Lloyd Preacher and Associates are now about to finish a \$300,000.00 job here, in which they took the old Ivy Street Garage and converted it into more than 50 classrooms, 25 administrative offices, 10 lavatories, - chemistry, biology, physics, and anatomy, - and put in a circulating air system which satisfactorily serves more than 25 of these rooms.

His work has been most satisfactory although the conditions under which he worked have been most trying, both from the standpoint of securing material and labor.

Having had some part in the building of about ten institutional buildings in my lifetime, I have found that Mr. A Lloyd Preacher and the group under his inspiration have more commonsense and regular old-fashioned "horse-sense" about dealing with people, and the one who is paying for the building, than anyone I have had dealings with in my lifetime. He is not the least bit temperamental as most architects and builders are, and seems to have his "feet on the ground," which is always most necessary when doing work under high pressure.
