Our school, with its proposed ministration to 5556 former students now in the armed services who will be coming back soon, is in a jam as to the use of surplus building materials.

We are in dire need, and Marion Smith, chairman of the Board of Regents, threatens to give back the recently acquired Ivy Street Garage unless we can convert it to Evening College purposes with the money we are to receive from the Baptist Tabernacle for our present building. Captain F. A. Sams, of the Veterans Administration, has advised us that many of these returning soldiers are coming back with the loss of legs. We believe that with a fire-proof building having ramps and elevators, our dreams for them would be a reality. The Ivy Street Garage is not costing the state money, as we are liquidating the purchase price by already established rentals in the building.

We are in urgent need of wall board, plaster, plumbing fixtures, light fixtures, wiring, doors, cafeteria equipment, chairs, and flooring of any description.

We have kept up with these boys constantly and are anxious for them to stay in Georgia. Arrangements have been made so they may hold a job in and around Atlanta and go to college at night, while receiving full benefits under the G. I. Bill, and also under Public Law 16 (disabled veterans). Scores of them are already enrolled with us.
