conditioned trains run the 7.1 mile track at approximately 70 m.p.h.









INCEPT

To orient new students to the campus and life at Georgia State University, several Incept conferences are held during the year. Under President David Gottlieb, Incept is the orientation program for freshmen and transfer students. Since the majority of new students enter in the fall, Incept concentrates on the later part of the summer. At this time, four two-day conferences are held for freshmen and two one-day conferences are held for transfer students.

Incept is not required, in fact it costs \$15.00 to attend one of the two-day sessions. However, the benefits of starting the quarter with some knowledge of the campus and life at Georgia State make Incept an important part of the school year.

Freshmen orientation emphasizes college life in general. The entering students spend the night at the Marriott Hotel in Atlanta and participate in a rigorous schedule of activities. The first activity is to take the math placement test. From there it's on to a guided tour of the campus, marketplace, a dance, and registration. The conference is concluded with Parents Night. This is a time when Inceptors orient entering freshmen's parents with the many aspects of life at G.S.U.

Transfer orientation emphasizes college life at G.S.U., a guided tour of the campus, marketplace and registration. Transfer conferences are held at the beginning of each quarter.



















HOURLY CARE **PROGRAM**




























Construction

Alumni



















ATLANTA RHYTHM SECTION

SIGMA NU SWEEPSTAKES





















NOAH'S FLOOD

Georgia State University was able to experience a rollicking revival of Noah's Flood, a medieval mystery play presented fall quarter by the Speech and Drama Department's Readers Theatre. The authentic interpretation included a pageant wagon as the ark, which was similar to the mobile stage that was pulled through many English villages between 1350 and 1550.

Noah's Flood revolves around the task of Noah (Michael West) to persuade his wife (Nicole Phillips) to board the ark before the rain begins. Of course the good advice of God (Eric Burden) lends peace to the family squabble, and so Noah's Flood ends on a sentimental note.

Directed by Linda Burson Lewis, the play radiated fine performances, interesting action, and melodic music.





Fall Recap

Many interesting events evolved during fall quarter this year. GSU's WRAS radio changed its program format, SGA approved a revised constitution, Independent Student Organization (ISO) was created, the women's basketball coach, Rankin Cooter, resigned, enthusiasm for GSU's night students was stressed, and the Committee on Student Communications (CSC) did not suspend the Signal. Each of these events affected student life at GSU in some way.

One of the more controversial issues concerned a decision to be made by the CSC. Members of WRAS radio who were "dissatisfied" with certain actions conducted by General Manager Mike Garretson, brought their complaints to the CSC during hearings on October 1 and 3.

Changing the program format from "progressive" music to a wider variety of music was one of his actions that was focused on during the hearings. On October 8, Dean of Students William Baggett announced the decision in favor of Garretson. And as a result of the decision, WRAS offers its listeners music from pop to rock to jazz — all album oriented.

After an October edition of the Signal which included in its









entertainment section on the night life in Atlanta, there came a strong negative response from the SGA. They requested to the CSC to suspend publication of the *Signal* but were not successful.

A new student group was organized fall quarter, Independent Student Organization (ISO). Among the club's interests are to improve the SGA and spark more involvement in university affairs.




Black Awareness Week







What the Butler Saw

The GSU Players' winter production of Joe Orton's What the Butler Saw brought an assortment of entertainment to their audiences. What the audience saw was a delightful farce set in a mental institution during the 1950s.

The plot is simple enough. Dr. Prentice (Robert Luttrel McBath, Jr.) is head of the institution which is being investigated by a government official, Dr. Rance (Dorset Noble). Dr. Rance ends up investigating Dr. Prentice because he believes the latter may have homosexual tendencies. Mrs. Prentice (Burg Blanton), a lesbian and nymphomaniac, has her problems with bellhop Nicholas Beckett (Jack Swersie) who is blackmailing her to get a job from Dr. Prentice. Her daughter, Geraldine (Cecilia Smith), and Nicholas discover that they are twins and who their real parents are. In the meantime, Sergeant March (Gary Anderson) is on a hunt for the "missing parts" of Sir Winston Churchill.

