Dear Mri. Simith:
This is to follow up your suggestion that I keep you posted so that information would be in your file concerning our progress toward acquiring surplus property.

Since my letter to you of August 14, I have been quite busy in search of surplus property, but haven't made as many contacts as I would have had there not beon a two-day holiday period granted all federal agencies.

The ripest contact I have made is at the old Fisher Body plant whore Pirestone has been making wings for PBY planes. This plant has plenty of movable partition matorial, which, if wrooked by us, could be used in our building. This includes thousands of electrical fixtures which have already been specified by Tucker to be used in the building. These poople belleve they will be out in less than a month, as it bohooves Pirestone to got out of the Pisher Body plant so that automobiles can be assombled inmediately. Pirestone, which has a lease on the building for the Navy, is the biggest oustomer of General Motors. We are doing everything we can to arrange for this material, but of course we know we are just one of many who will be in the general soramble.

I also have many letters out to people who "lonow their way around" as to surplus material and how the agency actually works. The most profitable answer so far was an inmediate reply from Mayor Hartsfield in which he gave us most useful information. Mr. Hartsfield has always been a good friend of our institution. In addition to people he suggested we should see, he advised us to write letters to Congressman Ramspeck, and Senators Ceorge and Russell, and also to make an approach through the Veterans Bureau.

This, we shall prooeed to do, and the reason we are being specific in these names is that we think you might say a word to Congressman Ramspeck or one of the sonatars if you meet them on their present facation in Georgia.
