I have your letter concerning the lack of heat on some recent date in the Ivy Street Building.

I immediately took this up with Mr. Sims, and he stated that it was the day after Thanksgiving when the building had been thoroughly cooled during the holiday previous, and he assured me that heat would be turned on at the proper time so that your quarters would be kept comfortably warm in the future.

With Mr. Sims I inspected both floors occupied by your company and found that the floor which had recently been replastered should be painted as soon as possible. Please give us a little time to secure surplus paint from the army or navy, and we will put our maintenance men to work as soon as such paint can be secured. Mr. Bryant, our maintenance man, is a qualified painter who followed that trade twenty years before we employed him.