Under the direction of Dean James E. Sligh, the actors do a fine job speaking in British accents and performing the physical comedy essential to the farce.




















Hit and Run Productions

Hit and Run Productions is a new drama organization on campus that was created by students fall quarter of this year. The organization, considered a drama club, encourages students to write and submit their own plays to the club so they may reveal their own talents as playwrights.

Three one-act plays were presented by Hit and Run Productions for its debut in January. Each play was written, directed and performed by students. The plays, *Girl Talk, Save Us Oh Lord*, and *Turf*, were enjoyed by enthusiastic audiences.

Girl Talk, written and directed by Cork Bowman, is a "slice of life" that enters the lives of two female characters who are roommates. Jennifer (Dee Watkins), a twenty-five year old, is dating a teenager who is sixteen years old. Her roommate Susan (Lenore Guirreri), who is twenty-seven, tries to convince Jennifer that her age presents a problem and that the relationship will not succeed. As Jennifer prepares for her date, Susan watches the excitement that she experiences and, in the end, reciprocates that enthusiasm to Jennifer. The play illustrates how each character reacts to a situation that is not highly respected by society.

Save Us Oh Lord was written, directed, and narrated by Sande Cropsey. The story involves a man who became a preacher to receive the glory and acceptance from a congregation, as had the "unnamed preacher" who influenced him. The smooth and flowing dialogue of Save Us Oh Lord, done in reader's theater style, capture the humor of Preacher Poke's (Paul Alarcon) delusions. Although Poke preaches his best sermon in attempting to "save" the soul of the sensuous Dixie Star (Cecilia Smith), her death reveals the ironic results of his delusions. The dedicated, gossipping women of the congregation were played by Nancy Hawkins and Marijo Jackson. The aggressive "unnamed preacher" was played by Gary Anderson.

Turf is an absurdist play written by Dee Watkins and was directed by Burg Blanton. Through its humor, Turf shows how man can be molded by traditions and norms into what is respected by society. The play begins in mime with the little clown (Jon Witherspoon) investigating his toy box. He finds blocks and builds a wall. The theme of building a wall between man and society streams throughout the play until finally, in the end, he has completely isolated himself from society. Other scenes which are spoken take place in a home, a classroom, and at a graduation. The actors improvised throughout the play and displayed their flexibility in changing character. The cast included Jon Witherspoon (little clown at different ages), Gary Anderson (Daddy One, student, principal, policeman), Elouise Montague (Mommy One, student, girlfriend, secretary), Magella Hardie (Daddy Two, teacher, fast-food waiter), and Beth Chandler (Mommy Two, Cheerleader, Surveyer).







"Goodbye to All Cats"




Jerry Paris






G.S.U. Jazz Bands






Men's Tennis




MEN'S CROSS COUNTRY










Men's Basketball

The Lady Panthers won the Sun Belt Invitational Tournament and placed third in the GAIAW. Teresa Allen was the most valuable player.








Touch The Earth

Touch The Earth is definitely an exciting addition to Georgia State University. Through this program outdoor recreational activities are coordinated for GSU students. The Coordinator of Outdoor Recreation, with the help of the student advisory committee for the Touch The Earth program, helps plan trips, although each trip develops its own detailed agenda. These trips range from backpacking in the Georgia mountains to snow skiing in Vail, Colorado. The student activity fee buys the outdoor equipment and the department pays all other expenses except food and transportation, which must be paid for by the student.

Traditionally, the largest trips are rafting trips. The Rookie Rafter Splash and the Ocoee Raft trip each averaged thirty people on their excursions. The two Vail ski trips had fifteen and forty-four participants respectfully. An additional ski trip to the French-Swiss Ski School in Boone, North Carolina was offered for academic credit.





















One of the benefits of attending Georgia State University is the abundant access to any free programs and services. An example is the recreational service program. 




























Intramural Sports


Intramural sports at Georgia State are opened to all students regularly enrolled, current staff and faculty, but excludes current and recently active varsity athletes. Officials and equipment are provided by the intramural program so there is generally little or no cost for the participants.
